**Motor Car Acts.
REGULATIONS.**

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 18 of the *Motor Car Act 1928*, and section 34 of the *Motor Car Act 1930*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend as follows the Motor Car Regulations 1931, that is to say:—

1. At the end of the first paragraph of Regulation 72 there shall be inserted the following proviso:—

Provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to the driver of a motor car (other than a motor car used for carrying passengers for hire or goods for hire or in the course of trade) which is registered in New South Wales, Queensland, or South Australia, if, before entering Victoria, he presents such motor car and produces such certificate and licence to, and lodges such application with, the Commissioner for Road Transport of New South Wales, or the Secretary and Registrar of Motor Vehicles of the Queensland Main Roads Commission, or the Registrar of Motor Vehicles of South Australia (as the case may be), and obtains from him a permit and label in accordance with the provisions of this and the next succeeding regulation.

2. In the second paragraph of Regulation 72, and in Regulation 75, after the words "Police Force," there shall be inserted the words "or such Commissioner, or Secretary and Registrar, or Registrar (as the case may be)".

3. For Regulation 73 there shall be substituted the following:—

73. A label in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Thirty-fourth Schedule hereto shall be supplied to such driver by such member of the Police Force, or such Commissioner, or Secretary and Registrar, or Registrar (as the case may be). Such label shall be affixed on the windscreen or in some other prominent position on the motor car (unless it is a motor cycle) in such a manner as to be visible at a reasonable distance from the motor car. Such label shall not be removed from the motor car before the expiry of the period for which the permit is issued unless the motor car is taken out of and remains out of Victoria.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF ROYAL PARK, IN THE CITY OF
MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands reserved for Public Park in the City of Melbourne known as "Royal Park," hereinafter referred to as the "Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly or not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Park, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.

2. No person shall bring, carry, or take into the Park any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any person consume or drink same in the Park, nor shall he found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control.

3. No person shall interfere with, remove, damage, or destroy the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Park, or throw stones or other missiles, or light fires therein, or leave in the Park any bottles, fruit-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, litter, or refuse of any kind.

4. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the Park, or lie on the seats or grass, or stick bills on the fences, gates, seats, trees, posts, or other structures, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences or other structures, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

5. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless held by a chain or cord.

6. No persons except workmen employed in the Park shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.

7. No assemblies for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, unless authorized by the Committee of Management in writing, shall offer or expose for sale in the Park any article, fruit, or merchandise.

9. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play any musical or noisy instrument, or sing in the Park, nor shall any person preach or declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Park, or shall litter the same by scattering or throwing down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.

12. No games or athletic sports shall be played in the Park without the written permission of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, on the application of the secretary of any society or club, or of any person desiring to play such games or sports respectively, and then only in such portions of the Park as may be set apart for the purpose and indicated by the officers of the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall engage in any sport or play or practise cricket, football, golf, or other game, or train for any sport or game in the Park on Sunday.

14. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Park unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.

15. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management, carry, use, or discharge any fire-arms in the Park, or molest any animal therein.

16. No person shall in any part of the Park wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty, or insult or neglect to obey the lawful directions of any park-keeper or other servant of the Committee of Management.

17. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats or any structure or erection within the Park.

18. No booth, tent, or other structure shall be erected within the Park without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall interfere with or remove any plants, flowers, seeds, soil, or other property from the Park, or injure any property therein.

20. No delivery cart, tradesman's motor vehicle, or cart, dray, lorry, wagon, van, truck, or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Park.

21. No vehicle, motor car, or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Park, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.

22. No passenger vehicle carrying more than six persons, or built to carry more than six persons, shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Park without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

23. No vehicle shall be driven along any roadway in the Park at a speed exceeding 16 miles per hour; and when entering or leaving the Park, or passing over any crossing, the speed shall be reduced to such limit as will not be dangerous to the public.

24. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Park except on the portions thereof specially provided for equestrians.

25. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Park.

26. No horse uncontrolled shall enter or pass over or through the Park.

27. No person on foot shall enter or pass over or through the portions of the Park specially set apart for equestrians, except to cross through the openings provided for access from one part of the Park to another part thereof, as indicated by notices in the Park.

The Park has been placed under the control of the Council of the City of Melbourne as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (h) Providing for materials to be used in walls and floors.
- (i) Providing as to stairs.
- (j) Providing as to porches and stair landings.
- (k) Prescribing for ventilation of rooms in flats.
- (l) Prescribing building line requirements.
- (m) Providing as to allotments on which flats shall be built.

2. Defining the word "flat."

3. Application of building regulations and by-laws to flats.

4. Providing that restriction covenants on land shall be part of the By-law.

5. Prescribing conditions under which buildings may be altered to become a flat.

6. Prescribing penalties for contravention of provisions of By-law.
