RIVER MURRAY WATERS ACT 1934 (No. 4268).

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION FIXED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of His Present Majesty King George V., called the *River Murray Waters Act 1934*, it is among other things enacted that the said Act shall come into force on a day to be fixed by Proclamation by the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, which Proclamation may be made when the Governor in Council is satisfied that the Parliament of the Commonwealth and each of the States of New South Wales and South Australia respectively, had passed an Act ratifying the amending agreement, a copy of which is set out in the schedule to the Act now under recital: And whereas I as such Governor in Council am satisfied that the Parliament of the Commonwealth and each of the said States respectively have by Acts passed ratified the amending agreement aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix and appoint the sixteenth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, as the date on which the *River Murray Waters Act 1934* shall come into force in the said State of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, and in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
