DETERMINATION OF THE BRICKLAYERS BOARD.

Note .-- (1) This Determination on the 21st September, 1934, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) On the 7th July, 1926, the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed laying or fixing faience or majolica on floors, walls, or ceilings, was taken from the Tilelayers Board and conferred exclusively on the Bricklayers

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than labourers) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a bricklayer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 21st September, 1934, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽³⁾ ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid to persons employed on work away from their employers' place of business:—

(1) The fales, exceeding 4d. per day, necessarily expended in going from and to the employee's residence to and from his work.

(2) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business if the employee is unable to return to his home the

(4) Time of Beginning and Ending Work.—The time of beginning and ending work for persons (other than those employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction) shall be— Time of Beginning. Time of Ending. 5.15 p.m. on each of five days in the week.12 noon on the other working day of the week on which the half-holiday is usually observed. 7.45 a.m. . and 7.45 a.m. (5) OVERTIME.—(a) Persons employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction shall be paid— For work done in excess of 44 hours in any week .. Time and a quarter. For work done in excess of 44 hours in any week

(b) Persons employed on any other work shall be paid—

For work done within the hours fixed as the time of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week

For work done on the weekly half-holidsy—

Between 12 noon and 5 p.m.

Between 5 p.m. and midnight

For work done on the other working days of the week—

Between 5.15 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Between 8 p.m. and midnight

Between midnight and 7.45 a.m. Time and a quarter. Double time. Double time. Time and a half.

(6) Special Rates for Sundays and Public Holidays.—All work done on—Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, 26th January (Australia Day), 21st April (Eight Hours Day), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.
