NOTICE OF INTENTION TO FIX A BAG LIMIT FOR MACQUARIE PERCH TAKEN FROM THE BARWON AND MOORARBOOL RIVERS AND THEIR TRIBUTARIES.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation providing that no person shall on any one day during the period from the first day of December in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive), take from the Barwon or Moorarbool Rivers or their tributaries more than five (5) Macquarie Perch, or have in his possession more than five (5) such fish taken from the said waters.

BY-LAW No. 66.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year
Commencing on the First Day of July, 1937.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes other than by measure:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £20—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £20—One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £5—Five shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £5—One shilling in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1937, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1938, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the thirteenth day of August, 1937, and the first day of January, 1938.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates with the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

MAIZE MARKETING BOARD REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 43 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337), doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Maize Marketing Board" Regulations 1937.

2. Interpretation of Terms.—In construing these Regulations, the following words, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"The Act" means the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935* (No. 4337).

"Board" means the Maize Marketing Board, constituted and appointed under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*.

"Person" includes any body of persons corporate or unincorporate, and any firm of partners.

"Producer" means a producer as defined by the Act who produces maize within Victoria.

"Schedule" means the Schedule to these Regulations.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Maize Marketing Board and includes any person appointed by the Board to act as Secretary during the absence of the Secretary.

3. At all meetings of the Board at which the Chairman is present he shall preside. In the absence of the Chairman through any cause whatsoever the Board shall elect from those members in attendance one who shall be Deputy Chairman for that meeting.

4. The Board shall meet on such dates, at such places, and at such times as the Chairman may in his discretion from time to time determine, but the Chairman, if so requested by any two members of the Board, shall call a special meeting of the Board at any time.

5. The Secretary shall cause to be delivered to each member of the Board a notice, in writing, or by telegraph, of any ordinary or special meeting, two clear days before the date of such meeting, provided that, if in the opinion of the Chairman it is desirable in the case of an emergency to do so, shorter notice may be given to each member of any special meeting.

6. If at the time appointed for a meeting a quorum is not present, one-half hour from the time so appointed shall be allowed for the formation of a quorum, and, if at the expiration of that period no quorum is present, the meeting shall lapse.

7. If the meeting lapses through the absence of a quorum the business set down for such meeting shall be the business, or included in the business, of the next meeting of the Board.

8. At all meetings of the Board, save as herein provided, every member shall vote.

9. The Secretary shall keep proper minutes of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board, which shall be submitted to the members for confirmation, and, when confirmed, shall be signed by the Chairman. Any entry in the minute book, and signed by the Chairman, that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

10. All correspondence shall be signed by the Chairman, Secretary, Manager, or other person authorized by the Board.

11. The Secretary or any other person authorized by the Board shall receive and account for all moneys paid to the Board, and each day shall bank moneys received by him at a bank selected by the Board.

Only the Secretary or such person authorized for that purpose may endorse cheques for collection on behalf of the Board, and all cheques so endorsed shall be passed through the Board's bank account.

12. All accounts due and payable by the Board shall be passed by the Board, provided that the Secretary, with the approval of the Chairman, may make payments not exceeding Fifty pounds in the aggregate in anticipation of and subject to the confirmation of the Board at its next regular meeting following any such payment or payments.

13. (a) All accounts due by the Board which exceed Two pounds shall be paid by cheque signed by any two members of the Board, and countersigned by the Secretary.

(b) All accounts not exceeding Two pounds may be paid from a petty cash account, the standing balance of which shall not at any time exceed Ten pounds.

14. The Secretary to the Board shall have the custody of the common seal of the Board, which shall be kept in such place as the Board directs, and when not in use shall be kept in a place of safe custody secured by lock and key.

15. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of a resolution of the Board. In every case where the common seal is authorized to be affixed to any document, such seal shall be affixed only in the presence of at least two members of the Board (one of whom shall be the Chairman or Deputy Chairman) who shall sign every such document, which shall be countersigned by the Secretary.

16. The order of business at any meeting shall be as follows:--

- (i) Reading and confirmation of minutes of previous meeting.
- (ii) Matters arising from the minutes of previous meeting.
- (iii) Correspondence.
- (iv) Statement of receipts and payments since the previous meeting.
- (v) Accounts.
- (vi) Matters relating to servants, agents, and officers of the Board.
- (vii) Such other matters as any member of the Board desire to bring before the Board.

17. A resolution of the Board shall not be revoked or altered unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration is given in writing to each of the members two days at least before the meeting at which the revocation or alteration is to be proposed.

18. There shall be conspicuously displayed at least every twelve months in the Board's public office a full and explicit statement of the Board's receipts and expenditure, stock transactions, and liabilities, for the period since the last preceding statement was so displayed.

19. At least every year there shall be similarly displayed a full and explicit balance-sheet of the Board, audited in accordance with section 11 of the Act.

20. The statement and balance-sheet referred to in Regulations 18 and 19 shall remain displayed until they are replaced by any subsequent statement and balance-sheet, and shall be available for perusal and copying at reasonable hours by any person.

21. The certificate to be issued by the Board in accordance with and subject to section 24 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 1 of the Schedule.

22. The Board may replace any lost or damaged certificate issued in accordance with section 24 of the Act, provided that such duplicate certificate shall be clearly stamped across the face thereof with the words "Duplicate only."

23. The notice to be given by a producer in accordance with section 28 of the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 2 of the Schedule.

24. The notice to be given by any person claiming to be entitled to any bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, or encumbrance whatsoever of or upon or over any of the commodity delivered to the Board, or claiming to be the true owner of such commodity shall be in or to the effect of Form 3 of the Schedule.

25. All maize delivered to the Board shall be good, sound, dry maize in merchantable condition.

26. The certificate of refusal to be given to a producer in accordance with the Act shall be in or to the effect of Form 4 of the Schedule.

27. In the event of dispute regarding quality of maize forwarded to the Board the matter shall be referred to an officer of the Department of Agriculture appointed by the Director of Agriculture for decision, and his decision shall be final.

28. The Board may, in every sale, or agreement of sale, of maize by the Board to any person, insert conditions, and fix a sum as and by way of liquidated damages for any breach of condition, which damages shall be recoverable accordingly.

29. Applications, under the provisions of paragraph (d) of section 19 of the Act, for exemption from the operation of the said section shall not be considered by the Board unless—

- (1) The producer makes application to the Board not later than sixty days after the completion of the harvesting of the maize, such application to be in or to the effect of Form 5 of the Schedule.
- (2) The producer has paid all levies and other charges due by him to the Board.
- (3) The producer has complied with all the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made thereunder.
- (4) The terms of any contract entered into or proposed to be entered into by the producer with respect to the maize have been submitted to the Board for consideration.

30. Any exemption granted by the Board from the operation of section 19 shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:—

The producer of maize to which an exemption applies—

- (a) shall permit any member of or person authorized by the Board to enter at any reasonable time any land, building, or premises of the producer for the purpose of inspection thereof, and to inspect any books, accounts, registers, documents, or writings in the custody or control of the producer relating to his business as such producer, and to take notes, copies, or extracts thereof or therefrom, and shall truthfully answer any questions relating to such books or accounts, or to any maize produced by him;
- (b) shall not without the consent of the Board use such maize for any purpose other than that for which the exemption was granted;
- (c) shall pay all levies and other charges due to the Board within the time prescribed;
- (d) shall, if required by the Board, deliver to the Board not later than One hundred and twenty days after the completion of the harvesting of the maize a return in the form of a statutory declaration showing the total number of bags and weight of the maize produced from that harvest, the quantity delivered to the Board, the quantity otherwise disposed of, and the manner of its disposal and the prices obtained for any such maize sold.

- (1) Every producer of any commodity which is subject to any bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, or encumbrance, or in respect of which, or of the crop from which the same was harvested, he has entered into any agreement in derogation from his title to sell the commodity as the absolute owner thereof (and whether such bill of sale, mortgage, lien, pledge, interest, trust, encumbrance, or agreement was made before or after the application of this Act to the commodity) shall, when delivering the commodity to the Board, give to the person receiving the commodity on behalf of the Board a notice in writing in the prescribed form, and containing the prescribed particulars of every such bill of sale, mortgage, charge, lien, pledge, interest, trust, encumbrance or agreement.
(2) The provisions of the last preceding sub-section shall extend and apply to every person by or for whom any of the commodity is delivered to the Board under this Act in respect of the commodity so delivered, and in addition the notice to be given by him when delivering the commodity to the Board shall contain particulars as to all other persons interested in any way in such commodity, and the nature of their respective interests therein.
(3) A notice given in respect of a delivery made to any person receiving any of the commodity on behalf of the Board at one railway station or place, or delivery shall not be deemed to be a compliance with this section in respect of a delivery made to any other person receiving any of the commodity on behalf of the Board at the same or any other railway station or place of delivery.
(4) Any person guilty of any contravention of, or failure to comply with, any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the Regulation made on the seventh day of April, 1937, and to make a further Regulation in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited, as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth by this Order revoke the Order made on the seventh day of April, 1937, aforesaid, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

After clause 73 of Chapter IX. of the Regulations made on the fourth day of March, 1930, and on the eighteenth day of December, 1933, there shall be inserted the following clause:—

TIME-BOOK OR OTHER RECORD FOR AN EMPLOYEE IN A HOTEL, RESTAURANT, OR BOARDING-HOUSE.

74. Country Agricultural Implements Board, Furniture Board, Shops Board No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder), or Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder—Country), or persons engaged in ship or boat building, or the erection of bridges, wharfs, or similar structures), employed as—

- (a) box-makers;
- (b) stackers, sorters, loaders, or unloaders of sawn, hewn, or split timber or logs;
- (c) saw-mill, timber-yard, timber seasoning plant, box factory, or joiners workshop employees (other than carpenters or joiners);
- (d) builders of tramways for the conveyance of logs or timber;
- (e) timber-fellers, hewers, or splitters wheresoever employed;
- (f) forest workers conveying timber to a sawmill;
- (g) workers conveying timber from a sawmill by tramway;
- (h) wood-workers making articles not under the jurisdiction of any Wages Board heretofore appointed or hereafter to be appointed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MERBEIN, AT MERBEIN WEST.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 7th December, 1936, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Merbein, at West Merbein.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any buildings or any booth or other structure, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any games, sports, or entertainments of any sort in the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly, or carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

12. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young shrubs and trees.

14. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of Three guineas per day.

15. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sport, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of grounds so set apart.

16. The Committee of Management may from time to time select portions of the Reserve for the parking of cars and vehicles, and for the tethering of horses, and no car, vehicle, or horse shall be parked or tethered in any portion of the Reserve other than in the portion set apart for this purpose. A charge of a Shilling per day may be made for the admission of any car, vehicle, or horse to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding twenty in any one year, on which a charge for admission is being made, as provided by clause 1 of the Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR RACECOURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION AT GRENVILLE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in Trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein, or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 16th December, 1884, as a site for a Racecourse and for other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Clarksdale, and known as "Grenville Racecourse Reserve."

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, race meetings, sports, fêtes, or other holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding 10s. (Ten shillings) may be taken and charged for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. Any person, or club, or any other organized body desirous of using any portion of the Reserve shall make application to the Committee of Management; such applicant must state the dates upon which he requires the use thereof, and such Committee shall have the sole right in granting or refusing, in whole or part, such application.

3. The Committee of Management shall have power to fix from time to time the charge to be made by way of rental for any division or divisions of the Reserve; such charge, in the aggregate, must not exceed £5 5s. per day.

4. Any club, person, or association hiring any portion of the Reserve may have the right to charge the public for admission only on such days as the Committee of Management grants permission, subject to clause 1 of these Regulations.

5. No person or persons shall park a motor car, motor cycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve, except at such area as is set apart as a parking area by the Committee of Management, and every person using such parking area shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding 2s. (Two shillings) per motor car, cycle, or other vehicle per day for entrance to and use thereof on such days only as a charge is being made for admission as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

6. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club, or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.

7. Persons, clubs, or others renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on any occasion whatsoever may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £10, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or any thing contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve or any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and any person so offending shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have paid for admission or holds a ticket of admission or of membership of any club using the Reserve for the time being with the consent of the Committee of Management.

9. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall climb or jump over or damage in any way whatsoever the buildings, seats, fences, gates, &c., in or around the Reserve, or stick bills thereon, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve for agistment any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. The fees to be charged for agistment shall be fixed by the Committee of Management.

12. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog without same being under full control by chain or cord.

14. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any building or any other structure, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first being obtained.

15. No person shall sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to such conditions as such Committee may determine.

16. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

17. No person, except labourers or other workmen employed in the Reserve, or any other duly authorized person, shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed as a plantation of trees, shrubs, or flowers.

18. All fees payable and received in accordance with these Regulations shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF LAND TEMPORARILY RESERVED IN THE PARISH OF MARROO, AND KNOWN AS "GELANTIPY PUBLIC HALL."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 14th September, 1936, as a site for a Public Hall in the Parish of Marroo, and known as "Gelantipy Public Hall."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for public meetings, dances, entertainments, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings (2s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gate or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play in any competition, tournament, or inter-club game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 118.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made under the powers conferred by Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and under any other powers howsoever arising, and numbered 118, for appointing in streets and roads standing places for motor cars, and for repealing certain clauses of By-law No. 106 (Traffic Regulation, &c.).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. *Definitions*.—In this By-law, unless repugnant to or inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“City” means City of St. Kilda.

“Council” means the Council of the City of St. Kilda.

“Driver” means any person in charge of a motor car.

“Footway” includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city habitually used by pedestrians, and not generally used by vehicular traffic.

“Motor Car” means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

“Parking Area” means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.

“Street” includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the city other than a footway.

“Vehicle” means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car, and motor car trailer, but does not include perambulators, go-carts, or invalid chairs.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. *Repeal*.—From the clauses in By-law No. 106 relating to “Local Rules (Clauses 19-24 inclusive)” the following shall be and are hereby repealed:—

Sub-clause (a) of clause 19—Brighton-road.

Clause 21—Lower Esplanade.

3. The streets or parts thereof respectively mentioned and set forth in the schedule hereto are hereby appointed standing places for motor cars, and may be used by drivers as parking areas.

4. It shall be lawful for the Council by notice in writing under the hand or by the direction of the Town Clerk from time to time as may be convenient or necessary, to fix or appoint openings through and in any parking areas to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to vary the same or any of them, and also in like manner from time to time to alter or vary the hours during which parking areas or any of them shall be available for use or to discontinue the same or any of them.

5. No driver shall cause or allow or permit his motor car to obstruct or occupy any such opening through any parking area to permit of cross traffic as is fixed or appointed under the provisions of this By-law.

6. The Council may—

(1) by resolution from time to time discontinue for such period as it thinks fit any parking area for motor cars appointed hereunder;

(2) from time to time and for the purpose of supervising parking areas, appoint or employ officers or attendants and remove any such officer or attendant.

7. No person not being an officer or employee or otherwise authorized by the Council shall destroy, remove, or in any other manner interfere with any notice, sign, or standard, or any other erection supporting any such notice or sign which has been fixed or placed by the Council upon any street, road, footway, verandah, building, or other public place or building.

8. No person not being an officer or employee or otherwise authorized by the Council shall affix any notice, sign, or other thing on or to or in any street, road, or footway, or erect, drive, or fix any post, standard, spike, peg, or other erection or thing upon or into any street, road, or footway.

9. Any wilful contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

10. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (c) By-law No. 316, which contains provisions for the protection and control of (i) tree reserves and garden plots, lawns, and ornamental plantations in or upon any street or road; (ii) trees, shrubs, and plants planted and tree-guards, statues, monuments, fountains, and seats erected in or upon any street or road; (iii) posts, fences, raised pavings, and places of refuge in or upon any street or road (1) for protecting persons being on or passing along any street or road or footway, or (2) for regulating traffic along any street or road or on footways, or (3) for making the crossing of any street or road less dangerous to any such persons.
- (d) Regulation No. 317, which repeals Regulations numbered 113, 137, 184, and 206, and contains provisions for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens within the Municipal District of South Melbourne.
- (e) By-law No. 318, which contains provisions for the protection and control of closets, urinals, or conveniences provided by the Council and for regulating the conduct of persons using the same.
- (f) By-law No. 323, which repeals By-laws Nos. 164 and 195 and contains provisions for the control and management of the children's playgrounds provided within the municipal district of South Melbourne.
- (g) By-law No. 324, which repeals By-laws Nos. 268, 274, and 289 and contains provisions for (i) regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and stands therein and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto; (ii) fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held; (iii) regulating the use of the weighing machines provided by the Council, and for preventing the use of false or defective weights, scales, or measures.

SHIRE OF BASS.

By-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Shire of Bass, made under Part VII., Division I, section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 25, for prohibiting or regulating the depasturing of stock upon roads within the Shire of Bass, for the suppression of nuisances and for maintaining the good order and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bass order as follows:—

1. That the provision with respect to the impounding of cattle, &c., contained in section 545 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, be enforced, and that all cattle, horses, and sheep found depasturing or wandering at large upon any road or street in the Shire of Bass be impounded, unless exempted therefrom under the following provisions:—

2. That the above order be carried out under the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—That all ratepayers of the said Shire and occupiers of land abutting the said roads, &c., and other persons approved by the Council, shall be exempt from such impounding of their cattle up to ten head of cattle.

3. That the condition precedent to such exemption be a payment to the Council of the Shire of Bass of such charge or fee and in such manner as the Council is hereby empowered from time to time to fix by resolution.

4. That when the aforesaid charge or fee is paid to the Council's herdsman he shall register such number of cattle in a book to be kept for the purpose as being exempt from impounding, and in the case of such cattle fasten a wire band or chain or strap and a number tag on the neck or head of each beast in token of such exemption, and shall give to the person so registering a receipt for the money paid, and the same shall be entered in the book to be kept for that purpose for the information of the Council, and he shall furnish a return to the Council every seven days.

5. The Council will appoint a herdsman (or herdsmen), and he may, if he deems it necessary for any purpose, yard up or request the owner to yard up such owner's cattle grazing on the roads. The herdsman shall from time to time patrol the roads of the Shire, and shall have authority to question persons driving cattle, &c., and sheep, as to the names of owners of same, the place of destination, the distances travelled, and any other matters pertaining to the duties of his position as herdsman.

6. The Council or herdsman will not be responsible for any damage arising from the impounding of such exempted stock by any person owning lands adjoining or abutting such roads, or owning land in any situation whatever.

7. The Council may from time to time, by resolution, declare certain specified areas within the Shire as areas in which any exemptions from impounding granted in accordance with the provisions of the By-law shall not apply.

8. The Council will not be responsible nor liable for loss, for theft, for death, nor for any injury nor damage to, nor straying of any such cattle grazing under the aforesaid exemption receipt, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the exemption will be applied for and obtained under these conditions.

9. Calves at foot under the age of six months, the progeny of the registered cow, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that limit of age.

10. No bull shall be exempted.

11. No pigs, goats, sheep nor horses, no diseased or infirm cattle, no steers over the age of twelve months, no fence-breaker or jumper, shall be exempted or allowed to wander or graze on the roads or streets.

12. Each animal for which application is made to register shall be the bona fide property of the applicant, and the applicant may be called on to make a declaration to that effect in the form of the schedule attached hereto.

13. Persons travelling with or in charge of sheep, cattle, or horses, along any road within the Shire, shall travel by the nearest route to the place of destination, and between the hours of sunrise and sunset on each day shall travel not less than six miles with sheep and ten miles with cattle and horses, otherwise it shall constitute an offence against this By-law, and a prosecution shall follow.

14. No person shall be allowed to remove from the roads, unless in the case of death of an animal, cattle registered as herein provided without giving due notice of the same beforehand to the herdsman, upon receipt of which by the herdsman the owner so removing the cattle, will be entitled without further charge to substitute for each head so removed one head of cattle, for the unexpired portion of the registered period.

15. The Council shall have the exclusive right to cause all cattle suspected of contagious disease, or cattle proved or reported fence-breakers or jumpers, or dangerous to the public, to be removed from such roads, and in the event of any registered cattle dying, the owner shall at once cause same to be removed or destroyed, and on the owner failing to do so, the herdsman, or other Council employee may cause same to be removed or destroyed at the owner's risk and expense, and such expense or cost may be recovered in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the case of stock proving a nuisance as fence-breaker, &c., the herdsman may impound same.

16. This By-law shall have operation throughout the Shire of Bass.

17. Violations of the provisions of this By-law shall render the person so offending liable to be prosecuted, and excepting under clause 13 liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds. Every person guilty of an offence under clause 13 of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five shillings for each sheep and not more than Ten shillings for each head of cattle or horses, travelling contrary to the provisions of the said clause.

18. For the purposes of this By-law "Cattle" includes bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, and calves.

DETERMINATION OF THE TANNERS (FURRED SKINS) BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 14th August, 1937, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of a tanner of all kinds of furred skins, or a dresser or a dyer of such skins," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 14th August, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) DEFINITIONS.—“Flesher” is an adult person removing flesh from raw wet skins on a beam or upright knife.
“Shaver” is an adult person shaving partly dressed skins with a sharp-edged knife.
“Puller” is an adult person employed pulling wet raw skins over an upright knife.
- (4) OVERTIME.—For work other than shift-work done in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work—Time and a quarter.
- (5) SHIFT-WORK.—Shift-work shall consist of nine consecutive hours of which one hour must be allowed for meals. Any time worked outside the period of such shift shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter for first two hours and time and a half thereafter.
- (6) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day (21st April), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (7) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—Employees who work any time within seven days prior to any of the undermentioned holidays shall be entitled to such holiday without deduction of pay, viz.:—Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Labor Day (21st April).
- (8) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Two days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee or two days' pay shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof.
- (9) TOOLS AND APPLIANCES.—Every employer shall provide gloves, apron, leggings with vamps attached, or any tools or implements of trade required by employees in the performance of their duties.

NOTE.—The Board has determined in accordance with section 25 (1) of the amended *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, that the process, trade, business or occupation is so unskilful that no person shall be taken as an apprentice.

(3) **PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT**—The employment of any improver under the age of eighteen years is prohibited.

(4) **HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT.**—With the exceptions herein set out the ordinary hours of employment shall be 44 per week, to be worked in five days of 8 hours and one day (Saturday) of 4 hours, or five days of 8 hours 48 minutes each, continuously except for meal hour breaks at the discretion of the employer between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7 a.m. to noon on Saturday: Provided that the spread of hours herein prescribed may be altered by mutual agreement between an employer and his employees.

By agreement between any employer and his employees ordinary hours may be worked on the basis of 88 per fortnight with one week of 40 and one of 48 hours.

Continuous Work Shifts.

5. **SHIFT WORK.**—(a) For the purposes of this clause, the expression "Continuous Work" means work carried on with consecutive shifts of men throughout the 24 hours of each of at least six consecutive days without interruption except during break-downs or meal breaks (if any).

(b) Employees working on continuous work shifts shall work thereon such number of shifts up to six per week as may be required; no such shift to exceed 8 hours inclusive of meal breaks (if any) nor to be discontinuous except for meal breaks (if any).

(c) The ordinary hours of actual work or duty exclusive of meal breaks off duty (if any) of employees working on continuous work shifts shall not exceed—

- (i) 8 in any one day; nor
- (ii) 48 in any one week; nor
- (iii) an average of 44 per week during the period of employment upon such shifts; nor
- (iv) such average reduced to 43 hours 5 minutes if such shifts include Sunday shifts; nor
- (v) a total of 176 hours during any four weeks of the period of employment upon such shifts; nor
- (vi) such total reduced to 172 hours 20 minutes during any such four weeks if such shifts include Sunday shifts.

Provided that such average and total shall not be so reduced to 43 hours 5 minutes and 172 hours 20 minutes if the employees on such shifts are paid for each ordinary hour worked thereon by them in the case of weekly employees at the rate of one forty-third ($1/43$) of the prescribed weekly wage, and in the case of hourly employees, at the rate of forty-four forty-thirds ($44/43$) of the prescribed rate for such employees which payment, the employer shall have the option of making; nor shall they be so reduced if, in addition to other holidays (if any) to be given under this Determination to such employees, such employees are given in each year, one week's holiday on full pay, which week's holiday the employer shall have the option of giving.

(d) For all time of duty outside the limits of the ordinary hours prescribed in sub-clause (c) hereof, an employee on continuous work shift shall be paid at double rates. This shall not apply to arrangements between employees themselves or in cases due to rotation of shift, or when the relief does not come on duty at the proper time: Provided that where not less than eight hours' notice has been given to the employer by the employee that he will be absent from work, and the employee whom he should relieve is not relieved, such unrelieved employee shall be paid time and a half for all time of duty after he has finished his ordinary shift.

(e) Employees on continuous work shifts, working afternoon and night shifts, shall be paid 5 per cent. more than ordinary rates for such shifts.

(f) Employees on continuous work shifts, working any Sunday or holiday shift, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for such shift.

Shift Work in other than Continuous Work.

(g) In shift work, not upon continuous work as herein defined, any afternoon or night shift which does not continue for five successive working nights or more in a five-day workshop, or six successive working nights or more in a six-day workshop, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(h) For any afternoon or night shift which has been in operation for five nights or more and less than one month 10 per cent. more than ordinary rates shall be paid and after such shifts have continued for more than one month 5 per cent. more than ordinary rates shall be paid.

(i) Shift workers shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first 4 hours and double time thereafter for all time worked in excess of shift hours.

(6) **MIXED FUNCTIONS.**—An employee engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If for less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

(7) **OVERTIME.**—(a) For all work done outside ordinary hours the rate of wages shall be time and a half for the first 4 hours and double time thereafter, such double time to continue to be paid until an employee has been relieved from work for at least 8 hours. Provided that an employee shall not be entitled to payment for such rest period.

(b) Except as provided above in computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.

(c) An employee recalled after leaving his workshop to work overtime shall be paid for a minimum of three hours' work at the appropriate rate.

(d) An employee occasionally required to hold himself in readiness to work after ordinary hours shall be paid, until released, standing by time at ordinary rates from the time from which he is so to hold himself in readiness, provided that any custom now prevailing under which an employee is required regularly to hold himself in readiness for a call back shall continue.

(e) An employee (other than one on shift work) who has worked up to or beyond midnight shall not be bound to continue work on the following day.

(f) As far as practicable employees shall not work overtime while competent labour is available.

(g) For work done during meal hours and thereafter until a meal hour break is allowed time and a half rates shall be paid. An employee shall not be compelled to work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

(h) An employee working overtime shall be allowed a crib time of twenty minutes without deduction of pay after each 4 hours of work, but this provision shall not prevent any arrangement being made for the taking of a longer meal period without pay.

(i) Before starting overtime after working ordinary hours a meal break of at least 45 minutes shall be allowed, unless the period of overtime is less than one and a half hours.

An employer and his employee may agree mutually to any variation of this sub-clause to meet the circumstances of the work in hand.

(j) An employee required to work overtime for more than two hours without being notified the day before that he will be so required to work, shall be supplied with a meal by the employer or paid 1s. 6d. in lieu thereof, or if work extends into a second meal hour 2s. 6d. for the two meals, but such payment need not be made to employees living in the same locality as their workshop who can reasonably return home for meals.

If an employee pursuant to notice has provided a meal or meals and is not required to work overtime he shall be paid for each meal so provided.

(k) Subject to the provisions of the second part of the sub-clause (g) of this clause an employee shall work during meal breaks at the ordinary rates herein prescribed whenever instructed so to do for the purpose of making good break-downs of plant or upon routine maintenance of plant which can only be done while such plant is idle.

(l) When an employee working overtime finishes work at a time when reasonable means of transport is not available, the employer shall provide him with a conveyance or pay him his current wage for the time occupied in reaching his home.

(8) **HOLIDAYS AND SUNDAY WORK.**—(a) Employees shall be entitled to the following public holidays (without pay except as hereinafter provided):—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or such other day as is generally observed in the locality as a substitute for any of the said days respectively.

Exceptions.

By agreement between any employer and his employees, other holidays may be substituted for the said days or any of them as to such employer's undertaking.

(b) Employees not engaged in continuous work shall be paid at the rate of double ordinary time for work done on Sundays and public holidays, such double time to continue until the employee has been relieved from duty for at least 8 hours. Provided that the employee shall not be paid for the time he is resting.

Provided that employees engaged in repairs to or renewals of their employer's plant and machinery necessary for resumption of work the next following working day (not including the installation of new machinery) shall be paid for work on holidays or Sundays at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Employees, other than those on shift work, required to work on Sundays or public holidays shall be paid for a minimum of three hours' work.

(9) **PIECE-WORK PRICES.**—Subject to the minimum wages herein prescribed an employer may remunerate any of his employees under any system of payment by results.

(10) **EXTRA RATES NOT CUMULATIVE.**—Extra rates in this Determination, including rates prescribed in clause 15 are not cumulative so as to exceed the maximum of double the ordinary rates.

(11) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—(a) Wages shall be paid weekly or fortnightly. Where the services of an employee are dispensed with, wages shall be paid to him on the day of dismissal or forwarded to him by post on the day following.

(b) An employee kept waiting for his wages on pay day for more than a quarter of an hour after the usual time for ceasing work shall be paid at overtime rates after that quarter-hour, with a minimum of a quarter of an hour.

(12) **CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT.**—(a) With the exceptions hereinafter stated, employment may be by the week or by the hour. If by the week it shall be terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day or (if the employer terminate it without such notice), by payment of one week's wages.

A contract for weekly employment may be terminated by any employer, without liability to pay for more than time actually worked, for misconduct or for absence from work without reasonable excuse.

If an employee engaged by the week absents himself from duty, except on public holidays or for days for which he produces a certificate from a medical practitioner or other proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness (aggregating 4 days' sickness in each year), a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay, i.e., one-sixth of the weekly wage for each day of absence, including Saturday in shops working six days and one-fifth in shops working five days per week: Provided that only time actually lost shall be deducted when an employee is absent with leave on a Saturday.

(b) If the contract of employment is for hourly hiring, the total amount of the rates prescribed for adults in clause 2 hereof shall be increased by 5s. per week, but such amount shall not be taken into account in computing overtime, Sunday, and holiday rates.

(c) An employee starting work on hourly hiring shall be entitled to a minimum of four consecutive hours' work or to four hours' pay for the job—such hours may be deemed to be consecutive if worked in ordinary hours at the end of a day and the beginning of the next succeeding day.

(13) **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.**—(a) **Tools.**—The employer shall provide for each employee all necessary tools. The employee shall replace or pay for any tools so provided if lost through his negligence.

(b) Employers shall provide proper sanitary accommodation and adequate washing facilities with hot water. In any workshop in which employees through a shop steward or committee ask for the provision of lockers and shower baths and an undertaking is given that the baths provided will be used by the majority of the workmen and that the baths and lockers will be properly cared for, a locker shall be installed by the employer for each workman, together with hot and cold shower baths (away from sanitary accommodation).

(c) Suitable canvas or leather gloves shall be provided by employer for the use of any person employed—

- (i) severing lead pipes leaving an extruding machine,
- (ii) mixing, or melting, or feeding metal.

(14) **TIME AND WAGES BOOK.**—Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each employee and his occupation, the hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week.

The time occupied by an employee in filling in any time books or cards or in the making of records shall be treated as time of duty, but this does not apply to checking in or out at the beginning or end of duty.

(15) **SPECIAL RATES.**—In addition to the wages prescribed in clause 2 hereof, the following special rates and allowances shall be paid:—

- (a) Leading hands in charge of not fewer than 3 and not more than 10 employees, 6s. per week extra; more than 10 and not more than 20, 12s. per week extra; more than 20, 18s. per week extra.
- (b) Working in wet places—1½d. per hour extra.
Working in confined spaces—3d. per hour extra.
- (c) Working for more than one hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degree Fahr., 1½d. per hour extra; in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahr., 3d. per hour extra. Where work continues for more than 2 hours in temperatures exceeding 130 degrees Fahr., employees shall also be entitled to 20 minutes' rest after every 2 hours' work without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the foreman of the work after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.
- (d) Working for more than one hour in places where the temperature is reduced by artificial means below zero, 1½d. per hour extra. Where the work continues for more than two hours employees shall be entitled to a rest period of twenty minutes every two hours without loss of pay.
- (e) Dirty work, i.e., work which a foreman and workman shall agree is of an unusually dirty or offensive nature, 1½d. per hour extra.
- (f) Compensation to the extent of damage sustained shall be made for work in which clothing or tools are damaged or destroyed by the use of acids.
- (g) Where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

(16) **DEFINITIONS.**—

- "Year" means 365 consecutive days, starting from the day of commencement of operation of this Determination.
- "Shift work"—afternoon shift means any shift finishing after 6 p.m. but not later than midnight. Night shift means any shift finishing subsequent to midnight but not later than 8 a.m.
- "Sunday" means all time between midnight Saturday and midnight Sunday.
- "Wet place" means a place in which water is continually dripping from overhead to such an extent as to saturate the clothing of a workman, or a place where water accumulates underfoot to a depth exceeding 2 inches.
- "Confined place" means a working place, the dimensions of which necessitate an employee working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position, or without proper ventilation, or where confinement within a limited space is productive of unusual discomfort.
