ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 4467. "An Act to amend the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (Contributions) Act 1927.*"
No. 4468. "An Act relating to the Publication of the Reports of Parliamentary Debates."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this tenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS, AND FOR THE ADMISSION OF SUCH CANDIDATES TO PRACTICE.

The 15th day of June, 1937.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1928*, the said Council hereby makes the following Rules and alterations to its Rules:—

1. The Rules of the Council of Legal Education made the 29th day of December, 1932, as amended and added to by the Rules of the said Council made respectively on the 26th day of March, 1935, and the 21st day of May, 1936, are herein-after referred to as "the existing Rules".

2. Rule 4 of the existing Rules is amended by inserting after the words "Commonwealth Practitioner" the words "or a New Zealand Practitioner".

3. Division 2 of Part II. of the existing Rules is amended—

(a) By inserting in the heading to the said Division after the word "Commonwealth" the words "New Zealand".

(b) By inserting after Rule 10 the following new Rules:—

10A. "New Zealand Practitioner" means any Barrister and Solicitor or Barrister or Solicitor of the Supreme Court of New Zealand who has

been in practice before that Court for not less than three years.

10B. Any New Zealand Practitioner who has resided in Victoria for at least five months immediately preceding the day upon which he causes to be delivered to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners the statement required to be given under Rule 36 (b) may, subject to the payment of the fees now or for the time being prescribed by law or any Rule of the Supreme Court, and to compliance with such of these Rules as are applicable to his case, be admitted to practise as a Barrister or Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

4. Rule 36 of the existing Rules is amended by inserting after the words "Commonwealth Practitioner" the words "and every New Zealand Practitioner" and by deleting the word and figure "and 3" and inserting in lieu thereof the word and figures "3 and 5".

5. Schedule F of the existing Rules is amended by inserting after clause 4 thereof the following clause:—

"5. (In the case of Commonwealth, New Zealand, and British Practitioners) Qualification for admission with relevant dates."

6. Schedule H of the existing Rules is amended—

(a) By inserting in the heading thereof after the words "Commonwealth Practitioner" the words "New Zealand Practitioner".

(b) By inserting in clause 1 of the said Schedule after the words "state qualification relied upon" the following:—"and in the case of a New Zealand Practitioner the period of practice before the Supreme Court of New Zealand with relevant dates".

(c) By inserting after clause 10 of the said Affidavit the following clause:—

"11. (And in the case of a New Zealand Practitioner) I have continuously resided in Victoria from the _____ day of _____, 19____, to the _____ day of _____, 19____."

PUBLIC SERVICE OF VICTORIA.—VACANCIES.

Duties.—To have charge of the Appropriation ledgers and of the accounts relating to Advances from the Public Account; to examine the accounts of the Departments of Lands, Agriculture, and Police; and to have charge of the distribution of expenditure vouchers.

Qualifications.—A thorough knowledge of Treasury and audit procedure and of the Audit Act and General Regulations respecting public accounts. An intimate knowledge of the system of Treasury accounts is essential.

Third Class Clerk, Department of Public Instruction.

Duties.—To have charge of the Buildings Branch; to deal with applications for the establishment and closing of schools, selection of sites, leasing of buildings and provision of furniture, and remodelling and repairs to school buildings and residences; to advise as to expenditure of grants to school committees; to make recommendations in regard to allowances for the conveyance of children to elementary schools, and to conduct correspondence in connexion therewith.

Qualifications.—To be able to conduct inquiries as to the establishment of State schools, to understand plans of buildings, and to control and direct a staff; to possess good organizing ability, tact, and judgment; to have an intimate knowledge of departmental organization and procedure.

Fourth Class Clerk, Office of the Public Service Commissioner, Department of Premier.

Duties.—To have charge of registration; to prepare certificates, recommendations, &c., for the Commissioner's signature; to assist in the preparation of the Classified List of Officers, statistics, &c.

An applicant must be a good typist, and be well acquainted with the provisions of the Public Service Act and the Regulations thereunder.

Fourth Class Clerk, Taxation (Income Tax) Branch, Department of Treasurer. (Two vacancies.)

- (1) *Duties.*—To act as Shipping Clearance Officer, and in that capacity to deal with applications for taxation clearances from persons about to leave Australia, and, before issuing such clearances, to take the necessary action to ensure that all liability for taxation under the State and Federal Income Tax Acts, the Sales Tax Assessment Act, and the Wool Tax Assessment Act is discharged or provided for by acceptable guarantees.

Qualifications.—Practical experience in the operations of the Acts set out and of the routine and practice of the various State and Federal Taxation Offices with respect to shipping clearances; a good knowledge of shipping and passport procedure generally, and ability to conduct, with tact and expedition, interviews with overseas travellers or their representatives.

- (2) *Duties.*—To assess income tax returns of large businesses and partnerships generally for State and Federal purposes.

Qualifications.—To have an intimate knowledge of the State and Federal Income Tax Acts, Regulations, rulings, and procedure thereunder, and the general routine of the office. To have a practical knowledge of accountancy.

Fourth Class Clerk, Department of Lands and Survey. (Two vacancies.)

- (1) *Duties.*—To deal with tenders for sale and leasing closer settlement lands and sales of Crown lands; to supervise general accounts relative thereto; to prepare Orders in Council, contracts of sales, and transfers.

Qualifications.—A knowledge of those sections of the Closer Settlement, Land, Local Government, and Transfer of Land Acts which relate to sales conducted by the Department; tact in dealing with the general public.

- (2) *Duties.*—To supervise the administration of Part 42 of the *Local Government Act 1928* (Unused Roads and Water Frontages).

Qualifications.—A good knowledge of Part 42 of the Local Government Act, the Land Acts and the procedure thereunder.

Fourth Class Clerk, Department of Public Instruction.

Duties.—To deal with correspondence in regard to examinations; to act as Secretary to the Board of Examiners; to arrange details for the holding of examinations for teachers and pupils; to record results of examinations; to arrange for examinations for the University of London.

Qualifications.—To possess good organizing ability, tact, and judgment; to have a good knowledge of departmental organization and procedure and of the regulations relating to examinations and qualifications of teachers and pupils.

Typist and Assistant (Male), Audit Office, Department of Premier.

PORT FAIRY WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Borough of Port Fairy for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, and for a loan subject to the provisions of the said Acts to carry out works for the supply of the Township of Port Fairy with water, and doth order and appoint as follows:—

- 1. The construction of the said waterworks.
2. That the Councillors for the time being of the Borough of Port Fairy and one other person shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.
3. That the amount of the loan to be granted to such Trust shall be Twenty-four thousand (£24,000).
4. That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

PORTION 1.

Reticulation Area.

Commencing at the intersection of the western boundary of J. Atkinson's Special Survey, Parish of Belfast, County of Villiers, with the high water mark of the Southern Ocean; thence northerly along the aforesaid western boundary of J. Atkinson's special survey to its intersection with a line parallel to and distant 500 links northerly from the northern boundary of the Hamilton-road; thence south-easterly and easterly by lines parallel to and distant 500 links northerly from the northern boundary of the Hamilton-road to a point on a line parallel to and distant 500 links westerly from the western boundary of the Warrnambool-road; thence northerly by lines parallel to and distant 500 links westerly from the western boundary of the Warrnambool-road to the centre line of the Warrnambool-Port Fairy railway; thence continuing northerly by a line parallel to and distant 500 links westerly from the western boundary of the Warrnambool-road for a distance of 1,700 links; thence easterly by a line to the intersection of the town boundary of Port Fairy with the left bank of the Moyne River; thence south-easterly along the aforesaid town boundary to the high water mark of Port Fairy Bay; thence southerly and westerly along the high water mark of Port Fairy Bay and the high water mark of the Southern Ocean to the point of commencement.

PORTION 2.

Pipe Tracks.

Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 7, Parish of Belfast, County of Villiers, being a point on the western boundary of the reticulation area; thence by a strip of land 33 feet in width, being 16 1/2 feet on either side of the centre line of the main pipe line, westerly, north-westerly, and northerly through Crown allotments 7, 2, 3, 10A, 5, and 17 to the site of the reservoir in Crown allotments 19 and 17; and commencing at a point in Crown allotment 17, being a point on the main pipe line; thence easterly by a strip of land 33 feet in width, being 16 1/2 feet on either side of the centre line of the branch pipe line, through Crown allotment 17 to the site of the reservoir in Crown allotments 17 and 16.

PORTION 3.

Reservoirs.

A site in Crown allotments 19 and 17, Parish of Belfast, County of Villiers, comprising the site of a reservoir; and a site in Crown allotments 17 and 16, Parish of Belfast, County of Villiers, comprising the site of a reservoir.

5. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of reservoirs, pipe mains, service basin, pumping plant, stand-pipe, and pipe reticulation of the Township of Port Fairy.

6. That the name of the Trust shall be the Port Fairy Waterworks Trust.

EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 43 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337), doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board" Regulations 1937.
2. For the purposes of these Regulations—
 - "Act" means the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337).
 - "Board" means the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board constituted and appointed under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*.
 - "Board's Mark" means any mark or stamp placed by the Board upon eggs to denote that they are or have been the property of the Board.
 - "Grading" means candling, weighing, and branding.
 - "Person" includes a firm or corporation, but does not include the Board.
 - "Producer" means a producer as defined by the Act who produces eggs within the State of Victoria.
 - "Quality" means any one of the qualities prescribed by these Regulations.
 - "Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.
 - "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board, and includes any person appointed by the Board to act as Secretary during the absence of the Secretary.
 - "Sell" includes barter and exchange and to offer or attempt to sell or display for sale or receive for sale or have in possession for sale or expose for sale or send forward or deliver for sale or cause or suffer or allow to be sold and offered or exposed for sale, but refers only to selling for consumption or use by man.
3. The Board shall meet regularly on such dates, not being less than once in every month, at such place or places and at such times as shall be fixed by the Board.
4. The Chairman may, and, if requested in writing by any two members of the Board, shall call a special meeting of the Board at any time.
5. Every member of the Board shall be presided over by the Chairman, who shall be elected annually. In the absence of the Chairman, at the time appointed for the holding of any meeting the members of the Board present shall elect from amongst their number a person to be Deputy Chairman of such meeting.
6. The Secretary shall cause to be delivered to each member of the Board two clear days before any ordinary or special meeting, a notice of such meeting containing a statement of the business to be dealt with at such meeting, provided that, if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable to do so, shorter notice may be given of any special meeting.
7. If at the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, one-half hour from the time so appointed shall be allowed for the formation of a quorum, and if at the expiration of that period no quorum is present, the meeting shall lapse.
8. If a special meeting lapses through the absence of a quorum, the business set down for such meeting shall be the business, or included in the business, of the next ordinary meeting, or of a special meeting summoned as prescribed in Regulation 4.

9. Save as is hereinafter provided, at any special meeting no other business shall be dealt with than that which is set out in the notice relating to such meeting.

10. The order of business at any meeting shall be as follows:—

- (i) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
- (ii) Matters arising from the minutes of previous meeting.
- (iii) Correspondence.
- (iv) Receipts, accounts, finance, and like matters.
- (v) Matters relating to servants, agents, and officers of the Board.
- (vi) General business.

11. The Chairman or Deputy Chairman shall determine all questions of pre-audience.

12. At all meetings of the Board, save as herein otherwise provided, every member present shall vote. If a member refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

13. The members present at a meeting may, from time to time, adjourn the meeting.

14. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members three days at least before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.

15. The Secretary shall keep proper minutes of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board, which shall be submitted to the members for confirmation, and when confirmed, the Chairman of the meeting at which they were confirmed shall sign them, and they shall be preserved by the Secretary. Any entry in the minute book, and signed by the Chairman, that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

16. There shall be conspicuously displayed every twelve months in the Board's public office a full and explicit statement of the Board's receipts and expenditure, stock transactions, and liabilities for the period since the last preceding statement was so displayed.

17. At least every year there shall be conspicuously displayed a full and explicit balance-sheet of the Board, audited in accordance with section 11 of the Act.

18. The statement and balance-sheet referred to in Regulations 16 and 17 shall remain displayed until they are replaced by any subsequent statement and balance-sheet, and shall be available for perusal and copying at reasonable hours by any person.

19. (i) The Secretary or other officer authorized by the Board shall receive and account for all moneys paid to the Board, and each day shall deposit moneys received by him at a bank selected from time to time by the Board. Only the Secretary or other officer authorized by the Board may endorse cheques for collection on behalf of the Board. All cheques so endorsed shall be passed through the Board's bank account.

(ii) All accounts due and payable by the Board other than accounts due to producers in respect of the delivery of eggs to the Board shall, before payment, be passed by the Board, provided that in cases of necessity payments may be made out of a Manager's Advance Account established for the purpose without such prior approval in anticipation of and subject to the confirmation of the Board at its next regular meeting following any such payment or payments. The Manager's Advance Account shall not exceed seven hundred pounds (£700).

(iii) Payments to producers in respect of eggs delivered to the Board shall be made by cheque signed in the manner provided for in sub-clause (v) (a) hereof.

(iv) All accounts paid out of the Manager's Advance Account shall be by cheque signed by the Manager and the Secretary or Accountant.

(v) Subject to the provisions of sub-clause (iv) of this Regulation—

(a) all accounts exceeding Two pounds due by the Board shall be paid by cheques signed by any one member of the Board and counter-signed by the Secretary or Accountant;

(b) all accounts not exceeding Two pounds due by the Board may be paid from a petty cash account, the standing balance of which shall not at any time exceed the sum of Fifty pounds (£50).

20. The Board may, in every sale or agreement for sale of eggs by the Board to any person, insert conditions and fix a sum as and by way of liquidated damages for any breach of condition, which damages shall be recoverable accordingly.

21. Correspondence shall be signed by the Chairman, Secretary, manager, or other person authorized by the Board.

22. All contracts and agreements not under seal when approved by the Board shall be signed for and on behalf of the Board by a member of the Board and by the Secretary, or by two members of the Board.

23. The common seal of the Board shall not be affixed to any document except with the authority of the Board. The Secretary shall have the custody of the seal which shall be kept under lock and key in such place as the Board directs.

In every case where the common seal is authorized to be affixed to any document, such seal shall be affixed only in the presence of at least two members of the Board (one of whom shall be the Chairman or Deputy Chairman), who shall sign every such document, which shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

24. The certificate to be issued by the Board to the producer in accordance with section 24 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule.

25. The Board may replace any lost or damaged certificate issued in accordance with section 24 of the Act, provided that such duplicate certificate shall be clearly stamped across the face thereof with the words "Duplicate only."

26. The notice to be given by any person claiming to be entitled to any bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, or other encumbrance whatsoever, of or upon or over any of the commodity delivered to the Board or claiming to be the true owner of such commodity shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule.

27. The notice to be given by a producer in accordance with section 28 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule.

28. The periods of time for the purpose of computing payments to producers of eggs in accordance with subsection 1 of section 23 of the Act, shall be the period commencing on the day appointed for the vesting of the commodity up to and inclusive of the Saturday preceding the first Monday in the month of July, 1938, in respect of eggs delivered to the Board, and in respect of eggs delivered to the Board after such period, shall be the period commencing on the first Monday in the month of July of each year, and terminating upon the Saturday next preceding the first Monday in the month of July in the next following year.

GRADING, PACKING, DELIVERY, AND MARKETING OF EGGS.

29. Any exemption granted by the Board from the operation of section 19 of the Act shall be on the following terms and conditions:—

- (i) The producer of the eggs to which an exemption applies—
 - (a) shall permit any member of or person authorized by the Board to enter at any reasonable time any land, building, or premises of the producer for the purpose of inspection thereof, and to inspect any books, accounts, registers, documents, or writings in the custody or control of the producer relating to his business as such producer, and to take notes, copies, or extracts thereof or therefrom, and shall truthfully answer any question relating to such books or accounts, or to any eggs produced by him;
 - (b) shall not, without the consent of the Board, use such eggs for any purpose other than that for which the exemption was granted;
 - (c) shall not, without the consent of the Board, place such eggs in cold storage or preserve them by any process for subsequent sale;
 - (d) shall not sell any of such eggs for less than the price charged at the time of such sale by the Board for eggs of the like quality and grade;
 - (e) shall, if more than 25 adult female fowls or ducks are kept on the holding owned or occupied by him, deliver to the Board not later than the seventh day of each month a return showing the number of eggs produced during the previous month, the method by which they were disposed of, and the prices obtained for any such eggs sold.

30. An exemption shall not apply in the case of a producer on whose holding more than 25 adult female fowls or ducks are kept unless he has made application, in writing, to the Board for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which the exemption is sought, and the Board has granted such exemption in his case.

31. There shall be two qualities of eggs of the domesticated fowl, namely:—

“First Quality” eggs, which shall consist of eggs—

- (a) the shells of which are clean, uncracked, and free from stain, and which are not thin, porous, rough, or misshapen;
- (b) which, when candled, are free from blood spots, the yolks of which are translucent or but faintly visible, the whites of which are translucent and firm, and the air cells of which are not more than three-sixteenths of an inch in depth.

“Second Quality” eggs which shall consist of eggs which do not conform to the quality or description of “First Quality” eggs, but which are fit for human consumption, and are not cracked.

32. Each quality of eggs of the domesticated fowl shall be divided into three grades, namely:—

“Hen,” which shall consist of eggs of not less than $1\frac{3}{4}$ oz. each in weight, with an average weight of not less than 24 oz. to the dozen.

“Medium,” which shall consist of eggs of not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. each in weight.

“Pullet,” which shall consist of eggs of not more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. or less than $1\frac{1}{4}$ oz. each in weight.

33. There shall be one quality of duck eggs, namely:—

“First Quality,” which shall consist of eggs which are fit for human consumption, and are not cracked.

34. Duck eggs shall be divided into two grades, namely:—

“Duck,” which shall consist of eggs of not less than $2\frac{1}{4}$ oz. each in weight, and “Medium Duck,” which shall consist of eggs which are less than $2\frac{1}{4}$ oz. each in weight.

35. No producer shall deliver any eggs to the Board in any container unless the container is legibly marked on the end thereof with the following particulars:—

- (i) the words “Board eggs only”;
- (ii) the name and address of the person, firm, or corporation by whom or by which the eggs were packed, or the name and address of the producer.

36. The certificate of refusal to be given to a producer in accordance with section 22 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule.

37. (1) Any officer, servant, or employee of the Board duly authorized by the Board in that behalf may from time to time, and at any time by notice in writing order any producer, resident who owns or controls, or has at any time during the period of twelve months immediately preceding such notice owned or controlled more than 25 fowls, or upon whose premises there are, or have been at any time during such preceding period as aforesaid, more than 25 fowls, to furnish to him a return in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule, setting out the number of eggs produced by such fowls during such period or periods as may be specified in such notice, the manner in which, and the names and addresses of the person or persons to whom such eggs were disposed of.

(2) Such return shall be signed by the producer so ordered, whose signature thereto must be duly attested by a justice of the peace.

(3) Any producer who omits to furnish such return to such person so authorized within the time specified in the notice, and any producer who furnishes a return which is incorrect in any particular shall be guilty of a contravention of these Regulations.

38. No person shall, within Victoria, market, sell, display for sale, or store any egg—

if any such egg is stamped or marked with any stamp or mark which so closely resembles the Board's mark as to be likely to deceive or mislead any purchaser or intending purchaser thereof.

39. No person shall, within Victoria, market, sell, display for sale, or store any eggs if—

- (a) Two or more grades or qualities of such eggs are contained in the same container.
- (b) Eggs bearing the Board's mark are contained in the same container with eggs not so marked.

40. (1) Any member, officer, servant, or employee of the Board duly authorized by the Board in that behalf may at any reasonable time during the day enter upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting any eggs displayed for sale or held in such premises, and may take such sample or samples of any such eggs which do not comply with the provisions of these Regulations or any of them, and may inspect any books, accounts, invoices, registers, documents, or writings, in or upon such premises relating to any such eggs, and may take notes, copies, or extracts thereof or therefrom.

(2) Any person who obstructs any person so authorized, and any person carrying on business in such premises who refuses to produce such books, accounts, invoices, registers, documents, or writings, or to answer any question relating to such books, accounts, invoices, registers, documents, or writings, or to any eggs displayed for sale or held in or upon such premises, or who wilfully gives any untruthful answer to any such questions, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(3) Any person carrying on business in such premises, shall, if requested so to do by a person so authorized, state in writing the name and address of the person from whom any eggs displayed for sale or held in such premises were purchased, consigned, or supplied.

41. No person shall within Victoria—

- (a) display for sale by retail any eggs unless there is placed in a readable position upon the eggs or upon the container containing the eggs or within six inches of such eggs or receptacle a card on which is printed, stencilled, or written in letters not less than one-half an inch in height and three-thirty-secondths of an inch in thickness the words "Eggs—Produce of" together with the full name of the country or, if produced within Australia, of the Territory or State in which the eggs were produced, and shall add to such card in type of not less than three-quarters of an inch in height and five thirty-secondths of an inch in thickness, a description of quality in the words "First Quality", "Second Quality", and grade in the words "Hen", "Medium", "Pullet", "Duck", or "Medium Duck",
- (b) sell to any person eggs of a quality or grade different from the quality or grade which such person asks or requests to be supplied with.
- (c) display for sale by retail any eggs in such position that the eggs are exposed to the sun for more than three hours in any one day; or
- (d) display for sale by retail any eggs packed in bulk against shop windows.

42. No person shall within Victoria sell any eggs on which is displayed or in reference to which is displayed any notice, placard, sign, or advertisement, containing any untrue description of the quality, grade, or State or country where the eggs were produced.

EGG PULP.

43. Egg pulp shall be prepared and packed as prescribed hereunder :—

- (a) All eggs shall be individually submitted to the candling test and every egg found to be unsound or abnormal in appearance shall be rejected.
- (b) Every egg shall be broken singly by hand into a small vessel capable of being easily cleansed and effectively sterilized by heat.
- (c) Whenever an unsound or abnormal egg is broken into any vessel such vessel shall not be used again until it has been cleansed and sterilized.
- (d) Subject to a method approved by the Board the pulp shall be blended and strained and packed in new containers and such containers shall be removed forthwith after being packed to the refrigerator for freezing purposes.

44. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty pounds (£50).

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE MANUFACTURING CHEMISTS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 13th August, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and such portion of the Shire of Buninyong as is within a radius of 5 miles of the Ballarat Post Office.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) a wholesale or a manufacturing chemist;
(b) manufacturing toilet preparations, perfumery, essences, essential oils, food preservatives, branding fluids, deodorants, disinfectants, fungicides, insecticides, vermin destroyers, weed destroyers,"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 13th August, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(4) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid—

(a) in any week in which two or more Public Holidays At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(b) in any other week ^{occur} At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

(5) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—All work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Easter Monday, Good Friday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above holidays, the special rates shall be payable only for the days so substituted.
