SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT MAIL STABLES SWAMP, NEAR EDENHOPE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the part of Victoria hereunder described shall be a locality in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act* 1928:—

BAG LIMIT FOR MACQUARIE PERCH TAKEN FROM THE BARWON AND MOORARBOOL RIVERS AND THEIR TRIBUTARIES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation provide that no person shall on any one day, during the period from the first day of December in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following (both days inclusive), take from the Barwon or Moorarbool Rivers or their tributaries more than five (5) Macquarie Perch, or have in his possession more than five (5) such fish taken from the said waters.

PROHIBITION OF NETTING IN SYDENHAM INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation amend the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of April, 1936, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of April, 1936, respecting netting in Sydenham and Tamboon Inlets, by deleting therefrom all reference to Sydney Inlet, and prohibit the use of trammels, trawls or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing during the whole of each year in Sydenham Inlet, within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such Inlet enter the ocean.

This Proclamation shall take effect on and from the first day of October, 1937.

TAMBOON TOWNSHIP EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act* 1928, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act* 1933, do hereby extend the Proclamation dated the 31st March, 1925, defining certain land in the Parish of Barga as a township, by the addition of the Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:-

Parish of Barga, County of Croajingolong: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 4; thence by that allotment and allotments 2, 3, and 4 of section 4, a line, and allotments 1 and 2 of section 3 bearing N. 16 deg. 2 min. E. to the Tamboon Inlet; by said inlet bearing easterly and southerly to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 1 of section 4 aforesaid; and thence by a line and the southern boundary of said allotment 1 bearing S. 73 deg. 58 min. AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act* 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act* 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, and 8 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act* 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts set forth be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the portions of the Borough of Port Fairy and the Shires of Kerang, Huntly, Beechworth, and Numurkah set forth hereunder shall be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified accordingly.

NORTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Kerang.—Parishes of Meran and Kerang and Town of Kerang, Counties of Tatchera and Gunbower: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1, section C, Parish of Meran, County of Tatchera: bounded thence by that allotment bearing N. 0 deg. 1 min. E. 328 links, N. 44 deg. 59 min. W. 800 links, N. 0 deg. 1 min. E. 400 links, N. 89 deg. 59 min. W. 1,300 links, and N. 23 deg. 59 min. W. 800 links more or less; thence by lines through said allotment 1 bearing west 3,000 links more or less, and north to a 3-chain road; thence by that road bearing west to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 20, section A; thence by a line and the east boundaries of allotments 20, 18, a line, and 1 of section A bearing north to the north-east angle of said allotment 1, Parish of Meran: thence by a road bearing east to the north-east angle of allotment 13, section B, Parish of Kerang, County of Gunbower: thence by the east boundary of said allotment 13 to the south-east angle thereof: thence by a road bearing west to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 7A, section 1: thence by a line and said allotment 7A bearing south 4,000 links more or less; thence by a line through that allotment and a road bearing west to the Loddon River: and thence by a line bearing northerly to the point of commencement.

Shire of Huntly.—Parish and Township of Elmore, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 4, Parish of Elmore: bounded thence by that allotment bearing east to the Campaspe River; thence by that river bearing generally southerly to the south-east angle of allotment 22 of section 6; thence by the southern boundary of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 26 of section 7: thence by a road bearing south-westerly to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 3A of section 7; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by the southern boundary of said allotment 3A to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line and the south boundary of allotment 1A bearing westerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing north-westerly and north-easterly to the north-west angle of the Township of Elmore; and thence by the Township boundary bearing east to the point of commencement.

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Beechworth.—1. Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the Township of Beechworth in line with the west boundary of Crown allotment 10, section N1, Parish of Beechworth; thence north-westerly by a line and the west boundaries of allotments 10 and 11, section N1, to the most westerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north-easterly by the north boundary of allotment 11, a line, the north boundary of allotment 14 of section N1, and the production thereof to Spring Creek; thence generally south-easterly and south-westerly by the boundary of the Township of Beechworth to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at the most northerly angle of Crown allotment 12 of section P1, Parish of Beechworth; thence southerly by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 3, section 1; thence easterly by the south boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotment 4 to the south-eastern angle

of allotment 4; thence southerly, westerly, and north-easterly by the boundaries of allotment 8, section 1, and north-easterly by the west boundary of allotment Q and a line to the southern boundary of the Township of Beechworth; thence generally in a north-westerly direction by the boundary of the Township of Beechworth to the point of commencement.

Shire of Numurkah.—Parishes of Muntoona, Baulkamaugh, Katunga, Drumanure, and Township of Numurkah, County of Moira: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 6, section 1 (Numurkah Estate), Parish of Muntoona; bounded thence by a road bearing west to the south-west angle of allotment 5; thence by the west boundary of that allotment to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line and the west boundary of allotment 26, section A, Parish of Baulkamaugh, bearing north to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a road bearing west to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 23; thence by a line and the east boundary of the last-mentioned allotment bearing north to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a road bearing east to the north-east angle of allotment 24, Parish of Baulkamaugh; thence by a road bearing north to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 14, section C, Parish of Katunga; thence by a line and a road bearing east to the north-west angle of allotment 19; thence by a road bearing south to the south-west angle of allotment 23, Parish of Katunga; thence by a road bearing east to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 5, section A, Parish of Drumanure; thence by a line and a road bearing south to the south-east angle of allotment 5A; thence by a road bearing west to the south-west angle of allotment 8 (Numurkah Estate), Parish of Drumanure; and thence by a line bearing west to the point of commencement.

SOUTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Borough of Port Fairy.—Those portions not at present included within the Southern Fire District.

DIMINUTION OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, whenever the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board certifies that it is necessary or desirable that any specified portion of the metropolitan fire district or of any country fire district (as the case may be) be excised therefrom, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that such portion shall be excised accordingly, and that thereupon such specified portion shall for the purposes of the said Act no longer be included in or be part of such metropolitan or country fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is necessary and desirable that the portions of the Northern and North-Eastern Fire Districts set forth hereunder be excised from such Fire Districts: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (2) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the portions of the said Northern and North-Eastern Fire Districts set forth hereunder shall be excised from such Fire Districts, viz.:

Northern Fire District.—The Townships of Kerang and Elmore.

North-Eastern Fire District.—The Township of Numurkah.

And as on and from the 1st day of July, 1937, the said Order of the Governor in Council shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 297 of the *Water Act 1928*, and under all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth make the following Regulations affecting the issue by the Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply of Certificates of Qualification as Engineers of Water Supply. These Regulations shall take effect as on and from the 1st day of October, 1938, and His Excellency doth by this Order revoke as from the 30th day of September, 1938, the Regulations made on the 26th day of July, 1910.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GRANTING OF CERTIFICATES
OF QUALIFICATION AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY,
VICTORIA.

1. The Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply will issue Certificates of Qualification, after examination or without examination, as the case may be, to such candidates as shall comply with some one of the conditions following:—

- (a) After examination—to every such candidate as shall satisfactorily pass the examination conducted by the Board in accordance with these Regulations.
- (b) Without examination—to every such Candidate as satisfies the Board that he has been employed for not less than one year in some responsible professional capacity in charge of the construction and management of hydraulic works, and that he is—
 - (i) A Member or Associate Member of the Institution of Civil Engineers of London; or
 - (ii) A Certificated Engineer or Bachelor or Master or Doctor of Engineering of a University of an Australian State or of New Zealand or of a University of Great Britain or Ireland or of a University whose graduates are admitted by the University of Melbourne, *ad eundem gradum*.

CONDITION (a)—CERTIFICATES AFTER EXAMINATION.

2. Examinations of candidates for Certificates of Qualification will be held in Melbourne in October in each year or such other time as may be fixed by the Board from time to time of which not less than one month's notice will be given. Each examination shall be held at such place in Melbourne as the Board may from time to time appoint.

3. An intending candidate must, prior to the date of examination, give at least 21 days' notice of his intention to present himself, and must at the same time submit documentary evidence satisfactory to the Board—

- (a) That he has passed the Leaving Examination of the University of Melbourne or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto, provided that in the case of a candidate of 35 years of age or more the Board may otherwise satisfy itself as to his having reached an adequate standard of education.
- (b) That he has been properly trained during not less than two years as a Civil Engineer.
- (c) That he has been further engaged for not less than two years (exclusive of any period of training or pupilage) in the active practice of such profession.
- (d) That one year at least of such practice has been in connexion with hydraulic works.

In addition, intending candidates must submit to the Board a detailed statement of the nature and extent of the work on which he has been engaged; and also a drawing of structure prepared by him of a standard

satisfactory to the Board, and accompanied by a certificate signed by a qualified engineer that the drawing has been wholly executed by the candidate.

4. Upon his application being approved by the Board the candidate will be required to pay to the Secretary of the Board the sum of Three pounds three shillings at least one week before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself.

5. Except as hereinafter provided each candidate presenting himself for examination will be examined in the following subjects:—

- (i) Surveying.
- (ii) General Principles of Civil Engineering.
- (iii) Engineering Structures.
- (iv) Hydraulics.
- (v) Water Supply and Sanitary Engineering.
- (vi) Power and Duties of a Water Supply Engineer.

6. Candidates who have obtained the Certificate of the Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors or of the Board of Examiners for Mining Surveyors in Victoria will be exempted from the examination in subject—

- (i) Surveying.

7. Candidates who have obtained the Certificate of Competency or Certificate of Qualification of the Municipal Surveyors Board of Victoria will be exempted from examinations in the following subjects:—

- (i) Surveying.
- (ii) General Principles of Civil Engineering.
- (iii) Engineering Structures.
- (iv) Hydraulics.

8. Candidates who have obtained a degree in Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne or of a University whose graduates are admitted by the University of Melbourne *ad eundem gradum*, will be exempted from examinations in the following subjects:—

- (i) Surveying.
- (ii) General Principles of Civil Engineering.
- (iii) Engineering Structures.
- (iv) Hydraulics.
- (v) Water Supply and Sanitary Engineering.

9. Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scale, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted to use any ordinary and accepted engineer's pocket book or book of tables which he may bring into the examination room, but he will not be permitted to leave the room during the examination. Any candidate receiving assistance during the examination will be disqualified.

CONDITION (b)—CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate applying for a Certificate of Qualification without examination must submit satisfactory documentary evidence in detail as to his experience, and must satisfy the Board that the rights conferred by the certificate or membership in virtue of which he makes his application have not been cancelled or suspended.

11. Upon his application being approved by the Board the candidate shall pay a fee of Three pounds three shillings to the Secretary of the Board, and upon receipt of same a Certificate of Qualification will be issued.

GENERAL.

12. On each Certificate of Qualification it shall be stated—

- (a) The qualifications in respect of which it is issued.
- (b) Whether it is granted without an examination, or, if after partial examination, the subjects in which the applicant was examined.

13. All communications to the Board of Examiners should be addressed to the Secretary, Board of Examiners of Engineers of Water Supply, State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.

BUILDERS LABOURERS BOARD.—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board, described as the Builders Labourers Board, and did by subsequent Orders vary and adjust the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the Orders above-mentioned so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred, the said Builders Labourers Board shall be given the following power, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons (other than persons bolting structural ironwork in position, heating rivets, and holding up for boilermakers) employed in the occupation of—

- (a) builder's labourer on or about any building, or assisting any bricklayer, mason, plasterer, carpenter, plumber, or any other tradesman engaged in building operations;
- (b) labourer engaged in the construction, repair, demolition, or removal of buildings and bridges;
- (c) scaffolder, gear hand, gantry hand, crane hand, or dogman, or as a drainer on work in connexion with buildings;
- (d) labourer excavating ground for foundations or basements of buildings, or levelling ground on a proposed building site;
- (e) labourer doing concrete work or mortar mixing in connexion with or incidental to building construction;
- (f) labourer doing tar-paving or asphaltting work, or other work of a similar character in connexion with or incidental to building construction;
- (g) labourer cleaning bricks on a site on which a building is being demolished, repaired, or constructed.

SHOPS BOARD No. 10 (FISH AND POULTRY).—NUMBER OF MEMBERS INCREASED.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council, by Order made on the twentieth day of March, 1935, directed that the Wages Board described as the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry) should consist of eight members and a chairman, four of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and four as representatives of employees: And whereas it is expedient to vary the said Order in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby direct that the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry) shall consist of ten members and a chairman, five of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and five as representatives of employees.

APPOINTMENT OF A PHOTOGRAPHIC GOODS BOARD.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing or preparing photographic goods or materials.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of four members and a chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of manufacturing or preparing photographic goods or materials.

Also, that such Wages Board may, in any regulation, determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding, be described for all purposes as the Photographic Goods Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

MEMBER OF A WAGES BOARD REMOVED.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby remove Herbert Arthur McKeon from the Shops Board No. 14 (Furniture Dealers), constituted under the said Acts, owing to his whereabouts being unknown.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
