DECLARATION OF THE MURRAY VALLEY HIGHWAY.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the twenty-third day of January One thousand nine hundred and thirty-three the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a State highway and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a State highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a State highway: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board a State highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for Declaration of a State Highway under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highway within the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule hereunder written is of sufficient importance to be a State highway acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such Highway to be a State highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

DECLARATION OF THE NEW CALDER HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.

Unemployment Relief (Administration) Act 1932.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of February, 1933.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Unemployment Relief (Administration) Act 1932*, and the Acts Interpretation Act, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby rescind the Regulations made under the provisions of the Income Tax Acts and the Unemployment Relief Acts on the 11th day of July and the 2nd day of August, 1932, respectively, and do hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

The aforesaid rescission shall not effect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under the said rescinded Regulations. Saving.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Unemployment Regulations 1933." Citation.

2. Unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the *Unemployment Relief (Administration) Act 1932*. Interpretation.

"Identification Card" means a card in the form set out in Schedule II. hereto duly completed by the Registrar, and signed by the person to whom issued, and "Current Identification Card" means a card as aforesaid bearing a date not more than one month old. Schedule II.

"Committee" means the Public Assistance Committee appointed for any Municipal district pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Act.

"Local Labour Bureau" means the Labour Bureau situate nearest to the residence of any person applying for sustenance.

"Minister" means the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Act.

"Traveller" means a person qualified under the Act and these Regulations to receive sustenance bona fide proceeding to or seeking employment in a place situate elsewhere than in the district wherein such person is registered or entitled to be registered as being so qualified.

"Traveller's Identification Card" means the card in the form set out in Schedule III. hereto issued to a traveller by any Committee. Schedule III.

"Registration Card" means the card issued by any local Labour Bureau to persons seeking employment, and "Current Registration Card" means such a card bearing a date not more than one month old.

"Rationed employment" means a system of employment whereby an employee is required periodically to take time off from his employment without pay.

"Registrar" means the Officer appointed under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 14 of the Act to be the Registrar of Public Assistance in any Municipal district.

"Secretary" means the person appointed to act as Secretary of the Public Assistance Committee appointed for any Municipal district.

The provisions of the Acts Interpretation Acts shall apply to these Regulations. Acts Interpretation Acts to apply.

Where in these Regulations any reference is made to or any power or duty is conferred or imposed upon the Registrar, then if no Registrar has been appointed for a Municipal district such expression shall mean and such power or duty may be exercised or performed by the Secretary of the Committee for that district. References to Registrar and Secretary.

COMMITTEES.

3. Every Committee shall consist of not less than six persons, unless special permission for a lesser number has been granted by the Minister. Constitution of Committee.

APPLICATIONS FOR SUSTENANCE.

Applications
for sustenance.

4. Any person who is unemployed and who has been a bona fide resident in Victoria for a period of three months prior to the date of his application for sustenance, may, provided he is at the time registered at the Labour Bureau nearest to his place of residence as being able and willing to take employment, is in possession of a current registration card, and is otherwise qualified as provided by the Act and these Regulations, apply in writing in the form set out in Schedule I. hereto to the Registrar for Sustenance.

5. The Registrar may at any time and from time to time require any person in receipt of sustenance to complete a form of application in addition to any such form which may have previously been submitted. The sustenance allowance of any person failing to comply with any such request may be forthwith cancelled or suspended by the Committee.

6. Where any person is the head of a family, the members of which reside with him, any application for sustenance for himself and any such members shall be made by him only on his and their behalf.

Pensioners not
eligible for
sustenance.

7. No person who is in receipt of an old-age or invalid pension payable under the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia shall be eligible to make application for or be granted sustenance as the head of a family living together or as a member of such family. In such cases any other member of the family eligible under these Regulations may make the application on behalf of himself and the other members thereof, in which case the amount of the said pension shall be included in the total income of the family.

STATEMENT OF INCOME.

Schedule IV.

8. The Registrar may at any time and from time to time require any person in receipt of sustenance to furnish to him forthwith a statement in the form set out in Schedule IV. hereto of the amount of income received by such person.

Granting of
applications.

9. The Committee on receipt of applications for sustenance shall consider the same, and if satisfied that the provisions of the Act and these Regulations have been complied with, may grant to the applicant sustenance as hereinafter prescribed.

IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

Identification

10. Every applicant whose application for sustenance has been approved shall receive from the Committee an identification card, which shall be duly completed in all respects before issue.

How kept
current.

11. Such identification card shall be kept current by being produced to the Registrar for perusal and stamping on Thursday only of any week as requested by the Committee between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and noon at least once in every month, or as otherwise required by such Committee.

TRANSFERS TO OTHER DISTRICTS.

Transfers from
one district to
another.

12. Any person in possession of a current identification card desiring to transfer from one municipal district to another such district may apply to the Registrar, who, upon proof that such application is made bona fide, shall issue to such person a transfer in the form set out in Schedule V. hereto.

13. Upon the issue of any such transfer the Registrar shall immediately take all necessary steps to ensure that sustenance orders are no longer issued from the sustenance depot in his district.

14. On presentation by any person to him of a transfer as aforesaid the Registrar to whom the same is directed shall satisfy himself as to—

- (i) the identity of such person with the person named therein, and
- (ii) as to the right of such person to receive sustenance, and shall thereupon authorize the issue to him of sustenance orders in accordance with these Regulations.

LIMITATIONS ON GRANTING OF SUSTENANCE.

15. No application for sustenance shall be granted by any committee—

- (a) when made by or on behalf of or in respect of any child or children for whom assistance is being received from the Children's Welfare Department; or
- (b) when made by or on behalf of—
 - (i) any person in employment or rationed employment unless special permission has been granted by the Minister; or
 - (ii) any person engaged in business, whether primary or secondary, wholly or partly on his own account; or

- (c) when made by or on behalf of any person referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), or (c) of section 7 or sub-section (4) of section 8 of the Act; or Unemployed through own fault.
- (d) unless the person by whom or on whose behalf the same is made is in distress due to unemployment caused otherwise than by reason of the matters referred to in the said sub-sections; or Must be bona fide unemployed.
- (e) notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, when made by or on behalf of any person who has been employed other than on Unemployment Relief Work, and whose average weekly earnings during the period which he was so employed were equal to or in excess of the total weekly basic wage paid to unskilled labourers until after the expiration of a period equal to one week for every month employed; or Postponement of grant in certain cases.
- (f) in any other case until after the expiration of a period of two weeks from the day of the date upon which such application was made.

Provided that where any Committee is satisfied that the postponement as heretofore provided of the granting of any application would cause undue hardship on the applicant and the persons upon whose behalf the application is made, such application may be granted at such earlier time as the Committee deems fit. No postponement where hardship caused thereby.

Provided further that where any child or children as referred to in paragraph (a) hereof forms or form part of a family living together in respect of which family an application for sustenance is made, particulars regarding such child or children and the amount being received from the said Department in respect thereof shall be shown in the application. Statement of income regarding wards of State.

PERMISSIBLE INCOME OF APPLICANTS AND VALUE OF SUSTENANCE RECEIVABLE.

16. Applications for sustenance shall not be granted by any Committee where the income including any pension, allowance, bonus, commission, or other benefit of the applicant and of all the members of his family residing with him exceeds the amounts shown opposite the appropriate family unit in Column I. of the table appearing in the next succeeding Regulation. Limitation on amount of family income.

17. Applicants for sustenance as heads of families whose applications have been granted may receive in the manner hereinafter provided sustenance equal in amount to the appropriate sum appearing in Column II. of the following table, but so that the total amount of the income received by a family living together (hereinafter referred to as a "family unit") and the value of the sustenance granted shall in no case exceed the sum of Two pounds seventeen shillings in any one week. "Income" includes the full amount of money earned by the applicant and all members of the family residing with him (including any pension, allowance, bonus, commission, or other benefit and money received from all sources except from charitable organizations or societies). What is included in "Income."

For the purpose of these Regulations "Income" shall be deemed to include any board and lodging and maintenance or any of them received by any applicant, the value whereof for the purpose of assessing the said income shall be calculated at the actual cost or estimated value thereof to the donor but not exceeding in any case the sum of 12s. 6d. per week for each person.

18. Where any person not being a member of a family unit is, for a consideration, lodging and boarding with, or being maintained by a family in respect of which sustenance is receivable or being received, one-third only of the amount paid to such family by or on behalf of such person shall be included as income in any statement of income made and lodged under these Regulations. Boarders.

EMERGENCY CARDS.

Emergency
cards may be
issued.
Schedule VI.

19. Where the head of a family receiving sustenance on behalf of his family becomes a traveller he may make application on the form set out in Schedule VI. hereto to the Committee that another member of his family be granted sustenance on behalf of the remaining members of the family for a period not exceeding four weeks.

Renewal
thereof.

20. If the head of the family has not returned to his home before the end of four weeks he shall make further application to the Committee for the continuance of the issue of sustenance to such other member of his family, and must forward with such application a statement of income on the prescribed form covering the said period of four weeks.

Suspension of
sustenance
orders.

21. Where such statement of income is not submitted the issue of sustenance orders in respect of the said family shall be forthwith suspended and shall not be continued until the Registrar is satisfied that the same may otherwise be properly issued.

SUSTENANCE TO TRAVELLERS.

Certificate to
be obtained.

22. Any Committee, on the application of any person in receipt of or entitled to receive sustenance under the provisions of the Act and these Regulations and upon being satisfied that all the requirements of such provisions have been complied with and that such person is not merely an itinerant travelling continuously within any circumscribed area but intends proceeding to or seeking employment in a place situate elsewhere than in the district for which such Committee was appointed, not being a place within the metropolis, may issue to such a person a certificate that he is a traveller within the meaning of these regulations.

Identification
card to be
surrendered.

23. A certificate, as per Regulation 22, shall be issued only upon the surrender for cancellation of the identification card (if any) previously issued to such person.

Issue of
travellers'
identification
cards.

24. Upon presentation of such certificate the Registrar of any Committee in any of the districts set out in Regulation 26 may, on Thursday of any week, between the hours of Four and Five o'clock in the afternoon, issue such person with a traveller's identification card, which shall be duly completed in all respects before issue.

Counterpart to
be forwarded.

25. The counterpart of the said traveller's identification card shall forthwith, after the issue of the traveller's part, be forwarded to the Officer-in-Charge of Sustenance, Sustenance Branch, Geological Museum, Gisborne-street, Melbourne; and when a new traveller's identification card is issued as hereafter provided to replace one that is alleged to have been lost, such counterpart shall indicate that fact upon its face before being so forwarded.

Value of

26. Travellers entitled to sustenance as such shall receive sustenance orders as hereinbefore provided not exceeding in value the sum of 5s. 9d. in any week, but only in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations relating thereto and at the following depots:—

27. Such orders shall be issued at the depots aforesaid, on Thursdays only, between the hours of Four o'clock and Five o'clock in the afternoon, but not otherwise, and no traveller shall receive such orders at the same depot more than once in any period of four weeks.

Marking cards.

28. Before handing to a traveller any sustenance order the Registrar to whom application for sustenance has been made shall record on the back of the traveller's identification card the particulars thereon referred to.

Renewal of
travellers'
identification
cards.

29. Any traveller may upon the expiry of his identification card apply to the committee of the district in which he is registered as qualified to receive sustenance or of any of the districts in which the aforesaid depots are situate for the renewal of such identification card.

Expired cards.

30. Upon the renewal of any traveller's identification card the expired card shall be retained by the Registrar and forwarded to the Officer-in-Charge of the Sustenance Branch, Melbourne, once at least in every week, together with a return showing the number of the card issued in lieu thereof.

31. Any Committee may on the application of any person who has lost his traveller's identification card, if satisfied that such person is in fact a traveller, and that such card is no longer in his possession or control, or in that of any other person with his knowledge and on his behalf, subject to the Act and these Regulations, issue a new identification card in lieu thereof.

Lost travellers' identification cards.

32. Immediately upon the issue of a new identification card, the Registrar of the Committee which authorizes such issue shall notify the Officer-in-Charge of the Sustenance Branch, Melbourne, who shall thereupon cause the number of the lost identification card to be circulated to all sustenance depots.

Notification to be sent when new card issued.

33. At least once in each week the Registrar shall forward to the Officer-in-Charge of the Sustenance Branch, Melbourne, a return showing the identification card numbers of travellers to whom sustenance orders as aforesaid has been issued.

Return of sustenance orders issued to travellers.

34. The provisions of these Regulations relating to demands to work in return for sustenance shall, with such modifications as may be necessary, apply to travellers.

Demands on travellers for work for sustenance.

KEEPERS OF LODGING OR BOARDING HOUSES OR ESTABLISHMENTS.

35. The proprietor or manager of any house or establishment in which any person by whom sustenance is receivable under the Act and these Regulations is lodged, boarded, or maintained for any consideration, and who is willing to accept in return (in whole or in part) for the provision of such lodging, board, or maintenance, the sustenance receivable by such persons, may make application to the Minister, in the form set out in Schedule VII. hereto, and that such house or establishment be approved as an "approved establishment."

Application for approval of "approved establishments".

Schedule VII.

36. The Minister may upon being satisfied that the information contained in any such application is correct, and that the house or establishment is a fit and proper place for the lodging, boarding, or maintenance of persons entitled to sustenance under the Act and these Regulations, signify his approval thereof in the form set out in Schedule VIII. hereto.

Approval of "approved establishments".

Schedule VIII.

37. Such approval shall operate only so long as the person named therein as the proprietor or manager continues in that position and may be revoked by the Minister for any breach by such person of the provisions of the Act and these Regulations, or for any other reason which, in his opinion, is sufficient.

Operation of approval.

38. Any person by whom sustenance is receivable as aforesaid who is lodged, boarded, or maintained by the proprietor or manager of an "approved establishment" may authorize such proprietor or manager to receive the said sustenance on his behalf by handing to the Registrar and the said proprietor or manager an authority under his hand, in the form set out in Schedule IX. hereto.

Authority to receive sustenance may be given.

Schedule IX.

39. The Registrar shall, upon the presentation to him of the approval of an "approved establishment" and an authority granted under the last preceding regulation, and upon being satisfied that the same have been duly completed and issued, and are otherwise correct, authorize the proprietor or manager of such establishment, in the form set out in Schedule X. hereto, to obtain the sustenance referred to in such authority.

Boardinghouse keepers, &c., may receive sustenance.

Schedule X.

40. The proprietor or manager of an "approved establishment" shall upon any person, on whose behalf and by whose authority he is receiving the sustenance to which such person is entitled, leaving such establishment, forthwith notify the Registrar to that effect, and shall thereupon cease to receive the said sustenance. The Registrar upon receipt of such notification shall immediately cause a record thereof to be made and ensure that sustenance is no longer issued to such proprietor or manager in respect of such person.

Information to be given when persons leave "approved establishments".

41. The proprietor or manager of an "approved establishment" shall, at least once in every two weeks, submit in writing under his hand to the Registrar a return showing the names of the persons on whose behalf he is receiving sustenance, together with the identification numbers appearing on the identification cards of such persons, and shall also certify that such persons were boarded, lodged, or maintained during the period covered by the said return.

Return of persons to be furnished.

SUSTENANCE ORDERS.

42. Sustenance shall not, except in cases where the Minister expressly otherwise provides or where work is performed in return for sustenance, be payable to successful applicants, or to any duly authorized person on their behalf, in cash, but shall be given in the form of orders upon the

Sustenance—how collected.

classes of tradesmen or shopkeepers supplying the kinds of goods herein after mentioned; the choice of such goods shall be made by the applicant or the person duly authorized by him at or before the time of the issue of the orders referred to.

43. Such orders for sustenance shall not (except where the Committee otherwise decides) be handed to applicants whose applications have been granted or to any persons duly authorized on their behalf, but shall be issued only to tradesmen or shopkeepers who have agreed in writing with the Committee to abide by the conditions governing the fulfilment of such orders, and to charge not more than the prices for goods respectively prescribed and fixed by the Minister.

44. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 42 persons entitled to receive sustenance may intimate to the Committee the particular tradesmen or shopkeepers to whom they desire their sustenance orders to be issued.

45. Identification cards and Travellers' Identification cards issued as aforesaid shall be produced to tradesmen or shopkeepers at the time of collection of the goods referred to in the sustenance orders and at any time on request by the Registrar for the purpose of renewal or otherwise.

CLASSES, ETC., OF GOODS RECEIVABLE.

46. Sustenance orders shall be negotiable only with tradesmen and shopkeepers as aforesaid, and only in respect of the supply of the following goods and such other goods as may from time to time be prescribed:—

MODE OF SUPPLY OF GOODS.

47. Tradesmen and shopkeepers to whom sustenance orders have been issued shall supply the goods thereby authorized to be supplied only to the person in respect of whom such orders are issued upon his presenting to such tradesmen and shopkeepers a current identification card.

48. Provided that the proprietor or manager of an "approved establishment" within the meaning of these Regulations who is authorized to receive sustenance in the form of goods on behalf of any person whose application has been granted may obtain the same from any such tradesmen or shopkeepers on presenting to them the authority referred to in Regulation 38.

49. The tradesman or shopkeeper to whom application is made for the supply of goods in compliance with an order shall cause the applicant to sign a receipt therefor and shall compare such signature with that on the identification card or other authority presented to him. No goods shall be handed to any person applying therefor unless such tradesmen or shopkeepers are satisfied from such comparison that the applicant is identical with the person described on the said card or authority.

50. In the event of any dissimilarity between such signatures the tradesman or shopkeeper shall require the applicant to furnish further proof through the Registrar that the applicant for such goods is identical with the person in respect of whom the sustenance order or authority presented was issued.

51. A tradesman or shopkeeper shall not—

- supply cash in respect of any order issued to him in pursuance of these Regulations or in respect of any part thereof;
- supply goods in anticipation of the issue to him of any sustenance order;
- in any one week supply goods in excess of the value shown in the sustenance order;

- (d) supply goods of kinds other than those herein referred to;
- (e) charge for goods supplied prices in excess of those fixed by the Minister and agreed to as aforesaid;
- (f) require or permit an applicant to sign dockets in blank or in advance of the actual supply of the goods required by such applicant.

Any tradesman or shopkeeper committing a breach of this regulation shall, in addition to any other penalty to which he may become liable, be disqualified from receiving further sustenance orders issued in accordance with these Regulations. Penalty.

PAYMENT TO SUPPLIERS OF GOODS.

52. Every tradesman and shopkeeper shall from time to time submit to the Registrar their accounts for goods supplied in obedience to sustenance orders. Such accounts shall be submitted upon official "L.2A—Contingencies" forms and supported by delivery dockets signed by the recipients of the goods therein enumerated, indicating the details of such goods and the prices charged therefor. Payment for goods on sustenance orders.

53. The Registrar shall check or cause to be checked all such accounts as are received by him, and if correct shall certify to that effect and forward the same together with all supporting dockets to the Secretary of the State Treasury, Melbourne, who shall cause cheques for the amount of the said claims to be sent direct to the claimants. Passing claims for payment.

DISQUALIFICATION OF SUPPLIERS OF GOODS.

54. Any Committee upon being satisfied that any tradesman or shopkeeper is not complying with the provisions of these Regulations may, in addition to any other proceedings which it may seem fit to take, cancel any unsatisfied sustenance orders issued to any such tradesman or shopkeeper. Disqualification of tradesmen, &c.

RECOUPMENT OF UNEMPLOYMENT RELIEF FUND.

55. The relatives of any person receiving sustenance may upon receipt of a notice in the form set out in Schedule XI. hereto make a proposal voluntarily to recoup or to contribute towards recouping the Unemployment Relief Fund the amount of the cost of the sustenance of such person by signing an undertaking in the form set out in Schedule XI. hereto. Notice to relatives. Schedule XI. Voluntary undertaking.

56. If within the time limited by such notice no such proposal is made by any such relative he shall, in order that his means and ability to contribute as aforesaid may be ascertained, furnish to the Committee information in response to the questions appearing on the back of such notice and shall subscribe to the declaration at the foot thereof. Declaration to be made.

57. Any person who voluntarily undertakes to make any contribution as aforesaid shall pay the amounts mentioned in such undertaking to the Registrar. Payment of contributions.

58. The Registrar shall issue an official receipt for any amounts so received and account for such moneys to the Treasurer of Victoria in accordance with the law for the time being in force relating to the receipt of public moneys. Receipts to be issued. Moneys to be accounted for.

PERFORMANCE OF WORK IN RETURN FOR SUSTENANCE.

59. Before any demand to perform work in return for sustenance is made upon any person in pursuance of the Act, the Council of any Municipality shall obtain from the Registrar a complete list of the names of all persons who are in receipt of sustenance, showing the amount of sustenance received by them each week, and from such list shall choose the persons upon whom such demand is to be made. List of persons receiving sustenance to be obtained.

60. Reimbursement of the amount of wages paid to any persons for work performed in response to any such demand shall be made by the State Treasury only on receipt of completed and acquitted wages sheets in the form set out in Schedule XII. hereto. Payment of wages. Schedule XII.

61. Except with the express consent, in writing, of the Minister no person shall perform work in any one week, as aforesaid, the value of which amounts to more than the value of the sustenance to which he is entitled for the ensuing two weeks. Work in anticipation of sustenance.

62. No demand under the Act to perform work in return for any sustenance received shall be made— Demand for work in return for sustenance.

- (a) upon any person who is also in receipt from the Crown, or any Department thereof, of a grant of money to enable him to engage in prospecting or mining; or
- (b) upon any person who is in receipt only of such sustenance provided that the Committee is satisfied that he is legitimately engaged in prospecting and mining, and that in its

opinion it would be disadvantageous for him to discontinue in that occupation, or that the local Mining Inspector or officer of Geological Survey certifies that he is so engaged and recommends that he be exempted from being subjected to any such demands.

STATISTICAL RECORDS AND RETURNS.

- Index of unemployed.** 63. Each Committee shall keep an index of all persons receiving sustenance in its district.
- Statistical returns.** 64. At the end of the months of March, June, September, and December in each year, every Committee shall furnish to the Minister a return in the form set out in Schedule XIII. hereto, containing the particulars thereby required of all persons appearing on the said index who, for the preceding quarter or any part thereof, received sustenance.
- Schedule XIII.** 65. In addition to the said return, Committees in the metropolitan area shall forward to the Officer-in-Charge of the Sustenance Branch, Melbourne, particulars in regard to all new applicants for sustenance immediately their applications are granted.
- Particulars of new applicants also to be forwarded.** 66. The Registrar shall forward to the Officer-in-Charge, Sustenance Branch, Melbourne, once in each week a return showing the number of persons receiving sustenance and the total amount of expenditure in respect of the preceding week.
- Weekly returns by registrars.**

COLLECTIONS FOR UNEMPLOYMENT.

- Form of licences. Schedule XIV.** 67. The licences referred to in Part II. of the Act shall be in the form or to the effect of the forms set out in Schedule XIV. hereto.
- Successful appeals.** 68. Where the Minister upon appeal by any aggrieved applicant grants any application for a licence, the Charities Board of Victoria or the Council of the Municipality concerned shall thereupon issue a licence as aforesaid to such applicant.
- Display of licence.** 69. Any licence issued to a society or association shall be conspicuously displayed at the administrative office of such society or association and shall be returned to the said Board or the Council of the Municipality concerned forthwith on the expiration thereof, or on receipt of a demand in writing to that effect.
- Licences to be produced.** 70. Any licence issued to a person not being a member of the committee or other governing body of a society or association which is the holder of a licence shall—
- (a) on demand by any person from whom a collection is sought be presented for his inspection;
 - (b) on the expiration thereof or on demand in writing of the Council of the Municipality concerned or the Secretary to the said Board (as the case may be) be returned to the said Council or Board.
- Production of authorities issued by licensee.** 71. Any written authority issued by a person or a society or association which is the holder of a licence shall—
- (a) on demand by any person from whom a collection is sought be presented for his inspection;
 - (b) on the expiration thereof or on demand in writing (as the case may be) be returned to such person or to such society or association.
- Penalty.** 72. Any society, association, or person infringing or omitting to comply with the requirements of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each breach of such Regulations.

PENALTIES.

- Suspension of sustenance.** 73. The sustenance allowance of any person who fails to comply with any request of any Committee or Registrar for the production of any card or for the supply of any information required by or under the Act or these Regulations may be cancelled or suspended by any Committee.
- Penalty for supplying false information.** 74. Any person being the member of a family in respect of which or any part thereof any application for sustenance is made who wilfully supplies to the person making such application any false information for inclusion therein or for the purpose of the same being furnished in response to any inquiry made by or on behalf of any Committee or the Minister shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty-five pounds.
- General penalty.** 75. Any person who fails or neglects to do anything required to be done, or who does anything which is forbidden to be done by or under these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Minister of the Crown administering the Unemployment Relief Acts, shall give the necessary directions accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF BORHONEYGHURK AT MT. DORAN.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th September, 1932, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Borhoneyghurk at Mt. Doran:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

1A. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No club or organization shall conduct any entertainment in or on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only subject to such conditions and to the payment of such fees as such Committee may decide.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sunday.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
