PARTICULARS AND LIGHTING OF DAYLIGHT CHANNEL.

SHIRE OF RIPON WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1933-34.

THE Council of the Shire of Ripon, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shire of Ripon Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1933, and shall be payable on the 30th day of June, 1934, at the office of the said Council, Shire Offices, Beaufort.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such-fore-said quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

On every house, tenement, or public building being outside the boundaries of the Township of Beaufort, and which is supplied with water from the pipe line from Mt. Cole to Beaufort, by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall such charge be less than the minimum sum of Sixty shillings. The Council shall let for hire water meters, the rental for which shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum for half-inch meters. Such rental shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water.

- (2) Any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—
 - (a) fixing or repairing new or secondhand furniture or seating in buildings; or
 - (b) french, wax, or lacquer polishing new or second-hand furniture or fittings in or in connexion with buildings;
- (3) any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the trade of designing, making, painting, or decorating—
 - (a) furnishing accessories or novelties, wholly or partly made of wood, such as nut bowls, smokers' or ornamental stands, or fancy boxes;
 - (b) domestic woodware, such as bread boards or salt boxes;
 - (c) walking sticks;
- (4) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing furniture timbers cut to size, veneers, veneered panels, plywood or coreboard, but not including persons subject to the determination of any other Wages Board heretofore appointed;
- (5) Any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the manufacturing processes of a maker of overmantels and of wood mantelpieces (other than wood mantelpieces to be painted, such as are usually made in sawmills) or in repairing any such overmantels or wood mantelpieces;
- (6) any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the manufacturing of wire mattresses;

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RECREATION RESERVE AT FRENCH ISLAND.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 31st July, 1933, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of French Island.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for public festivals, holiday amusements, cricket, sports, or football matches, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult person to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency in dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, post bills thereon, or damage or injure in any way the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees therein; nor deposit rubbish or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Re-

serve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure or booth for the purpose of offering any article for sale, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall spit on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty-six in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings,

gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the Reserves for Public purposes in the Parishes of Drouin East, Jindivick, Neerim, and Nayook as are indicated by pink colour on plans marked D.E.2/8/32, J.2/8/32, N.M.2/8/32, and N.Y.2/8/32 with the Lands Department Correspondence C.80586, hereinafter referred to as "The Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. "The Reserve" shall be open to the public free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in "The Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

No. 37.—2819.—3.

3. No person shall take into or remove from "The Reserve," or have in his possession while in "The Reserve," any ferns, trees, or any other vegetation.

4. No person or persons shall camp in "The Reserve," nor erect therein any tent or structure without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee of Management. Camping will only be permitted where the site or sites have been approved by the Committee of Management.

5. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, tins, or any other litter on any part of "The Reserve," or shall break glass of any kind thereon, or leave anything therein which would injure any person.

6. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, sheep, or any other animals or vehicles to be or remain in or on "The Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on "The Reserve," and shall be taken to be the occupier of "The Reserve" (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall permit or suffer any dog to be taken into or on "The Reserve," unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. The erection of structures or fences in or on "The Reserve" is prohibited, unless authorized, in writing, by the Committee of Management.

9. The removal of sand, gravel, or any other materials from "The Reserve" is forbidden, and no person shall cultivate, plough, or break the surface of "The Reserve" without the approval and authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

10. No person shall within "The Reserve" divert, cause to be diverted, permit, or suffer any drainage to enter the River Tarago, or other sources of water supply, from any house, dairy, cow yard, piggery, cess-pool, or other premises.

11. No person shall in or from "The Reserve" throw, cast, or discharge, or cause, permit, or suffer to be thrown, cast, or discharged any night-soil or other offensive matter into any river, creek, stream, channel, lake, lagoon, swamp, or waterhole, nor shall any person commit, permit, or suffer any nuisance to be committed on or in "The Reserve."

12. No person shall be permitted to swim in or from "The Reserve" except at sites approved of by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall be permitted to water cattle or animals of any description in "The Reserve" except at properly constructed watering places approved by the Committee of Management.

"The Reserve" has been placed under the control of the Warragul Waterworks Trust as a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10).

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, by bank draft or marked cheque, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonwealth Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount of the deposit required with each tender must be enclosed and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be.

Security will be required, either in bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Victorian or Commonwealth Government debentures, Savings Bank deposit book, or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for _____" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where actual quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind offered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured

within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for; and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside this radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the goods.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any Department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend as in clause 13 of these conditions.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
