PROHIBITION OF BOATS WITH LONG LINES ON BOARD IN PORT PHILLIP BAY (INCLUDING CORIO AND HOBSON'S BAYS), ETC.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Fisheries Act 1928* (No. 3683), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Proclamations to provide for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of fish and any waters in which fishing may be carried on, and may prescribe any matters or things which are authorized or required to be prescribed or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the aforementioned Act into effect: And whereas by section 9 of such Act any Proclamation so made may be varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1928*, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made the thirteenth day of May, 1932, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of May, 1932, respecting prohibition of boats with long lines on board in Port Phillip Bay, &c., and prohibit in respect of the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bays), or of any creek or river flowing into such bay, any person from doing any or all of the following things at any time throughout each year:—

Taking a boat with long lines on board or attached thereto on to the said waters; permitting a long line to remain on or attached to any boat on such waters; allowing any boat with long lines on board to be upon the said waters; or allowing a long line to remain in or upon such waters or within one hundred yards thereof; provided that during the period from the first day of April in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive), the above provisions shall not apply to any person using long lines for taking flug only in the waters of Port Phillip Bay west of an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction from the mouth of Little River to Indented Head and the West Channel Pile Light, and thence south-westerly to Point Nepean, on condition that such lines are made and used in accordance with the following specifications:—

1. The lines shall consist of the material known as five ply bagging or sewing twine; the hooks attached thereto shall not exceed size 3/0; and no bait other than raw beef shall be used.
2. The snoods on which the hooks are tied shall be attached to the long line at intervals of not more than twelve feet.

3. Not more than 800 hooks shall be used on a long line by any one person, but where two or more persons are employed in the one boat, they shall severally and together use not more than 1,600 hooks.

111. The fee for correspondence tuition for the School Intermediate Certificate (a three-years' course) shall be £3 per annum, and for the School Leaving Certificate £4 10s. per annum.

Where the Minister is satisfied that the parent of any pupil with the assistance (if any) of members of his family is not in a position to pay the fees of such pupil, and that the pupil has attained a standard of education which in the opinion of the Director will enable him to profit by the course of instruction, the Minister may exempt such pupil and the parent of such pupil from the payment of fees.

3. Where the Minister is satisfied that the average weekly income from all sources of the family of the parent of any pupil does not exceed the aggregate of the sum of Four pounds, together with Ten shillings for the second and each successive living child under the age of fourteen years or attending any school within the meaning of the Education Act, such pupil and the parent of such pupil shall be exempt from the payment of fees.

4. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MONBULK, AND KNOWN AS "SASSAFRAS RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby, in

respect of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Monbulk, and known as "Sassafra Recreation Reserve," rescind Regulation No. 4A, made on 31st January, 1929, and doth also make the following Regulations in respect of such Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

4A. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of any lawful games, amusements, sports, entertainments, or organized picnics, and from time to time grant to any club, or association of clubs, or person, or persons, the use of the ground so set apart, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the charge therefor shall not exceed the sum of £1 1s. per day.

No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for that purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such Committee, not exceeding one shilling in respect of any such car or cycle, for the use of such parking area.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the police force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

BY-LAW No. 57.

Prescribing a Residential Area within the Municipal District of the City of Caulfield.

BY-LAW of the City of Caulfield made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 57, for prescribing a residential area, and for amending and altering By-law No. 40, and for other purposes as hereinafter provided.

1. That By-law No. 40 of the City of Caulfield, the Resolution for making and passing of which was agreed to by the Council at its meeting on the 10th day of February, 1920, and confirmed on the 20th day of April, 1920, shall be and is hereby repealed, so far only as it permits or authorizes the erection of shops in Hawthorn-road, between the south side of Glen Eira-road and the north side of Briggs-street, within the Municipality of the City of Caulfield.

2. That the following area within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, and within the said Municipality, shall be and is hereby prescribed and declared to be a residential area, that is to say, all that area of land commencing at a point being the north-western corner of North-road and Ormond-road; thence proceeding easterly along the north side of North-road to the western side of Koornang-road; thence northerly along the western side of Koornang-road to the southern side of Oakleigh-road; thence westerly along the southern side of Oakleigh-road to the east side of Grange-road; thence southerly along the east side of Grange-road to a point 150 feet north of North-road; thence easterly by a line parallel with the northern boundary of North-road to the west side of Ormond-road; thence southerly 150 feet along the western side of Ormond-road to the starting point.

3. That the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any buildings for the purposes of all classes of trade, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements, except those hereafter mentioned in this By-law, are hereby prohibited within the whole of the area above described in the immediately preceding clauses.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to the business or profession of any solicitor, doctor, dentist, architect, music teacher, or tutor, or to private schools or private hospitals, or to a single worker who carries on business in a private dwelling, and whose advertising is restricted to an approved plate, or to the business of a milk vendor, but no person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any dairy or other building to be used in connexion with a milk vendor's business, or convert, or cause to be converted, any existing building for such purposes in the said area above described without first obtaining consent, in writing, of the Council.

5. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purposes, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

6. Should any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement above referred to, which was established in a building prior to the coming into operation of this By-law be removed, become defunct, or close down, the Council may, on receipt of an application in writing, grant permission for the building to be used for such other purposes as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the 4th day of November, 1931, and confirmed on the 1st day of December, 1931.

BY-LAW No. 60.

Prescribing a Residential Area within the Municipal District of the City of Caulfield.

By-law of the City of Caulfield made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 60, for prescribing a residential area, and for amending and altering By-law No. 40, and for other purposes as hereinafter provided.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 40 of the City of Caulfield, the Resolution for making and passing of which was agreed to by the

Council at its meeting on the 10th day of February, 1920, and confirmed on the 20th day of April, 1920, shall be and is hereby repealed so far only as it permits or authorizes the erection of shops in Orrong-road, between the south side of Lucan-street and Dandenong-road, within the Municipality of the City of Caulfield.

2. That the following area within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, and within the said Municipality, shall be and is hereby prescribed and declared to be a residential area, that is to say:—All that area commencing at a point being the corner of Alma-road and Dandenong-road; thence north-westerly and westerly along the south side of Dandenong-road to Orrong-road; thence southerly along the eastern side of Orrong-road to the south side of Lucan-street; thence easterly along the south side of Lucan-street 120 feet; thence southerly along a line 120 feet east of and parallel with the east side of Orrong-road to Alma-road; thence easterly along the north side of Alma-road to the starting point.

3. That the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements, except those hereafter mentioned in this By-law, are hereby prohibited within the whole of the area above described in the immediately preceding clauses.

4. Nothing herein contained shall extend to the business or profession of any solicitor, doctor, dentist, architect, music teacher, or tutor, or to private schools or private hospitals, or to a single worker who carries on business in a private dwelling, and whose advertising is restricted to an approved plate, or to the business of a milk vendor, but no person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any dairy or other building to be used in connexion with a milk vendor's business, or convert, or cause to be converted, any existing building to such purposes in the said area above described without first obtaining the consent in writing of the Council.

5. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

CITY OF ESSENDON.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law of the City of Essendon made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 75, to amend By-law No. 72 with respect to the appointment in streets and roads of standing or parking places for motor cars, and to amend By-law No. 71 with respect to the erection of stables within the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Essendon hereby order as follows:—

1. Clause 3 of Division 7 (Parking Areas) of By-law No. 72 is hereby repealed. The following clause numbered (3) will be substituted therefor:—

(3) The Council may appoint such officers as it thinks proper to supervise such parking areas, and every driver shall pay to the Town Clerk, or such other officer or officers as the Council may from time to time direct, a fee of One shilling per diem, or such other fee as the Council may determine by resolution from time to time for each vehicle parked by such driver in any such parking area or areas within the hours hereinafter laid down.

II. By-law No. 72, Division 7, Schedule A. No. 2, Moonee Valley areas, shall be amended by the addition of the following streets:—
