### PROCLAMATION

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4292. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and five thousand and eleven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four and One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five."

No. 4293. "An Act to provide for the Investigation of the Affairs of certain Companies and for other purposes."

## COMMON DIMINISHED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1928* it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of

Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the undermentioned common, viz.:—

STAWELL AND PLEASANT CREEK GOLDFIELDS COMMON, by deducting therefrom 99 acres, more or less, of land in the Parish of Illawarra, comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 17th July, 1935.

## CERTAIN PLANTS DECLARED TO BE NOXIOUS WEEDS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plants named hereunder to be noxious weeds for the purposes of the above Act, viz.:—

*Salpichroa Rhomboidea* ("Pampas Lily of the Valley"), within the City of Malvern.

*Onopordon Acaulon* ("Stemless Thistle"), within the Shire of Kerang.

## AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

REGULATIONS.—APPOINTMENT OR TRANSFER TO THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

CHAPTER III.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter III. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council :—

Clause 5

*Read—*

5. A candidate shall not be eligible for appointment to the Clerical Division unless he is recorded by the University of Melbourne as having passed the School Intermediate Examination in Arithmetic and the School Leaving Examination in English and four other subjects, or has passed such other examinations as may be deemed by the University of Melbourne to be equivalent thereto, and passes in Handwriting. Provided that a candidate shall be required to enter for competitive examination in Handwriting and in four of the following subjects as prescribed for the School Leaving Examination, viz. :—

*Honours Subjects.*

English, two Languages (other than English), Mathematics, I., II., III., IV. (one, two, or three in number, but not more, may be taken), British History, European History, Commercial Principles, Commercial Practice, Economics, Geology, Geography, Physics, Chemistry.

*Pass Subjects.*

English, one Language (other than English), Mathematics, I., II., III., IV. (one or two in number, but not more, may be taken), British History (or any one other History subject), Commercial Principles, Commercial Practice, Economics, Geology, Geography, Physics or Chemistry.

Provided further that a candidate may elect to enter for competitive examination in five of the School Leaving subjects prescribed herein, in which case only the four subjects in which he obtains the highest number of marks shall be counted in determining his aggregate of marks.

A candidate may not enter for both Honours and Pass in the same subject.

A candidate who enters for both Honours and Pass in any of the under-mentioned groups of subjects may select therefrom the subjects in which he desires to be examined as set out hereunder :—

Languages (other than English)—One Honours subject and one Pass subject :

Mathematics—Not more than two Honours subjects and one Pass subject :

History—One Honours subject and one Pass subject :

Physics and Chemistry—One Honours subject and one Pass subject.

The maximum number of marks that may be awarded to a candidate shall be :—

School Leaving Honours subjects	..	200 each.
School Leaving Pass subjects	..	100 each.
Handwriting	.. ..	80.

The minimum number of marks required in order to obtain a pass, third class honours, second class honours, or first class honours, in each subject of examination shall be as determined by the examiners.

A candidate who obtains less than the minimum number of marks required for a pass in Handwriting and in four School Leaving subjects for which he has entered shall not be included in the number to be selected for appointment.

The marks obtained by candidates in honours subjects shall be standardized in such manner as determined by the Commissioner.

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. No offer will necessarily be accepted.
2. The deposit mentioned in each case must accompany each offer.
3. Offers must be at A PRICE PER TON, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE SPECIES OF WATTLE, and the bark must be weighed at the weighbridge named in each case, or at a weighbridge approved by the officer in charge, and at the expense of the licensee. Duplicate weighbridge tickets must be provided, and, if so directed by him, the bark must be weighed in the presence of the officer in charge.

4. Royalty must be paid in two instalments, the first payment covering all bark removed by the 1st December, 1935, and the second payment covering all bark stripped by 28th February, 1936, by which latter date all work must cease, and all bark, stripped or otherwise, remaining on the area after that date shall be the property of the Crown.

5. No tree shall be felled or stripped on any beauty spot, picnic ground, or on any portion of any area which the officer in charge points out as not to be operated upon, and no particular tree specially marked by him to remain standing shall be felled or stripped; wherever situated.

6. No tree shall be felled so as to fall into any watercourse, or so as to obstruct any road or track.

7. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground shall be stripped when of the black or feather-leaved variety, or less than 2½ inches in diameter at a height of 2 feet from the ground when of the broad-leaved species, unless otherwise stated herein, and wherever a size limit is mentioned it shall be at a height of 2 feet from the ground. Notwithstanding this, trees of any diameter may be stripped with the express permission of the officer in charge, if diseased, or for other, in his opinion, valid reason.

8. The whole work to be done under the supervision of the officer in charge, and in accordance with his instructions.

9. Bark must be properly bundled, securely tied, and stacked in heaps of not less than 10 cwt. in clear places only, and the licensee must take every reasonable precaution against fire. A space of at least 40 feet round each stack must be cleared of grass and rubbish.

10. No bark must be removed without the express permission of the officer in charge.

11. Camps must be pitched and fires lighted only in such places as shall be pointed out by the officer in charge, and the licensee shall, on demand of that officer, instantly dismiss from his employ any person or persons who shall carelessly use, leave, or light any fire, whether by smoking, cooking, or other operations, or who shall otherwise act in contravention of these conditions.

12. No live trees, other than wattle, must be cut or broken, or firewood used, without the express permission of the officer in charge.

13. - (e) The provision, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise), and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.
- (f) Preventing or regulating the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets and other lands and places under the control of the Council.
- (g) The disinfecting and deodorizing, and cleansing of sanitary conveniences.
- (h) The removal, replacement, cleansing, and disinfecting of receptacles for refuse, rubbish, or nightsoil, and the use of deodorants or disinfectants in such receptacles, or in sanitary conveniences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part IV. of the *Health Act 1919*, and sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of every other statutory provision hereinto them enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed within the limits of any townships in the Shire any privy except in the form of an earth closet in accordance with the following provisions of this By-law.

2. Every privy attached to any school, licensed club, licensed premises, hotel, coffee palace, or common lodging house, and every public privy and every privy attached to any factory or workroom within the municipal district, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or opening of at least half an inch in every foot.

3. No privy shall be constructed abutting on or within 20 feet from the avenue or street frontage of any property within the municipal district.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of some material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall keep or cause to be kept the contents of every pan or other receptacle for nightsoil in such earth closet thoroughly and effectually deodorized.

5. Every pan-closet shall be so constructed as to prevent access of flies to the pan contents, and shall have:—

- (a) Its internal dimensions not less than 3 ft. 6 in. in width, 5 feet in length, by 7 feet in height from floor line to wall, plate level;
- (b) Weather-proof walls formed of brick, stone, concrete, or wood or other approved materials, and at least two of its walls shall be exposed to the air and the door shall be in one of such walls.
- (c) Weather-proof roof formed of slates, tiles, galvanized iron, or other approved material.
- (d) A properly fitting door capable of being fastened from the inside when shut.
- (e) An impervious floor of brick and cement, tar, macadam, asphalt, concrete, flagstone, or other approved material, having its surface impervious, horizontal beneath the seat, with a gradient downwards from the riser to the front wall  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch per foot, and shall be nowhere less than 6 inches above the surrounding ground level.
- (f) A seat with an oval opening of suitable dimensions, and such opening shall be at least 34 inches behind the riser, and at least 1 inch forward from the back of the pan-mouth when this receptacle is in position for use. The said pan-closet shall be so constructed that the upper rim of the pan, measuring 144 inches high and 14 inches wide, shall not be more than 12 inches from the under surface of the seat. The seat opening shall be provided with a hinged fly proof cover or lid.
- (g) Access shall be provided to the pan for the purpose of removal from the exterior of closet building; the pan door shall be constructed to slide vertically within approved guides, and shall be so placed that when opened the pan may be conveniently removed or replaced in position under the seat, and it shall be kept shut when not required, for the prescribed removal or replacement of pan.
- (h) The space under the seat shall be fitted with guides and stops so that the pan may be easily introduced into its proper position.

- (i) The space under the seat when the pan door and the lid covering the opening in the seat are shut shall be fly-proof, and shall be provided with a fly-proof air grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall, and have a clear airway of at least 16 square inches, and an upcast outlet ventilator not less than 16 square inches in cross-sectional area extending from beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof.
- (j) Every outlet ventilator shaft as aforesaid shall extend vertically to such a height that the mouth of the shaft shall be at least 6 feet higher than any adjacent window, door, or other opening of any habitable or occupied room.

6. No person not specially authorized or employed by the Council for the purpose shall within the limits of any township where a municipal sanitary service is in operation, and while such service is in operation, empty or cause to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool, or any pan in any earth closet, privy, or other place for the reception of night-soil.

7. No occupier of any premises shall contract with any person for the removal of nightsoil or other refuse or offensive matter from the premises of such occupier, except upon terms which comply in all respects with the By-laws and Regulations of the Shire Council for the time being in force.

8. No person shall deposit any nightsoil or other refuse or offensive matter, except at the places set apart by the Council for those purposes.

9. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, refuse, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung soil, or any nightsoil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health.

10. The duties and authority of every inspector of the Council shall include the visiting and inspecting from time to time subject to and for the purposes mentioned in section 319 of the *Health Act 1919* of any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house or yard, or any house, out-building, lane, alley, or other place in the municipal district.

11. Every occupier of any premises on which house refuse is produced or accumulated shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of impervious material for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which receptacle or receptacles shall be of such shape that each may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, and shall be of a size not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and every such occupier shall provide and keep thereon so many of such receptacles (one or more) as may be sufficient to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week, and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in such receptacle or receptacles.

12. The word "Township" wherever appearing in this By-law shall be deemed to mean and include any place within the said Shire whereon there may be an aggregation of not less than three buildings either wholly or partially used or adapted for use as dwellings, and whether or not suitable or used wholly or partially for any other purpose, and at least three of such buildings could or might be enclosed in a circle having a diameter of three hundred yards, and whether or not such place shall have been proclaimed a "Township."

13. Any person committing any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall on conviction pay a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings and not exceeding Five pounds for each and every such act or default.

14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District provided that those provisions expressed to apply only to townships as herein defined shall apply to all townships within the Municipal District. It is declared that clauses 2, 3, 4, and 5 shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

The resolution for making and passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Mildura at its meeting on the seventh day of July, 1927, and confirmed on the twenty-ninth day of August, 1927.
