NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT BOATS WITH LONG LINES ON BOARD IN PORT PHILLIP BAY (INCLUDING CORIO AND HOBSON'S BAYS), ETC.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the thirteenth day of May, 1932, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of May, 1932, respecting prohibition of boats with long lines on board in Port Phillip Bay, &c., and prohibiting, in respect of the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays), or of any creek or river flowing into such bay, any person from doing any or all of the following things at any time throughout each year:—

Taking a boat with long lines on board or attached thereto on to the said waters; permitting a long line to remain on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing any boat with long lines on board to be upon the said waters; or allowing a long line to remain in or upon such waters or within one hundred yards thereof; provided that during the period from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive) the above provisions shall not apply to any person using long lines for taking ling only in the waters of Port Phillip Bay west of an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head, and the West Channel Pile Light, and thence south-westerly to Point Nepean, on condition that such lines are made and used in accordance with the following specifications:—

1. The lines shall consist of the material known as five-ply bagging or sewing twine; the hooks attached thereto shall not exceed size 3/0; and no bait other than raw beef shall be used.

2. The snoods on which the hooks are tied shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than 12 feet.

3. Not more than 800 hooks shall be used on a long line by any one person, but where two or more persons are employed in the one boat, they shall severally and together use not more than 1,600 hooks.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 43 of the *Medical Act 1928* the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make such Regulations as the Board thinks fit for or with respect to prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying Part II. of the said Act into effect: Now therefore the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulation relating to such elections, that is to say:—

Regulation.

1. Regulation 5 of the Regulations relating to elections made on the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, by the Dental Board of Victoria and to which the consent and approval of the Governor in Council was given on the second day of August, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, is hereby amended by inserting after the words "extraordinary vacancy" (where last occurring) the words "and the person so elected shall hold office for the unexpired term of office of the person whose vacancy he has been elected to fill and no longer."

This Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria held on the fifteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934.

THE Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of One shilling in the pound on the municipal valuation of lands and tenements within the Bairnsdale Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST (URBAN DISTRICT).

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934.

THE Ballan Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Ballan Urban District:—

On such lands and tenements—a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Forty-five pounds, One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Forty-five pounds but not exceeding Seventy pounds, and Fivepence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Seventy pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than One pound ten shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1934, and shall be payable in two instalments, the first instalment due and payable on the 1st day of April, and the second instalment on the 1st day of October, 1934, at the office of the said Trust.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1934, No. 37.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure on lands and tenements within the Charlton Urban District:—

On such lands and tenements a rate of Two shillings and sevenpence in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Six hundred and forty pounds; where the annual municipal valuation exceeds Six hundred and forty pounds the sum of Eighty pounds shall be paid.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Two pounds, and in respect of any lands on which there is no building less than Eight shillings.

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

FURTHER AMENDMENT OF PLUMBING AND GASFITTING REGULATIONS (No. 3).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of December, 1933.

IN pursuance of the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 4 of the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 25th day of December, 1933.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

"4. The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the 25th day of December, 1933, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of 6 years:—

1st year—at the rate of 12s. 9d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 17s. 11d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 23s. 7d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 32s. 1d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 42s. 6d. per week.
6th year—at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of 5 years:—

1st year—at the rate of 17s. 11d. per week.
2nd year—at the rate of 23s. 7d. per week.
3rd year—at the rate of 32s. 1d. per week.
4th year—at the rate of 42s. 6d. per week.
5th year—at the rate of 58s. 6d. per week."

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

56. (a) A member of the Force, unless with the approval of the Governor in Council first obtained, shall not accept either for himself or on behalf of any other person any reward offered to him by reason of his holding an appointment in such Force, or for any service rendered in his capacity as such.

A member of the Force shall not participate in the distribution of any such reward made to any other member of the Force the payment of which has not been approved by the Governor in Council.

A member of the Force found guilty of a breach of this clause shall be dismissed therefrom.

For the purposes of this clause "reward" includes any donation, subscription, gift, or payment of any kind other than as provided by the Police Regulations, and whether it be payment for services rendered by a member of the Force or any other person or for any other purpose whatsoever.

(b) An association of members of the Force, unless with the approval of the Governor in Council first obtained, shall not accept any donation, subscription, or reward by reason of its members holding appointments in such Force or of any service rendered by members of the Force.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC BATHS IN THE PARISH OF MIRBOO, TOWNSHIP OF MIRBOO NORTH.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved for Public Baths in the Parish of Mirboo, Township of Mirboo North, in lieu of the Regulations made on 13th November, 1908:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The bath shall be open to the public at such times as may be fixed by the Committee of Management from time to time.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and any person so offending, and failing to forthwith leave the Reserve or bath when requested to do so by any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or officer or servant of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the Reserve.

5. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for the admission to the Reserve and use of the bath shall be as follows:—

(a) For admission of every person to the Reserve and use of the bath (except on occasions on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein), such annual fee as the Committee of Management shall determine not exceeding Ten shillings.

(b) For admission of every adult person to the Reserve and use of the bath on occasions (not exceeding ten (10) in any one year) on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein, such sum as the Committee of Management shall determine not exceeding Two shillings.

(c) For admission of every person to the Reserve and use of the bath on any occasion (except those on which fêtes, sports, carnivals, matches, or displays are held therein), such sum as the Committee of Management shall determine not exceeding Sixpence.

6. No person shall remain in the Reserve or the bath who has not paid the charge for admission and/or use of bath as prescribed by these Regulations, and any person who, not having paid the said charge and having been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or officer or servant of the said Committee, or requested by any of such persons to leave the Reserve or bath, fails to forthwith do so, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall erect any building in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

The Bath.

10. Every person using the bath shall be clad in a suitable costume.

11. No person while using the bath shall use any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water may be rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

12. No person coming direct from any dirty work shall enter the swimming bath before washing himself.

13. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the swimming bath.

14. No person shall use any obscene or profane language or actions within the precincts of the swimming bath or the immediate vicinity thereof.

15. No person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter the swimming bath.

16. Children shall not be permitted to enter the swimming bath except under adequate supervision.

17. The swimming bath may be set apart at stated hours for the use of males, females, or children, respectively. Mixed bathing may be permitted on such days and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may at any time determine.

18. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC HALL AND PUBLIC RECREATION AT POMONAL.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 17th January, 1933, as a site for Public Hall and Public Recreation in the Parish of Jallukar, at Pomonal.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket and football matches, fêtes, sports, entertainments, dances, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person found infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, entertainments, dances, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

By-Law No. 23.

A By-law of the City of Chelsea made under section One hundred and ninety-seven of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered twenty-three, for the adoption of the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Chelsea do hereby, by virtue of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, make the following by-law and order:—

1. The whole of the provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* (which said provisions may be summarized as follows):—

Part 1.—Streets and Footways.

- (1) Porticoes, Projections, &c.—Clauses 1 to 7 both inclusive.
- (2) Naming Streets and Numbering Houses.—Clauses 8 to 11 both inclusive.
- (3) Spouts and Drains from Houses, &c.—Clauses 12 to 14 both inclusive.
- (4) Crossings over Footways and Channels.—Clauses 15 to 26 both inclusive.
- (5) Deposit or Discharge of Liquid, Rubbish, &c., on Streets, &c.—Clauses 27 and 28.
- (6) Depositing Building Materials, Excavations, &c.—Clauses 29 to 37 both inclusive.
- (7) Lighting, &c., of Obstructions generally.—Clauses 38 and 39.
- (8) Houses, &c., Encroaching on Street, &c.—Clause 40.
- (9) Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.—Clauses 41 to 45 both inclusive.
- (10) Undermining Streets.—Clause 46.
- (11) Miscellaneous.—Clauses 47 to 49 inclusive.

BY-LAW No. 18, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE HEALTH ACT 1928.

A By-law for securing the cleanliness and general sanitary conditions of Camps and Camping Sites within the Shire of Otway.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928*, and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Otway do hereby order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be read and taken in conjunction with the "Camping Regulations 1927" of the Department of Public Health.

2. Every camp shall be provided with closet accommodation at the ratio of one closet for every eight persons.

3. Each closet shall consist of a fly-proof receptacle for a suitable pan, except as in next clause provided.

4. Where a camp is situated outside a pan service area a properly constructed trench may be substituted for a pan. Such trench shall not be more than three feet long nor more than one foot wide.

5. All closets must have overhead protection from the weather, and shall also have a suitable screen erected to provide for privacy and decency.

6. Provided that land within a township or in the vicinity thereof is used as a camping site the owner or trustees of such land shall erect thereon sufficient closets built according to the General Sanitary Regulations 1931. And if such site is within an area, in which a pan service is provided, it shall be the duty of the owner or trustees to arrange with the sanitary contractor to provide the necessary service, and to pay the necessary fees for such service.

7. All refuse and garbage produced at a camp or camp site shall if such site is within an area provided with a house refuse service, be temporarily stored in covered receptacles, and arrangements made with the refuse contractor for its removal. If the camp site is not within such service area the refuse must be buried or burnt daily.

8. Upon the termination of any camp, the occupier or owner of the site shall cover all nightsoil and refuse trenches with at least nine inches of clean earth.

9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Otway.
