Private entrée cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at 10 a.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at 10.15 a.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levées held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the orden of presentation, but it is requested that members of the Service and all public bodies group themselves together as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so.

On the occasion of the celebration of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levée should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting their names in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Malvern has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore 1, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State. do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Malvern aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.: the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1935, doth hereby make the following Regulations to take effect from the eleventh day of June, 1936, that is to

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Road Traffic Regulations 1936."
- 2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or Definitions subject-matter-

"Act" means the Road Traffic Act 1935.

"Driver" means the person in charge of a vehicle or a horse.
"Footway" includes every footpath lane or other place

habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles. "Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

- "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of property lines of two or more streets which join at an
- angle whether or not such streets cross.
 "Major street" means any street along which tramcars travel. "Minor street" means any street along which tramcars do not travel.
- "Motor car" has the same meaning as in the Motor Car Act 1928.
- "Safety zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the council of any municipality in any street.

"Street" includes any highway road lane or thoroughfare other than a footway.

- "Traffic-control signal" includes any device using coloured lights or words or any combination thereof whether operated mechanically electrically manually or otherwise by which traffic is directed to stop and proceed.
- "Tram-stop" means a place appointed by any authority controlling tramways at which tramcars stop for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers.
- "Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human animal mechanical electrical or other power including a tram motor and tramcar but does not include railway locomotive or railway carriage.
- 3. The driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along a major Proceeding along major along major street. street shall-

- (i) on approaching the intersection of another major street stop before entering such intersection;
- (ii) on approaching the intersection of a minor street proceed at such rate of speed (not exceeding in the case of a motor car or tramear twenty-five miles an hour and in the case of any other vehicle or a horse ten miles an hour) that he will be able to stop immediately such vehicle or horse in case of sudden danger:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic or a trafficcontrol signal is installed and is operating. Penalty £10.

4. The driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along a minor street

(i) on approaching the intersection of a major street stop along minor before entering such intersection:

(ii) on approaching the intersection of another minor street proceed at such rate of speed that he will be able to stop immediately such vehicle or horse in case of sudden danger:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic or a trafficcontrol signal is installed and is operating. Penalty £10.

Giving right of way to vehicle approaching from right.

5. The driver of a vehicle or horse reaching the intersection of two minor streets at approximately the same time as another vehicle or horse shall give the right of way to the vehicle or horse approaching from his right: Provided that this regulation shall not apply at an intersection where a member of the Police Force is controlling traffic or a traffic-control signal is installed and is operating. Penalty £5.

Stopping behind stationary tramear. 6. The driver of a vehicle or horse overtaking any tramcar stationary at a tram-stop shall bring such vehicle or horse to rest so that no portion of such vehicle or horse projects beyond the rear of such tramcar and shall keep such vehicle or horse stationary until such tramcar resumes its journey and the street between such tramcar and the adjacent footway is clear of pedestrians: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to that part of the City of Melbourne included within the area bounded by Victoria-street, Spring-street, Flinders-street and Spencer-street; nor to the outer tracks of St. Kildaroad, Brighton-road, Royal-parade from Flemington-road to Park-street, Flemington-road from Elizabeth-street to Flemington-bridge; nor to those sections of Victoria-parade, Dandenong-road, Peel-street (North Melbourne), and Mount Alexander-road (Essendon), containing tramway reserves. Penalty £25.


"Driving past safety zone. 7. No person shall drive any vehicle or any part thereof or drive ride or lead any horse over along through or on the right or off side of a safety zone. Penalty £10.

Keeping to

8. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramcar) or a horse on any street shall keep such vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the edge of the carriage way or to the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street. Penalty £5.



The driver of any vehicle (other than a tramcar) or horse before turning to the right or off side from one street into another shall proceed along the left or near side of the street which he is leaving and parallel to the kerb alignment of the footway upon the left or near side of such street until he is as near as practicable to the kerb alignment of the footway on the left or near side of the street which he is entering as shown in the diagram.

The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramear) on any street shall when crossing from one side of such street to the other side make the complete turn so that when stationary at the kerb his vehicle shall be headed in the same direction as the traffic is proceeding as shown in the diagram.

11. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramcar) or a horse shall-

 when meeting a vehicle horse or pedestrian proceeding or headed in the opposite direction keep on the left or near side of the street;

 (ii) when passing a vehicle (other than a tramcar) horse or pedestrian proceeding or headed in the same direction go on the right or off side of such vehicle horse or pedestrian;

(iii) When passing a tramcar proceeding or headed in the same direction pass such tramcar on the left or near side thereof.

Penalty £20.

12. No person shall allow a vehicle (other than a tramcar) to remain unattended in any of the following places:-

Vehicles not to remain

(a) Within thirty feet of an intersection;(b) within fifty feet of a tram-stop;

(c) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within twenty feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone;

(d) within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant;

(e) in front of a private driveway; (f) alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when traffic would be obstructed.

Penalty £10.

13. No person shall drive any vehicle upon any street or permit priver to have any vehicle to be driven upon any street unless such vehicle is so traffic constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle, and no person while driving any vehicle upon any street shall occupy such a position as will interrupt or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid. Penalty £5.

14. No person shall in any street at one and the same time act priver not to as driver or have sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by have charge of animal power or of more than two vehicles fastened together, in which vehicle steep case the length of the tow shall not exceed twelve feet: Provided that in certain circumstances. this regulation shall not apply in the case of a motor car drawing a trailer registered in accordance with the provisions of the Motor Car Acts. Penalty £5.

15. The driver of a vehicle upon any street shall when stopping Taking up or for the purpose of taking up or setting down any passenger or goods setting down do so as near as may be to the footway on his left or near side. Penalty £5.

No person shall drive any vehicle (other than a tramcar) or travelling side drive ride or lead any horse upon any street in such manner or in by side. such order that more than two vehicles or horses are travelling side by side in the same direction: Provided that this regulation shall not prevent three horses abreast being attached to one vehicle or any vehicle from passing two bicycles travelling side by side in the same direction.

18. (1) Every person alighting from a vehicle shall as soon after rersons joining alighting therefrom as the exigencies of traffic permit pass by the and leaving transport of the contract of shortest and most direct route to the nearest footway.

- (2) No person while waiting to board a vehicle shall stand on any portion of the carriage way of a street or pass to such vehicle until the same has stopped to take up such person or for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers.
- (3) This regulation shall not apply to any person upon a safety zone. Penalty £5.
- 19. Every pedestrian upon a footway shall keep to the left or Pedestrians to near side of such footway and shall when overtaking any person pass keep to the on footway. on the right or off side of such person. Penalty £5.

20. No pedestrian shall cross any street or any part thereof except Pedestrians at right angles to the footway. Every pedestrian shall on leaving the footway proceed by the shortest line from the point on such footway from which he left such footway to a point on the other footway of the street immediately opposite the first-mentioned point. Penalty £5.

21. (1) Every person shall at all times observe and comply with obedience to traffic-control signal.

- (2) When any traffic-control signal at an intersection indicates that "caution" is required—
 - (i) no driver of a vehicle or horse shall enter such intersection until such time as a further indication or notification is given that he may proceed; and no pedestrian shall in like circumstances proceed beyond the kerb alignment of the footway of the street he is approaching until such further indication or notification as aforesaid is given;

(ii) every person being lawfully upon such intersection when such cautionary signal as aforesaid is given shall forthwith proceed so as to clear such intersection with all reasonable speed.

Penalty £20.

Imitation of or obscuring traffic-control signal.

22. No person shall place maintain or display upon any street or in view of any person passing along any street any sign signal or design which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles a traffic-control signal or which obscures from view any traffic-control signal. Penalty £10.

Interference with traffic-control signal, &c. 23. No person shall wilfully deface injure move obstruct or interfere with any traffic-control signal or traffic sign or notice. Penalty £10.

Driving in front of moving tramear at intersection. 24. No person shall drive a vehicle or drive ride or lead a horse in front of and across the course of a tramcar which has commenced to cross an intersection. Penalty £10.

Alighting from or joining vehicle in motion.

25. No person shall alight from or board or join a vehicle which is in motion. Penalty £5.

Riding on certain portions of tramcar forbidden. 26. No person shall ride upon any portion of a tramcar not designed or intended for the carriage of passengers: Provided that this regulation shall not apply in the case of any person employed by any authority controlling tramways engaged in the discharge of his duties. Penalty £5.

Parallel parking. 27. Every person leaving a vehicle unattended on any street shall leave such vehicle in such a position that the left or near wheels thereof are parallel with and not more than ten inches from the edge of the kerb of the footway on the left or near side of such street and that such vehicle is not less than three feet from any other vehicle: Provided that this regulation shall not apply to any vehicle standing in a parking area established by any municipal council. Penalty £10.

28. No person shall stop stand or leave a vehicle in any street in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave less than ten feet of the width of such street available for the free movement of traffic. Penalty £10.

Parked vehicle to leave ten feet of street space.

Displaying

29. No person shall stop stand or leave a vehicle on any street for the primary purpose of displaying an advertisement. Penalty £5.

Displaying advertisement on vehicle on street. Cyclists clinging to vehicles.

30. No person riding a bicycle motor cycle coaster or any toy vehicle shall cling to or attach his vehicle or himself to any other vehicle upon any street. Penalty £5.

Driving in

31. The driver of a vehicle shall not reverse or drive backwards unless such movement can be made with safety having regard to the movement of traffic at the time. Penalty £10.

Obedience to direction of member of Police Force. 32. In the event of an accident collision commotion congestion of or obstruction to traffic in a street the driver of any vehicle or horse shall at all times obey the reasonable direction or instruction of a member of the Police Force. Penalty £5.

Signal when stopping or turning right. 33. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tramcar)-

(i) before stopping such vehicle shall at a distance of not less than twenty-five yards from the place at which he proposes so to stop indicate his intention of so doing either by extending his arm beyond the vehicle and raising his hand with fingers extended and pointing upwards or by means of a mechanical signal or device approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police so that such hand signal or device shall be clearly visible to the driver of any following vehicle;

(ii) before turning such vehicle to the right shall at a distance of not less than twenty-five yards from the place at which he proposes so to turn indicate his intention of so doing by extending his right arm beyond the vehicle with hand and fingers pointing horizontally in the direction

in which he intends to turn.

Penalty £10.

Offences.

34. Every person who fails to comply with the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalties.

35. Where a penalty is set out in any clause of these Regulations it is the maximum penalty prescribed in respect of any person committing a breach of such clause.

8. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal or eggs of any description within the Reserve without the permission, in writing that of the committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms or airguns in the Reserve.

10. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter, on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

12. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except those set apart by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to the payment of such fees and under such conditions as the Committee of Management may from time to time determine.

13. The permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized picnics or sports in the Reserve.

14. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public

or sports in the Reserve.

14. No assemblies for concerts or for the purpose of public worship or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character shall take place in the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless under proper control or led by a chain or cord, nor shall any person put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout that portion of the Shire of Braybrook, commencing at a point where the Sunshine-Newport railway line crosses Wrightstreet; thence by Wright-street westerly to the Kororoit Creek; continuing thence up stream by that creek to Andrew-parade, thence northerly by Andrew-parade to the boundary fence of Sclwyn Park, and continuing round Selwyn Park westerly, northerly, and north-easterly to Perth-avenue; thence northerly by Perth-avenue to Ballarat-road; thence easterly by Ballarat-road to Duke-street; thence southerly by Duke-street, and continuing under the Sunshine-Tottenham railway line through the Black Arch to Sunhury-road; thence westerly by that road to the commencing point. by that road to the commencing point.
