PROCLAMATION

RULES UNDER THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACTS.

THE following Rules, pursuant to the *Workers' Compensation (Transfer of Funds) Act 1931* (No. 3952), shall be incorporated with the Rules under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928*—

1. Where money (other than a weekly payment under Rule 56 or arrears of weekly payments under Rule 57) is paid into a County Court or Court of Petty Sessions in Victoria under the Acts for the benefit of any workman or dependants resident or about to reside in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Judge of the County Court or the Police Magistrate, as the case may be, may, on the application of the workman or dependants, order the money to be transferred to the said United Kingdom, there to be administered for the benefit of the workman or dependants in such manner as the appropriate authority may think fit, and may in such order make any request regarding the administration of the money.

2. Where an order has been made for the transfer of money under the last preceding paragraph, the Registrar of the County Court or the Clerk of Petty Sessions, as the case may be, shall send in an envelope addressed to the Registrar, County Court, Melbourne, a sealed copy of the order, and at the same time forward under cover to the Registrar, County Court, Melbourne, a crossed cheque for the amount held in trust for the workman or dependants payable to the Registrar, County Court, Melbourne, who shall transmit the said sealed order to the officer indicated in the first column of the schedule to these Rules (as the case may be), and a crossed cheque for a like amount to that received from the transmitting Court to the officer indicated in the second column of the said schedule.

3. Where money paid under the law relating to workmen's compensation in force in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is transferred in pursuance of an order of any competent authority to the County Court at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, for the benefit of a workman or dependants residing within the jurisdiction of that Court, the Registrar of the County Court at Melbourne shall, upon application made by the workman or dependants, transfer the money and the sealed copy of the order under which the money was transferred when received by him to the nearest appropriate County Court, having regard to the residence of the beneficiary, which Court shall receive and administer the money for the benefit of the workman or dependants as if it were compensation paid into Court for his or their benefit under the *Workers' Compensation Act 1928*, and shall, so far as possible consistently with that object, take into account and act upon any request contained in the order of the transmitting Court regarding the administration of the money.

4. On receipt of the money so transferred, the Registrar of the appropriate Court shall send notice in writing thereof to the workman or dependants, and may require him or them to attend at the Court in order that he or they may give the Registrar such information as he may require, and receive any money payable to him or them.

5. The Court by which the money is administered in Victoria shall not charge any Court or other fees in respect of the administration of the money.

BY-LAW NO. 37 FOR MAKING AND LEVYING RATES.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes other than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) of the net annual value of £20 and under situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) above the net annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (c) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (d) Of any tenement above the net annual value of £500 situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £4 per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such tenement.
- (e) Of lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the valuation of such lands.
- (f) Of any warehouse or wholesale store used exclusively for such purposes situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of £3 10s. per cent. in the pound of the valuation of such warehouse or wholesale store as aforesaid.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of January, 1934, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1934, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1934, at the office of The Water Commissioners at Ballarat.

3. For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipalities in which such lands and tenements are situate in The Ballarat Water Supply District shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

4. For water supplied by the Commissioners for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by the Commissioners in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Tenpence per 1,000 gallons.

5. Such persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

ORDER IN COUNCIL CONFIRMING RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD RESCINDING IN PART A RESOLUTION DECLARING A CERTAIN HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF NUMURKAH TO BE A STATE HIGHWAY.

- (i) Electric passenger lifts—600 feet per minute.
- (ii) Hydraulic passenger lifts—300 feet per minute.
- (iii) All other lifts—200 feet per minute.

For clause 76 there shall be substituted the following clause:—

76. (1) Where a lift is automatically controlled the controlling apparatus thereof shall be so designed that—

- (i) it will be impossible to open any door or gate from the outside except when the lift car is opposite;
- (ii) as soon as it is operated by any person the car shall be beyond the control of any other person until the completion of its run;
- (iii) between the arrival of the car at the completion of its run and the commencement of another journey there shall be a time interval at least sufficient to allow of the door being opened.

(2) Where a lift is automatically controlled and the car speed thereof exceeds 200 feet per minute—

- (i) a car door or gate shall be fitted across the whole width of each car entrance, and the controlling apparatus of every such lift shall be arranged so that it cannot be operated automatically when any person is in the car unless every such car door or gate is closed;
- (ii) accurate floor levelling devices shall be fitted thereto;
- (iii) it shall be so controlled that the speed of the lift, when making a stop at any landing, shall not exceed 150 feet per minute.

At the end of clause 77 there shall be added the following words:—

"unless the speed of such lift is increased."

WHEREAS by section 622 of the *Local Government Act* 1928 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, on the application of the council of any municipality, and being satisfied that the special circumstances of the case require it, may make regulations for declaring the maximum weight to be carried in or by means of any vehicle on any public road in the district of such municipality or in the portion of such district which is mentioned in such Regulation. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, to apply within the municipal district of the Shire of Dunmunkle:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF PUBLIC RESERVES IN THE CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

- (5) The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 9th February, 1874, as a site for ornamental plantation purposes in the Borough of Sandridge, now City of Port Melbourne, but excepting the area occupied under permissive occupancy by bowling club as indicated on plan attached to Lands Department correspondence C.80655.

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

The "Reserve" shall mean the Reserves hereinbefore specified, and each of them, or any part or parts thereof.

The "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

The "Committee" shall mean the Council of the City of Port Melbourne or other Committee of Management for the time being of the Reserve appointed pursuant to the above Act.

"Unauthorized person" shall mean any person other than a person for the time being duly authorized in writing by the Committee or the Board, or an officer of or a person or servant of a person employed by the Committee or the Board in or about any work in connexion with laying out, planting, improving, or maintaining the Reserve.

2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.

3. No unauthorized person shall do any of the following acts, matters, or things on the Reserve:—

- (1) Enter the Reserve before the time hereinbefore appointed for the opening thereof, or enter the Reserve and remain therein after the time hereinbefore appointed for the closing thereof.

- (2) Injuring Trees or Flowers.—Cut, pluck, injure, or destroy the whole or any part of any tree, bush, or flower growing therein.

- (3) Cutting Turf, &c.—Dig, cut, or remove any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, or other substance thereon or therefrom.

- (4) Causing Fire.—Light any fire, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being thereon.

- (5) Leaving Rubbish.—Deposit or leave thereon, or on any part thereof, any rubbish, bricks, manure, timber, or other substance or material whatsoever.

- (6) Drying.—Bleach or place out to dry any article or thing.

- (7) Carpet Beating.—Beat, shake, sweep, brush, or cleanse any carpet, rug, or mat, or any other fabric retaining dust or dirt.

- (8) Interference.—Catch or trap any bird, or lay or place any trap for the taking of birds, or take birds' eggs or nests, or shoot or chase or disturb any game or other animal.

- (9) Allowing Animals to Stray.—Cause or suffer any horse, pony, mule, ass, bull, ox, cow, calf, heifer, steer, lamb, sheep, goat, hog, or sow belonging to him or in his charge to enter or go thereupon.

- (10) Making Erection or Obstruction.—Encamp thereon, or erect or place thereon any booth, tent, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, chair, or seat (other than a camp stool or other portable seat), or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or make any enclosure of any part thereof.

- (11) Defacing Notices, &c.—Injure, deface, or remove any seat, notice, or notice-board, post, chair, fence, railing, barrier, tree-guard, or other thing which may be from time to time erected or placed thereon by or by the authority of the Committee or Board.

- (12) Bill Posting.—Post or paint any bill, placard, or notice thereon, or on any fence, erection, or tree thereon.

- (13) Carving Names, &c.—Paint, write, carve, cut, or in any manner inscribe letters, figures, or marks upon, or otherwise disfigure any rock or tree, or any wall, fence, or other structure or erection in the Reserve.

- (14) Beast of Draught or Burden not to be brought into Ground.—Ride, drive, or bring, or cause or suffer to be ridden, driven, or brought into the Reserve any beast of draught or burden.

- (15) Prohibition of Vehicles, except Perambulators and Wheeled Chairs.—Drive or wheel, or cause or suffer to be driven or wheeled into the Reserve any barrow, truck, or machine, or any vehicle other than a wheeled chair drawn or propelled by hand, or a perambulator or a chaise drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children or an invalid.
- (16) Brawling, &c.—Brawl, fight, use indecent language, or act in an indecent, disorderly, or offensive manner, or exhibit any indecent or infamous book, picture, or representation to the obstruction, annoyance, or danger of any person resorting to the Reserve.
- (17) Firearms.—Fire or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any missile.
- (18) Climbing.—Climb any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or any tree, or any barrier, railing, or post in the Reserve, or be on any wall, roof, or parapet of any building or erection thereon.
- (19) Selling, &c., without Licence.—Sell or let or ply for hire with any article, animal, and/or cart or distribute any bill or like thing, or place any chair or seat for hire.
- (20) Collection of Money.—Solicit or gather money or other thing.
- (21) Dogs.—Cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from worrying or disturbing any beast, and from entering any ornamental water, and from injuring or destroying, worrying, or disturbing any fowl in the Reserve.
- (22) Smoking and Nuisances.—Smoke tobacco or any like substance in any building in the Reserve where, by a notice or notices affixed or set up in some conspicuous position, the Committee may prohibit smoking in such building, nor commit any acts of indecency, behave in an offensive manner, or commit any nuisance in any sanitary convenience.
- (23) Betting.—Frequent or use the Reserve for purposes of betting or wagering, or of agreeing to make any bet or wager.
- (24) Trample on Plant or Flower Beds.—Walk or run over, or stand, sit, or lie upon any part of any flower bed, or any shrub, underwood, gorse, furze, fern, or plant, or any ground in course of cultivation as a flower bed or for the reception or growth of any shrub, underwood, gorse, furze, fern, or plant.
- (25) Obstruction of Officers.—Disturbance or Interruption.—Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the use of the Reserve, or obstruct, disturb, or interrupt any officer of the Committee or the Board in the proper execution of his duty, or any person or servant or any person employed by the Committee or the Board in proper execution of any work in connexion with laying out, planting, improvement, or maintenance of the Reserve.
- (26) General Clause.—Do, aid in, or abet any act or thing which may not in these Regulations be specifically mentioned, and which may tend to the injury or disfigurement of the Reserve, or to interfere with the use thereof by the public for the purposes of exercise or recreation.
- (27) Broken Glass.—Break up or destroy any glass, or glass or stone bottles in the Reserve, nor deposit or leave any glass or any bottles therein.

The Council of the City of Port Melbourne has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AT WEST HAWTHORN.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands permanently reserved by Orders in Council of 17th November, 1879, and 14th August, 1923, as a site for Public Recreation purposes in the Parish of Boroondara, in the City of Hawthorn, in lieu of all previous Regulations, which are hereby rescinded:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom and to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
3. No person shall climb or jump over any gates, fences, buildings, structures, or property in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, structures, gates, fences, seats, trees, or other property in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
5. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
6. (a) No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
(b) Any dog found in the Reserve, except as provided in this Regulation, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the officers and/or servants of the Committee of Management, and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation, and shall also make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.
7. No person shall post or place any advertisement, bill, poster, or any other like sign in any part of the Reserve, nor give out or distribute any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet, or paper in the Reserve, nor litter the same by scattering or throwing down any handbill, placard, notice, advertisement, or paper.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall race, practise running, train for any athletics, or play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sunday, Anzac Day, or Good Friday.
13. No person shall race, practise running, train for any athletics, or play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on any day other than Sunday, Anzac Day, or Good Friday without the permission, in writing, of the

Committee of Management first obtained, unless such person is at the time a member of a club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve.

14. No person other than players and officials connected with any game, or competitors and officials at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground, oval, court, or rink during the course of such game or sport.

15. No person shall drive any motor car or motor vehicle or ride any bicycle or motor cycle in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. No person shall make any outcry or harangue or address any meeting or gathering or assemblage of persons in the Reserve, nor shall any meeting or gathering or assemblage of persons for any purpose whatsoever be held or conducted or permitted to take place in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, in writing, first obtained.

17. No person shall play any musical instrument, preach, deliver any address, or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management being first obtained.

18. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without having previously obtained written permission from the Committee of Management.

19. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

20. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs or set out or used as garden plots.

21. In any part of the Reserve used or set apart for a children's playground—

- (a) No person above the age of fourteen years shall use any of the appliances erected thereon.
- (b) Appliances erected shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.
- (c) No child shall use any of the appliances except for the special purposes for which they are respectively provided.
- (d) Cricket or football shall not be played therein.
- (e) All papers, fruit, peel, or other litter shall be placed in the receptacles provided by the Committee of Management for the purpose.
- (f) Every person in the children's playground shall, in respect to his conduct therein, obey instructions and directions of any bailiff of Crown lands or of any member of the Police Force.
- (g) The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the appliances in the children's playground.
- (h) The children's playground shall not be used after sunset.
- (i) Any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force shall have the right to remove or exclude from the children's playground any person who commits a breach of the foregoing Regulations, or who wilfully damages any appliances or property in the children's playground, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to the penalty prescribed for a breach of these Regulations.

The Council of the City of Hawthorn has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any

member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE DATTUCK RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th December, 1930, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Dattuck.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, fences, gates, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The By-law contains the following provisions:—

- Clause 1 repeals By-laws numbered 6, 15, 46, 50 and 97.
- Clause 2 defines the meaning of "vehicle."
- Clause 3 prescribes the practices to be followed by the driver of a vehicle or rider of a horse or other animal upon any street.
- Clause 4 provides that no person shall drive any vehicle upon any street, or permit any vehicle to be driven upon any street, unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver to have a full and uninterrupted view of the street traffic, and that no person while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as to prevent or interfere with his having a full and uninterrupted view of street traffic.
- Clause 5 provides for the lighting of vehicles between sunset and sunrise, and for the lighting of projections on vehicles, and requires that every vehicle shall carry a red tail light.
- Clause 6 prohibits the riding, driving, or leading of any horse or cattle, or the driving or impelling of any vehicle on footways.
- Clause 7 exempts authorized parades or processions from the provisions of clause 6.
- Clauses 8 and 9 prohibits the parking of vehicles in the positions specified in schedules.
- Clause 10—
 - (a) prohibits the feeding of horses in streets except by means of a nosebag;
 - (b) prohibits the removal of blinkers or bridle of any horse in a street;
 - (c) provides for the muzzling of vicious horses in streets.
- Clause 11 provides for the proper parking of materials in vehicles to prevent noise.
- Clause 12 provides that no person shall carry in any street upon a vehicle anything which touches or comes in contact with the surface of the street.
- Clauses 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17 prohibits any person making any loud noise, &c., such as may be calculated to cause annoyance or obstruction in any street or footway, or in adjacent premises.
- Clause 18 prohibits obstruction to streets or footways by the sale or offering for sale any goods.
- Clauses 21, 22, and 23 regulates pedestrian traffic.
- Clause 24 regulates street processions.
- Clause 25 provides for the compliance with lawful directions.
- Clause 26 prohibits unauthorized persons regulating, directing, or interfering with traffic, &c.
- Clause 27 prohibits unauthorized parking attendants.
- Clauses 28 and 29 provides for contraventions and offences against By-law.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE PLUMBERS BOARD.

NOTES.—(1) This Determination, on the 25th December, 1933, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) *Plumbing and Gasfitting were proclaimed on the 10th October, 1928, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Act 1928 for the Metropolitan District.*

Full particulars of the Apprenticeship Regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, 61 Spring-street, Melbourne (price 3d.).

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of a plumber or gasfitter ;
(b) wheresoever employed in any plumbing work (including electrical or gas fittings) in connexion with the erection or repairing of buildings."

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Anzac Day (by persons not subject to *Anzac Day Act 1928*), Christmas Day, Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable on the day so substituted.

** A Commonwealth award applies to certain of these employees.*

(6) ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid to persons (other than persons employed by the gas companies) employed on work away from the centre (the centre meaning the employer's usual place of business or the employee's residence, whichever is the nearer to the work) :—

(i) The fares necessarily expended in going from and to the centre to and from his work.

(ii) For time necessarily occupied in travelling from and to the centre to and from his work :—

(a) During usual working hours	} Ordinary rates.
(b) Outside usual working hours— Time in excess of a total of 1½ hours occupied in going from and to the centre to and from his work	

(iii) For work done at a distance from the centre, if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night, and suitable board and lodging has not been provided by the employer 8½d. per hour extra.

(7) TOOLS AND APPLIANCES.—That if any employee is required to provide any or all of the following tools or appliances :—

Caulking-irons, drilling frame and chain, tap key, chain wrenches, files, grips or tongs of over 12 inches in length, hacksaw frame or blades, mandrills, dummies, metal pots, pipe cutters, plumbing irons, ratchets, stocks, dies, drills for stone taps and drills for brass or iron threads, or vyces.

Is. per hour in addition to the ordinary rates fixed by this Determination shall be paid by the employer.

(8) MEAL INTERVAL.—Persons employed as gas main or service layers shall not be called upon to work for a longer period than five hours continuously without an interval of one hour for a meal. Such provision shall only apply to persons employed within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work as set out in Clause (3) of this Determination.

(9) CASUAL LABOUR.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during the week for not more than one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work) shall be paid at the rate of 1½d. per hour extra.
