NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT THE SPEARING OF FLOUNDERS, ETC.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prohibiting during the whole of each year the taking of flounders or soles by means of spears or any similar instruments in all Victorian waters, provided that in the waters of the Gippsland Lakes, the taking of flounders or soles by means of spears or any similar instruments shall be prohibited:—

- (a) From Ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday until sunrise on each Sunday following throughout each year; and
- (b) From sunrise on each Sunday until Ten o'clock in the morning of each Friday throughout each year, within a radius of Two hundred yards from any fish pen or paddock.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934.

THE Boort Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Fifty pounds, of One shilling and ninepence in the pound on amount of annual municipal valuation exceeding Fifty pounds but not exceeding One hundred pounds, and One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding One hundred pounds of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Boort Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Forty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the first day of January, 1934, and shall be payable on the 30th day of June, 1934, at the office of the said Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the said Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

KYNETON SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage District Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust for the proclamation of a sewerage district and for the constitution of a Sewerage Authority to carry out works for the sewerage of Kyneton for the purpose of the said Acts, and doth hereby appoint as follows:—

- (a) That the amount of loan moneys to be borrowed by such Sewerage Authority shall be Five thousand pounds (£5,000) for detail survey, revised estimates, and report on the scheme.

Audit Act 1928:

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS AMENDED.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Audit Act 1928*, doth hereby repeal clause 42 of the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts made on the 20th day of January, 1930, and published in the *Gazette* of the 22nd idem, and in lieu thereof doth make the clause following, that is to say:—

Clause 42 (a).—Accounts submitted must be on the prescribed forms, and the writing thereon must be in ink. Accounts must be duly vouched and not be vitiated by erasures, interlineations, or in any other manner. Material alterations must be initiated by the Certifying Officer. In the case of the Railways Department, alterations may be initiated by either the Certifying Officer or the Accounting Officer.

Clause 42 (b).—The particulars inserted in the body of an account must be sufficient to fully support the payment, and to indicate the proper funds chargeable with the expenditure. The exact dates or periods of service, and particulars of services and rates thereof, must be set forth in such a manner as will permit of the calculations being readily checked.

Clause 42 (c).—Except as otherwise provided in clause 42 (d), each account must be signed by the proper claimant or by an agent acting under power of attorney or by an employee duly authorized on his behalf. In the cases of public institutions and bodies, companies registered under the Companies Act, partnerships, firms registered under the Business Names Act, Municipalities, and corporate bodies generally, accounts may be signed by an officer or employee on behalf of such institutions, bodies, &c.

Clause 42 (d).—In the cases of payments to the Commonwealth Government and to the Governments of the States of the Commonwealth, and in such other cases as the Treasurer approves, it will not be necessary for accounts to be signed by or on behalf of claimants.

Clause 42 (e).—The mark of a claimant unable to write must be properly vouched in the manner prescribed by clause 29 of these Regulations.

Clause 42 (f).—The name and address of the claimant must be written legibly in the proper place on accounts. Departmental and sub-departmental accounts, however, must be made out in the name of the Department or sub-Department concerned, and not in the name of an officer.

Clause 42 (g).—The financial year, Department, Head of Service, Vote, Appropriation, or fund to be charged must be inserted in the places provided on accounts.

Clause 42 (h).—The amount of an account must be written in words at length opposite to the total, and any blank space between the words must be filled in by drawing a line across it.

Clause 42 (i).—In all cases where expenditure has been incurred under gazetted contracts, approved requisition, agreement, or other authority, reference to such authority must be made on the account.

(ii) be wetted above the waist in the course of a shift through working clothes other than oilskins or other waterproof clothing shall be paid 1s. 4d. per day or portion of a day, in addition to the above rates.
Any topman working at a depth of 8 feet or more and any other employee working at a depth of 16 feet or more shall be paid 2d. per hour in addition to above rate.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—The following additional rates shall be paid to any person employed—

On all work within the Metropolitan District, 10d. per day or portion of a day.

Any Other Place.

On all work distant from his residence—

- (a) over 2 miles and up to 4 miles, 4d. per day or portion of a day.
(b) over 4 miles and up to 9 miles, 11d. per day or portion of a day.
(c) over 9 miles and up to 12 miles, 1s. 2d. per day or portion of a day.
(d) over 12 miles, 1s. 5d. per day or portion of a day.

(4) SHIFTS.—That—

- (a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:—

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) TIME RATES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.
