 DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF DIVISION TWO OF PART II., AND DIVISIONS TWO AND THREE OF PART III., AND SECTIONS THREE AND SIX, AND THE SCHEDULES.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George V. intitled the *Legislative* No. 217.—14028. —PRICE 6d.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.

*Council Elections Act 1935*, it is amongst other things enacted that Division Two of Part II., and Divisions Two and Three of Part III., and Sections Three and Six of the said Act, and the Schedules to the said Act, shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, which Proclamation may be made when an arrangement has been made by the Governor in Council with the Governor-General of the Commonwealth for the appointment of Divisional Returning Officers of the Commonwealth and of the Clerks to such Divisional Returning Officers as Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars respectively of and for Divisions of Provinces: And whereas on the twenty-first day of September, 1936, the said arrangement was made by the Governor in Council with the Governor-General of the Commonwealth: And whereas the said arrangement came into force on the fifteenth day of October, 1936, and a notification of the said arrangement and the date when it came into force was published in the *Commonwealth Gazette* on the fifteenth day of October, 1936, and in the *Government Gazette* on the thirtieth day of September, 1936: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, as the date upon which Division Two of Part II., and Divisions Two and Three of Part III., and Sections Three and Six of the said Act, and the Schedules to the said Act, shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

VEGETATION AND VINE DISEASES ACT 1928.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the Water Act 1928, I hereby declare that the lands included in the area defined hereunder, as shown on a plan lodged in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne, ought to be constituted a Waterworks District.

The area hereinbefore referred to is defined as follows:— Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment 24A, section 1, Parish of Wangoom, County of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 24A, 28A, 35A, 36A, 14, 13B, and 13A, said section 1, and allotments 1, 8, and 9, section E, and lines connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally easterly and northerly by the southern boundary of a road forming the northern boundaries of allotments 9, 10, 11, and 12, said section E, allotment 7, section H, and the western boundary of allotment 8, section H, and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to the most southerly angle of allotment 1, section G; thence north-easterly by a road forming the eastern boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 4, 5, and 6, section G, to the northern boundary of the Parish of Wangoom; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to the western boundary of the Parish of Tallangatta; thence generally north-easterly by the western boundaries of the Parishes of Tallangatta and Garvoc and easterly by the northern boundary of the last-mentioned parish to the south-western angle of allotment F2, Parish of Keilambete; thence northerly by a road to the northern boundary of that parish; thence generally easterly by the last-mentioned boundary and the northern boundary of the Parish of Terang to the western boundary of the Parish of Marida Yallock; thence generally northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the last-mentioned parish to the north-western angle of the Parish of Colongulac; thence generally easterly by the northern boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned parish to the northern boundary of the Parish of South Purrumbete; thence westerly by the southern boundary and northerly by the western boundary of the Parish of Carpendeit to the south-western angle of allotment 6B of that parish; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundaries of allotments 37B, 37A, and 37C, Parish of Jancourt, and north-westerly by the south-western boundaries of allotments 37C, 34, 34A, 33B, and 33A of that parish to the most westerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of the Parishes of South Purrumbete and Tandarook and northerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned parish to the south-eastern angle of allotment 5B, Parish of Elingamite; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 5B and 5A, a line, and the northern boundary of a road to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Ecklin; thence northerly by that boundary

The estimated cost of the proposed works is £319,000.

1. That no nets shall be used other than those with meshes measuring not less than three and a half inches;
2. That no person shall use at the one time more than two hundred and twenty yards of net.

A Regulation of the City of Footscray, made under sub-section 6, section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for preserving good order and decency in the Footscray Town Hall buildings and preventing damage to such buildings and to the furniture and fittings thereof, and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray order that the following rules and conditions of letting shall apply to and operate with respect to the Footscray City Town Hall Buildings, situate at the corner of Hyde and Napier streets, Footscray.

## RULES AND CONDITIONS OF LETTING.

1. Every application for the use of the Assembly Hall or other rooms must be made in writing to the Council.
2. Rent must be paid at the time of hiring.
3. The hirer shall deposit such sum as is mentioned in the attached schedule of letting in respect of the Assembly Hall and other buildings before taking possession as a guarantee for the fulfilment of all conditions of letting and as a security up to the amount named against damage to furniture or building; but such deposit shall not be deemed to cover any further damage that may be done during the term of the hiring beyond the amount of such deposit, but the hirer shall pay the full amount of such damages on demand by the Council. In case of any breach of the conditions of letting, the deposit shall be forfeited to and become the property of the Council. If there be no breach of conditions of hiring or injury to the furniture or building, of which the Council shall be sole judge, the deposit will be returned to the hirer.
4. The hirer may vary the arrangement of seats, but such variation is to be conducted under the supervision of the hallkeeper.
5. The floors, walls, or any other part of the buildings shall not be broken, pierced by nails, screws, or other contrivances or in any way injuriously affected, and no notices shall be pasted on or affixed to the walls.
6. No malt or spirituous liquors of any kind shall be sold in any portion of the building upon pain of absolute forfeiture of the deposit paid, and the Council may, at its discretion, prevent entirely the introduction of malt or spirituous liquors into the municipal buildings.
7. The Mayor, Councillors, and following officers, viz., the Town Clerk, City Surveyor and City Electrical Engineer, Health Inspector, and their deputies, shall at all times, and notwithstanding any hiring, be entitled to free access to any and every part of the buildings let.
8. Notwithstanding that the Assembly Hall or any part of the municipal buildings may have been let or that these conditions may have been signed, and that the rent and the deposit may have been paid, the Mayor of the city or, in his absence, the chairman of the Town Hall Committee or the Town Clerk shall have full power, if he think fit so to do, to cancel such letting and direct the return of the rent and deposit so paid, and the hirer shall in that case accept the same, and be deemed to have consented to waive such letting, and to cancel the same free from all claim for any loss or damage that may be occasioned by such cancellation.
9. Good order shall be preserved in and throughout the municipal buildings and premises.
10. No spitting, obscene or insulting language, or disorderly behaviour, or damage to property shall be committed or allowed in any part of the premises. Smoking is permitted only in places set apart for same. Smoking on the dancing floor is absolutely prohibited.
11. No portion of the premises shall be sublet, nor shall the hirer introduce any additional party, nor take him or her as a partner or assign, or transfer the tenancy, without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
12. All stage properties, decorative and catering appliances, fittings, &c., shall be removed before Ten o'clock on the morning following the day or night engaged.
13. The premises shall be vacated punctually at the time set out in the application.
14. The hirer shall comply in every respect with the regulations under the Health Act for the prevention of overcrowding and obstruction in gangways, passages, and halls in any public building. Any person offending will be removed from the hall.
15. The hirer, at his own expense, shall arrange with the hallkeeper for the supply of the necessary attendants for cloakrooms.
16. The use of confetti or streamers within the Town Hall buildings or grounds is prohibited, unless with the written permission of the Council.
17. No trade advertisements, notices, or announcements of any kind whatsoever shall be exhibited in the hall entrances or corridors without the consent of the Council.
18. No vehicle will be allowed to remain in the Town Hall grounds.

19. The hirer shall not permit nor allow any person to canvass or tout within the Town Hall buildings, either by printed or oral announcement or in any other manner whatsoever, for the booking and/or engagement of means of vehicular transport, nor accept nor permit or allow to be accepted within such buildings any such booking and/or engagement. The hirer shall not, either directly or indirectly, give or allow nor permit to be given or allowed, any privilege or preferential facility to any proprietor or representative of any proprietor of any vehicle in respect of the booking and/or engagement within the Town Hall buildings of any means of vehicular transport, but shall strictly conform to the Council's policy of affording absolute equality of business opportunity to all proprietors of vehicles.

20. The subject of any lecture or entertainment must be submitted to and approved by the Council.

21. No person shall be entitled to a reduction of rent for any entertainment held to assist charitable institutions, schools, or distress cases unless the purpose of the charity is mentioned in the form of application, and unless the hirer is willing to submit a balance-sheet to the Council for perusal immediately after the proceeds of such entertainment are known.

22. Whenever the Town Hall is let on a Sunday for any lawful purpose, the hirer will not be permitted to take up a collection at the door or entrance of the audience, or solicit any subscription or donation from any person attending thereat, otherwise than by a collection from the seated audience.

23. Any person committing a breach of any one or more of these conditions is liable to be expelled from the municipal buildings, though he may have paid for admission.

24. The hirer must produce evidence satisfactory to the Town Clerk that, prior to the entertainment for which he has engaged the hall, he has duly notified the Amusement Branch of the Taxation Department of the nature of the entertainment. Where payment for admission to such amusement is deemed by the Taxation Office to be taxable, he must produce certificate of registration.

25. The hirer must sign these conditions in token that he undertakes to comply with them.

3. In this By-law the word "instrument" means any instrument device or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loudspeaker, amplifier, broadcasting set, wireless receiving set, gramophone, piano player, piano, or other instrument or device.

4. By-law No. 61 of the City of Northcote is hereby repealed.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Northcote.
