Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

LEVY BY THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in section 32 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337), the Chicory Marketing Board hereby recommends for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that for the purposes of the said Act, the Board be empowered in and for the year ending on the 31st August, 1937, to make a levy on, and to be paid by all producers of chicory in manner following (that is to say):—

Every producer of chicory shall, in and for the year ending on the 31st August, 1937, pay to the Chicory Marketing Board a levy at the rate of £1 for every ¼ acre, or part thereof, of the area planted by such producer with chicory during the year ending the 30th June, 1937. For the purposes of determining the amount of such levy, the area planted by a producer as aforesaid shall be deemed to be the area registered by him with the Chicory Marketing Board, pursuant to and in accordance with a regulation made on the 23rd March, 1937, under the above-mentioned Act, and published in the Government Gazette on the 24th March, 1937.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at .. ." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Acceptance of tenders will be notified in the *Government Gazette* and by letter to successful tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter, and the long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood be obtained from a State Forest Timber Reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the Forests Commission. Messmate wood will not be accepted.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement in such places as may be directed by the officer receiving the supply. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 5 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being caused, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, or failure to stack the wood in the places directed, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, provided that the contractor shall be given 48 hours' notice before purchases are made or the wood re-stacked at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Tender Board, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense incurred thereby, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. Accounts for firewood shall be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made through the Treasury, Melbourne.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, Commonwealth Treasury bonds, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days of acceptance of tenders to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount of the preliminary deposit required with each tender must be enclosed, and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque or bank draft, as the case may be.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the Elizabeth-street (Melbourne) Post Office.

6. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. 9. In the event of a difference of opinion as to the quality between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

10. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 4.

11. 14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE CYCLE TRADE BOARD.

NOTES.—(a) This Determination, on the 8th July, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not within the said district: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool: the town of Newtown and Chilwell: and the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Maryborough, and Sebastopol.

(b) RE APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.—On the 5th March, 1930, the trade of motor cycle mechanic was proclaimed an Apprenticeship Trade under the Apprenticeship Act 1927, and, so far as the Metropolitan District is concerned, the provisions of that Act and the Regulations thereunder determine the conditions of employment of apprentices indentured after 5th March, 1930, and of improvers permitted to enter the trade after 20th November, 1929.

These provisions, however, do not affect indentures of apprenticeship entered into before 5th March, 1930, or improvers employed prior to 20th November, 1929.

Particulars of such Regulations may be obtained on application to the Secretary, Apprenticeship Commission, Gisborne-street, Melbourne. Price 3d.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since 4th November, 1931, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a maker of bicycles, tricycles, or motor cycles, or of a maker of any part or parts (other than tires or engines) of a bicycle, tricycle, or motor cycle," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 8th July, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) ORDINARY WEEK'S WORK.—The number of hours which shall constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 44. Provided that, in any place where the principal work carried on is incidental to and directly connected with the employer's retail business, not more than two persons may be employed for a maximum of 46 hours per week without payment of overtime rates.

(4) **SHIFTS.**—

(a) *Day Shift.*—The hours of duty shall not exceed $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours per day for five days, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours on the day on which the statutory weekly half-holiday is observed locally, and shall be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 1 p.m. on the day upon which the statutory weekly half-holiday is observed locally, and between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the other working days of the week.

(b) *Afternoon, Night, or Other Shift.*—i. *Hours.*—The hours of duty on any shift other than a day shift shall be arranged mutually between the employer and the majority of the employees, providing that $9\frac{1}{2}$ hours shall be the maximum duration of such a shift.

ii. *Wages.*—The following percentages shall be added to the rates fixed for the day shift :—

During the first month's employment on such shift	10 per cent.
Thereafter	5 per cent.

A statement, setting out the ordinary daily working hours, shall be displayed conspicuously in the workshop.

(5) **CRIB TIME.**—Where three shifts are worked, shift workers shall be allowed, after four hours' work, a crib time of twenty minutes without deduction of pay therefor.

(6) **OVERTIME.**—

(a) For all work done (i) outside the ordinary working hours on any day or shift, or (ii) within the ordinary working hours on any day or shift but in excess of the number of hours fixed in clause (3), the rate of wages shall be time and a half for the first 4 hours and double time thereafter, such double time to continue to be paid until an employee has been relieved from work for at least 8 hours.

(b) Except as provided in the preceding sub-clause, in computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

(c) Any employee working overtime for a longer period than 2 hours shall be allowed 20 minutes' crib time (without deduction of pay) after the completion of his ordinary shift and after each additional 4 hours of work, unless a mutual agreement has been made for the taking of a longer period of rest without pay.

(7) **FIVE-DAYS' WEEK.**—Notwithstanding anything contained in clause (4) the ordinary week's work may be completed in five days, provided that the employer and the majority of his employees concerned mutually agree in writing.

(8) **TIME WAGES.**—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid of follows :—

(i) for time worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed in clause (3)—

(a) in any week in which two or more Public Holidays occur ..	At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum
---	---

(b) in any other week	At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum
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(ii) for time worked beyond the one-half mentioned in sub-clause (i), at the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(9) **SPECIAL RATE FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.**—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(10) **PIECE-WORK.**—The Board determines under the provisions of section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed in the rim-making department, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and that such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the minimum wage fixed for the said department.

(11) **SUPPLY OF MILK.**—Any person engaged for the greater part of his day's work at cleaning off joints by any method other than filing, shall be supplied free of charge by the employer with one pint of milk each day he is so engaged.

(12) **DEFINITIONS.**—

(a) "Afternoon Shift" shall mean any shift finishing after 6 p.m., but not later than midnight.

(b) "Night Shift" shall mean any shift finishing later than midnight, but not later than 8 a.m.
