STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

ORDER OF 19TH DECEMBER, 1932, RELATING TO CERTAIN MATTERS ARISING OUT OF AWARD NO. 2.

In the matter of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932*, and in the matter of a reference by the Powlett River Branch of the AUSTRALASIAN COAL AND SHALE EMPLOYEES FEDERATION for interpretation of certain matters arising out of Award No. 2 of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal.

THIS reference having come on for hearing before the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, and the said Tribunal having heard the representations made on behalf of the parties concerned, it is ordered that the matters referred to be and the same are hereby interpreted as follows:—

AWARD NO. 2.

Clauses 2, 3, and 5.—

The day shift rate for employees who come under the provisions of clause 3 is ascertained by adding the sum of 1s. 6d., referred to in clause 3, to the rate prescribed in clause 2. The rate under clause 2 is ascertained by adding the margin specified in clause 2 to 11s. 6d., or 12s. 6d., as the case may be.

For afternoon and night shift work, the rate is ascertained by adding 7½ per cent. to the total rate ascertained as aforesaid.

STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.
AWARD No. 3 OF 22ND DECEMBER, 1932, RELATING TO
RATES OF PAY.

(To take effect as from the 12th January, 1933.)

THE State Coal Mine Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder dated 19th July, 1932, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. Adult male employees comprised in Part 2 of the Schedule to the Act hereinafter enumerated, working on a basis of twelve shifts a fortnight, shall be paid a basic wage of 11s. 6d. per day, and 12s. 6d. per day if working on a basis of less than twelve shifts a fortnight, and in addition the margins prescribed hereunder.

2. Where any such adult employee (excluding sub-station attendant) works underground on any day or part of a day, the sum of 1s. 6d. shall be added to the rate hereinbefore prescribed for such employee.

3. The rates for apprentices shall be those specified hereunder.

4. Existing practices relating to matters within the powers of the Tribunal shall continue until further Award.

5. This Award shall not apply to any worker engaged at the Montague Coal Depot.

MARIBYRNONG RIVER.

HENLEY ON THE MARIBYRNONG.

NOTICE TO BOATMEN AND OTHERS.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 4th February, 1933, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

Boat races must not be obstructed nor public safety or order endangered.

Every motor boat must have a supply of dry sand and carry a bucket for fire-extinguishing purposes, and no inflammable oil or spirit shall be exposed.

All non-competing boats shall be kept off the course during the racing programme, and the direction of the officers in charge of the course must be strictly attended to.

Passengers on any boat overcrowded or incompetently managed may be ordered to disembark, and no boat deemed by the River Officer, or his deputy, to be too large, or deemed to be offensive, dangerous, unsuitable, or unsightly, shall remain on the river along the course or adjacent waters.

No fireworks or firearms are to be discharged from any boats, unless permission of the River Officer or his deputy has been given for so doing.

After sunset, motor boats shall have a red light exhibited, and shall go slow.

Motor boats shall not tow any boat.

After sunset, rowing boats shall have a white light exhibited.

All boats must give way to racing boats going upstream to the start of the course.

FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1928 (No. 3677).

RECISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Municipal District of the Borough of Portland, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the sixth day of January, 1915, directing that all shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Municipal District of the Borough of Portland shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-Holiday, and fixing the closing-hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

REVOCATION OF A REGULATION APPOINTING A DAY AS AN ANNUAL HOLIDAY FOR IRONMONGERS' SHOPS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the Chief Inspector of Factories and Shops as signed by a majority of the employers and a majority of the employees to be effected, doth hereby revoke the Regulation made on the sixth day of February, 1929, appointing the second Monday in March in each year, in the Metropolitan District, as defined under the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), as an annual holiday for persons employed in the business carried on in ironmongers' shops, and directing that all shops in which that business is carried on in the said Metropolitan District shall be closed for the whole of that day in each year.

ALTERATION OF THE NETTING BOUNDARY AT THE MOUTH OF THE MITCHELL RIVER.

PROCLAMATION
