PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF BRIGHTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Brighton has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Brighton aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Noel-street.—All that piece of land known as Noel-street, Brighton, being part of Dendy's Crown Special Survey, Parish of Moorabbin, County of Bourke: Commencing at a point 330 feet easterly from a point in Landcox-street, Brighton, 930 feet north of Union-street, Brighton; thence by lines running S. 89 deg. 45 min. E. 3 inches, S. 48 deg. 20 min. E. 17 ft. 10½ in., S. 33 deg. 31 min. E. 65 ft. 10 in., S. 0 deg. 15 min. W. 451 ft. 9 in., S. 44 deg. 45 min. E. 36 ft. 4½ in., S. 89 deg. 45 min. E. 136 ft. 3½ in., N. 45 deg. 18 min. E. 14 ft. 2 in., S. 0 deg. 21 min. W. 70 feet, N. 44 deg. 42 min. W. 14 ft. 1½ in., N. 89 deg. 45 min. W. 156 ft. 11 in., N. 44 deg. 45 min. W. 77 ft. 9¼ in., N. 89 deg. 45 min. W. 1 ft. 3 in., N. 0 deg. 4 min. E. 115 feet, N. 0 deg. 27 min. E. 424 ft. 1½ in. back to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Kew has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been used as streets within the said city, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the lands used as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Kew aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1936-37.

THE Council of the Shire of Beechworth, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Shire of Beechworth Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-five shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October 1936, and shall be payable on the 19th day of June, 1937, at the office of the said Council.

For water supplied by the Council for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Council), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF CUT PAW PAW, CITY OF FOOTSCRAY, FRONTING BALLARAT-ROAD AND ADJOINING FARNSWORTH-AVENUE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Lands and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st January, 1937, as a site for Public Recreation in the City of Footscray, Parish of Cut Paw Paw:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fence in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the Reserve.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten (£10) pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
14. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Reserve except by permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
15. No person shall engage in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, baseball, or any other like game, nor shall any band perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
16. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

17. No person shall cross or trespass on the playing ground during any cricket or football match or sports, show, &c., or during practice at football or cricket, when any such crossing or trespassing would be injurious to or undue interference with the progress of the aforesaid sports, football, or cricket, &c.

18. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission, shall pay to the Committee of Management such a fee as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with the Regulations.

19. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or table, or any support, fastening or fitting used or constructed, or adapted to be used, for the exhibition of any regulation or notice, and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

20. No person shall at any time ride, drive or bring, or cause to be ridden, driven or brought into the Reserve any beast, draught, or burden, except in such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose.

21. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, or cut or mark any advertisement sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.

22. No person shall, in the Reserve, erect any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building, or structure without the consent of the Committee of Management.

23. No person shall be on the Reserve in a state of intoxication or behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance therein, or obstruct any servant of the Committee of Management, or interfere (not being a player) with any games or sports therein, or use insulting words or gestures, or otherwise misbehave.

24. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, on such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

25. No person shall, in the Reserve, wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or on any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

The Council of the City of Footscray has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Act 19, Geo. V., No. 3720, and of every other Act or power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Borung order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—
"Hawker" includes any person holding licence under the *Hawkers and Pedlars Act 1928*.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Shire, other than a footway habitually used by vehicular traffic and not pedestrians, notwithstanding that such highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place may be formed on private property.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Shire habitually used by pedestrians and not vehicular traffic, notwithstanding that such footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place may be formed on private property.

Words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person carrying on the occupation of a hawker or itinerant trader shall, between the hours of One o'clock in the afternoon and Six o'clock in the afternoon on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, and between the hours of One o'clock in the afternoon and Nine o'clock in the afternoon on Fridays, sell or offer for sale any goods in that part of Scott-street, Warracknabeal, which is bounded on the north by Kelsall-street and on the south by Lyle-street, and in those parts of Woolcock-street, Warracknabeal, and Phillips-street, Warracknabeal, which are bounded on the east by Devereux-street and on the west by Jamonneau-street.

3. No person in any street or footway shall—

- (a) Sell or offer for sale any goods in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway.
- (b) Every such person shall move on upon being so required by any officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force.

4. No person on any land adjacent to or abutting on any street or footway shall sell or offer for sale any goods in a manner calculated to cause persons to whom such goods are sold or offered for sale to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway.

5. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided, apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Borung.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE KNITTING TRADE BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination, on the 17th June, 1937, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) Work on Sunday, except in certain prescribed circumstances, is prohibited by the *Factories and Shops (Sundays) Act* 1932, No. 4102.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since 12th February, 1935, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (i) knitting or crocheting fabric, or any article of human wear;
- (ii) mending or repairing any knitted or crocheted fabric, or any knitted or crocheted article of human wear;
- (iii) spinning or preparing silk yarn,

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 17th June, 1937, the last and all previous Determinations of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) DEFINITIONS.—(a) "Leading hand" means an employee in charge of any operation where no foreman or assistant foreman is employed, or an employee who is empowered by the management to discharge such duties as would devolve upon such foreman or assistant, if employed.

(b) "Machine operator or attendant" means an employee who, in the course of his or her duty, is called upon to operate a machine, and does not include an employee whose sole duty is carrying material to and from a machine.

(c) "Continuous process" means the working of three shifts per day from Monday to Saturday inclusive.

(4) **SHIFTS.**—(a) A "day shift," shall be a shift worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, and between the hours of 7 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturday.

(b) A "night shift" shall be a shift worked between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive.

(c) In addition to the rates payable to day shift employees, workers employed on night shift shall be paid at the rate of 1s. per shift, unless engaged in a continuous process. If adult employees in such continuous process work three alternating shifts, they shall be paid 5 per cent. extra, if alternating afternoon and night shift $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. extra. Male junior employees shall be paid 1s. per shift extra on afternoon or night shifts with a maximum payment of 5s. per week.

(d) Workers employed on a shift extending after 7 p.m. shall be paid at night shift rates for the time worked after 7 p.m., provided that workers employed on a shift commencing after 5 p.m. shall be paid at night shift rates throughout.

(e) By mutual arrangement between the employer and his employees, the hours of duty prescribed herein for workers on night shift may be worked in four shifts without payment for overtime. Under any such arrangement arrived at after 5th July, 1935, all hours of duty beyond ten hours, even if they come within the starting and finishing times of a shift, shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(f) The employment of females before 7 a.m. or of males under 18 years of age after 9 p.m. is prohibited.

(g) As far as practicable employees shall work shifts in rotation.

(5) **OVERTIME.**—(a) Males under 18 years of age, or females, required to work overtime shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half to a maximum of four hours in one day and ten hours in one week, with double time thereafter.

(b) Apprentices or improvers for each period of overtime worked, shall be paid 6d. up to two hours' work, and 3d. for each additional hour or part thereof in addition to their overtime earnings and any tea-money to which they are entitled.

(c) For work done by an employee not provided for in sub-clause (a) before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time of his or her shift, or after an employee has completed the ordinary daily hours of work, overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours on any one day, and double time thereafter.

(d) Employees required to work overtime for more than one hour without being notified on the day immediately before that they will be required to work, shall either be supplied with a meal free of charge by the employer or paid 1s. 6d. each in lieu. If the notice is given and overtime is not worked (except as a result of breakdown of machinery or plant), the tea money prescribed herein shall be paid.

(e) The usual starting or finishing time in any factory or part thereof shall not be altered except on seven days' notice to the employees, and such starting and finishing times shall be posted on the notice board—see clause (8).

(6) **TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT.**—(a) Employment shall be on an hourly basis, except that notice equivalent to 44 working hours shall be given on either side to terminate employment. Such notice may be given at any time. This shall not affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct (in which case wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only), or to deduct payment for any day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike, or through any breakdown of machinery, or any stoppage of work, or any cause for which the employer cannot be reasonably held responsible.

(b) In lieu of such 44 working hours' notice, except in circumstances referred to above, the employer shall pay 44 hours' wages. The employee leaving his or her employment without notice shall forfeit 44 hours' wages, which shall be deducted from any wages due.

(c) Provided that any notice determining the employment solely for the purpose of evading payment for prescribed holidays, and not to determine the engagement finally, shall not deprive the employee of payment for any prescribed holiday occurring or observed between such notice to terminate and any re-engagement.

(7) **MEAL HOURS.**—(a) A meal interval of not less than 45 minutes and not more than one hour shall be allowed each day, provided that, by mutual arrangement between the employees and the employer, a shorter meal time may be fixed, in which case it shall not be less than 30 minutes.

(b) Time and a half rates shall be paid to any employee required to work during his or her meal hour. No employee shall be compelled to work for more than five hours without a break for a meal. Provided, however, that where three shifts are worked in a continuous process and it is mutually arranged, there shall be no break for meals, but employees may take their meals in the employer's time as opportunity offers.

(c) An employee engaged in the maintenance of plant, when breakdowns occur, shall work meal hours at the ordinary rates herein prescribed whenever instructed so to do.

(d) Meal intervals having been fixed shall not be altered except on seven days' notice posted in the factory.

(8) **NOTICE BOARD.**—The employer shall permit a notice board to be erected in his establishment for the purpose of posting any notices thereon in connexion with meetings or other business the employees may require, such notice board to be in a prominent position. All such notices shall be submitted to and approved by the employer before being posted.

(9) **TOOLS OF TRADE.**—Rubber aprons, gloves, and top boots (where necessary for dyehouse work or scouring department), together with all materials and appliances required for the cleaning of machinery, shall be supplied by the employer free of charge when requested by the employee concerned.

(10) **LIMITATIONS.**—(a) One operator receiving not less than the full operator's wage shall be employed on each full-fashioned machine (legger and/or footer).

(b) No female shall be required to use an iron exceeding 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. weight.

(11) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—(a) Wages shall be paid weekly, not later than Friday, except by mutual agreement between the employer and his employees.

(b) Any employee kept waiting for his or her wages on pay day for more than ten minutes after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid at overtime rates for the time so kept waiting.

(c) Where the services of an employee are dispensed with, all wages due shall be paid to him or her on dismissal, or forwarded to him or her by post on the day following.

(d) Not more than two days' pay of any employee shall be kept in hand by an employer.

(12) **TIME AND WAGES BOOK.**—Each employer shall keep a time and wages book or record in the English language showing the name of each employee and his or her occupation, the hours worked each day or each week, and the wages or allowance paid each week.

The time occupied by an employee in filling in any time book or in the making of records shall be treated as time of duty, but this does not apply to checking in or out at the beginning or end of duty.

(13) **SUNDAYS AND HOLIDAYS.**—(a) All work done on Sundays by time-workers or on the following holidays shall be paid for at the rate of ordinary time in addition to the ordinary rate. All work done by pieceworkers shall be paid for at the ordinary rate payable to time-workers doing the same class of work, in addition to the piecework earnings:—

New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

Provided that Melbourne Cup Day shall be observed as a holiday in the Metropolitan District instead of King's Birthday.

(b) If any other day be by Act of Parliament or proclamation substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted. Time-workers who are off duty on any of the above-mentioned holidays, other than Sunday, shall be paid for such days at the ordinary rates. Pieceworkers who are off duty shall be paid for such days at the ordinary rates payable to employees on time-work doing the same class of work.

(c) Where an employee is absent from his or her employment on the working day before or the working day after a holiday without reasonable excuse, or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(14) **PIECEWORK.**—(a) The lowest piece-work price payable to any outside worker for performing any of the undermentioned work shall be as specified in the following schedule, viz. :—

(b) Except as provided in Clause 14 (a) any employer may fix piece-work prices for any process, provided such prices enable adult employees of average capacity to earn at least the minimum weekly rate prescribed for their respective classes, with the addition of 15 per cent. Such prices shall not be altered except by mutual agreement between the employer and the piece-worker concerned.

(c) Where an employee has worked part of the week on piece-work he or she shall be entitled to his or her earnings in full for the actual time worked on piece-work if the earnings are higher than the minimum rate for such time.

(d) Adults and juniors doing the same operations shall be paid the same piece-work prices.

(e) As far as practicable, different grades of work shall be equitably divided between piece-workers.

(f) A piece-worker who also instructs learners shall receive, in addition to piece-work earnings, 10s. per week for the first week 7s. 6d. for the second week, and 5s. for the third week, but at the end of the third week, shall not be called upon to continue instructing a learner unless paid 5s. per week in addition to the piece-work earnings.

(g) Male piece-workers called on to perform work before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid 10d. per hour in addition to the prescribed piecework prices, and female pieceworkers 8d. per hour in addition to the prescribed piecework prices.

(15) **OUTSIDE WORKERS.**—(a) No person who is or is deemed to be the occupier of a factory within the meaning of section twenty-three of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3877) shall issue or give out or authorize or permit to be issued or given out any material whatsoever for the purpose of being wholly or partly prepared or manufactured outside a factory as articles of clothing or wearing apparel for trade or sale, except to a person who has been licensed by the Chief Inspector of Factories as an outside worker. Provided that no such outside worker shall employ any other person or persons whatsoever in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing such articles of clothing or wearing apparel save and except members of such worker's own family.

(b) Every such outside worker shall be paid the prescribed piece-work prices.

(c) Every outside worker shall be provided, free of charge, with cotton, silk, thread, and all other sewings and trimmings used in the manufacture of garments.

(d) In the case of an employer delivering or collecting the work of such outside worker, the same shall be done without charge to such outside worker.

(e) Every employer who has work done elsewhere than in his factory or workshop shall keep a record book, which shall contain a correct account written in ink as follows :—

(i) The name and full address of the outside worker.

(ii) The number of articles and description of work given out.

(iii) The price paid for such work.

(f) The record book mentioned in the preceding sub-clause shall be signed each week by each outside worker, verifying the accuracy of the amount of remuneration received, and shall be open for inspection at any time by any authorized officer of the Department of Labour.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREADCARTERS BOARD.

NOTE.— This Determination on the 17th June, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely :—

- (a) the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677); such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not within the said Metropolitan District; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Chelsea, Mildura, Mordialloc, and Warrnambool; the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Echuca, Hamilton, Sebastopol, and Wonthaggi; the Township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye; and
- (b) the shires or portions of the shires (if any) set forth below in the column opposite the name of the shire :—

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board which, since 13th August, 1934, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (1) whosoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving or in delivering bread in connexion with the business of a baker or a seller of bread;
- (2) employed in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by a baker or a seller of bread"—

has made the following determination, namely :—

(1) That on the 17th June, 1937, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK (EXCEPT IN THE MILDURA DISTRICT).—That the times of beginning and ending work for all persons (other than stable workers) shall be:—

Time of Beginning.	Time of Ending.
5 a.m.	6 p.m. on ordinary days.
5 a.m.	7 p.m. on days during which bread for more than one day's consumption is delivered.

NOTE.—Section 32, Act 4275, provides that within the Metropolitan District:—

Every person—

(a) who before six o'clock in the morning or after six o'clock in the evening on any day carts or delivers bread on sale whether in a retail or wholesale way, and whether the same has been paid for or is to be paid for on or after delivery; or

(b) who causes any bread to be so carted or delivered—
shall be guilty of an offence. Penalty: Minimum one pound, maximum five pounds.

(4) OVERTIME.—(a) For stable workers—

In excess of 48 hours in any week 9d. per hour in addition to ordinary rates.

(b) For any other person—

(i) In the Mildura District—

In excess of the number of hours fixed as the week's work 9d. per hour in addition to ordinary rates.

(ii) except in the Mildura District—

Outside the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work .. 3s. per hour.

Within the hours fixed, in excess of the number of hours fixed as the week's work 9d. per hour in addition to ordinary rates.

(5) ALLOWANCE.—Any employee who is required to wear clean washable outer garments shall be paid 1s. per week in addition to ordinary rates.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—That double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Labour Day), King's Birthday, Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Royal Agricultural Show Act), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(7) DAY AND LATEST HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Thursday, at 5.30 p.m., shall be the day and latest hour for payment of wages.

(8) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(9) DEFINITION.—The expression "Mildura District," wherever occurring herein, shall be deemed to mean—

(a) the City of Mildura, and

(b) the Township of Merbein in the Shire of Mildura and such portions of the said Shire as are within a radius of 1 mile of the Red Cliffs Post Office and the Trymple Post Office respectively.
