### PROCLAMATION

No. 4417. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two million seven hundred and six thousand four hundred and fifty-nine pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six and One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven."

### DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the first year of the reign of His present Majesty King Edward VIII., intituled the *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936* (No. 4405), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and

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with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the twelfth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, as the day upon which the said *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936* shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

### PROCLAMATION

## AMENDMENT OF SECOND SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928.

## ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Poisons Act* 1928 it is enacted (*inter alia*) that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the said Act and that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* amend the said Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article and the Schedule so amended shall have the same force and effect as if such amendment had been enacted in the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation amend the said Second Schedule as follows, that is to say:—

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

## List of Poisons—First Part.

To the First Part of the said Second Schedule add the following, namely:—

*Chloroform.*

*Ether.*

*Dinitro-phenol* 2:4, and *dinitro-o-cresol*, and any salts, compounds, derivatives, or any preparations or admixtures of *dinitro-phenol* 2:4, or *dinitro-o-cresol* or their salts, compounds, extracts, derivatives, preparations, or admixtures.

Any substances not specifically mentioned in this Schedule which if taken in a single dose of 1 grain (6 centigrams) or less will produce a dangerous or deadly effect on an adult.

In place of item 20 in the First Part of the said Second Schedule substitute the following, namely:—

"20. *Ergot*, its preparations and all admixtures thereof."

In the First Part of the said Second Schedule remove the following article, namely:—

*Ephedrine* (including synthetic *ephedrine*) and its salts and all preparations or admixtures thereof containing 1 per centum or more of *ephedrine* or synthetic *ephedrine*.

## List of Poisons—Second Part.

In place of item 3 in the Second Part of the said Second Schedule substitute the following, namely:—

3. *Antimonium tartaratum* (tartar-emetic) in all preparations or admixtures containing less than 10 per centum of tartar-emetic except ant or insect destroyers containing not more than 10 per centum of tartar-emetic, when included in the Fourth Schedule.

In place of item 14 in the Second Part of the said Second Schedule substitute the following, namely:—

14. *Chloroform*, all preparations or admixtures containing more than 0.25 per centum of *chloroform*.

In the Second Part of the said Second Schedule add the following new article:—

*Glacial acetic acid.*

In the Second Part of the said Second Schedule remove the following article, namely:—

*Ephedrine* (including synthetic *ephedrine*) and its salts in all preparations or admixtures containing less than 1 per centum of *ephedrine* or synthetic *ephedrine*.

and substitute therefor the following article, namely:—

*Ephedrine* (including synthetic *ephedrine*) and its salts in all preparations or admixtures containing 1 per centum or more of *ephedrine* or synthetic *ephedrine*.

## Poisons Acts.

## AMENDMENT OF THIRD PART OF SECOND SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Poisons Act* 1928 it is enacted (*inter alia*) that in any case where the Governor in Council considers that any substance (whether or not the same was at the commencement of the said Act included in either of the other parts of the Second Schedule to the said Act) is not of such a nature as to make it necessary for the safety of the public that all the provisions of the said Act applicable to poisons should apply to such substance but is of such a nature that its sale and use should be subject to certain conditions and restrictions under the said Act the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria may by Proclamation insert the name of such substance in the Third Part of the Second Schedule to the said Act: And whereas by the said section it is also enacted that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* amend the said Second Schedule by adding to any part of such Schedule or removing therefrom any article and the Schedule so amended shall have the same force and effect as if such amendment had been enacted in the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do consider that each of the substances specified hereunder is not of such a nature as to make it necessary for the safety of the public that all the provisions of the said Act applicable to poisons should apply to such substance but is of such a nature that its sale and use should be subject to the conditions and restrictions under the said Act, and on the recommendation of the said Board do by this my Proclamation insert in the Third Part of the said Second Schedule the substances following and declare that the sale and use thereof shall be subject to the said conditions and restrictions, and further that the said Third Part of the said Second Schedule shall be amended as hereinafter set out, namely:—

## SECOND SCHEDULE.

## List of Poisons—Third Part.

To the Third Part of the said Second Schedule add the following, namely:—

17. *Acriflavine* and solutions thereof.

18. *Mercurochrome* and solutions thereof.

In place of item 6 in the Third Part of the said Second Schedule, substitute the following, namely:—

6. *Ether*, all preparations or admixtures containing more than five per centum of ether.

In the Third Part of the said Second Schedule remove the following item, namely:—

14. *Argyrol* and any synthetic organic silver compound,

and substitute therefor the following, namely:—

16. *Argyrol* and any synthetic organic silver compound.

## AMENDMENT OF FOURTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928.

## POISONOUS SUBSTANCES AND PREPARATIONS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act* 1928 it is among other things enacted that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* amend the Fourth

Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* by adding thereto or removing therefrom any substance or preparation, and such Schedule so amended, shall have the same force and effect as if such amendment had been enacted in the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation amend the said Fourth Schedule as hereinafter set out: And I declare that the amendments to Part I. of the said Fourth Schedule shall come into force on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

## FOURTH SCHEDULE.

## Part I.

To Part I. of the said Fourth Schedule add the following, namely:—

2A. *Carbon tetrachloride* or solutions thereof.

2B. *Grays, pastels, and coloured chalks* containing lead or arsenic in greater proportion than the following limits:—

*Lead* as Pb 5 per centum.

*Arsenic* as arsenious oxide  $As_2O_3$ —1 grain to the pound.

2C. *Hydrofluoric acid* (HF), *Hydrosilicofluoric acid* ( $H_2SiF_6$ ), salts of these acids; and other fluorine compounds.

2D. *Paradichlorobenzene* and solutions thereof, when sold as a moth-killer or insecticide.

13A. *Trichlorethylene, Dichlorethylene*, and preparations, including those sold for the purpose of cleaning fabrics.

## Part II.

In Part II. of the said Fourth Schedule remove items 14 and 18 and substitute the following, namely:—

14. Agricultural and horticultural preparations containing any poison (except cyanide of potassium) intended to be used exclusively for agricultural or horticultural purposes or for the purposes of destroying birds or animals or insect pests which are vermin under any Act relating to vermin or for use exclusively as sheep dips, sheep washes, or weed killers or insect destroyers or substances sold exclusively for the preservation of timber. Sheep drenches for removal of internal parasites in sheep and domestic animals exclusively.

18. Poisonous preparations intended to be used exclusively for the purpose of destroying rats, mice, or ants.

To Part II. of the said Fourth Schedule add the following, namely:—

18A. *Poisonous substances* intended to be used exclusively as sprays for the purpose of destroying vermin in buildings (except sprays containing arsenic).

In Part II. of the said Fourth Schedule remove the following item, namely:— 19 (a) *Carbon tetrachloride*, as from the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

*Fire Brigades Act 1928.*

## ALTERATION OF CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, whenever the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board certifies that it is necessary or desirable that any specified portion of the metropolitan fire district or of any country fire district (as the case may be) be excised therefrom, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that such portion shall be excised accordingly, and that thereupon such specified portion shall for the purposes of the said Act no longer be included in or be part of such metropolitan or country fire district: And whereas it is also enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades

Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is necessary and desirable that the Townships of Allandale and Bacchus Marsh be excised from the Central Fire District: And whereas the councils of the Shires of Creswick and Bacchus Marsh have requested that the portions of such municipal districts set forth in the Schedule hereunder be added to and form part of the said Central Fire District, and certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said Townships of Allandale and Bacchus Marsh shall be excised from the said Central Fire District, and that the portions of the Shires of Creswick and Bacchus Marsh set forth in the Schedule hereunder shall be added to and form part of the said Central Fire District.

## SCHEDULE.

*Shire of Creswick*.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment 63, Parish of Spring Hill; thence south by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 28, Parish of Spring Hill; thence west by a road to the east boundary of the Township of Broomfield; thence south and west by that boundary to its junction with the east boundary of allotment 15, section F, Parish of Creswick, and south by a line to the south boundary of allotment 14, Section F, Parish of Creswick; thence west by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 10, section F, Parish of Creswick; thence north by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 80, Parish of Spring Hill; thence generally in an easterly, south-easterly, and easterly direction by a road to the point of commencement.

*Shire of Bacchus Marsh*.—The boundaries of the Urban Division of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply District as defined under the *Water Act 1928*, by Order in Council dated the sixteenth day of July, 1934, and proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, No. 118, dated the eighteenth day of July, 1934.

**W**HEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act* 1928, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the undermentioned common, viz.:—

## WARRAWINGA COMMON.

By deducting therefrom 17 acres 2 roods 39 perches more or less of land, being allotment 8 of section 31, in the Parish of Wangaratta South, County of Delatite, comprised within the boundaries as defined by description published in the *Government Gazette* of 7th October, 1936.

## The Game Acts.

## SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT HORSESHOE LAGOON AND SURROUNDING LANDS NEAR TRAWALLA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1928.

## PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Parish of Livingstone, County of Ripon: Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 3 of section 2A, Parish of Livingstone; thence north-westerly by the western boundaries of allotments 3, 2, and 1 of section 2A and a direct line across a road to the south-west corner of allotment 9 of section 4A; thence north-westerly, northerly, and north-easterly by the western boundaries of allotments 9, 7, 6, and 1 of section 4A and north-easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 4A to the north-west corner of allotment 1 of section 3A; thence easterly by the north boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 3A and southerly by the east boundaries of allotments 4 and 5 of section 3A, a direct line across a road and the east boundaries of allotments 10, 9, and 8 of section 2A to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 8 and 7 and south-westerly and south-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of allotment 6 of section 2A to the most south-eastern corner thereof; thence westerly by the south boundaries of allotments 6, 5, 4, and 3 of section 2A to the point of commencement. Including all intersecting roads and the area known as Horseshoe Lagoon.

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Camberwell aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

## WINSON GREEN ROAD.

All that piece of land being part of Elgars Crown special survey, Parish of Boroondara, County of Bourke, and being the land more particularly described as Winsong Green-road, coloured brown on plan of subdivision number 5608 lodged in the Office of Titles, commencing at the intersection of the east boundary of Rochester-road with the north boundary of Winsong

Green-road; thence by lines bearing south 89 deg. 44 min. east 350 feet, south 63 deg. 38 min. east 129 feet, north 89 deg. 54 min. east 250 feet to a point on the west boundary of Faversham-road; thence bearing south 50 feet along Faversham-road; thence by lines bearing south 89 deg. 54 min. west 261 ft. 9 in., north 63 deg. 38 min. west 129 ft. 2 in. and north 89 deg. 44 min. west 338 ft. 3 in.; and thence bearing north 0 deg. 4 min. east 50 feet along Rochester-road to the commencing point.

## POISONS REGULATIONS 1936.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Poisons Regulations 1936," and shall be read and construed as one with "The Poisons Regulations 1930," "1931" and "1932," which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Poisons Regulations."

2. In Regulation 3 of "The Poisons Regulations 1930" for the word "Register" wherever appearing substitute the word "Registrar."

3. Regulation 15 (3) of "The Poisons Regulations 1930" is hereby amended as follows:—

For the words "arsenic, strychnine, corrosive sublimate, carbolic acid, lysol, nicotine, cyanide of potassium, arsenate of lead, arsenical weed killer, and arsenical fly exterminator" substitute the words "arsenate of lead, arsenic, arsenical fly exterminator, arsenical weed killer, carbolic acid, caustic soda, corrosive sublimate, cyanide of potassium, lysol, nicotine, phenyle, phosphorus, strychnine."

4. In Regulation 16 of "The Poisons Regulations 1930" omit the words "package or" which appear before the word "container" in the said Regulation.

5. In place of Regulation 22 of "The Poisons Regulations 1930" the following Regulation is substituted, namely:—

22. *Custody of poisons, &c., by others than pharmaceutical chemists.*—Every person (other than a registered pharmaceutical chemist) having the custody of any poison, poisonous substance or preparation within the meaning of the Poisons Acts shall keep the same duly labelled in the original package or container in which the same was sold to him.

**REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ELSTERNWICK PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION RESERVE.**
