No. 4143. "An Act to approve an Agreement between the Commonwealth of Australia of the one part and the State of Victoria of the other part relating to a Scheme for adjusting the Grievances of certain Migrants settled upon the Land in Victoria in pursuance of an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland known as the *Empire Settlement Act 1922*."

No. 4144. "An Act to amend Sections Three and Four of the *Auction Sales Act 1928*."

5. Irrigation.—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

6. Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust's area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water Troughs.—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

8. Excess Payments.—Where water meters are fixed, the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust.

9. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1934, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1934, at the office of the said Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the rates.

## HOSPITAL AND CHARITIES ACT 1928, No. 3699.

**BY-LAWS OF THE CASTERTON HOSPITAL.****Introductory**

1.—All By-Laws in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-Laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

2.—These By-Laws shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1934.

**Definitions**

3.—In these By-Laws the word "Contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act. The words "The Act" shall mean the Hospitals and Charities Act 1928 or any amendment thereto, and Regulations made by the Governor-in-Council under these Acts.

**Objects**

4.—The objects of the Casterton Hospital shall be:—

(a) To afford relief, including maintenance and the treatment or cure of, or attention to, any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and/or surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance, support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto under the Act.

(b) To provide for carrying out investigations into ailments, diseases, injuries, or other matters affecting the human body.

**Seal**

5.—The Common Seal of the corporation shall be kept by the Secretary, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument or writing except by order of the General Committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making such order.

**Constitution**

6.—The incorporated institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and the members of the Committee hereinafter referred to, Honorary Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

**Life Governors**

7.—A Life Governor shall be any person who is a Life Governor at the date of the coming into operation of these By-Laws, or, being eligible under the By-Laws, is elected a Life-Governor by the Committee.

8.—Any person may be elected a Life Governor:—

(a) Who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the Casterton Hospital other than by contributing thereto. Any person who raised the sum of £50 from the public by means of fete, entertainment or other functions shall for the purpose of this by-law be considered to have conferred a signal benefit on the Casterton Hospital.

(b) Who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the funds of the Casterton Hospital a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds (£20) in one donation.

(c) Who is nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time has contributed to the Casterton Hospital a sum of not less than Twenty Pounds (£20) in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm.

**Meetings of Contributors**

9.—All Annual Meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the Secretary at least 14 days, and all Special Meetings at least seven days, before the day on which such meeting is to be held in a newspaper circulating in the Casterton district.

10.—The Annual General Meeting of contributors shall be held on such day, between the first day of July and the thirty-first day of August in each year, as shall be fixed by the Committee, for the following purposes:—

(a) To confirm the minutes of the previous Annual Meeting and Special Meetings, if any, no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

(b) To receive the report of the General Committee and audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the year to the 30th June preceding.

(c) For the election of President, two Vice-Presidents, Honorary Treasurer and Auditors for the ensuing year.

(d) The election of members of the General Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.

(e) For the transaction of any business of which at least seven days notice has been given.

11.—If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition in writing of six members of the Committee, or of ten contributors, the Secretary shall, as provided for in By-Law No. 9, convene a Special Meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such Special Meeting excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.

12.—At every General Meeting, the President, or, in his absence the senior Vice-President, in attendance, shall, preside as Chairman, but if none of these office-bearers is present, the contributors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman at that meeting.

13.—At all meetings of contributors, all questions, except questions involving contested elections, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless before or on the declaration of the result, a division is demanded by any contributor, in which event it shall be decided by a division. A declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or otherwise, and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact; provided, however, that where at least seven contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a By-Law shall be decided by poll as hereinafter provided. At all meetings of contributors, the Chairman shall, in the event of there being an equality of votes on any question, have a casting vote only.

14.—Votes of contributors given through the post shall, on a show of hands, division or poll, be counted in the same manner as if they had been given in person.

15.—Contributors shall on all occasions be entitled to one vote only.

16.—Where at any meeting of contributors a poll is duly demanded on any resolution confirming a By-Law, the Chairman of such meeting shall adjourn the meeting to admit of the poll being taken to a day to be fixed by him, but not less than four, nor more than ten days, after the day of adjournment. On the day preceding that fixed for the adjourned meeting, a poll of all contributors on the resolution in respect of which the poll was demanded shall be taken. Notice of the poll, specifying the By-Law or By-Laws to be confirmed, and the day, place and time of polling shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Casterton district not less than three days before, the day so fixed. The result of such poll shall be announced by the Chairman at the adjourned meeting, and shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.

17.—Where, under the By-Laws, any election has to be decided by poll, such poll shall be taken on a day to be fixed by the Committee. Notice of the day so fixed, of the time and place of polling, and of the office or offices to be filled, and the names of the candidates duly nominated, shall be advertised in a newspaper circulating in the Casterton district not less than three days before the day so fixed.

18.—Upon a poll being taken, each contributor may give his vote either in person or through the post. The poll shall be kept open from eight o'clock in the morning to seven o'clock in the evening on the polling day, and the votes of contributors who vote in person shall be recorded at any time between these hours. Votes recorded by post shall reach the polling office appointed as aforesaid or the Secretary before closing time for the poll. The Committee shall make provision for the orderly conduct of the poll and the proper counting of the votes.

19.—A minutes book shall be kept in which shall be recorded minutes of all General Meetings. Such minutes, if purporting to be signed by the Chairman of the meetings at which the proceedings were held

or by the Chairman of the next succeeding General Meeting, shall be evidence of the proceedings, and such meeting shall be deemed to have been duly held and convened, and the resolutions recorded in the minutes duly passed or otherwise as recorded.

#### Office-Bearers and Committee

20.—The Committee shall consist of Fifteen (15) contributors, comprising the President, the two Vice-Presidents, and the Honorary Treasurer, ex-officio, and Eleven (11) elected members.

21.—The President, Vice-Presidents and Treasurer respectively shall hold office for one year, and shall retire on the day of the Annual General Meeting next succeeding their election, but may be re-elected.

22.—On the day of the Annual General Meeting of the Contributors in each year, one-third part or the integral number nearest to one-third part of the elected members of the Committee shall retire from office, but may nevertheless be re-elected, and the persons who shall so retire shall be:—

(a) All members temporarily appointed by the Committee as hereinafter provided; and

(b) The members who shall have been longest in office without re-election. Where two or more persons have been in office for the same length of time then those who shall so retire shall be determined between themselves by lot in the presence of a quorum of the Committee.

23.—No paid officer of the Institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

24.—The maximum number of legally qualified Medical Practitioners who may be members of such Committee shall not exceed one-sixth part of the members of the Committee or the integral number nearest to such one-sixth part.

25.—The advertisement calling the Annual General Meeting shall state the names of the members of the Committee who will retire at such meeting, and the number of vacancies to be filled, and that nominations for the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Auditor, and of members of the Committee require to be delivered to the Secretary at least seven days before the Annual Meeting.

26.—Where, on or before the day so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have not been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, the Chairman at the Annual General Meeting shall declare the persons so nominated duly elected to the offices for which they have been nominated.

27.—Where, on or before the date so named in the advertisement as aforesaid, more eligible candidates have been duly nominated for any of the aforesaid offices than there are vacancies to be filled, a poll shall be taken. Such poll shall be held before the day of the Annual General Meeting, and the results of such poll shall be announced by the Chairman at such meeting, and the persons elected by such poll shall be deemed to have been elected at the Annual General Meeting.

28.—The Committee shall meet at least once in each month and at such place, day and time as the Committee may from time to time determine.

29.—Special meetings of the Committee may be convened by the President or any four members. Notice shall be given to members of such meeting, specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting.

30.—Written notice of each monthly meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee by delivering it to him before the meeting or by sending it by post in a prepaid letter addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode in time to reach him prior to the meeting being held.

31.—The Committee shall proceed to business so soon after the hour of meeting as there shall be a quorum present, and if, at the expiration of thirty minutes from the hour of meeting there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day and hour as the members then present shall decide, not being more than fourteen days from the day appointed for such meeting.

32.—The President, or, in his absence, the senior Vice-President in attendance, shall preside at all meetings of Committee, but if none of these office-bearers is present, the members shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

33.—All questions arising at any meeting of the Committee shall be decided by a show of hands, or, if demanded by any member, by a division. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote. In the event of the numbers being equal, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

34.—Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings of Committee.

35.—No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded until one month after such resolution has been passed, and then only upon notice of motion, and by an absolute majority of the Committee.

36.—The Committee shall prepare and lay before the contributors at each Annual General Meeting a general report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a balance sheet, duly audited, exhibiting a summary of receipts and expenditure for the twelve months ended on the 30th day of June next, preceding the day appointed for such meeting. No less than Six (6) of the members shall form a quorum at any meeting of Committee.

#### House Committee

37.—The Committee shall, at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of the Contributors, appoint from among themselves a House Committee of Three (3) Members, Two (2) to form a quorum. The senior member of the House Committee shall retire monthly, and a new member shall be appointed by the General Committee. The House Committee shall:—

(a) Meet at least once in each fortnight and more often if necessary.

(b) Visit the Hospital at least once during the month.

(c) Examine the condition of the furniture, beds and bedding in the Hospital.

(d) Satisfy themselves that all articles for human consumption in the Hospital are sound and wholesome, and that all food given to patients and staff is properly cooked and served out in a suitable manner.

(e) Hear and investigate all complaints upon any matter relating to the Hospital.

(f) Make suggestions for the further good management and discipline of the Hospital and for the comfort of the patients.

(g) Perform such other functions as the Committee may from time to time determine.

(h) Report in writing to the next monthly meeting of the Committee the result of their inspection and examination and otherwise regarding their work.

#### Finance Committee

38.—A Finance Committee consisting of the Treasurer and two other members shall be elected by and from the General Committee at its first meeting after the Annual Meeting of Contributors. The Finance Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting. Two members shall form a quorum.

The Finance Committee shall:—

(a) Visit the Hospital once in each week.

(b) Examine the admission form of each patient admitted to the Hospital and fix the amount payable by each patient by way of fee towards the cost of maintenance of the Institution.

(c) Examine a statement (prepared by the Secretary) of all outstanding patients' fees and make recommendations to the Committee whether

(1) The outstanding fees should be written off, and why

(2) Further action should be taken and by what means.

(d) Examine the Secretary's cash book and other books of accounts and compare same with the bank pass book.

(e) Give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collector, with reference to keeping, books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations.

(f) Examine the abstract of accounts prepared for presentation to the Committee at its monthly meeting, satisfy itself that all services in relation thereto have been duly executed, and that all vouchers connected with the abstract have been correctly acquitted or certified.

(g) See that the vouchers in connection with previous payments passed by the Committee have been properly receipted.

(h) Examine the returns prepared for the Charities Board of Victoria, and other Government Departments, and the annual statement of accounts.

(i) Perform such other duties as may be allotted by the Committee.

In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Finance Committee the signature of some member thereof should be appended with the date of examination.

#### Other Sub-Committees

39.—The Committee may at any time appoint any other Sub-Committee (consisting of members of their own body) they may think fit, and may prescribe the functions of and delegate any of its powers to any such Sub-Committee.

#### Finance

40.—The Secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the Institution and issue the official receipt forthwith. Such moneys shall be deposited without delay to the credit of the Institution in such bank as the Committee may from time to time determine, and the Treasurer shall satisfy himself that all moneys received are so paid in.

41.—All accounts shall be paid by cheques and no payments shall be made without the authority of the Committee. Cheques shall not be drawn or signed by the Treasurer except for moneys the payment whereof has been duly authorized by the Committee.

42.—All cheques drawn and signed by the Treasurer shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

#### Allocation of Funds Received

43.—All pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) made to the Hospital specifically for endowment purposes shall be placed to the credit of endowment fund, and shall be invested by the Treasurer as the Committee shall from time to time direct, and any income arising from such investment shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account. All pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) not exceeding the sum of £100 and not subject to conditions attached shall be paid to the credit of the maintenance account. All pecuniary gifts (inter vivos or testamentary) exceeding the sum of £100 and not subject to conditions attached shall be paid to the credit of the reserve fund. Accumulated credits to the maintenance account shall not be applied for endowment purposes, but may be transferred to the reserve fund from time to time as the Committee directs. All amounts placed in the reserve fund may be invested by the Treasurer from time to time as the Committee directs, and any income arising from such investments shall be paid to the credit of maintenance or reserve funds at the discretion of the Committee, provided that the Committee may at any time for maintenance, building, or equipment purposes authorise the disposal of the whole or any part of the reserve fund investments.

#### Auditors

44.—Two Auditors shall be elected at the Annual Meeting each year, and remuneration, if any, to be paid to them shall then be fixed.

45.—The Auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the Institution at all times, and shall, if they consider it necessary, report direct to the Committee.

46.—The Auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the Treasurer's annual financial statement, compare it with all books and accounts and documents relating thereto, and list of contributions and donations; they may make any special report thereon, which they consider necessary to the Annual Meeting.

#### Admission of Patients

47.—All patients (when able to do so) shall supply the particulars required on the prescribed admission form, and shall sign the appropriate declaration thereon. The Committee or a Sub-Committee duly appointed for the purpose or an officer of the Institution authorised to act on their behalf will determine the admission of patients. Except in cases of serious accident or other emergency which may be admitted by an authorised officer without recommendation, those requiring treatment at the Hospital must be examined by a Medical Practitioner and, subject to his recommendation or certificate that treatment is necessary, the application may be dealt with.

49.—No case of contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted till satisfactory arrangements are made with the Committee and the Medical Officer.

50.—Every in-patient and every out-patient who is admitted into or maintained by, or receives any relief from the Institution, shall be liable to contribute towards the funds of the Institution according to his or her means. Patients shall pay such fees as may be fixed by the Finance Committee, and the payment of same must be made weekly. In addition to the amount so due, such person shall, if he obtained admission in consequence of any false statement made by him regarding his circumstances, be liable to pay to the Institution a sum of not more than twenty pounds (£20), recoverable in a Court of Petty Sessions.

51.—Patients quitting the Hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

#### Visitors

52.—Friends may be allowed to visit patients at such hours as are fixed by the Committee.

#### General

53.—Any patient gambling, smoking in the wards without permission, or behaving in any indecent manner in any part of the hospital premises, will be liable to immediate discharge by the Committee.

54.—Under no condition shall any material be taken from the Hospital without an application in writing to the House Committee and their consent in writing thereto.

55.—Annual leave will be granted to the staff at such time as is convenient.

That the following boundaries be substituted for the boundaries set out and described in the Proclamation of the Governor in Council made by Order of the Governor in Council on 7th day of November, 1932, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of 9th day of November, 1932.

BOUNDARIES OF BARWON HEADS AND OCEAN GROVE URBAN DISTRICT.

(Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment 19, section 3, Parish of Bellarine, County of Grant; thence southerly, by a line, the western boundary of allotment 21, and a line in continuation of that boundary to the shore of Bass Straits; thence generally westerly, southerly, and westerly by the said shore to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment M, section 23, Parish of Conewarre; thence northerly by a line to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly and north-easterly by the western and north-western boundaries of the said allotment M to the most northerly angle of that allotment; thence north-easterly by a line bearing N. 72 deg. 24 min. **REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF PETROLEUM,  
ETC., IN THE SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.**

**W**HEREAS by section 656 of the *Local Government Act* 1928 (No. 3720) it is enacted that the Governor, in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable liquids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore the Honorable Sir Frederick Wollaston Mann, as Deputy for His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden, and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the said Council of the said municipality for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the 8th December, 1933.

**REGULATIONS.**

*Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.*

1. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all buildings and/or premises shall be first approved of by the Council.
- (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick, concrete, iron, or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
- (3) The lower floor of such buildings shall be at least one foot below the grade of the adjoining street and shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
- (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored, or retained in any such buildings.

*Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.*

2. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, or metal, or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion, and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons, in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than 1 pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour

can escape therefrom, and if the position of the storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

- (2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, earthenware, or metal, and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises.

*Precaution to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.*

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

*Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.*

4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than 1 pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test, he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—

- (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Country Fire Brigade where practicable.
- (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry sand, shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.
- (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the premises.
- (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

*Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.*

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire-fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

*Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.*

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

*Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.*

7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.
- (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of best mild steel plate not less than 10 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.
- (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.



*Power to Enter and Inspect.*

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any other persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence:

*Offence.*

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

*Penalty.*

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

*Exemptions may be Made by the Council.*

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings or an adjoining property boundary.

NOTE.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

*Definitions.*

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "Premises" includes all the land within the boundary of the allotment or allotments, or part thereof, on which the building is situated and which is occupied by the owner or occupier of the building, and includes all other land used for the purpose of storing volatile fluids under any conditions. "Approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said Shire of Hampden, or any deputy appointed by the said Council of the said municipality to act for him. "Council" means the Council of the said municipality. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fahr. Abel close test, if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the schedule.

## SCHEDULE.

Methylated spirits, benzine, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fahr. Abel close test.

And the Honorable John Percy Jones, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
