## THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 12th day of November, 1930, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 18th day of December, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of December, 1930, are hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations."

2. After Regulation 23 of the Principal Regulations the following Regulation is inserted:—

23A. The master of a vessel proceeding inwards shall not enter the River Yarra whilst the following signals are exhibited:—

*In day-time*.—A black ball suspended from the yardarm 34 feet above high water on the mast erected on the Breakwater Pier, Williamstown.

*In night-time*.—(a) A fixed red light exhibited on the Breakwater Pier, Williamstown, 34 feet above high water and 10 feet vertically below the green navigation light; and/or

(b) A fixed red light exhibited 24 feet above high water and 6 feet vertically below the flashing green light on the beacon on the west side of the river entrance.

This Regulation shall not apply to self-propelled vessels of less than the following dimensions:—

Length, between perpendiculars	.. .. .	130 feet.
Breadth	.. .. .	26 feet.

RATING BY-LAW No. 16.

The Ballarat Sewerage District.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following Sewerage Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable seweraged properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

- (1) Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said District.

- (4) For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.
- (5) Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

## STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

AWARD NO. 34, OF 7TH DECEMBER, 1936, RELATING TO CONDITIONS OF WORK AT STATE COAL MINE, WONTHAGGI.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the *State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932* (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

## OVERTIME.

1. Overtime shall be:—

(i) In the case of workers who ordinarily work a day shift only—

(a) all time on duty beyond the usual daily spread;

(b) all time on duty before 7 a.m. or after 5.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday, inclusive, and before 7 a.m. or after 12 noon on Saturday, except in cases where the regular shift on Saturday is from 6 a.m. to 12 noon.

(ii) In the case of all other workers, all time on duty outside the usual rostered daily hours or beyond 8 hours from Monday to Friday inclusive and 6 hours on Saturday (as the case may be); and

shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

This provision shall not prejudice any greater benefits that may be conferred upon any worker under section 7 of the Coal Mines Regulation Act.

2. When a worker is required to work in such a way that he cannot commence his crib by the usual time or within a period of not less than 1 hour after such commencement, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the commencement of his usual meal time until he is permitted to commence his crib.

3. When a worker is required to continue his shift for more than 2 hours beyond the usual termination thereof without being notified in time to enable him before leaving home for work to provide himself with a meal, provision shall be made to procure a meal for him, or else he shall be paid 1s. 6d. in lieu thereof. Where it appears that such overtime work will extend over a long period, provision shall be made to procure a meal for him as soon as possible after the usual termination of his shift; thereafter he shall be dealt with in accordance with clause (4) hereof.

4. A worker working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of 20 minutes, without deduction of pay, after each 4 hours of overtime worked, and provision shall be made to procure a meal for him at each such crib interval, or else he shall be paid 1s. 6d. in lieu thereof.

5. When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, a time shall be stated from which he is to hold himself in readiness, and unless such call has been previously countermanded, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he has held himself in readiness.

6. When a worker, having left the employer's premises after completion of his ordinary shift, is recalled to work, he shall be paid at least as for four hours' work at ordinary rates, except where otherwise provided in any other award of this Tribunal.

#### SHIFT WORK.

1. Workers working on afternoon or night shift shall be paid at a rate of 7½ per cent. additional to their day shift rate.

2. If a worker who ordinarily works a day shift only is required to work shift work on at least 3 successive working days, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the first afternoon or night shift he works, and thereafter he shall be paid in accordance with Clause 1 for such shift.

3. In the case of shift workers, crib time of 30 minutes shall be included in the working time without deduction of pay.

#### SUNDAY AND HOLIDAY WORK.

1. Where the work of any grade of workers is so continuous over the whole week as to necessitate their being rostered for work regularly on Sundays and/or holidays, the rate for such work shall be time and a half; provided that any grade of workers who are at present being paid on the basis of a 6 hours shift for such work shall continue to be so paid.

2. The rate for all other Sunday and holiday work shall be double time.

3. Any worker called on to work on Sunday or a holiday shall be paid for at least 4 hours at ordinary rates, except where otherwise provided in any other award of this Tribunal.

"Holidays" shall mean the holiday specified in the Coal Mines Regulation Act or any other Act forbidding work at the State Coal Mine on any other day.

#### TRAVELLING TIME AND EXPENSES.

1. When a worker is required to work away temporarily from his ordinary location, all time reasonably spent outside his ordinary hours of work in travelling between his home and his temporary location on the State Mine coal field, in excess of ten minutes beyond the time usually spent in travelling between his home and his ordinary location shall be paid for at ordinary rates; and/or any expense reasonably incurred in such travelling, in excess of the expense usually incurred in travelling between his home and his ordinary location, shall be refunded to him.

2. The following allowances for travelling shall be paid to Drill Foremen, Drill Sub-foremen and Drill Assistants when:—

- (a) working at a location at least three miles in a direct line from the Wonthaggi Post Office—1s. per shift;
- (b) working at a location in the Kirrak Area within the three miles above specified—6d. per shift.

#### WET PAY.

1. Any surface worker who is required to work in a wet place for at least one hour during a shift, if not provided with clothing and/or footwear so as to protect him from getting wet, shall be paid 1s. extra for such shift, unless the wet conditions occur in the last two hours of the shift.

2. Any worker underground (other than a miner, brusher, wheeler, or a worker engaged in driving stone drives) who is required to work in a wet place for at least one hour during a shift, shall be paid 1s. 3d. extra for such shift unless the wet conditions occur in the last two hours of the shift; but this provision shall not apply to cases where at present workers are provided with protective clothing and/or footwear, which protects them from becoming wet.

3. A place shall be deemed to be wet when water other than rain is flowing or dripping from overhead to such an extent as to saturate the clothing of the worker and/or when the worker is required to work in water more than two inches deep.

4. The present practice relating to the payment of miners, brushers, wheelers and workers engaged in driving stone drives, working in wet places shall continue, except that the rates in such cases shall be 1s. 3d. in wet places and 2s. 6d. in extra wet places, unless altered by any Award of the Tribunal referring specifically to such rates.

#### PROVISION AGAINST WET WEATHER.

Workers (except those the nature of whose duties ordinarily requires them to work out in the open throughout the shift) who are required to work in the rain shall, as far as practicable, be provided with suitable clothing to protect them therefrom, but this provision shall not be construed in such a way as to deprive any other worker, at present provided with waterproof clothing, from such protection.

#### DIRT ALLOWANCE.

Dirt money at the rate of 1s. per shift or part thereof shall be paid to workers on the surface whilst engaged in stripping and replacing gear wheels of pumps and haulages which are covered with oil or grease, also stripping, repairing and replacing sprocket wheel of creeper chains and for work on creeper chains, screens and coal conveyors whilst in position, and which are covered with oil or grease, and for work done inside crank case engines, and generally for all work of a similar nature where the parts are covered with oil or grease; or (except in the case of a boiler cleaner) when working in the inside of any furnace, boiler pass, flue, uptake, or combustion chamber which is in a dirty condition.

#### HEAT ALLOWANCE.

Should any metal trade worker be required to perform work in any place where the shade temperature is raised by artificial means to 115 degrees Fahr. or more, he shall be paid 1s. 6d. per hour in addition to his ordinary rates.

#### WORK IN CONFINED SPACES.

Workers on the surface, working in a space, the dimensions of which necessitate their working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position or without proper ventilation, or where confinement within a limited space is productive of unusual discomfort, shall be paid 3d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rates.

This Award shall not apply to any worker engaged at the Montague Coal Depot, clerks, or workers for whom weekly rates are prescribed.

#### STATE COAL MINE INDUSTRIAL TRIBUNAL.

AWARD NO. 36 OF 15TH DECEMBER, 1936, RELATING TO RATES OF PAY OF CERTAIN WORKERS AT STATE COAL MINE.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

1. Sub-clause (a) of clause 8 of the agreement dated 6th March, 1916, is to be applied without any minimum limitation in respect of the vertical measurement. This provision to operate for a period of three months, and continue in force thereafter until superseded.

2. The following provision shall be added to clause (b) of Award No. 23:—

Where in crossing a fault by regrading or brushing under the provisions of this clause the whole height of the coal seam is not exposed, an additional payment shall be made at the rates payable in accordance with clause 8 of the said agreement, per inch vertical of the unexposed seam for every yard of the width of the roadway.

## RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION BOARD.

AWARD No. 49 OF 21ST DECEMBER, 1936, RELATING TO RATES OF SALARIES AND WAGES FOR THE YEAR 1936.

THE Railways Classification Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the Railways Act 1928 (No. 3759), hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

(1) The rates of salaries and wages to be paid to officers and employees during the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six shall be as set forth hereunder:—

- (a) Adult male employees (except gatekeepers) shall be paid a basic wage of 14s. per day subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 5th May, 1933, and 17th April, 1934 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, and 46, and in the schedule to this Award.
- (b) Adult male officers shall be paid a basic salary of £172 per annum, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in the Orders of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration dated 5th May, 1933, and 17th April, 1934 (Railway Award) respectively, and in addition the margins prescribed therein in the schedule to Award No. 20 of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, and 46, and in the schedule to this Award.
- (c) Adult male gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the basic wage.
- (d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therein in the schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.
- (e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therein in the schedule to this award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

(2) The rates prescribed for casual employees, junior employees and female employees are based on an adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall on the same dates be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

- (i) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.
- (ii) The rates of pay of junior employees, female employees, and of junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be).

Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male basic wage.

(3) (a) The Commissioners may make emergency deductions from the rates of pay of officers and employees, the maximum of which is to be determined by applying to the rates in force on the 3rd October, 1930, the same rate of reduction as is applied by the State Financial Emergency Act or any amendment thereof to similar or substantially similar rates of officers of the Public Service, and subtracting from this result the amount of the decrease in the basic rate subsequent to that date.

(b) The rates in force on the 3rd October, 1930, shall be deemed to include such rates as modified by any subsequent variation of the margins comprised therein now or hereafter in operation.

(c) Provided that no such deduction shall reduce the rate payable below that in operation on the 30th June, 1934, except to the extent of any decrease in the basic rate below that payable on that date.

(d) If such rate is so reduced it shall not be increased owing to any subsequent basic rate adjustment so long as the provisions of this Award relating to emergency deductions are applicable.

(e) Should any such rate be reduced by basic wage adjustment to an extent which renders the provisions of this Award relating to emergency deductions inapplicable, it shall not thereafter be increased by similar adjustment above the rate payable after the maximum emergency deduction determined as prescribed herein has been made, except to the extent that any such net increase since 3rd October, 1930, may exceed such maximum deduction.

(4) The amount of the emergency deduction made under the provisions of clause 3 hereof shall be calculated to the nearest pound or the nearest penny (as the case may be).

(5) The amount of any emergency deduction made by the Commissioners under the provisions of clause 3 hereof shall be deemed to be a deduction made under this Award.

(6) If in any period during the currency of this Award the Commissioners are bound to pay to any grade referred to herein the rate provided in respect of such grade in any other Award or in any agreement, undertaking or Act binding upon the Commissioners, then the rate prescribed herein shall not apply during such period, but there shall be payable in lieu thereof a rate not less than that provided in such other Award or in such agreement, undertaking or Act.

This clause shall not apply to the grades of exchange mechanic (leading hand), fitter (district), fitter-in-charge Class 2, fitter-in-charge Class 1, and fitter (senior leading hand).

(7) Any increase prescribed by this Award or as a result of the quarterly cost of living adjustments shall not entitle any officer to a salary exceeding £500 per annum.

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

His Excellency doth by this Order further provide, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 15 (1) (b) of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), that the Orders in Council approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council on the 18th December, 1934, and 17th June, 1935, prescribing routes within the Metropolitan area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted under the provisions of the said Act may ply for hire, shall be amended in the manner following:—

REGULATIONS AMENDED.

APPROVAL TO CONSTRUCT AN ELECTRIC TRAMWAY EXTENSION IN HAWTHORN-ROAD, BRIGHTON.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE QUEEN'S PARK PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, HEALESVILLE.**

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: And whereas the said Board in pursuance of such powers on

the 9th day of July, 1936, made certain regulations in respect of the land (hereinafter called the Reserve) temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 9th August, 1886 and 26th August, 1912 as a site for public recreation purposes in the Township of Healesville and known as "Queen's Park": Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following regulations in respect of the said Reserve in addition to and not in substitution for the said first-mentioned Regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, ride, drive or lead any animal in or upon the Reserve or any part thereof.

2. The Committee of Management may give such consent as aforesaid upon and subject to such terms and conditions as to it may seem reasonable, and any act done or suffered or omitted to be done in breach of or contrary to any such term or condition shall invalidate such consent and in such case such consent shall for all purposes be conclusively deemed never to have been given and the purpose in respect of which such consent was given never to have been authorized.

3. Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations or shall refuse or neglect to obey the lawful orders or directions of any authorized officer of the Committee of Management, may, without prejudice to any penalty to which he may be liable hereunder, be forthwith removed from the Reserve notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket or paid a fee entitling him to admission thereto.

The Council of the Shire of Healesville has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 and every person who knowingly and wilfully commits any offence against these Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ULLINA RECREATION RESERVE.**

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 12th November, 1923, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Smeaton, at Ullina, and known as "Ullina Recreation Reserve."

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or any holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall at any time take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BALLAN MINERAL SPRINGS RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act* 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 9th December, 1935, as a site for Public Purposes in the Parish of Moorarbool West, and known as "Ballan Mineral Springs Reserve."

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge at all times, except on such days not exceeding ten in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, musical performances, swimming or holiday amusements, and on any of such occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admittance of each adult person to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or be guilty of riotous or offensive behaviour.
3. No person shall light or use fires in the Reserve, except in the places set apart for such purpose, without the authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall jump or climb over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or in any way remove, displace, damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve.
5. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, property, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, cutting, embankment or path in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
6. No person shall remove, displace or damage any board, plate, pump, pipe, fitting or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
7. No person shall carry firearms into or through the Reserve or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds or remove fish therefrom, except with the authority of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
9. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1928.
10. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and for the tethering of horses, and no cars, vehicles or horses shall be parked or tethered in any portion of the Reserve other than in the portions set aside for the purpose, and the Committee of Management may make and fix such fees for the parking of vehicles and tethering of horses as it may determine, such fees not to exceed One shilling per day per horse or vehicle.

11. No person shall use closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals for any purposes other than that for which the same are constructed.

12. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

13. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except that specially set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to payment of such fees and to such other conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.

14. No person shall erect any building or any booth or any other structure in the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall interfere in any way with any springs or the taps or pipes connected therewith, or prevent or interfere with the flow of the mineral water within the Reserve, and no person shall fill and deliver for fee or reward or profit any cans or vessels with mineral water from any spring or springs in and upon the Reserve for use or consumption by any other person or persons without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and no person shall, without the like consent, remove or carry away any mineral water from the said spring or springs for fee, profit or reward for use or consumption by any other person or persons.

16. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be permitted to enter any swimming pool on the Reserve.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (g) Premises at or in any part of which eggs for sale are received or stored for the purpose of being chilled.—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (h) Cattle sale-yards.—One pound (£1).
- (i) For the transfer of registration.—Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Euroa.

### Conditions of Contract for Requisites, Education Department.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside this radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time being allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

10. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to be made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

11. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned.

12. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, *the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein.* He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 13. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

13. *Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.*

14. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

15. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor by post to the teacher to whom each parcel is directed, for him to sign and return.

16. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 7.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 12 and 13 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the *Customs Act 1901-35*, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. The foregoing provision, however, shall not apply to contracts for imported goods in which fixed and definite quantities to be delivered at stated times are expressed in the Schedules. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

20. Should an increase or reduction take place in the prices at present charged for books and school requisites contained in the said schedule hereto by the publishers or manufacturers, a corresponding increase or reduction shall be made to or by the contractors in the prices of the articles supplied by them. In case of any disagreement as to the amount of increase or reduction the same shall be decided and settled by the Director of Education.

21. Under no circumstances will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

## DETERMINATION OF THE QUARRY BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 22nd January, 1937, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since 13th October, 1924, has had the power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in—

- (1) the process, trade or business of quarrying not including agriculture;
- (2) (a) carting or driving, or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with or incidental to the trade or business of quarrying (not including agriculture);  
(b) the trade of crushing stone,"

has made the following determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 22nd January, 1937, the previous Determinations of the Quarry Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Any of the above times of beginning and ending may be varied on any job by mutual consent of the employer and the majority of the employees, but in no case shall the total length of any shift be increased.

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by any employee before or after his shift shall be time and a half.

(4) **TIME WAGES.**—Any person working on time wages in connexion with stonecrushing plants for less than the number of hours of an ordinary week's work, shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work, be paid the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

(5) **SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.**—Time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Labour Day, Good Friday, or Easter Monday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) **TOOLS AND APPLIANCES.**—That any employee on wages rates who is called upon to supply any or all of the following Tools or appliances, viz:—

Picks, shovels, wheelbarrows, face bars, banker bars, drills, jumpers, dressing hammers, spawling hammers, striking hammers, scabbling picks, or any other tools that may be necessary for the process of quarrying, shall be paid by the employer 3d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rates fixed by this Determination.

(7) **POWDER MONKEY.**—Powder monkey shall mean a person using or having charge of explosives during any portion of a week.

(8) **ASSISTANT POWDER MONKEY.**—Assistant powder monkey shall mean a person who assists a powder monkey. Provided that if, in the absence of the powder monkey and/or for any other reason, he carries out the duties of a powder monkey, he shall be paid at the rate fixed for such person.

(9) **SANITATION.**—Proper sanitary conveniences shall be provided by the employer for the use of employees.

(10) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—An employee kept waiting for his wages on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after—

- (a) the usual time of ceasing work in the case of a person not working overtime, or
- (b) his time of ceasing work in the case of a person working overtime,

shall be paid at overtime rates after that quarter of an hour with a minimum of a quarter of an hour.

(11) **SHELTER SHEDS.**—Shelter sheds, to give reasonable protection to the employees, shall be provided by the employer.

(12) **CARRYING OF WORKING TOOLS.**—All time occupied by an employee in carrying his working tools—

- (a) into or out of the quarry, or
- (b) for a greater distance than 100 yards to or from the face of the quarry;

shall be paid for at the rate fixed in this Determination for the class of work usually performed by him.

(13) **MEAL INTERVAL.**—In places where only one shift is worked, each employee shall have not less than one hour meal interval each day.

(14) **PIECE-WORK.**—The lowest piece-work prices to be paid to persons engaged in the undermentioned work shall be—

All stones for pitchers or cubes shall be plugged and placed on the banker ready for persons engaged knocking out and dressing.

## DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4 (BUTCHERS, COUNTRY).

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 23rd January, 1937, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, the *Wages Board* appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd January, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.**—

Any of the above times may be varied by mutual consent, but in no case shall the total spread of hours be increased.

(4) **OVERTIME.**—The following rate shall be paid for all work done:—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 3 . . . . . } Time and a half.
- (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause 3 in excess of 48 hours in any week . . . . . }

(5) **MEAL INTERVALS.**—(a) One hour shall be allowed for a meal between noon and 2 p.m.  
 (b) Where an employee is required to commence duty before 7.30 a.m., one hour shall be allowed for breakfast.

(6) **PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.**—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Anzac Day, and one Pionic Day in each year.

(7) **ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.**—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted six days' holiday in each year on full pay.

(8) **SICK LEAVE.**—All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness shall be allowed six days' sick leave each year on full pay providing satisfactory evidence is produced to the management or employer within 24 hours of the usual hour for commencing work.

(9) **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(10) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
