Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 10 (FISH AND POULTRY).

Note.—This Determination on the 23rd May, 1933, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), and the Order in Council made thereunder, and such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board which since the 24th April, 1933, has had power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons wheresoever employed in the business of—

(a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game;
(b) preparing fish for sale uncooked or for canning, drying, or smoking;
(c) selling by wholesale or retail (except for consumption on the premises) poultry, game, fish, or oysters;
(d) marketing (in fish and poultry markets) poultry, game, or fish "—

has made the following Determination, namely :-

(1) That on the 23rd May, 1933, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(2) (a) Persons Employed in connexion with the Preparation of Rabbits for the Wholesale or Export Trade.

- (d) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), and Christmas Day; and time and a half for all work done on Australia Day (26th January), Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Boxing Day, and Fishmongers' Picnic Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (c) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and
- (f) MEAL HOUR.—A period of one hour shall be allowed for breakfast between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., and also a period of one hour for dinner between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 1.30 p.m.

(g) HOT WATER TO BE PROVIDED .- The employer shall (where facilities are available) supply hot water for the making of tea.

(c) Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday; and time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Fishmonger's Pionic Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(Note.—Section 223 of the Factories and Shop: Act provides that:—Every fish or poultry shop in the Metropolitan District shall be closed on the last Monday in February in each year; and every employee working in or in connexion with such shop shall be entitled to and given a holiday on such day.)

(d) Casual Labour.—Casual employees (i.e., persons employed during any week for not more than 24 hours) shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.
