MARINERS and others are hereby notified that on or about the 7th of August, 1934, the deeper water route, 26½ feet, recently marked by unlighted buoys that were removed on the 16th April last, will now be redefined by the addition of three light buoys, and the remooring of the three existing light buoys on to the route.

The particulars of the demarcation from Point Richards to Hopetoun Channel in successive order will thenceforth be as follows:—

Point Richards Light Buoy—No. 1 (B).

Position.—This buoy will be moved true north 4,000 feet to a position in 28 feet water, 351.9 deg., 9,600 feet from the white beacon or Trig. Station at Point Richards. The buoy will be known as No. 1 (B) in addition to its present name, and will mark the eastern end of the channel on south or port side.

No. 5 Black Can Buoy (Unlighted).

Fairway Light Buoy No. 9 (B).

Character.—A flashing green light every four seconds, thus:—

Structure.—A red spherical light buoy, surmounted with framework.

Visibility.—Four (4) miles.

The following is a description of the 26½ feet route from Point Richards to Hopetoun Channel:—

Point Richards Channel.—This channel, the centre of which is 331 deg., 9,100 feet from the white beacon on shore, crosses the Point Richards bar in a 239 deg. direction leading directly to the fairway around Wilson Spit. It will be marked on the port or south side only by the two light buoys already specified. The north side of the channel will remain unmarked.

The light buoys are 6,710 feet apart in a 239 deg. direction, and their line produced 6 miles westward cuts close on the south of No. 5 Black Can Buoy, 700 feet southward of Wilson Spit Light Beacon.

Depths—Western End.—For a width of 460 feet northward from the buoyed side, the shoalest water is 26½ feet, extending along channel eastward a cable's length from 200 to 800 feet from No. 3 Light Buoy. From immediately westward, and from 800 feet eastward of this buoy, the depths increase. No. 3 Light Buoy is moored so as to clear 25½ feet water close up to the eastward, and 24½ feet water 1½ cables south-eastward thereof. Clear of the channel N.E. by N. from No. 3 Buoy at 1½ to 3 cables, the water shoals from 26 to 24½ feet respectively.

Eastern End.—The shoalest water is 27 feet, which will be cleared to the northward by No. 1 Light Buoy, whilst along channel westward therefrom for ½ of a mile the shoalest water is 31 feet.

Point Richards Bank.—The outer edge of this bank where there is 6 feet water lies 281 deg., 5,300 feet from the shore beacon, but between there and the channel there is a clear stretch of 5,300 feet, with a least depth of 24 feet.

No. 3 Light Buoy to Wilson Spit.—This section of the route is through the broad water of the bay, the depths ranging from 39 feet at the eastern end to 31 feet at the western end. At 10,000 feet eastward from Wilson Spit Light, where a red cone buoy was temporarily moored until April last, a projection from Wilson Spit Bank, 24 feet water, lies 800 feet clear to the northward of the route.

Wilson Spit Turn.—This passage to the Outer Harbour is about 800 feet wide, south of the light beacon, the central depths ranging from 29 to 31 feet. At 1,000 feet west of the beacon there is a 24-ft. bank, which will now be marked and cleared by Moolap Light Buoy No. 7 (B).

Outer Harbour.—After passing Moolap Buoy, the passage from Wilson Spit to No. 2 and Fairway Light Buoys is about ½ mile wide, as marked. Between Fairway Buoy and Hopetoun Channel the 26½ feet approach is 550 feet wide, its north or starboard side being defined by the line of No. 2 and No. 4 Light Buoys, which are 8,040 feet apart on a 282 deg. bearing.

Directions from Seaward—By Night.—Vessels whose draught necessitates the use of the 26½ feet route should, after passing well to the north-eastward of the Prince George Light, shape a course so as to permit of the vessels being straightened up on the line of the Point Richards Channel, 239 deg., before passing to the northward of No. 1 Light Buoy at its eastern end, when proceed on this course, 230 deg., for 7 miles to Wilson Spit Light Beacon.

As the 26½ feet route is 460 feet wide near its western end, vessels should pass no more than a ship's length to the north of No. 3, or the Western Light Buoy, at Point Richards.

Outer Harbour.—Having rounded Wilson Spit, vessels should proceed with the white light from No. 2 Buoy on the starboard bow to enable the vessel to be straightened up for the centre of the 26½ feet approach to Hopetoun Channel before passing north of the red light from Fairway Buoy, when proceed on a 282 deg. course until 2 cables westward of the green light from No. 4 Buoy, when gradually alter course to 263 deg., and proceed through Hopetoun Channel, ¼ mile ahead, to the Inner Harbour.

Vessels should pass the Fairway Buoy No. 9 (B) at least about half a cable off, as a small area of 26 feet water, which it is intended to dredge as soon as possible, projects 200 feet north-east from this buoy.

Note.—Inner Harbour.—Vessels should proceed ¼ mile westward of No. 8 Beacon, Hopetoun Channel, before shaping course for either Corio Quay or Lascelles Wharf.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

 - (d) garden tools or implements or parts thereof.

VARIATION OF THE POWERS OF THE GROCERS' SUNDRIES BOARD AND REVOCATION OF ORDERS APPOINTING THE CANDLEMAKERS BOARD, THE SOAP AND SODA BOARD, AND THE STARCH BOARD.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts* for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did, by Orders made from time to time, appoint Wages Boards styled respectively the *Candlemakers Board*, the *Soap and Soda Board*, the *Starch Board*, and the *Grocers Sundries Board*: And whereas by further Orders made as aforesaid the Governor in Council did extend and adjust the powers of the said last-mentioned Board: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such of the said Orders as relate to the appointment of the aforesaid *Candlemakers Board*, the *Soap and Soda Board*, and the *Starch Board*, to abolish such Boards, and to transfer the powers, duties, and authorities thereof to the aforesaid *Grocers Sundries Board*.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*, doth hereby revoke the said Orders accordingly, and abolish the said *Candlemakers Board*, the said *Soap and Soda Board*, and the said *Starch Board*, and confer the powers, duties, and authorities of such Boards upon the said *Grocers Sundries Board* to the intent that in substitution for the powers conferred by previous Orders as aforesaid, such *Grocers Sundries Board* shall be given, and may exercise the following powers (that is to say):—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) manufacturing (except in flour mills) cereal foods, condiments, spices, coffee, chicory, or cocoa, or any kind of goods commonly known as grocers sundries;
- (b) making, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale moulders' blacking, moulders' plumbago preparations, black-lead, boot blacking, boot paste, boot polish, washing blue, harness dressing, harness compounds, ebonite shine, stove polish, knife polish, metal polish;
- (c) grinding, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale charcoal or coal dust;
- (d) making soap, washing soda, candles, or starch.

And the Honorable George Louis Goudie, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By-Law No. 111.

Prohibiting Nuisances.

A By-law of the City of Heidelberg, made under the provisions of section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 111, for the purpose of (1) prohibiting spitting or expectorating on footpaths; (2) prohibiting throwing, placing, or leaving upon any public highway orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the municipal district of Heidelberg.

2. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footway, or on any street crossing habitually used by pedestrians.

3. No person shall put, throw, or allow to fall and remain upon any footway the skin or peel or stem of any fruit, or the leaves of any part of any vegetable.

4. Every person who is guilty of a wilful offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

The Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 19th day of June, 1934, and confirmed on the 17th day of July, 1934.
