# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by section 11 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799) it is enacted that it shall be the duty of every occupier and of every owner of land from time to time to destroy all vermin on any land occupied or owned by him and on the adjacent half-widths of all roads bounding or adjoining the same or any part thereof and to keep such land and half-width of roads clear and free of all vermin and for such purposes to do all necessary or proper acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert cutting embankment acts or things: Provided that where on any road any formed part of the road or any bridge culvert culting embankment channel drain or work or any stone gravel wood or material deposited on the road to be used in the construction or maintenance thereof is a harbour or cover for vermin it shall be the duty of the Conneil of the municipality in the numicipal district of which such harbour or cover is situate to destroy all vermin therein and to keep the same clear and free of

And whereas by section 12 of the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time. by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, specify a day on from and after which any duty specified in the next, preceding section shall in the whole or any part of Victoria specified in the Proclamation he simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of any land within the whole or such part of Victoria (as the case may be).

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby name the twenty-fourth day of January. One thousand nine then the duty specified by the said section 11 shall be simultaneously commenced continued and performed by every occupier and every owner of land within the whole of Victoria.

# Factories and Shops Act.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1928
(No. 3677).

MANUFACTURE OF WHITE LEAD, RED LEAD, OR LITHARGE, AND THE MANUFACTURE OR REPAIR OF ELECTRIC ACCUMULATORS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of December, 1933.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Factories and Shops Act 1928 and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendments and additions to the Regulations made under the said Act on the fourth day of March, 1930, and published in the Government Gazette on the seventh day of March, 1930 (that is to say):—

These Regulations shall come into force on, from, and after the first day of January, 1934.

On the date aforesaid, Regulations 32, 33, and 34 of Chapter I. of the aforesaid Regulations shall be revoked.

After paragraph (h) of Class "F" of Regulation 35 of Chapter I. of the said Regulations insert the following:—

" (See Chapter IX., Regulations 35 to 47, for further requirements regarding Class "F" of this Regulation.)"

For Class "G," Regulation 35, of Chapter I. of the said Regulations substitute the following:—

# Class "G."

BUILDINGS IN WHICH LEAD OR COMPOUNDS THEREOF ARE USED FOR THE MANUFACTURE OR REPAIR OF ELECTRIC ACCUMULATORS.

- (a) The floors of all rooms in which lead or compounds thereof are used for the manufacture or repair of electric accumulators shall be of cement or similar impervious material, with a smooth surface, and laid so as to drain into an approved sewerage system or into impervious drains.
- (b) The walls of the pasting and mixing rooms shall be lined with a smooth-faced impervious material to a point 6 feet above the floor.
- (c) Every room shall be provided with-
  - (i) a system of mechanical ventilation approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories; or
  - (ii) openings, other than windows and doors, for the inlet and outlet of air in the proportion of not less than 24 square inches of inlet openings and 24 square inches of outlet openings for each person working in the room. Such ventilation to be subject to such other provisions of Regulation 12 of Chapter I. of these Regulations as are applicable.
- (d) Efficient control of dust and fumes shall be provided by approved mechanical means.
- (e) A suitably furnished luncheon-room shall be provided for the use of employees. It shall be constructed and placed so as to be free from dust or fumes generated in the manufacturing process, and shall have no direct communication with a work-room.
- (f) Two suitably furnished dressing-rooms shall be provided. In the first shall be removed and stored all private clothing put off by the workman during working hours. In the second shall be put on, removed, and stored all overalls and other clothing worn only while at work. The dressing-rooms shall be so constructed and placed as to be free from any dust or fumes generated in the manufacturing process.
- (g) A suitable lavatory shall be provided and maintained for the use of the employees. Lavatory basins, with hot and cold water laid on and a waste pipe fitted to each, shall be installed therein in the proportion of one basin, at least, for every five or fraction of five persons working.
- (h) Sufficient shower-bath accommodation, with hot and cold water laid on, shall be provided for all persons engaged in the manipulation of dry oxides of lead or in pasting.
- (See Chapter IX., Regulations 48 to 72, for further requirements regarding Class "G" of this Regulation.)

After Regulation 34 of Chapter IX, of the said Regulations insert the following Regulations:—

MANUFACTURE OF WHITE LEAD, RED LEAD, OR LITHARGE.

Special conditions to be observed by occupiers and employees of factories in which the manufacture of white lead, red lead, or litharge is carried on.

(See also Chapter I., Class "F" (Regulation 35), for structural requirements respecting these factories.

### Definition.

35. In these Regulations "lead process" shall include any work (other than work in connexion with the manufacture or repair of electric accumulators) which exposes a person to the dust of white lead, red lead, or litharge.

Aga

36. No male under eighteen years of age and no female of any age shall be employed in a lead process.

# Gloves and Clothing.

- 37. (a) The employer shall provide for all persons employed by him in a lead process overalls, consisting of coat and trousers, and indiarubber gloves, which shall be maintained by him in good repair and condition, and shall be thoroughly cleansed at least once a weeck.
- (b) No person shall work at a lead process unless he wears overalls and indiarubber gloves which are in good repair.
- (c) No overalls or indiarubber gloves shall be kept or worn in the second dressing room required to be provided under Chapter 1, Class "F" (Regulation 35).

# Floors to be kept Damp.

38. The floors of all workrooms in which a lead process is carried on shall be kept constantly damp during working hours, and shall be thoroughly cleaned daily.

# Rooms, da, to be Cleaned Daily.

39. The dressing room, bath, lavatory, and sanitary conveniences shall be thoroughly cleaned daily.

# Washing Time.

40. Before each meal, in addition to the regular meal times and before the end of the day's work, at least ten minutes for washing shall be allowed to each worker engaged in a lead process.

# Soap, Nail Brushes, &c., to be Provided.

41. An adequate supply of hot and cold water, soap, nail brushes, and clean towels shall be provided and maintained in the bathroom or lavatory.

# Smoking, &c., Prohibited.

42. No person shall smoke, or chew tobacco, or take snuff while employed in a lead process.

# Food to be Kept out of Room.

43. No person shall introduce into, or keep, or prepare, or partake of any food or drink in any room in which a lead process is carried on.

# Precautions after Leaving Workroom.

44. No person leaving a workroom shall enter the luncheon-room or partake of food until he has taken off his overalls and head covering, and placed them in the place provided for the purpose, nor until he has also thoroughly washed face and hands in the bathroom or lavatory.

# Interference Prohibited.

45. No person shall without authority interfere with the means provided for the removal of dust or fumes.

# Medicinal Compounds.

- 46. There shall be kept available for the use of employees-
- (a) a medicinal compound prescribed by a duly qualified medical practitioner as being suitable for counteracting the pathological effects of lead absorption, or for aiding elimination of lead from the human system; or
- (b) a medical compound of the following ingredients:—Sulphate of magnesium (Epsom salts) 2 oz., water 1 gallon, lemon syrup sufficient to flavour.

# Respirators and Head Coverings.

47. Every employee engaged in packing or handling dry white lead, dry red lead, or litharge, or drawing stoves shall be provided with and shall wear a respirator of approved pattern and material, and shall also wear a head covering. Every respirator shall be cleaned daily, and when not in use shall be kept in a suitable place set apart for the purpose

MANUFACTURE OR REPAIR OF ELECTRIC ACCUMULATORS IN CONNEXION . WITH WHICH LEAD OR COMPOUNDS THEREOF ARE USED.

Special conditions to be observed by occupiers and employees of factories in which is carried on the manufacture or repair of electric accumulators in connexion with which lead or compounds thereof are used.

(See also Chapter I., Class "G" (Regulation 35) for structural requirements respecting these factories.)

# Definition.

48. In these Regulations, "lead process" shall include any work involving the manipulation of dry compounds of lead, or pasting, or the smelting or casting of lead or lead compounds, or lead burning, or any work involving the manipulation of dry pasted plates in connexion with the manufacture or repair of electric accumulators.

49. No male under eighteen years of age and no female of any age shall be employed in any lead process.

- 50. (a) The employer shall provide for all persons employed by him in a lead or forming process overalls, which shall be maintained by him in good repair and condition, and shall be thoroughly cleansed at least once
- (b) No person shall work at a lead process unless he wears overalls which are in good repair.
  - (c) No overalls shall be kept or worn in the cloak-room.

# Floors.

- 51. The floor of every room in which any part of the manufacture is carried on shall be-

  - (a) of concrete or similar material faced with cement plaster so as to be smooth and impervious to water:
    (b) maintained in a sound-condition;
    (c) cleansed throughout daily by means of a suction-cleaning apparatus, or after being thoroughly sprayed with water at a time when no other work is being carried on, except that the floors of the pasting and mixing rooms shall be flushed down daily with water from a hose;
    (d) kept constantly moist while work is being done (this provision)
  - with water from a nose:

    (d) kept constantly moist while work is being done (this provision shall not apply to grid-easting rooms):

    (e) laid so as to drain into a suitable drainage system;

    (f) kept free from all material or plant or other obstruction not required for the process being carried on in the room.

# Walls.

52. The walls of the pasting and mixing rooms shall be lined with a smooth-faced impervious material to a point 6 feet above the floor, and shall be maintained in a clean condition.

- 53. Each workroom shall be provided with-
- o. Each workroom shall be provided with—

  (a) ventilators, other than windows or doors, of such capacity as will provide 24 square inches of inlet and 24 square inches of outlet ventilation for each person working therein, such ventilators to be placed where directed, and to be subject to such other provisions of Regulation 12 of Chapter 1 as are applicable; or

  (b) a system of mechanical ventilation approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories.

- $-54,\,\mathrm{No}$  paster shall work within 5 feet of the centre of the working position of any other paster.
  - 55. Every work bench on which pasting of plates is done shall-

    - (a) have a smooth impervious top with raised edges; and
      (b) be kept constantly moist during working hours, and thoroughly cleansed daily while in a damp condition.
- 56. Every work bench on which dried plates are manipulated shall be of grid or wire-mesh construction, under which a suction lood or hoods shall be fixed in such a position as to catch all particles or dust dislodged during the manipulation thereof.
  - 57. All other benches at which a lead process is carried on shall-

  - (a) have a smooth surface.
    (b) be kept free from all material or plant not required for or produced in the process being carried on thereat.
- 58. The surface of every work bench at which a lead process is carried on shall-

  - (a) be constantly maintained in a sound condition;
     (b) be thoroughly cleaned daily after being damped. A suction-cleaning apparatus shall be used for cleaning wherever practice.

# Segregation of Processes.

- 59. Each of the following processes shall be carried on under such conditions as will secure effectual separation of the following processes from each other, and from any other processes:—
  - (a) manipulation of dry compounds of lead;

  - (b) pasting;
    (c) drying of pasted plates;
    (d) lead smelting and lead casting;
    (e) rumbling of any materials containing lead;
    (f) storage of old batteries or materials containing lead unless same are stored in a suitable confined space in the rumbling-room.

# Mechanical Draught.

- 60. Mechanical exhaust draught shall be provided for all the following processes, and shall be so arranged as to effectively remove all dust and fumes from the workroom:—,
  - (a) smelting of lead or of materials containing lead;

(b) manipulation of dry compounds of lead;
(c) brushing, filing, or any other abrading or cutting of pasted plates causing dust;
(d) lead hypoing.

(d) lead burning;

(a) read ourning;
 (c) rumbling of any material containing lead or any other operation during the course of which lead dust is evolved.

# Receiptacles.

61. At each melting pot, a suitable covered receptacle shall be provided. All dross and skimmings from the pot shall be placed in this receptacle.

62. In every other workroom there shall be provided suitable receptacles in which shall be deposited old plates and waste material.

### Racks.

63. The racks or shelves provided in any drying chamber shall be-

- (a) not more than 8 feet above the floor nor more than 2 feet in width; provided that racks or shelves operated from both sides may be 4 feet wide;
  (b) be kept free from accumulations of lead dust, and shall be cleaned only by means of an efficient suction-cleaning apparatus.

# Opening Lead-oxide Containers.

64. Containers holding lead oxides shall be opened only in the mixing-om. The open containers shall be placed on raised platforms adjacent

# Rumblers.

65. All rumblers shall be so constructed that the contents thereof will discharge into a suitable box or container, in which the material shall be removed to the store or the mixing-room.

### Luncheon and Dressing Rooms.

- 66. A suitably furnished luncheon-room shall be provided for the use of the employees. It shall be so constructed and placed as to be free from dust or fumes generated in the manufacturing process, and shall have no direct communication with a workroom.
- 67. Two suitably furnished dressing-rooms shall be provided. In the first shall be removed and stored all private clothing put qif by the workman during working hours. In the second shall be put on, removed, and stored all overalls and other clothing worn only while at work. The dressing, rooms shall be so constructed and placed as to be free from any dust or furnes generated in the manufacturing process.

# Lavatoru.

- Lavatory.

  1. A suitable lavatory shall be provided and maintained for the use of the employees. Lavatory basins, with hot and cold water laid on and a waste pipe fitted to each, shall be installed therein in the proportion of one basin, at least, for every five or fraction of five persons working.

  1. 69. Each lavatory shall be equipped with a supply of clean towels made of suitable material and renewed daily, in the proportion of one to each worker. A sufficient supply of soap or other cleansing material and of nail brushes shall also be provided.

# Shower Baths.

70. Sufficient shower-bath accommodation, with hot and cold water laid on, and a sufficient supply of soap and clean towels shall be provided for all persons engaged in the manipulation of dry oxides of lead or in

# Notification of Suspected Lead Poisoning.

71. Where in any factory to which these regulations apply any person is absent from work for two days owing to suspected lead poisoning, the employer shall, within 24 hours after the expiration of the said two days, forward in writing to the Chief Inspector of Factories notification of the suspected lead poisoning and the name and address of the person concerned.

# Hygiene

72. (a) The dressing rooms, bath, lavatory, and sanitary conveniences shall be thoroughly cleaned daily.

(b) Before each meal, in addition to the regular meal times and before the end of the day's work, at least ten minutes for washing shall be allowed to each worker engaged in a lead process.

(c) No person shall smoke or chew tobacco while employed in a lead process.

(d) No person shall introduce into, or keep, or prepare, or partake of any food or drink in any room in which a lead process is carried on.

(e) No person leaving a workroom shall enter the luncheon-room or partake of food until he has taken off his overalls and placed them in the place provided for the purpose, nor until he has thoroughly washed face and hands in the bathroom or lavatory.

(f) No person shall without authority interfere with the means provided

for the removal of dust or fumes.

(g) Every person employed in a lead process shall make full and proper use of the appliances provided for any of the purposes of these Regulations.

73. If the occupier of a factory or any other person contravenes any of the provisions of the foregoing Regulations, numbered 35 to 72 inclusive, he shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON PUBLIC PARK, AND FOR THE PRESERVATION OF GOOD ORDER AND DECENCY THEREIN.

W HEREAS by Crown grant entered in the register-book, volume 2441, folio 488130, and issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington and their successors in respect of the land described therein and known as the Flemington and Kensington Public Park, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted (hereinafter called the Park) and the buildings for the time being thereon shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a Public Park and offices and conveniences connected therewith and for no other purposes whatsoever, under and in thereon shall be at all times maintained and used as and for a Public Park and offices and conveniences connected therewith, and for no other purposes whatsoever, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony (now State) of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Rules, Orders, Bylaws, and Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Borough of Flemington and Kensington. And whereas, pursuant to the powers conferred by Act 53 Victoria, No. 1055, the Governor in Council, by Order published in the Government Gazztte, on the twenty-fourth day of October, 1905, ordered, inter alia, that the municipal district of the said Borough of Flemington and Kensington be united to the City of Melbourne, and that the public reserves then vested in the said borough in conjunction with the Board of Land and Works or any other body as joint trustees should be vested in the Corporation of the City of Melbourne and such other body as joint trustees. 1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Park, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

- 2. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, foun-tains, fish, or any property in the Park, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the Park any hottles, fruit peel, paper, east-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.
- 3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the Park, or lie on the seats or grass therein. or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts, or other structures therein, or cut names, letters, or marks on such trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or other structures, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.
- 4. No person shall bring into the Park any aog, unless held by a chain or cord.
- $-5,\,N_0$  person, except workmen employed in the Park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.
- 6. No assembly for a fide, picnic, or concert, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or any meeting of a like character, shall take place in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Any person who attends and takes part in any such assembly or meeting shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation.
- 7. No person, unless authorized by the Trustees in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Pack any article, fruit. or merchandise.
- 8. No person shall bring or allow to remain in the Park any cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, fowls, or other animals, and any such found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 9. No person shall make, or cause to be made, any violent outery, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Park, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.
- 10. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Park, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.
- 11. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Trustees, carry, use, or discharge any firearms in the Park.
- 12. No person shall in any part of the Park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Trustees.
- 13. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within the Park.
- 14. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Park without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.
- 15. No person shall interfere with or remove any plants, flowers, seeds, or other property from the Park, or injure any property therein, and any person offending shall be liable to be removed from the Park.
