AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF TRARALGON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Traralgon has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Traralgon aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

*Church-street.*—All that piece of land, being part of Crown portion 16, Parish of Traralgon, County of Buln Buln, and being that part of lot 10, block 9, on plan of subdivision No. 4864, lodged in the Office of Titles: Commencing at the south-westerly corner of said lot 10; thence by a line bearing north 3 deg. west 400 links; thence by a line bearing north 87 deg. east 75 links; thence by a line bearing south 3 deg. east 400 links; and thence by a line bearing south 87 deg. west 75 links to the point of commencement.

REGULATIONS (AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS).

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by the *Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act 1935*, in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations:—

*Procedure at Termination of Period of Suspension of Creditors' Rights.*

1. In the following Regulations, "Period of Suspension" shall refer to the period specified in a determination of the Board during which the rights and remedies of, whatever nature of a secured creditor against the farmer or any property, estate, interest, effects, or assets of the farmer have been suspended by the Board pursuant to section 31 (3) (a) of the *Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act 1935*.
2. A farmer and any secured creditor whose rights have been suspended by a determination of the Board may at a date earlier than the termination of the period of suspension consent to the Board making the adjustment provided in section 31 (3) (d) of the said Act of the secured debt of such secured creditor by executing and lodging with the Board the consent contained in the schedule hereto and numbered Form 22.
3. Such consent shall be executed by the farmer and the secured creditor in the presence of a justice of the peace.
4. At least thirty days before the termination of the period of suspension or if a farmer and a secured creditor have executed and lodged with the Board a consent in the terms of Form 22, then within seven days of the lodgment thereof the Board shall appoint a competent valuator and arrange with such valuator to value the asset or assets of the farmer upon which the secured creditor's secured debt is secured.
5. The Board shall furnish such valuator, the farmer, and the secured creditor with a description of the asset or assets to be valued.
6. Upon receipt of the valuation the Board shall forward a copy thereof to the farmer and to the secured creditor.
7. The farmer or the secured creditor may within fifteen days after receipt by him of a copy of such valuation by notice, in writing, to the Board object to the valuation of any portion thereof.
8. Every such objection shall be supported by the reasons therefor.

9. If the Board thinks that the reasons given in support of the objection are reasonable the Board shall—

- (a) arrange for another valuation as aforesaid by another competent valuator;
- (b) consider any valuation which the farmer or such creditor (as the case may be) has furnished to the Board with the notice of objection; and
- (c) thereupon itself determine the valuation.

10. Should the farmer or the secured creditor object as aforesaid to the valuation made in accordance with clause 4 hereof, the Board shall forward a copy of such objection and the reasons therefor to the secured creditor or the farmer (as the case may be), and the Board shall fix a day, time, and place when the Board proposes to consider and determine the valuation and to adjust the secured debt in accordance with section 31 of the said Act.

11. Should either the farmer or the secured creditor fail to object as aforesaid to the valuation the Board shall notify the farmer and the secured creditor accordingly, and shall fix a day, time, and place when the secured debt shall be adjusted by the Board in accordance with section 31 of the said Act.

12. Reasonable notice of the day, time, and place fixed under either of the preceding clauses 10 and 11 shall be given by the Board to the farmer and the secured creditor, and the farmer and the secured creditor may appear before and be heard by the Board thereon.

13. Should any question arise in any proceedings under these Regulations the Board may and at the request of either the farmer or the secured creditor shall call the farmer and the secured creditor before the Board for such question to be determined by the Board.

14. Should the farmer or the secured creditor request the Board to determine any question he shall lodge such request with the Board in writing, and the question to be determined shall be included in such request.

15. Such notice as the Board considers reasonable of the day, time, and place for the determination of such question shall be given to the farmer and to the secured creditor in such manner as the Board considers adequate under the circumstances.

16. Should the determination of the value of the asset or assets of the farmer or the adjustment of the secured debt in accordance with section 31 of the said Act, or should the determination of any question which has arisen in connexion therewith not be completed at the expiration of the period of suspension, then the Board may extend the period of suspension, but so that the period of suspension and the extended period shall not together exceed a period of five years.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, sand, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of Management of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, sand, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees as the Committee of Management directs shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, sand, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, sand, earth, marl, and gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management under or by virtue of this paragraph shall be paid by the said Committee of Management into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half year.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BAMAWM EXTENSION RECREATION PARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act 1928, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 2nd February, 1928, as a site for Public Park and Recreation in the Parish of Bamawm, and known as the Bamawm Extension Recreation Reserve.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for public meetings, dances, entertainments, cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.
3. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
4. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve or leave anything thereon which will injure any person.
5. No fires shall be lighted except where directed by the Committee of Management, and no refuse or material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.
6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Lands and Works.
7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1928.
8. No person shall erect any building or tent on the Reserve nor any booth nor any structure, nor offer for sale any articles therein without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall carry or discharge any firearms or airguns in the Reserve.
10. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter, on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for the purpose.
11. No person shall let publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

12. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION IN THE CITY OF HEIDELBERG AND KNOWN AS "HEIDELBERG PARK."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 14th May, 1935, as a site for Public Park and Recreation in the City of Heidelberg, and known as Heidelberg Park, in lieu of all Regulations heretofore in force which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with or damage the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or any property in the Reserve, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or leave bottles, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter therein.

2. No person shall climb or jump over any buildings, seats or fences in, on, or around the Reserve, lie on any seats, steps, gangways or landings, or sit in or on any gangway, steps or landing, or stick bills on, cut letters or marks on, write or otherwise deface buildings, seats, fences, gates, posts, or trees therein.

3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee of Management shall bring any horse or vehicle into plots of ground closed for plantation, garden, or other similar purposes.

4. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve except as hereinbefore provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the Reserve unless in the charge of adult friends or nurses.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the Reserve any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the authorized officer or servant of the Committee of Management, or by a police constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

7. The Committee of Management shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve, and to adopt and enforce a scale of charges for admission thereto, and also may make a charge for the admission of any motor car or other vehicle as provided hereinafter, but on not more than fifty-two (52) occasions in any one year.

8. The Committee of Management shall have the power to let the whole or any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of cricket, football and similar games, or for holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto, or may demand the full rental in advance or on such terms as shall be specified in the "written authority to use the ground."

9. No charge or fee for admission to the Reserve shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years, nor shall the charge for the admission or "parking" of any car or other vehicle exceed One shilling.

10. No person except the members of the Committee of Management and officers and employees of the said Committee on duty shall enter or drive or otherwise propel any motor car or other vehicle into any portion of the Reserve, when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Committee of Management.

11. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under these Regulations, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

12. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, hockey, lacrosse, or any like games in the Reserve, without the written authority of the Committee of Management and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall engage in training or, in cricket, football, tennis, hockey or lacrosse, or any like game in the Reserve on Sunday.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within the Reserve.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder, or interrupt in their work any of the employees of the Committee of Management engaged in the Reserve by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale, within the Reserve any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Committee of Management nor without the payment of such fee as the Committee of Management may by resolution determine.

18. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee of Management to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

20. No persons shall assemble in the Reserve for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meeting of a like character, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management.

21. No person shall light any fires in the Reserve, without the written consent of the Committee of Management, and then only where the coppers for supplies of hot water are provided.

22. No male over the age of six years shall enter any building, part of building or enclosure set aside for or being used by females, and no female over the age of six years shall enter any building, part of a building or enclosure set aside for or being used by males.

23. Any person driving any horse, motor car, or other vehicle into the Reserve shall tether such horse and "park" such car in such place and such manner as the authorized officer of the Committee of Management shall direct.

24. No person shall enter or leave the arena riding or driving any horse or driving any car or other vehicle at a speed or in any manner dangerous to the onlookers, nor shall a horse be ridden nor a vehicle or motor car be driven among any onlookers. Every such horse, motor car, or vehicle shall travel by the route provided from arena exist to park exit or to saddling paddock or car parking site or vice versa.

25. No person, except with the consent of the Committee of Management, shall ride any bicycle, motor cycle, tricycle, scooter, billy-cart, or other similar velocipede in the Reserve.

26. No person, without the consent of the Committee of Management, shall graze any horse, cow, sheep, or other animal within the Reserve, and any wandering stock or stock tethered without permission may be impounded by the Committee of Management or the duly authorized officer.

All costs recovered in proceedings for offences committed against the provisions of these Regulations shall be paid into the funds of the Committee of Management of the said Reserve.

The Council of the City of Heidelberg has been appointed a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW NO. 65.—BEING A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW NO. 36.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Acts and the Water Acts, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the Trust in that behalf doth hereby make the By-law following:—

By-law No. 36 of the Trust shall be, and the same is hereby amended, as follows:—

(1) In lieu of sub-clauses (a), (b), and (c) of clause 2, there shall be substituted the following sub-clauses:—

*Shipping.*

(a) To the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for use in shipping other than shipping owned by the said Commissioners at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons.

*Parks, Gardens, and Rockeries.*

(b) For parks, (but excluding areas used as football or cricket ovals, or sports grounds), gardens, and rockeries under municipal control at the rate of Sixpence per thousand gallons.

*Victorian Railways or Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners.*

(c) For the Victorian Railways Commissioners or the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for the use of such Commissioners at the rate of Sixpence per thousand gallons as prescribed under section 53 of Act No. 2109.

(d) In all cases other than the foregoing at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

(2) In lieu of sub-clause (b) of clause 4, there shall be substituted the following sub-clause:—

(b) Save as aforesaid, in every case where the supply is by measure the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be a quantity which, if charged for as provided by clause 2 (d) of this By-law, would give a sum of Ten shillings for any continuous period of six months, or portion of six months.

(3) In lieu of the third paragraph of clause 5 commencing with the words "For building" and ending with the words "Ten shillings" there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"For building or structural purposes, in the case of buildings or structures not exceeding Two hundred pounds estimated capital value, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence. In the case of buildings or structures exceeding Two hundred pounds but not exceeding Three hundred pounds estimated capital value, the charge shall be Five shillings. In the case of buildings or structures exceeding Three hundred pounds estimated capital value, the supply shall be by measure with a minimum charge of Ten shillings."

(4) Immediately after the first paragraph of clause 6, commencing with the words "no meter" and ending with the word "respectively," there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—

"Every meter of 2 inches internal diameter and under shall be provided with connexions of brass, copper, or lead, or other material approved by the Trust, and must be fixed in a position directed by the proper officer of the Trust.

(5) In lieu of the fifth paragraph of clause 8 as amended by By-law No. 48, commencing with the words "meters other" and ending with the words "each test," there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

"Meters other than such as are hired from the Trust will be tested at the office of the Trust, and the fees hereunder shall be charged for each test:—

½ inch, ¾ inch, and 1 inch	.. One shilling.
1½ inch, 1¾ inch, and 2 inches	.. Two shillings.
3 inches and 4 inches	.. Three shillings.
Larger sized meters	.. Fees to be fixed by arrangement."

(6) At the end of clause 10 add the following:—

The following provisions shall apply:—

*Use of Pipes of Copper, Brass or other Material Approved by the Trust.*

(a) Except with the consent of the Trust all new services of 2 inches internal diameter or under must be of brass, copper, or other material approved by the Trust.

(b) Renewals of existing services exceeding one pipe length must be effected in accordance with clause (a), and must extend from the main to the building line, or to the meter where the latter is fixed.

(c) Notwithstanding clause (b) no replacements of bends, elbows, or other fittings will be permitted in the thoroughfare except they be of brass, copper, or other material approved by the Trust.

(d) The foregoing stipulations shall apply to all service pipes between the main and the building line, or where a meter is fixed between the main and the meter.

(e) Connexion of the service at the main must be effected by an approved stop cock ferrule connected to the service by means of a 90 degrees bend of brass or other material approved by the Trust.

(7) At the end of clause 11 add the following:—

*Insulating Couplings.*

"If required by the Trust a service must be provided with insulating couplings approved by the Trust—one of such couplings must be fixed at the stop cock ferrule on the main, and the other must be fixed at the service crossing the building line, but where a meter is fixed the coupling shall be fixed at the outlet end of the meter connexions instead of at the building line."

(8) In lieu of portion of clause 20 commencing with the words "The service pipes" and ending with the words "repair the same," there shall be substituted the following:—

"The service pipe from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenement supplied by such service pipe, the owner or occupier shall, upon receiving notice that such service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same."

(9) From clause 38 the words following shall be omitted, namely:—

"For each such fire service there shall be paid a sum of One pound per annum after the fixing thereof."

## CITY OF ST. KILDA.

## BY-LAW NO. 117.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda, made under the Local Government Acts, and every other power in thereunto enabling, and numbered 117, for the purpose of suppressing nuisances and preserving public decency, and generally, for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and by every other power in thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda orders, as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "public place" shall have the meaning assigned to it in section 27 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*.

2. From and after the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, any person who for the purpose of prostitution—

(a) solicits or accosts any person being in or on any public place; or

(b) lingers in or about any public place within the view of any person

shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

3. From and after such date any person, who—

(a) being the tenant, lessee, or occupier, or person in charge of any premises uses or knowingly permits such premises or any part thereof to be used as a brothel, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution; or

(b) being the owner or lessee of any premises, or the agent of such owner or lessee, lets or sub-lets the same or any part thereof with the knowledge that such premises or some part thereof are or is to be used, as a brothel or for the purposes of, habitual prostitution or is wilfully a party to the continued use of such premises or any part thereof, as a brothel, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution,

shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. For every offence against any provision of this By-law the offender shall upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. This By-law shall apply throughout the whole of the municipal district of St. Kilda.
