2. In these Regulations unless the contrary intention appears, schedule means the schedule of these regulations.
3. Claims for payments or progress payments under the Act shall be in accordance with Form A in the schedule and shall contain the following particulars relating to apples and pears grown by the claimants during the 1933-34 season :—
 - (a) The location and area of the orchard or orchards on which such apples and pears were grown.
 - (b) The area planted to apples and pears on each orchard.
 - (c) The quantity in cases of apples and of pears harvested from each orchard.
 - (d) The quantity in cases of such apples and pears sold by the claimant within Australia.
 - (e) The quantity in cases of such apples and pears exported from Australia by the claimant, together with the date of shipment of each consignment, the name of the vessel, destination, the number of cases in each consignment, the name of the exporting agent (if any).
 - (f) The quantity, in cases, of such apples and pears sold for export from Australia (only fruit actually exported from Australia to be included), the date of delivery to purchaser and the name and address of the purchaser.
4. Claims for payments or progress payments shall be accompanied by such of the following documents as may be applicable :—
 - (a) Account sales relating to all apples and pears grown by the claimant in Victoria during the 1933-34 season and exported by him from Australia.
 - (b) Statements of accounts relating to all apples and pears grown by the claimant in Victoria during the 1933-34 season and sold by him for export from Australia (only fruit actually exported from Australia to be included).
5. Claimants for payments or progress payments shall state whether a certificate under the Farmers Relief Acts has been issued to them.
6. Where the claimant is a share-farmer he shall state in the claim the nature and extent of his interest in the apples and pears under the share-farming agreement and the name and address of the other party or parties to the share-farming agreement.
7. Claims for payments or progress payments shall be supported by a statutory declaration made by the claimants before a justice of the peace or a commissioner for taking declarations and affidavits.
8. Claims shall be forwarded in the first instance to the Orchard Supervisor stationed in the district in which the orchard of the claimant is situated.
9. For the purpose of verifying any claim for payment or progress payment under the Act any officer duly authorized in writing by the committee may by notice in writing call upon any person who makes a claim for payment or progress payment under the Act, to furnish to him within such time as may be specified in the notice, such books, documents, diaries or other documents or writings relating to apples and pears as the committee thinks necessary, and any such person who without reasonable excuse fails after receipt of such notice, to comply with the requirements of such notice, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds or imprisonment for not more than three months.

Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the *Land Act* 1928 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.
