CITY OF CAMBERWELL,

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under Part XXXIII. of the Local Government Act 1928, numbered 65, for the purpose of repealing By-law No. 28, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon any lands purchased or rented or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council of the Municipality of the City of Camberwell for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation and also for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in any such grounds or places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Govern-ment Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

By-law No. 28 made by the Council of the Town of Camberwell on the first day of February, 1910, under the Municipal Grounds Act 1905 and the Local Government Act 1903 is hereby repealed.

Operation.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Camberwell, and shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.

Definitions.

- "Council" means the Council of the City of Camberwell.
- "Management Committee" means an Honorary Committee elected in accordance with rules applying to the constitution of Committees of Management of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation as laid down by the Council from time.
- 1. The Council may from time to time appoint local Manage ment Committees to manage such lands as have been or at any future time shall be purchased or rented or otherwise proany future time shall be purchased or return or otherwise provided by or granted or given by any person to the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation, and may prescribe Rules and Regulations for the appointment of such committees and the manner in which such management shall be carried out.
- 2. The Council shall have power to hold entertainments. performances, sports meetings, cricket or football matches or other forms of sport on any of such lands and to make a charge for admission thereto.
- 3. No charge or fee for admission shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person and One shilling for each child under the age of fourteen years unless the Council has previously authorized a higher charge.
- 4. No person except members of the Council or of the Management Committee, the town clerk, the city engineer, and employees of the Council or Management Committee on duty shall enter any portion of such lands when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fee charged unless otherwise authorized by the Council or Management Committee.
- 5. No person unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be required to leave during any such entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.
- 6. All such lands shall be open to the public free of charge except on such days and at such hours as the Council shall appoint or when a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.

 7. No person shall interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on the beds or borders or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or adevrtisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles broken glass, paper, fruit skins or peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever except in the receptacles provided, or spit or expectorate upon any of the paths or structures, or remove, displace, or damage any notice board within any of such lands.

 8. No person shall carry firearms in or through such lands.
- 8. No person shall carry firearms in or through such lands on shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein except by the authority of the Council.
- 9. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within such lands on Sundays.
- 10. No person shall engage in cricket, football, bowls, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in any of such lands without the authority of the Council, and then only on payment of any fees or charges that may be prescribed from time to time.
- 11. No person shall ride any bicycle, tricycle, scooter, truck, or other wheeled vehicle on any footpath or in any part of
- 12. No person shall play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or carry on any form of gambling or by any unseemly conduct or otherwise interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of other persons within such lands.
- 13. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder interrupt any employees of the Council engaged in any of such lands.
- 14. No person shall sell or offer for sale within any of such lands any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement or make any collection of money for any purpose without the written permission of the Council. of, the Council.
- 15. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or use indecent or abusive language or commit any nuisance or in any way offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct in any of such
- 16. No person except employees of the Council or of the Management Committee shall enter any plots in any of such lands which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs.
- 17. No person other than players or officials or competitors at any sports gatherings duly authorized as aforesaid shall enter or remain within or upon the playing arena in such lands during the progress of any cricket, football, tennis, howls, or lacrosse match, or sports gathering, nor interrupt nor interfere with any employee of the council or Management Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- .18. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket, football, tennis, bowls, or lacrosse match

- or sports gathering in such lands when such crossing or trespassing would cause undue interference with the progress of a match or sports gathering.
- 19. No person shall remain in any of such lands at any time when lawfully directed by any police constable or officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.
- 20. No cart or other vehicle shall without the authority of the proper officer of the Council or of the Management Com-mittee be driven in or through any of such lands.
- 21. No person shall put in any of the said lands any cattle. LAO person shall put in any of the said lands any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or other animals without the permission of the Council or Management Committee, and any animals found so trespassing on any such lands may be seized by the proper officer of the Council, and the owner proceeded against for such trespass.
- 22. All fowls, ducks, geese, or other poultry found within any of the such lands will be destroyed, and the owners shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done.
- 23. No person shall bring or have any dog in any of such lands unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.
- ames smess such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.

 24. No person shall park or leave any motor car or other vehicle in any of such lands excepting at such places and at such times as are provided for that purpose by the Council, and the Council may make a charge not exceeding One shilling a day or part of a day for every motor car or other vehicle so parked or left.
- 25. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil, or other material from any of such lands unless authorized in writing by the Council so to do.
- in writing by the Council so to do.

 26. Where any area in such lands has been set apart as a children's playground and swings and other appliances have been provided, the following rules shall apply:—

 (a) No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter upon or remain on such area or use any of the swings or other appliances therein, provided, however, that this condition shall not apply to parents or other persons in charge of children who shall be at liberty to enter or remain on such area to watch over children who are in their charge.

 (b) The swings or other appliances erected in such area shall not be used by any child or children for a longer period than five minutes consecutively if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.

 (c) Every person being lawfully on such area shall obey the directions of any officer of the Council or of any constable of police in respect of his or her conduct therein.

 (d) The Council and/or Management Committee shall not be responsible for any accident occurring on any pertion of such area or arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances therein.

 (e) Children's playgrounds shall not be open for use after the hour of sunset.

 27. None of the powers conferred on the Management Committee of any recreation reserve by the constitution and rules shall be exercised in the event of the Council having passed a Resolution forbidding the exercise of such powers of any of them.
- 28. Penaltics.—Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

- (5) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid—
 - (a) In any week in which two or more Public Holidays At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum occur.
 - (b) In any other week At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum
- (6) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day (21st April), and King's Birthday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
- (7) Weekly Day Off.—Every stoker shall be allowed, by rotation or otherwise, one clear day off in each week. A week shall be deemed to commence from the starting of the morning shift on Monday in each week.
- (8) Payment of Wages.—Payment of wages due up to 6 s.m. on the preceding Monday shall be made on Thursday of each week, or in accordance with the practice existing at the time of the making of this Determination, provided that such wage shall be paid not later than Friday of each week.
- (9) Annual Leave.—Every employee who serves an employer continuously for one year shall be allowed by the employer leave of absence in that year or in the following year for a continuous period of one week of seven days.
- (10) ABSENCE THROUGH SIGENESS OB ACCIDENT.—(a) Any employee not attending for duty will lose his pay for the time of such non-attendance, unless he produces or forwards within twenty-four (24) hours of the commencement of such absence, a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the management that his non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health, necessitating such absence.
- (b) In the case of personal accident or personal illness necessitating such absence referred to in (a), the pay for the week in which such accident or illness occurs shall be calculated on his pay at ordinary rates for the six working days up to and including the day such accident or illness occurs. Provided, however, that if such accident or illness necessitates absence beyond the week in which same occurs, the employer will for such period of absence not exceeding in all ten days, pay the employee in the manner hereinbefore provided. The maximum amount of pay for days not worked owing to such accident or illness necessitating absence as aforesaid shall be a total of ten days full pay in any year. For the purpose of this clause, a year shall be calculated as follows:—
