INSECT AND DISEASE DECLARED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare to be an insect within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*, the insect named hereunder. And I further declare every abnormal condition of or in any plant, or of or in the product or part of any of the same, whether consisting of the presence of or caused by or due to the operations, development, growth, or decay of the insect hereunder named, shall be a disease within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928*:—

The insect *Cydia molesta* (Busck), commonly known as the Oriental Peach Moth.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "MILFORD PARK,"
TARRAWINGEE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

County of Bogong, Parish of Tarrawingee: Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 1, Parish of Tarrawingee; thence south-easterly by the northern boundary of that allotment bearing north 118 deg. east 4,920 links to the west boundary of a road which forms the east boundary of the said allotment; thence south by the west boundary of the said road to the northern bank of the Owens River; thence generally westerly by the northern bank of the said river to a point in line with the continuation of the west boundary of allotment 1b; thence north by a direct line and the west boundaries of allotments 1b and 1 to the point of commencement.

CONSTITUTION OF A MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* (No. 3697), 1, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation extend the Shepparton Meat Area as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st day of August, 1935, to include that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney commencing at the centre of the Goulburn River at a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 10, Parish of Toolamba; thence west to and along the said southern boundary of allotment 10 to the east side of the 1½-chain Toolamba-Mooroopna road; thence by the said road southerly to a point east of a point on the west side of the said road 2,772 links southerly from the north-east angle of allotment 25, Parish of Toolamba; thence west to the west side of the said road; and thence west 434½ links; thence north 323 links; thence north 79 deg. 11 min. east 36½ links; thence north 24 deg. 37 min. east to the centre of a 3-chain road from Corop to Shepparton; thence by a line bearing north 23 min. west, passing through allotments 6 and 7A, Parish of Mooroopna, being 500 links from and parallel to the eastern boundary of the said allotment 6, to its intersection with the centre line produced of a road between allotments 9, 8, and 59A of the said parish; thence by a line bearing north 47 deg. 9 min. east to and across a 3-chain road and along the centre line of the aforesaid road, between allotments 9, 8, and 59A to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the said allotment 8; thence by a line, the eastern boundary of the said allotment 8, and a line bearing south 42 deg. 51 min. east to the centre of the River Goulburn, in the Parish of Mooroopna; and thence by the centre of the River Goulburn

in a general direction south-westerly to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 10, Parish of Toolamba, the commencing point aforesaid.

Water supplied to Government Departments shall be by measure at Eighteenpence per 1,000 gallons, or by agreement. Private water-troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum.

For water supplied for irrigation by pipe service for market gardens, orchards, and lucerne plots, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the annual assessment of the land:—

For one $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. service—£2 per acre; minimum, One pound (£1).

For two $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. services—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For one $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. service—£3 per acre; minimum, One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.).

For two $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. services—£4 per acre; minimum, Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for irrigation purposes from open race, the charge shall be as follows:—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ acre—Two pounds (£2).

For $\frac{1}{4}$ acre—Three pounds (£3).

For 1 acre—Four pounds (£4).

For 2 acres—Seven pounds (£7).

Each succeeding $\frac{1}{2}$ acre—One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.).

The minimum charge shall be Two pounds (£2).

For water supplied for stock purposes to occupiers of properties adjoining race frontages, a minimum charge of Three pounds (£3), or by agreement.

The charge for water supplied by measure or agreement shall be payable on demand.

Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

NIGHTSOIL AND SEWAGE PURIFICATION REGULATIONS
1936.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Nightsoil and Sewage Purification Regulations 1936, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Cattle” means any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, calf, or pig.

“Nightsoil” includes all human excrementitious or faecal matter which has not been purified as prescribed by these Regulations.

“Sewage” means any liquid containing human excrementitious or faecal matter and any liquid product of chemical, physical, or biological treatment of such liquid which has not been purified as prescribed by these Regulations, and includes sewage scum and sewage sludge.

3. For the purposes of these Regulations—

(1) Nightsoil shall be deemed to be purified if it has been raised throughout its mass to a temperature of not less than 212 degrees Fahrenheit and has been maintained at that temperature for at least ten minutes; and

(2) sewage shall be deemed to be purified if it has been so treated as to destroy or to remove from such sewage any eggs of *taenia saginata* or *taenia solium* which it may contain or to render such eggs incapable of development.

And the Honorable John Richards Harris, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

COMPULSORY VOTING (LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS) REGULATIONS 1936.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Compulsory Voting (Legislative Council Elections) Regulations 1936.

2. In these Regulations—

“Chief Electoral Officer” means the Chief Electoral Officer for the State of Victoria;
 “Division” means Division of a Province;
 “Province” means Electoral Province;
 “the Act” means *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928* as applied pursuant to section 10 of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935* to voting and elections for the Legislative Council;

any reference to a form shall be a reference to the form in the schedule hereto or to any form to the like effect.

3. (1) The marked roll on which the Returning Officer (or Substitute Returning Officer) is required to indicate by a distinguishing mark, pursuant to section 332 of the Act, the names of the electors who have not recorded their votes at the election, shall be a fair copy of the general roll (if any) and the ratepayers' roll for each Division of the Province for which the Returning Officer (or substitute) has been appointed.

(2) The marked roll for each Province shall be certified by statutory declaration in accordance with Form 110(A).

(3) All the Division rolls for a Province shall together form the roll for that Province.

4. (1) The notice which the Chief Electoral Officer is required, in accordance with section 333 (1) of the Act, to send by post to each elector who, pursuant to section 9 of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, is required to vote but who appears to have failed so to vote, shall be in accordance with Form 111(A).

(2) The request by the Chief Electoral Officer to any elector to notify the Chief Electoral Officer pursuant to section 9 (2) (b) of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935* of the name of the Division of the Province in respect of which he has recorded his vote may be incorporated in Form 111(A).

5. (1) The form of reply of any elector, pursuant to section 334 of the Act, shall be witnessed by any adult person residing in the State of Victoria, and shall be in accordance with Form 112(A).

(2) The notification to the Chief Electoral Officer required of an elector pursuant to section 9 (2) (b) of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935* as to the name of the Division of the Province in respect of which he has recorded his vote may be incorporated in Form 112(A).

6. (1) Where the reply of the elector states a reason for his failure to record his vote which, in the opinion of the Chief Electoral Officer, is not a valid and sufficient reason for that failure, the Chief Electoral Officer shall, after endorsing on the marked roll his opinion in accordance with section 334 of the Act, notify the elector, in accordance with Form 113(A), of his opinion, and inform him that he has the option of having the matter dealt with by the Chief Electoral Officer or by a Court of Petty Sessions.

(2) Before sending the notice referred to in regulation 4 or that provided for by regulation 6 (1), the Chief Electoral Officer shall insert therein a date (not being less than 21 days after the date of the posting of the notice) before or on which the form at the foot of the notice, duly filled up and signed by the elector and witnessed, is to be in the hands of the Chief Electoral Officer.

(3) Any elector to whom a notification has been sent pursuant to regulation 6 (1), who desires the matter to be dealt with by the Chief Electoral Officer, and who is prepared to abide by the decision of that officer, may notify the Chief Electoral Officer in accordance with Form 114(A).

7. Pursuant to section 336 of the Act—

(a) The Chief Electoral Officer may make an order in accordance with Form 115(A) requiring the elector to pay a sum not more than Ten shillings,

(b) If the sum as stated in the order of the Chief Electoral Officer is not paid within fourteen days after the date of the order, the Chief Electoral Officer may forward to a Clerk of a Court of Petty Sessions a certificate under his hand in accordance with Form 116(A).

8. (1) The Chief Electoral Officer may, pursuant to section 336 of the Act, authorize, in writing, in respect of any Province, some person or persons to institute proceedings for the enforcement of penalties under the said section or under section 9 (2) (b) of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*.

(2) Every such person shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be called a “Prosecuting Officer.”

(3) Such authorization shall be in accordance with Form 117(A).

9. In any proceedings in a Court of Petty Sessions against an elector for a contravention of section 334 of the Act or section 9 (2) (b) of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, there shall be served on the defendant a notice, in accordance with Form 118(A), that the defendant may attend the Court and answer the charge in person, or may, at any time, not less than seven days before the date fixed for the hearing, lodge with or send by post to the Chief Electoral Officer a statutory declaration setting out any matter which he desires to set out in answer to the charge, and unless the said Chief Electoral Officer after inquiring into the truth of the statements therein set out, so far as it is practicable for him to do so, is satisfied with the explanation given, and authorizes an application to the Court for the withdrawal of the charge, the matter shall be proceeded with, and the said statutory declaration may thereupon be put to such use at the hearing as may be necessary and permissible for the proper determination of the offence. The notice may be printed or written on the summons.

10. In any prosecution in a Court of Petty Sessions in respect of any contravention of section 334 of the Act or section 9 of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, a certified extract of the marked roll (as defined in section 335 of the Act) in accordance with Form 119(A) shall be lodged with the Court.

11. Any elector who, pursuant to section 9 (2) of the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, is required to record his vote in respect of his enrolment on the general or ratepayers' roll of any Province other than the Province in which he resides, and who, on receipt of a request pursuant to paragraph (b) of the said sub-section that he notify the Chief Electoral Officer of the name of the Division of the Province in respect of which he has recorded his vote, fails so to notify the Chief Electoral Officer, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Two pounds.

You may attend the Court and answer the charge in person, or may, at any time, not less than seven (7) days before the date fixed for the hearing, lodge with or send by post to the Chief Electoral Officer a statutory declaration setting out any matter which you desire to set out in answer to the charge, and, unless the said Chief Electoral Officer, after inquiring into the truth of the statements therein set out, so far as it is practicable for him to do so, is satisfied with the explanation given and authorizes an application to the Court for the withdrawal of the charge, the matter shall be proceeded with and the said statutory declaration may thereupon be put to such use at the hearing as may be necessary and permissible for the proper determination of the offence.

4.
