PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AS TO PART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation bearing date the 23rd November, 1920, defining certain land in the Parish of Nyang as a township under the designation of "Nyang," so far as regards the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.:—

180 acres, more or less, Township of Nyang, Parish of Nyang, County of Weeah: Commencing at the south-east angle of the township; bounded thence by roads bearing N. 89 deg. 59 min. W. 10,720 links and N. 27 deg. 30 min. E. 2,254 links more or less, by a line bearing S. 89 deg. 59 min. E. 7,573 links more or less; and thence by a road bearing S. 46 deg. 29 min. E. 2,904 links more or less to the commencing point.—(N.174(3) (M.31408, M.17273).

PROCLAMATION

 REGULATIONS (No. 3).**

WHEREAS in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636) the Governor in Council did, on the 13th day of January, 1930, make Regulations entitled *Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 3)*: And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

PRESCRIBING A FURTHER ROUTE WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN AREA ALONG WHICH MOTOR OMNIBUSES FOR WHICH "REGULAR SERVICE" LICENCES ARE GRANTED MAY PLY FOR HIRE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the metropolitan area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such route, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in this Schedule hereunder:—

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 15 (1) (b) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928*, No. 3742, that the Orders in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 18th December, 1934, 20th March, 1935, 8th July, 1935, 12th August, 1935, 30th September, 1935, 7th January, 1936, 30th June, 1936, 24th August, 1936, 28th September, 1936, and 12th January, 1937, prescribing routes within the metropolitan area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

For *Route No. 7A* there shall be substituted the following route:—"Commencing at intersection of Sydney-road and Bell-street, via Bell-street, Main-street, O'Heas-street, Sussex-street, to Gaffney-street, returning via Gaffney-street, Fischer-street, O'Heas-street, Main-street, Bell-street to Sydney-road; with extension, via Bell-street to Coburg Town Hall, then Bell-street and Sydney-road to corner of Sydney-road and Sheffield-street between the hours of 7 and 8 p.m. and between the hours of 10 and 11 p.m. week days only, without interfering with minimum service."

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE PARISH OF CASTLEMAINE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 9th March, 1937, as a site for Supply of Gravel in the Parish of Castlemaine.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, papers, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of One shilling and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, marl, earth, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission, a deposit of any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of the stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.

The Council of the Borough of Castlemaine has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin made under sub-section 2, section 19, of the *Transport Regulation Act 1933*, and numbered 75, for or with respect to the use and the control and management of stands appointed in pursuance of sub-section 1 of the said section.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Transport Regulation Act 1933*, and of any and every other power thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. No person being the owner or driver of a commercial passenger vehicle within the meaning of the *Transport Regulation Act 1933* shall use or occupy any stand other than the stand appointed by the Council of the City of Moorabbin (hereinafter called "the Council") for such vehicle.

2. No person shall interfere with or alter or deface any marks made on the road, surface or elsewhere by the Council for the purpose of defining any stand appointed by the Council in pursuance of the provisions of sub-section 1 of section 19 of the *Transport Regulation Act 1933*.

3. No commercial passenger vehicle shall ply for hire from any place other than the stand appointed by the Council for such vehicles.

4. This By-law shall apply both to stands now appointed and to any stand or stands which may hereafter be appointed by the Council.

5. The owner or driver or person in charge of any commercial passenger vehicle shall obey all instructions given to him by any officer of the Council concerning the use of any stand so appointed.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Moorabbin. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the nineteenth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and confirmed the seventeenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

TOWN OF HORSHAM.

BY-LAW No. 23.

A By-law of the Town of Horsham made under Part VII., Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 23, for suppressing nuisances.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by 19 George V., number 3720, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Horsham order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Town" means the Town of Horsham.

"Council" means the Council of the Town of Horsham.

"Footway" means and includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the town habitually used by pedestrians and not vehicular traffic.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the town other than a footway.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. No person upon any street or footway shall—

(a) Sound or play upon any musical instrument, or

(b) Sing or harangue, or

(c) Cause or permit or suffer any sound or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, wireless set, gramophone or piano player, or the like—

so as to cause annoyance or obstruction to, or so as to be calculated to cause such annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto, or within the hearing thereof.

3. No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the town shall, within the hearing of any person being upon any street or footway or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto, make or cause or permit or suffer to be made upon such first-mentioned land or premises (whether by means of any amplifier, wireless set, gramophone, piano player, or otherwise), any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound such as is calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

4. (1) No owner or occupier of any land or premises within the town shall, upon such land or premises within the hearing of any person being upon any street or footway, or in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto—

(a) Sound or play upon any musical instrument or cause or permit or suffer any person so to do; or

(b) Cause or permit or suffer any sound or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, wireless set, gramophone or piano player, so as to cause annoyance to or as to be calculated to cause annoyance to any such other person as aforesaid.

4. (2) Any person other than such owner or occupier operating such wireless set, gramophone, or piano player as aforesaid, or otherwise concerned in the making of such outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound as aforesaid, shall also be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

5. No person upon any street or footway shall, after being required by any member of the Police Force or by any officer of the Council, or by any inmate of any house within fifty yards of such person to desist from causing annoyance or obstruction—

(a) Sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument; or

(b) Sing or harangue.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the town.

7. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Town of Horsham this 6th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

A By-law of the Shire of Barrarbool made under the Health Acts, and numbered 11, for repealing By-law No. 4, and for fixing fees for registration, and renewal, and transfer of registration of premises.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Barrarbool order as follows:—

1. Repeal.—By-law No. 4 of the Shire of Barrarbool, made under the Health Act 1919, is hereby repealed.
2. The following fees shall be payable for granting or annual renewal of registration of the following premises respectively:—

Nature of Premises; Fee Payable.

- (a) Offensive trade premises—One pound.
- (b) Cattle sale-yards—One pound.
- (c) Boarding-house—Ten shillings.
- (d) Common lodging-houses—Ten shillings.
- (e) Eating-houses—Ten shillings.

That the stallage, rents, tolls, and dues to be levied and paid in the Bass Shire Markets on stock, goods, wares, and merchandise as mentioned hereunder, brought therein, on and after the passing of this By-law, shall be as follows:—

No dues shall be payable in respect of any cattle taken into the market yards and exposed or offered for sale, and not sold or agreed to be sold.

If the live stock, implements, or other articles are not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market, another toll of One shilling per head for live stock, and One shilling each for every implement or other article shall become due each 24 hours in respect of live stock, implements, or other articles so omitted to be removed.

That the ordinary day of holding markets shall be—at market at Dalyston, the third Thursday in each month; and at market at Bass, the first Thursday in each month; but the markets shall also be open for the receipt and for sale of all such animals, goods, and commodities as the Shire Council shall permit to be sold therein, and on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day, from sunrise to sunset, as the Council may from time to time determine, except Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays, on which no business shall be transacted therein.

There shall be appointed by the Council, if it deems necessary, an Inspector for the said markets, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- (1) To see that the Market Regulations are observed.
- (2) To preserve order and regularity in the market.
- (3) To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as are deemed unfit for use, to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent sale thereof.

All tolls and dues chargeable under the said schedule shall be payable on the entrance of the articles into the markets, or prior to their leaving the markets, to the proper officer of the Council, or duly authorized person, and no live stock shall be taken out of the market by any person without obtaining written authority from the auctioneer selling the same, and any person wilfully omitting or neglecting to pay any of such tolls or dues, or taking out of the markets any such live stock without such written authority, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Any person who shall wilfully place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall wilfully refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector or his assistant to do so, or who shall wilfully place any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow, or other article in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector or his assistant, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this By-law.

No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, peg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork, without the consent, in writing, of the Council, or some person authorized by it in that behalf.

That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of live stock, produce, or other articles, shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class, in the presence of the Market Inspector or other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the live stock, produce, or other articles in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced; and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

That only one auctioneer at a time shall sell or offer for sale by public auction any live stock, produce, or other articles.

That the owner or his agent shall furnish to the Market Inspector the name of the auctioneer selling his particular live stock, produce, or other articles, also the number of each class offered for sale.

The auctioneers shall furnish a monthly statement on Council forms of all sales, and pay the Market Inspector the amount of dues owing.

The classification for sales in the markets shall be in the following order:—1st, sheep; 2nd, calves; 3rd, cattle; 4th, pigs; 5th, horses; 6th, fowls; 7th, fruit and produce; 8th, sundries.

Time limit.—Single pigs and calves, 1 minute per head; in lots, 3 minutes per lot. Single cattle, 1 minute per head; in lots, 3 minutes per lot. Horses, 3 minutes per head. Fowls, 1 minute per head. Sheep, 3 minutes per pen.

After lots have been drawn for priority of sale in each class, each auctioneer or his agent shall furnish the Market Inspector with the numbers of stock, both singly and in lots, to be offered for sale in each class by him. Upon receipt of such information, the Market Inspector will allot the total selling time for each auctioneer, and upon the expiration of such time allotted, such auctioneer shall immediately cease selling.

Late yardings shall not be offered for sale until after the completion of the time table as prepared by the Market Inspector, when the same order of preference will apply.

In the event of the total time claimed by all auctioneers for selling exceeding the total time available, a proportionate reduction of time for each auctioneer shall be calculated by the Market Inspector, and the time table so amended shall be adhered to.

Any auctioneer not present and proceeding with his sale when his time arrives to commence selling shall, besides being guilty of a breach of this By-law as hereinafter mentioned, forfeit his right to sell, and shall be placed at the foot of the list of auctioneers entitled to sell. Any auctioneer, upon being informed by the timekeeper that his proportionate time for selling has expired, shall immediately cease to sell, and the next auctioneer on the posted list shall occupy the position vacated. No auctioneer shall offer or cause to be offered any cattle a second time at the same market until all other sales are disposed of and completed, and before offering for sale by auction any animal or animals sold on the same day in the market, the auctioneer shall procure from the purchaser instructing him to re-sell, the selling agent's pass for same.

Any auctioneer or agent wilfully not proceeding with his sale as and at the time and times provided herein shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

Any person offering any cattle for sale in the market which are not sold, who shall afterwards sell the same privately, having wilfully neglected to first pay the proper dues, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

The Market Inspector shall be appointed by the Council, to whom all disputes with reference to or affecting the time, order, and otherwise of conducting the sales in the market by the auctioneers, shall be referred, and his decision shall be final.

Every person desiring to offer land, &c., for sale by public auction within the precincts of the market, shall previously obtain permission of the Council, and shall forthwith, on the determination of such sale, if a sale be made, pay to the Council or its proper officer, a fee of One shilling per centum on the total amount of the purchase on such sale.

Any person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach or non-observance of any of the provisions of the foregoing By-law, shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

For transfer of registration of any of the above-named premises—One shilling.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Kilmore.
