VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 325.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law.

Where lower than the rates prescribed under By-law 300, the rates which during the period from 1st January, 1935, to 30th June, 1935 inclusive, shall be imposed for the carriage of the undermentioned classes and descriptions of goods between Melbourne and the stations specified shall be as shown hereunder:—

GENERAL.

1. Consignments despatched to or from suburban stations shall be charged under the District Rate conditions shown on page 139 of

1. Consignments despatched to or from suburban stations shall be charged under the District Nate conditions shown on page 159 of By-law 300.

2. The rates shewn include loading and unloading except where otherwise provided.

3. The rates specified herein for sugar are for carriage from Melbourne, Footscray, or Yarraville.

4. The percentage reductions provided in By-law 300 as concessions in respect of the rating on raw materials and manufactured products of Victorian Country Industries shall be computed on the ordinary Tariff rates published in By-law 300.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective as from the 1st January, 1935.
