PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MALVERN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Malvern has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used by the said Council as a street within the said city be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Malvern aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF MALVERN.

Alleyne-avenue.

Commencing at a point on the south building line of Union-street, which is on the eastern boundary of Crown portion 51, Parish of Prahran, at Gardiner; thence by lines bearing south 2 deg. 34 min., east 208 ft. 3½ in., east 50 feet, north 2 deg. 34 min., west 208 ft. 3½ in., and west 50 feet to the starting point.

COUNTRY ROADS BOARD.

BY-LAW NO. 4 FOR REGULATING THE EXHIBITION OF ADVERTISEMENTS AND THE ERECTION OF HOARDINGS ON OR IN THE VICINITY OF TOURISTS' ROADS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

THE Country Roads Board, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Country Roads Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law may be cited as the "Hoardings and Advertisements (Tourists' Roads) By-law 1937", and shall come into operation upon the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. "The Board" in this By-law means the Country Roads Board.

3. No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Board, erect or construct, or cause to be erected or constructed on or in the vicinity of any tourists' road, any hoarding for the exhibition thereon or advertisements of any description, or attach, fix to, or paint any advertisement on any building, fence, rock, cliff, tree or elsewhere on or in the vicinity of any such road.

4. The Board may, in its absolute discretion, refuse its consent to the exhibition of advertisements in such places, and in such manner, and by such means, on or in the vicinity of any tourists' road as in the opinion of the said Board will be an obstruction to the vision of persons using any such road, or will affect or be likely to affect, injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade, or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

5. If the Board is satisfied that any hoarding, whether constructed before or after the passing of this By-law, on or in the vicinity of any tourists' road is objectionable or unsightly, or is an obstruction to the vision of persons using such road, or is in such a state of disrepair as to be dangerous to the public, it may by order direct the removal thereof, or the making of such alteration thereof as to the Board seems necessary. A copy of such order may be served upon the owner of the hoarding, and on the owner for the time being of the land on which the same is erected, either personally or by affixing the same to some conspicuous part of such hoarding.

6. If within the time prescribed in the said Order the hoarding has not been removed or altered as directed, the Board may, by its agent duly authorized in writing, enter on the land on which such hoarding stands, and pull down and remove, or cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such hoarding, and in paying into the Country Roads Board Fund any fee or penalties due by the owner thereof.

7. The Board may also, by its agent authorized as aforesaid, abolish, obliterate, or remove any advertisement attached, fixed to or printed upon the road surface of any tourists' road, or upon any hoarding, building, fence, rock, cliff tree or elsewhere on or in the vicinity of any such road, if in its opinion such advertisement is unsightly, objectionable, or otherwise undesirable.

8. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

1st year—at the rate of 20s. 0d. per week.

2nd year—at the rate of 25s. 0d. per week.

3rd year—at the rate of 35s. 0d. per week.

4th year—at the rate of 47s. 6d. per week.

5th year—at the rate of 62s. 6d. per week.

Whereas I, the undersigned, a Police Magistrate in and for the State of Victoria, am satisfied by the information on oath of a member of the Police Force of a rank not below that of Inspector, that there is reasonable ground for believing that there are in a certain building, receptacle, or place situate at certain things, to wit: (a)

(a) (Here insert description of the things.)

- (1) upon or in respect of which an indictable offence has been or is suspected to have been committed;
- (2) which there is reasonable ground to believe will afford evidence as to the commission of an indictable offence;
- (3) which there is reasonable ground to believe is intended to be used for the purpose of committing an indictable offence against the person for which the offender may be arrested without warrant.

(1), (2), or (3). Strike out the paragraphs which are not appropriate.

These are therefore in His Majesty's name to authorize and require you with necessary and proper assistants—

- (1) to enter by day or by night into the said (b) building, place.
- (2) to open the said receptacle at any time during the day or night and therein diligently search for the said things, and if such things or any part thereof shall be found upon such search that you seize and carry the same before me or some other justice to be dealt with according to law.

(1) or (2). Strike out the paragraph which is not appropriate.

MEETINGS OF WAGES BOARDS AND PAYMENT OF MEMBERS.—FEES AND EXPENSES.

and revoke Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: And whereas it is expedient to revoke clause 28 of Chapter III. of the Regulation made on the fourth day of March, 1930, and amended on the first day of September, 1931, and on the ninth day of August, 1932, and to make a further Regulation in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited, as well as under all other powers by the said Acts him enabling in that behalf, doth by this Order revoke the said clause 28, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

FEES AND EXPENSES.

28. The Chairman and members of Boards shall be paid as follows:—

Three hours' attendance or less.—Chairman, 12s.; member, 7s. 6d.

Over three hours' attendance.—Chairman, 24s.; member, 15s.

Any chairman or member residing 20 miles or more from Melbourne shall be paid, in addition, train fares and 15s. a day expenses.

Provided that—

- (a) members of the Wages Board known as the General Board shall not be paid fees, fares, or expenses for a greater number of meetings than is approved of by the Minister;
- (b) members of any Wages Board other than that known as the General Board shall not be paid fees, fares, or expenses for more than—
 - (1) ten meetings in the first twelve months after the constitution of the Board;
 - (2) six meetings in any subsequent year.

When computing the time occupied in attendance, intervals for meals shall not be counted.

And the Honorable Edwin Joseph Mackrell, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CITY OF PRESTON.

REGULATION No. 44.

A Regulation of the City of Preston, Number 44, made under the 26th section of Part 1 of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1928*, in force in the City of Preston by virtue of a By-law of the above-named city, numbered 37, for regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels; the materials for making and constructing the same; the mode of laying and bedding such materials; the length, width, size, strength and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels; inclination or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and of every other power in that behalf, enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Preston made the following Regulation which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

(1) Every crossing hereafter made, or constructed over a footway and/or channel within the City of Preston shall be constructed in conformity with one of the specifications hereinafter set forth, but the Council shall have power to determine the class of crossing best suited to the locality in which any such crossing is to be constructed, having due regard to the nature and construction of the footway and the nature of the foundation and the capacity of the channel.

In no case shall a crossing be constructed over a channel which will reduce the waterway or cross sectional area of the channel below that which the channel is designed to carry.

(2) *Open Concrete Crossings.*—Open concrete crossings shall be constructed flush with the paved footway for a distance of 5 feet from the building alignment, and shall then fall with a gradual inclination to the invert of the channel, and from there shall continue towards the roadway on an upward gradient for a distance equal to the width of existing channel, and paving the same inclination to the invert as the existing channel. Crossings shall be constructed 4 inches thick for light traffic and 5 inches thick for motor trucks, &c., and shall be not less than 8 feet wide at the building line. Concrete shall be laid on a 3-inch bed of ashes or sand, and shall consist of four parts of screenings, two parts of sand, and one part of Portland cement, measured by volume—thoroughly mixed and immediately placed in position, screened to an even surface and then thoroughly tamped. Mortar, consisting of 2½ parts sand to one part of cement by volume, shall be applied immediately the crossing has been tamped, and finished to an even surface with a wooden float. Kerbs cast monolithic with the crossing and returned with a 3-feet radius shall be reinforced with ½-in. diameter rods, and shall be the same depth as the gutter kerb near the channel, tapering to nothing at the edge of the footpath, but maintaining the full width throughout and be trowelled to a smooth finish. The crossing shall be properly cured by being covered and kept damp for one week.

Crossings shall be graded from the channel to junction with the crown of the road, using premixed screenings. Where, in the opinion of the engineer, the level of the kerb or channel may be varied at some future date, precast concrete paving blocks, as specified for level crossings, shall be used.

(3) *Level Crossings.*—Level crossings shall be constructed where, in the opinion of the engineer, it is impracticable to grade a crossing from the footpath to the invert of the channel. Such crossings shall give full waterway of channel either by using approved reinforced concrete slabs set on

brickwork or concrete walls or using approved reinforced concrete box sections. The crossing from the building line to the back of kerb shall be constructed with concrete slabs, cast in situ 24 inches x 12 inches x 4 inches thick for light traffic and 5 inches thick for heavy traffic and laid on a 3-in. bed of sand or ashes, and having joints grouted with 3 to 1 cement-mortar, properly broomed and flushed in.

The approaches on the road side of channel shall be made good with metal properly consolidated and covered with premix screenings.

(4) *General.*—All work shall be carried out in a proper workmanlike manner, and to the entire satisfaction of the city engineer. Upon completion all surplus spoil shall be removed and the site left clean and tidy.

(5) An authority to alter the pavement or materials of the street or road for the purpose of constructing a crossing (other than a temporary crossing) will, on application, be issued by the Council to any person desiring to construct a crossing subject to the conditions stated in this Regulation and upon payment, by the applicant to the Council, of a fee of £2 5s., and every such authority shall state the kind of crossing to be constructed and the size of pipe (if any). The said fee, with the exception of the sum of 10s., which shall be retained by the Council to cover cost of inspection, shall be refunded to the applicant if the city surveyor certifies, in writing, that the work has been completed to his satisfaction.

(6) Applications, which shall be in writing, of desire to construct a crossing shall state the exact position and the type of crossing suggested and the nature of the traffic for which such crossing is intended to be used.

(7) In the construction of level crossings or crossings at sole pitch level, earth footways shall be levelled and graded to conform to the general slope of the footway, and footways which have been constructed shall be broken up and reconstructed according to the provisions of this Regulation to conform to the general slope of the pathway—broken asphalt or concrete shall not be used in construction work, and all waste material shall be carted away and the roadway and footway left neat and tidy.

(8) *Temporary Crossings.*—Whenever any permit is issued for the erection of any building, under By-law No. 42, and it is necessary to cross the footway or channel for the purpose of delivering materials or removing spoil or carrying out any other cartage work in connexion with the construction of the building, the contractor shall procure from the Council, at the time of submitting plans and specifications, a permit to cross the footway or channel, and shall lodge an inspection fee of 5s. and a deposit of £2.

The kerb and channel shall be properly protected by a temporary bridge over the channel and 6-in. x 1-in. boards on the path with edges adzed. Such boards to be placed close together, securely bound with hoop iron and to be held in such a manner as to prevent any obstruction to pedestrian traffic.

The street channels shall be kept clean and free from obstructions throughout the period during which any such temporary crossing is in use. Upon completion of the work, if it is found that the kerb or path has been damaged, the Council will carry out the repairs necessary, and deduct the cost of same from the above-mentioned deposit.

(b) In Part IV. of the said By-law, sections 1, 2, and 3 shall be deleted, and the following substituted:—

1. No person shall commence or cause to be commenced the erection of any building or any addition or alteration to any building without first delivering to the Surveyor notice, in writing, of his intention so to do, accompanied by the following particulars, in writing, signed by such person, namely, properly prepared plans and specifications of such building, addition, or alteration, together with a copy of such plan and summary of such specification, and such other particulars as are necessary to enable the Surveyor to decide whether the proposed building, addition, or alteration will comply with the provisions of By-law No. 19 and all amendments thereof.

2. Such plans and specifications and other particulars shall be considered by the Surveyor at the first available opportunity after the lodging thereof, and the Surveyor shall, if—

(a) the building therein referred to (if erected in accordance with such plans, specifications, and other particulars) will comply with the provisions of this By-law, and of all other Acts, By-laws, and Regulations (if any) applying thereto;

(b) such plans and specifications and other particulars are otherwise in conformity with the provisions of this By-law; and

(c) the fee, as prescribed by the Schedule "A" hereto, payable in respect of the permit hereinafter referred to shall have been paid to the Treasurer—

grant, or cause to be granted, to the person lodging the same a written permit for the commencement of the building, addition, or alteration referred to in such plans, specifications, and other particulars.

3. No person shall hereafter commence, or cause to be commenced, the erection of any building without having first obtained from the Surveyor such written permit for the commencement of the same as aforesaid.

4. No person shall hereafter erect any building (for which a permit for the commencement thereof has been granted as aforesaid) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or the plans, specifications, and other particulars in respect of which such permit was so granted.

5. The original plans and specifications, when approved, shall be returned to the owner, but one copy of the plans and summary of specification, if required, shall be retained by the Surveyor.

4th Schedule.—Fees payable.

5th Schedule.—Dimensions and spacing of all timbers and wood beams used in any building.

By-law No. 26 of the Shire of Ferntree Gully is hereby expressly repealed.

This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided, have force and effect throughout the municipal district.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.
