DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF HEIDELBERG.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Heidelberg has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land reserved, used, or acquired for the street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the City of Heidelberg aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF HEIDELBERG.

All that piece of land containing 16 perches or thereabouts, being part of a road shown on plan of subdivision No. 675 lodged in the Office of Titles, and part of Crown portion 115 at Alphington, Parish of Jika Jika, County of Bourke: Commencing at a point on the west side of Austin-street, Alphington, 961 ft. 3 in. north of Heidelberg-road, being the north-east corner of lot 14 on said plan of subdivision; and bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south 89 deg. 32 min. west 132 feet; thence north 0 deg. 28 min. west 33 feet; thence north 89 deg. 32 min. east 132 feet; thence south 0 deg. 28 min. east 33 feet to point of commencement.

BUTCHERS TRADE TRIBUNAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act* 1934, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that section 40 of the said Act shall extend and apply to and in respect of any trade specified in such Proclamation other than the trade of making or baking bread, or in the trade of delivering bread: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that the Governor in Council by such Proclamation may appoint a Trade Tribunal, of the name, style, or designation stated therein, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade specified as aforesaid the powers and duties conferred upon the Bread Trade Tribunal by section 40 of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Proclamation hereby declare that section 40 of the said Act shall, from the date hereof, extend and apply to and in respect of the trade of butchering, or selling of meat, or making or selling of small goods: And doth by this Proclamation appoint a Trade Tribunal, styled the Butchers Trade Tribunal, to have, exercise, and perform in relation to the trade above specified, the powers and duties conferred by section 40 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1934, upon the Bread Trade Tribunal.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 3268.—DRYSDALE URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE BELLARINE PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge, or to annul, or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

2. Every person using or supplied with water for other than domestic purposes solely shall, at his own expense, provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Commission or its proper officer.

3. No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

4. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

8. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Seven shillings and sixpence.

For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

9. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of any meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing; and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or

be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

10. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

11. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission, at Queenscliff, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

12. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check-meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

13. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

14. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water trough shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fitting thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

16. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.

17. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

- (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged for as provided by the last preceding clause, would give the sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

18. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

19. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

## KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1935.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement other than land on which there is no building be less than Thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Five shillings.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to Government Departments shall be by measure at Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons, or by agreement.

Private water-troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

For water supplied for irrigation by pipe service for market gardens, orchards, and lucerne plots, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the annual assessment of the land:—

For one half-inch service—£2 per acre; minimum, One pound (£1).

For two half-inch services—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For one three-quarter-inch service—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For two three-quarter-inch services—£4 per acre; minimum, Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for irrigation purposes from open race, the charge shall be as follows:—

For  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre—Two pounds (£2).

For  $\frac{3}{4}$  acre—Three pounds (£3).

For 1 acre—Four pounds (£4).

For 2 acres—Seven pounds (£7).

Each succeeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre—One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.).

The minimum charge shall be Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for stock purposes to occupiers of properties adjoining race frontages, a minimum charge of Three pounds (£3), or by agreement.

The charge for water supplied by measure or agreement shall be payable on demand.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

#### Rating By-law No. 34.

THE Council of the Borough of Clunes, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1923*, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Clunes Water Supply District.

On such lands and tenements a rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding Eighty pounds, and One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuation exceeding Eighty pounds.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Forty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Fifteen shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1934, and ending the 30th day of September, 1935, and shall be payable on the 2nd day of January, 1935, at the office of the said Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

For water supplied to factories or trade premises using steam the following amounts shall be charged, in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value, viz.:—One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons per rated horse-power of the boiler or boilers up to 200 horse-power; on every horse-power in excess of 200, the sum of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 10,000 gallons per horse-power in excess of 200.

For water supplied for irrigation for market gardeners and orchards, the following charges shall be paid, in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value of the land:—

For two half-inch services—£3 per acre; minimum, 25s.

For every additional half-inch service—£1 10s. per acre.

For one three-quarter-inch service—£3 per acre; minimum, 25s.

For two three-quarter-inch services—£4 per acre; minimum, 40s.

For every additional three-quarter-inch service—£2 per acre.

Not more than two services per acre are to be allowed unless by written consent of the Commissioners, who shall have regard to the size and locality of the main to supply the extra services.

For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the borough—Eighteen shillings per annum, in addition to the amount charged for domestic purposes.

For water supplied to Government Departments—

Railways—One shilling per 1,000 gallons by meter.

Post Office—One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station—One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 120,000 gallons per annum.

State School—One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 80,000 gallons per annum.

Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable iron trough with ball-cock and locked cover, the following charges per annum shall be paid for stock purposes, in addition to the amount charged on the annual value of the land:—

On land not exceeding 20 acres—Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum.

On land above 20 and not exceeding 50 acres—Eighteen shillings.

On land above 50 and not exceeding 75 acres—Twenty-five shillings.

On land above 75 and not exceeding 100 acres—Thirty shillings.

On land above 100 acres—Forty shillings.

Whereas every occupier or owner of any land or tenement rated under this By-law shall be liable for a re-opening fee of Five shillings for re-connecting the water supply where such supply has been disconnected by the order of the Commissioners for default in payment.

Whereas every occupier or owner of any land or tenement rated under this By-law shall be liable for a re-opening fee of Ten shillings for re-connecting the water service where such supply has been disconnected by order of the Commissioners at the request of such occupier or owner, such fee to be payable in advance.

Any person or body of persons occupying two or more separate factories shall pay a fee calculated on the aggregate number of all the employes in all of the separate factories.

The annual fee for the registration of the factory and the record (both of which must be received before the factory can be registered) are due on the 1st day of January in each year, and should be sent to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Spring-street, Melbourne.

The fee should be paid in the form of cash, cheques (without exchange), money orders, or postal notes. Stamps will not be accepted.

No notice or demand, written or verbal, will be given or made for the record and fee, but occupiers of factories making default are liable to a penalty of £10, and £1 for every day late.

Whenever a factory is transferred to a new occupier or to other premises a fresh registration must be made and another fee paid.

Employes should be grouped as far as possible according to the Determination under which they are paid, and, where necessary, each group should be shown on a separate form.

- (c) guards which will efficiently cover the upper half of the knife wheel and all gear wheels, so as to prevent bodily injury to any person in the vicinity thereof.
