Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE PLUMBERS BOARD.

- Nores.-(1) This Determination, on the 27th August, 1934, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.
 - (2) Plumbing and Gassitting were proclaimed on the 10th October, 1928, as Apprenticeship Trades under the Apprenticeship Act 1928 for the Metropolitan District.

Full particulars of the Apprenticeship Regulations for these trades may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, 61 Spring-street, Melbourne (price 3d.).

- In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons or classes of persons—

 - (a) employed either inside or outside a factory or workroom in the process, trade, or business of a plumber or gasfitter;
 (b) wheresoever employed in any plumbing work (including electrical or gas fittings) in connexion with the erection or repairing of buildings,"

has made the following Determination, namely:-

- (1) That on the 27th August, 1934, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

DETERMINATION OF THE PAINT AND COLOUR BOARD.

⁽⁴⁾ Special Rates.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day, but if any day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

⁽⁵⁾ Time Rates.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 24 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.
