Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts set forth be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the portions of the Shires of Avoca and Tungamah set forth hereunder shall be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified accordingly.

SOUTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Avoca, Town, Township, and Parish of Avoca, Counties of Kara Kara, and Gladstone: Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 11 of section A, Parish of Avoca; bounded thence by a road bearing north-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 2 of section A3; thence by that allotment and allotment 3 bearing east to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment 37 of section 1A; thence by that allotment bearing westerly and southerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by the town boundary of Avoca bearing respectively west, north, and east to the east side of the Avoca River; and thence by said river, Parish of Avoca, bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT PORTION OF PENTAL ISLAND AND BEVERIDGE ISLAND, NEAR SWAN HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

1. Parish of Pental Island, County of Tatchera: Commencing at a point on the southern bank of the Little Murray River directly opposite the south boundary of allotment B, Parish of Pental Island; thence east by a direct line across the said river and the river frontage reserve; and thence continuing east by the south boundary of the said allotment B to the south-east angle of that allotment; thence south-easterly by the south-western boundary of allotment 11, a direct line across a road and the south-western boundary of allotment 12 to the south-eastern angle of that allotment; thence north by the east boundary of the said allotment 12 and a direct line in continuation thereof across the river frontage reserve to the southern bank of the Murray River; thence generally north-westerly by the southern bank of the said Murray River to the northern bank of the Little Murray River at the junction of the said two rivers; thence westerly by a direct line across the mouth of the Little Murray River to its southern bank; thence generally south-easterly by the southern bank of the Little Murray River to the point of commencement. Including all water frontage reserves and all roads within the above-described area.

2. The whole of Beveridge Island, in the Parish of Tynnynder, County of Tatchera.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*, except quail.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1938 for free places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Each application must be made in the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to reach the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 1st December, 1937.

Land Surveyors Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF THE REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION AND LICENSING OF LAND SURVEYORS.

IN pursuance of section 9 of the *Land Surveyors Act 1928* and all other powers thereto enabling, the Board doth hereby amend the Regulations for the Examination and Licensing of Land Surveyors made by the Board, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th November, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st November, 1934, at pages 2750-52, as follows:—

These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1938. Regulation (1) is hereby repealed, and the following regulation is substituted therefor:—

REGULATIONS.

Registration of Articles.

(1) No person will be registered by the Board as an articulated pupil unless before entering into Articles he has passed—

- (a) The Matriculation examination at a University, provided that the subjects passed at such examination shall include English and Mathematics; or
- (b) At an examination considered by the University of Melbourne as being equivalent to Matriculation or Leaving standard, in five subjects, which shall include English and Mathematics, together with other subjects approved by the Board.

NOTE.—Mathematics will be interpreted to mean Mathematics II. and III. of the School Leaving Examination conducted by the University of Melbourne, or Mathematics Grade I. of the examination conducted by the Education Department of Victoria.

In Regulation 8, Examination subject (11) "Field Practice," the following clause shall be added thereto, appearing after the word "prescribed":—

"The Board will require production of original plans and field notes from the Candidate as in Regulation Nos. 9 (b) and 9 (c)."

Also in Regulation 8, Examination subject (14) "Practical Levelling" is deleted as such, but shall now form part of Examination subject (12) "Adjustment and Use of Instruments" and be taken together as one subject.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WOODWORKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts the Wages Board, which, since the 16th day of August, 1937, has had power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons (other than persons under the jurisdiction of the Carpenters Board, Agricultural Implements Board, Country Agricultural Implements Board, Furniture Board, Shops Board No. 12 (Fuel and Fodder), or Shops Board No. 13 (Fuel and Fodder—Country), or persons engaged in ship or boat building, or the erection of bridges, wharfs, or similar structures), employed as—

- (a) box-makers;
- (b) stackers, sorters, loaders, or unloaders of sawn, hewn, or split timber or logs;
- (c) sawmill, timber-yard, timber seasoning plant, box factory, or joiners' workshop employees (other than carpenters or joiners);
- (d) builders of tramways for the conveyance of logs or timber;
- (e) timber fellers, hewers, or splitters whosoever employed;
- (f) forest workers conveying timber to a sawmill;
- (g) workers conveying timber from a sawmill by tramway;
- (h) woodworkers making articles not under the jurisdiction of any Wages Board heretofore appointed or hereafter to be appointed—

has made the following Determination namely:—

(1) That on the 26th day of October, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(b) **Special rates—**

- (i) The minimum rates of pay of special workers except those provided for in clause 23 (2) shall be as follows:—In all places, 2s. 8d. per hour provided that:—
- (ii) Special work carrying timber or logs off rafts or sunken punts, or carrying or handling timber or logs on any raft, punt, wharf, or dump which has recently been submerged and is in a wet condition therefrom—an extra 6d. per hour.
- (iii) For work prescribed in clause 23 (2) hereof payment shall be made at the rate of 10 per cent. additional to the weekly rate prescribed herein for the class of work performed provided that:—
- (iv) Submerged timber—regular employees carrying off rafts or sunken punts, or carrying or handling on any raft, punt, wharf, or dump, timber which has recently been submerged and is in a wet condition therefrom—6d. per hour extra.

(3) **ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.**

(a) Pursuant to the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the wages and rates set out in clause 2 (a) of this Determination are based upon the following basic wage rates and shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amounts as such basic wage rates on and from the first days of June, September, December, and March in each year in accordance with the tables set out hereunder.

Male adult employees in bush or in bush sawmills shall in addition to the basic wage be paid 2s. per week as the allowance referred to in clause 10 (3) hereof.

Adjustment of Basic Wage.

(b) For work done before the beginning of the first pay period to commence in October, 1937, the amounts of the basic wage prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof shall be paid.

For work done during each future pay period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a December, a March, a June, or a September, the amounts of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Award the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician.

(1) Adjustment is to be based upon the equating of index number 1000 with a wage of 81s., the amount assessed upon that number of the Court's declared ordinary basic wage per week.

(2) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned thereto in sub-clause (a) hereof.

(3) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of thirteen weeks for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.

(4) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.

(5) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such period of or near a quarter.

The index number divisions in this table are based upon the equating of the index number 1000 with a basic wage of 81s. per week, and any necessary extension may be made by reference to the Table of Wages containing 1s. divisions authorized by the Court.

(4) **RATES FOR APPRENTICES AND JUNIOR LABOUR.**

The minimum rates for apprentices shall be as provided in clause 15 hereof and for unapprenticed boys as provided in clause 16 hereof.

(5) **PAYMENT BY RESULTS.**

(a) Subject to the employee receiving at least the minimum time rate an employer may remunerate any of his employees under any system of payment by results based on rates which will enable workers of average capacity to earn at least 10 per cent. in excess of their weekly rates.

(b) Where an employee works part of a full week at piece-work rates and part at time rates he shall be paid so much as he is entitled to receive under such piece-work rates, plus the proportionate amount which he is entitled to receive under this award at time rates of pay.

(c) Where an employer has any person working under any system of payment by results referred to in this clause, he shall reduce into writing the terms under which such person is working, and such document shall be signed by such person and the employer. Upon demand by an officer of the union such document shall be shown to him, and he shall be allowed to make a copy of same should he so desire.

(6) **TURNING AND LOADING SLEEPERS.**

When sleepers are being inspected whilst they are being loaded into trucks by piece-workers and, at the request of the employer or of a Government inspector or of the buyer, the sleepers are turned for inspection or re-inspection, the loaders shall receive turning rates whilst turning such sleepers and loading rates whilst loading such sleepers.

(7)

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE.

(a) Subject to the following an employee engaged in ordinary travelling on duty or on work on which he is unable to return to his home at night shall be paid such personal expenses as he reasonably incurs in travelling, which expenses shall be taken to be at least 7s. 6d. per day.

(b) Where such employee travels by boat or other conveyance in which his ticket includes meals and bed he shall not be entitled to the said allowance.

(c) Where the employer of such employee provides or is willing to provide meals and bed the employee shall have the option of receiving 7s. 6d. per day or accepting the meals and bed provided or offered by the employer.

(d) This clause shall not apply to workers in the bush or to those ordinarily and usually employed on lighters, punts, or rafts.

(8)

TRAVELLING TIME.

(a) Subject to the following a weekly employee shall, when he is directed or required to work at a place other than his usual place of work, be paid at ordinary rates for all time occupied in travelling to and from the place at which he is so directed or required to work in excess of the time ordinarily occupied in travelling to and from his usual place of work.

(b) Each employee in the bush shall have a fixed starting place which shall be the existing starting place.

(c) New starting places in the bush shall be fixed by agreement between the employer and the union.

(d) When an employee has a fixed starting point in the bush he shall be paid for all time occupied in travelling between the starting point and the work and for all time in excess of half an hour back from the work to the starting point.

(9)

MIXED FUNCTIONS.

(a) An employee engaged for more than half of one day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If for half or less than half of one day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

(b) Where an employee is transferred without seven days' written notice to a grade of work carrying a lower minimum rate of wage than that at which he is usually employed, he shall be paid, during such seven days or any less time so employed, the rate of wage he was receiving for the work usually performed by him.

(c) Where an employee is engaged on higher grade work at his own request for the purpose of learning such work, he shall be paid for the time he is so engaged for a period or periods not exceeding fourteen days in all at his usual rate of pay prior to his being so engaged, and thereafter at the rate prescribed for the higher grade work. The employer shall, within one week of the engagement of an employee under this sub-clause, inform the union by registered letter of such employment and the duration of such employment.

(10)

TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.

All employees except those engaged on piece-work or on casual work shall be employed on a weekly engagement subject to the following terms:—

(1) An employee shall perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the usual days and within the prescribed hours, provided that until the seven days' notice of transfer to a lower grade, prescribed by clause 9, sub-clause (b) hereof, expires, such work shall in the case of cities and towns be of or be paid for as of a similar class to that usually performed by such employee.

(2) Employment during the first week of such engagement shall be from day to day at the weekly rate prescribed, except in the case of a re-engagement within one month after the termination of a previous service of the employee under the employer.

(3) An employee shall be entitled to payment when absent from work consequent upon an accident or ill health (not attributable to his own misconduct) for not more than four days in any year provided that he produces evidence thereof satisfactory to his employer or to such employer's local manager within 48 hours of the commencement of such absence.

Provided that where, under any scheme of insurance or an accident relief or provident fund, to secure the benefit of which the employer has paid the necessary premium or under any Workers' Compensation Act, compensation becomes payable for any of such days of absence, the employer shall not be bound to pay more of such wage than is sufficient with such compensation to make up the full pay for any of such days.

This sub-clause shall not apply to workers who receive the allowance of 2s. per week under clause 3 (a) hereof in substitution therefor.

(4) Subject to the provisions of the two next succeeding sub-clauses a week's notice of the termination of such engagement shall be given to terminate such engagement on the corresponding day of the following week or on any later day thereof and if the employer terminates it without giving such notice he shall pay the employee one week's wages instead.

Provided that in the case of work in the bush and at bush mills such notice may be dispensed with by the consent in writing of the employer and employee.

Provided also that if an employee leave his employment otherwise than in pursuance of such week's notice or of such consent in writing or of dismissal by the employer, the employer may retain any money due by virtue of this award to the employee until the time at which it would have become payable if the employee had not so left.

(5) The employer may dismiss any employee peremptorily without notice for malingering, inefficiency otherwise than through temporary illness, neglect of duty or misconduct, and pay the employee's wages up to the time of such dismissal only.

(6) The employer may deduct payment for any day the employee cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by or participation in any strike by the union, by any branch of the union, or by any members or member of the union employed by the employer or because of any strike by or participation in any strike by any other union, branch of any other union or members or member of any other union employed by the employer, or because of any breakdown of machinery, or because of any other stoppage of work for any reasonable cause. The onus of proving reasonableness of the cause shall be on the employers.

(7) In any case where the wage per hour has to be calculated it is to be the weekly wage divided by the weekly number of hours which obtains in the industry.

(8) Employer parties may engage employees in box and case factories by the hour and shall pay such employees at a rate per hour proportionate to the weekly wage, plus 10 per cent., with a minimum amount in respect of any employment on a day as for the full day.

(11)

HOURS OF LABOUR.

The standard hours of work in this industry shall be 46 per week:—

(a) The maximum ordinary working hours of employees shall be 46 per week throughout the industry, provided that where persons are employed in any other industry such persons' hours of work shall be uniform with those prevailing in such industry.

(b) The daily spread of hours shall be such as may be agreed upon by a majority of the employees and employer concerned in any business and approved of by the State branch of the union. In default of such agreement and approval such hours shall be worked within nine and three-quarter consecutive hours between 7.15 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. standard time on Monday to Friday—one hour or such other time as may be agreed upon being allowed for luncheon between noon and 2 p.m.—and between 7.15 a.m. and 12 noon standard time on Saturday.

(c) Sub-clause (b) hereof shall not apply to feeders, hookmen, log yardmen, log loaders and log haulers, greasers, bush blacksmiths, sanitary men, and men employed on barges and rivers.

(d) The hours for shiftmen shall be as prescribed by clause 12 hereof.

(12)

SHIFT WORK.

In the event of more than one shift being worked then each shift—other than the day shift—shall be worked in five equal periods during the week (excluding Sunday), at such hours as may be agreed upon between the employer and employees concerned, provided that the total hours worked in any week on shifts, other than the day shift, shall not exceed 90 per cent. of the ordinary weekly hours prescribed for the day shift.

(13)

HOLIDAYS.

(1) All employees, except piece-workers, bush workers, and bush sawmill employees, shall be entitled to nine holidays with payment therefor in the manner hereinafter prescribed:—Such holidays shall be New Year's Day, 26th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Labour Day), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and (a) within 25 miles of the General Post Office at Melbourne, Melbourne Cup Day; (b) outside the radius mentioned in 13 (1) (a) Anzac Day, provided that in any year in which Anzac Day falls on a Sunday, King's Birthday shall be observed as a holiday in lieu thereof.

(2) Bush workers and bush sawmill workers, other than piece-workers, groomers, feeders, and watchmen, shall have a full week's holiday at Christmas and four days holiday at Easter, that is to say, Good-Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, and Easter Tuesday.

(3) (i) Except as provided in this sub-clause no deduction shall be made from wages in respect of any of the holidays prescribed in sub-clauses (1) or (2) hereof.

(ii) Subject to observance of the provisions herein set forth for payment to employees in respect of such holidays, the employer may deduct from an employee's wage an amount corresponding with the time which the employee works short because of such holidays. Such provisions are the following:—

(a) The employer shall for each calendar month of the employment credit in account the employee with one-eighth of the amount of the employee's prescribed weekly rate of wage, except in the case of a groomer or feeder or watchman where the amount to be credited shall be one-sixth of the amount of such rate.

(b) On or before the pay-day next preceding a holiday the amount of time that the employee will work short because of the holiday and the amount which will be deducted from his wage in respect of such working short shall be ascertained.

(c) If on such pay-day there is standing to the credit of the employee pursuant to the preceding paragraph (a) an amount equal to or exceeding the amount that will be so deducted from his wage, the employer shall on that day pay him an amount equal to that which will be so deducted and the employee's credit shall be reduced by the amount so paid.

(d) If on such pay-day the amount standing to such credit is less than the amount which will be so deducted, the employer shall on that day pay to the employee the amount then standing to such credit, which credit shall be reduced by the amount so paid.

(e) If on such pay-day there is nothing standing to such credit nothing shall be payable in respect of such holiday.

(f) On the first pay-day after the expiration of each twelve months of service of the employee the amount (if any) then standing to such credit shall be paid to him and such credit shall be reduced by the amount so paid.

(g) On the determination of the employee's service the amount (if any) then standing to such credit shall be paid to him.

(4) *Optional Holiday.*—On or before the 7th day of December in each year the union shall give the employer written notice of the number and names of his employees who do not intend to work during the working days between Christmas and New Year's Day. In default of such notice the employer may circularize his employees to obtain such information, and the employees intending not to work on such days shall inform the employer on or before the 14th day of December accordingly.

If the number of employees, whether members of the union or not, who inform the employer either by means of the union or otherwise that they do not intend to work on such days exceeds 33 per cent. of all the employees, whether members of the union or not, in the employer's business, then the employer may, if he chooses, close down his business on those days; provided that he gives notice to his employees on or before the 21st day of December that he intends to do so. Where such number of employees is 33 per cent. or under, then the employer shall keep his business open for work on such days. Where the business is kept open for work, the employer may require the employees presenting themselves for work to work in any capacity he may appoint, provided that the employees shall be paid at their ordinary rates for such work as they are called on to do.

If any employee whose name has not been submitted by the union as provided herein, or who has not informed the employer on or before the 14th day of December that he does not intend to work on the days in question, absents himself from work when the business is open for work on such days, then such employee shall be guilty of neglect of duty within sub-clause (5) of clause 10 hereof. An employee not working on the days in question shall receive no pay therefor.

(5) The employee shall be entitled only to the holidays prescribed herein notwithstanding anything contained in or under any State Act of Parliament creating or proclaiming any other holiday or holidays.

(6) (i) For the purposes of this clause calendar months shall be reckoned as commencing with the beginning of the first day of the employment or period of employment in question and as ending at the beginning of the day which in the latest month in question has the same date number as that which the commencing day had in its month, and if there be no such day in such subsequent month, shall be reckoned as ending at the end of such subsequent month.

(ii) For the purposes of this clause in the case of employment already existing the day of the coming into operation of this Determination shall be deemed to be the first day of the employment.

(14) OVERTIME.

(a) Subject to the following all time worked outside the spread of hours prescribed in clauses 11 and 12 hereof or in excess of the ordinary daily or shift number of hours prescribed therein or elsewhere shall be paid for as overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours, and double time thereafter. Work performed during the meal hour shall be paid for at double time rates, but where the total hours worked, including such meal time, do not exceed the prescribed number of hours, then such double time shall be deemed to mean an additional ordinary rate only.

(b) All work performed by a piece-worker before or after ordinary hours of work on the instruction of his employer shall be paid as overtime at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and of double time thereafter.

(c) Except where it is otherwise prescribed, all time worked by employees on the holidays to which they are entitled under this Determination shall be paid for proportionately, in addition to the indirect payment or to the payment by written agreement for holidays prescribed in clause 13 hereof, at the ordinary rates; and on Sundays shall be paid for at proportionately double rates. Provided that in the case of work done on either a Sunday or holiday payment shall be made for two hours at the least at such double rates.

(d) All work performed by a piece-worker on Sundays on the instructions of his employer shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(e) All time worked by employees on Sundays or holidays prescribed herein in maintaining or effecting repairs or renewals to plant or machinery, including the washout of boilers, which it is necessary to effect to enable work to proceed on the next working day shall be paid for, in the case of Sundays, at the rate of time and a half, and in the case of such holidays at ordinary rates in addition to the indirect pay or to the pay under written agreement for such holidays allowed in clause 13 hereof.

(15) APPRENTICES.

(1) The following sub-clauses apply only to city and town sawmills, shops, and factories.

(2) *Machinists.*—The employer shall employ at least one apprentice and not more than two apprentices to each six journeymen employed by him at full rates under this Determination, but may employ one apprentice if he so employs four journeymen. For the purpose of calculating the number and proportion of apprentices under this sub-clause, the following shall be journeymen:—Machinists on shaper, routing machine, general joiner, Boulton's carver, buzzer, moulding machine, planing machine, Lindemann gluer and jointer, tenoning machine, jointer, woodturners and grinders of knives and cutters, and any working proprietor working on any of such machines.

(3) *Sawyers.*—The employer may employ one apprentice when there are one or more journeymen employed by him at full rates under the Determination, but he shall not employ more than two apprentices to each six journeymen so employed. For the purpose of calculating the number and proportion of apprentices under this sub-clause, the following shall be journeymen:—Sawyers of any sort and saw sharpeners.

(4) *Saw Doctors.*—The employer may employ one apprentice to each saw doctor.

(5) Apprentices shall be apprenticed in accordance with a form of Indenture prescribed by the Board.

(6) Apprentices shall be apprenticed if under the age of eighteen years for a period of five years, and if eighteen years of age for a period of four years.

(7) The minimum rates of weekly wage to be paid to apprentices shall be as follows:—

Where an apprentice is under the age of 21 years on the expiry of his apprenticeship he shall be paid 4/5ths of the journeymen's time wage until reaching the age of 21 years.

(8) A boy about to be apprenticed shall, if the employer require it, furnish a certificate or statutory declaration as to his age, and the employer may rely on such certificate or declaration unless or until he has notice of its inaccuracy.

(9) An apprentice under sub-clause (2) hereof shall be instructed in and properly taught and practised in the work of at least three of the following:—Shaper, routing machine, general joiner, Boulton's carver, buzzer, moulding, planing, Lindemann gluer and jointer, tenoning and jointer machines; wood turner, and in the setting up of and grinding of knives and cutters for those machines in which he is instructed, taught, and practised; provided that any such group shall include at least one of the following:—Shaper, general joiner, Boulton's carver, buzzer (using other than straight irons), Lindemann gluer and jointer or wood turner.

(10) An apprentice under sub-clause (3) hereof shall be instructed in, and properly taught and practised in, the work of sawing ordinarily and usually done in a sawmill, and in the work of setting and sharpening saws.

(11) An apprentice under sub-clause (4) hereof shall be instructed in, and properly taught and practised in, the work of repairing and putting saws in perfect order and saw hammering.

(12) Where it is desired that an apprentice be instructed in, taught, and practised in any machine or machines not included in sub-clause (9) hereof, it may be so agreed with the consent of the union, provided that the apprentice be instructed in, taught, and practised in at least two of the machines referred to in that sub-clause in addition.

(13) During the first two years of apprenticeship the employer shall allow the employee one half-day per week for the purpose of attending Technical School where a Technical School is available.

(14) An employer requiring an apprentice to work overtime shall pay to such apprentice double rates for such overtime, provided no apprentice shall be required to work overtime for more than eight hours on such overtime in any one week, or more than sixteen hours in any four weeks, and provided that such work during such overtime shall not prevent the apprentice attending at any Technical School.

If the apprentice be willing to work on, and the employer desires to employ him on a holiday, then the employer may do so but must pay the apprentice double rates for such work. The work on such holiday shall not exceed the ordinary hours of work, and shall not be included in the calculation of eight and sixteen hours in the last preceding paragraph mentioned.

(15) An employer may employ a boy with a view to apprenticing him for a period of three months on probation, provided that if the boy shall then be indentured, such three months shall count as part of his apprenticeship. Within fourteen days of a boy being placed on probation for apprenticeship the employer shall notify the union by registered letter of such employment.

(16)

IMPROVERS AND JUVENILE WORKERS.

(1) The proportion of improvers who may be employed shall not exceed one improver to every four workers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

(2) Juvenile workers under 21 years of age may be employed at the following classes of work, provided that in any place the proportion of juvenile workers shall not exceed four juvenile workers to each employee receiving not less than the minimum wage:—

(i) Boring, assembling, sanding or finishing textile bobbins, or carrying or transporting wooden articles within textile bobbin factories.

(ii) Feeding timber not exceeding 2-in. square into magazine for automatic machine, or performing any work in connexion with the manufacture of golf tees.

(iii) Counting or packing bobbins, golf tees, or other small wooden articles, or sweeping up shavings or other refuse, or cleaning up factories.

(iv) Making wooden articles on "Polly" turning lathe or other similar rotary cutting lathe.

(v) Feeding automatic machine for the manufacture of shives.

(vi) Assembling all classes of wood veneer containers, such as strawberry boxes or punnets, fruit containers (not being cases or confectionery boxes).

(vii) Performing any of the following work in factories manufacturing electrical woodware:—

Staining, wrapping, counting, picking up blocks and stacking, sanding round blocks, cutting out backs, beading, cutting out round blocks, filling magazines, placing blocks in round forming machine, feeding burnishing machine, feeding nailing machine, tying up, rumbling, placing wooden bushings into machine for threading.

(viii) Performing any of the following operations in connexion with the manufacture of tennis rackets:—

Bumping grooves in bow, weighing frames, knurling handles of frames, cleaning glue off clamps, gluing, dowels in frames, counting and packing handle flakes, wood faces, overlays, &c., gluing paper to sand discs, grinding off screws, weighing, counting and stacking ash strips, marking bows for drilling, gouging stringing holes, bumping edges of grooves, countersinking stringing holes, removing frames from glue clamps, making lead weights.

(ix) Drilling, pointing, boring, slotting, threading, assembling, sanding, painting, varnishing, lacquering, or similar finishing any other small article of wood.

(3) The minimum rates of weekly wage to be paid to unapprenticed boys shall be as follows:—

(4) When any boy is engaged he shall, if the employer requires it, furnish a certificate or statutory declaration as to his age, and the employer may rely on such certificate or declaration until or unless he has notice of its inaccuracy.

(17)

SAWYER TO HAVE PULLER OUT.

No sawyer shall work or be required to work a running out saw bench cutting over 3 feet 6 inches in length without a puller out.

(18)

TOOLS TO BE SUPPLIED.

Employees other than millwrights, mantelpiece-makers, and piece-workers shall be supplied by the employer with all necessary tools, implements, and plant.

(19)

PROTECTIVE COVERING.

Water dogman and river logman shall be paid 6d. per week in addition to their ordinary wage for the cost of waterproof coats and boots.

(20)

TRANSPORT OF EMPLOYEE.

Where means of transport to the bush or bush sawmills is provided by the employer, on the termination of service of an employee, the employee, his family and his goods and chattels shall be transported free of charge within 48 hours of receipt by the employer of notice that such transport is required. But an employee shall not be entitled to free transport on a route along which the public is regularly transported for payment; on the other hand he shall not be charged a rate on such route in excess of that regularly charged to the public.

(21)

TIME BOOKS AND INSPECTION.

(a) The employer shall keep a time book or sheets or cards with entries typed, or perforated, or written in ink showing the names of his employees, the number of hours worked by each, the rate of pay and the wages payable and paid to each employee.

(b) The secretary or branch secretary or any officer of the union on production of an authority to the employer, his local manager or the person who purports to be in charge, shall be allowed at all reasonable times to inspect such time book, sheets, or cards, and to make a copy of the same. Such time book, sheets, or cards for the last preceding twelve months shall be kept available for this purpose.

(c) The secretary or branch secretary of the union or any officer of the union shall, on production of an authority to the employer or his local manager, be allowed at all reasonable times to inspect any part of an employer's works where it is suspected that a breach of this Determination has occurred or is occurring, but such inspection shall be carried out in the company of the employer or some one on his behalf. The employer shall provide the necessary facilities for the investigation of the breach or the supposed breach of this Determination including access to the time book, sheets, or cards referred to above. The union officers shall not interfere with or inconvenience the work and duties of the men more than is absolutely necessary for the proper investigation of the breach or supposed breach of this Determination.

(22)

RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIALS.

The secretary or branch secretary or any officer of the union shall have the right to enter employers' working establishments, during the meal time, for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business, on the following conditions:—

- (a) That the representative produces his authority to the gatekeeper or such other person as may be appointed by the employer.
- (b) That the representative interviews employees only at the places where they are taking their meals.
- (c) That not more than two such representatives shall at any one time visit or be in any one working establishment and if there are two representatives they shall both be there at the same time.
- (d) That if a working establishment shall have been visited by any such representative during a week it shall not be visited afterwards during the same week by any such representative.
- (e) That if any employer alleges that a representative is unduly interfering with his working establishment, or is creating disaffection amongst his employees, or is offensive in his methods, or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions, such employer may refuse the right of entry.
- (f) Any unreasonable delay in allowing officers of the union into the premises shall be regarded as a breach of this Determination.

(23)

PROVISIONS RELATING TO SPECIAL WORK.

Special work means the following work performed by an employee (other than a regular employee) employed by the hour:—

- (1) Receiving timber from any vessel or wharf for delivery into any yard, mill, railway truck, or other place; the delivery of timber received from any vessel or wharf directly into any yard, mill, railway truck, or other place and thereupon stacking; receiving timber at any yard, mill, railway truck, or other place for delivery to any wharf or vessel, and the delivery of such timber to any vessel or wharf and thereupon stacking.
- (2) Receiving timber at any railway truck or siding and its delivery into any yard, mill, or place (other than vessel or wharf) and thereupon stacking; delivering timber from any yard, mill, or place (other than vessel or wharf) into any railway truck or siding and thereupon stacking or loading, which work shall be paid for at the rate of 10 per cent. additional to the weekly rate prescribed herein for the class of work performed.
- (3) Where a weekly employee is put on to that work expressly defined by clause 23 hereof as special work, he shall, if he is discharged within four weeks of his being put on to such work, have his pay calculated according to the rates provided in this Determination for special work for the time he is so engaged, and shall be paid any back pay due to him forthwith on his discharge or within fifteen minutes thereof.
- (4) Unless otherwise agreed upon with the consent of the State branch of the union the wages of special workers shall be paid at least once a week or if the work should finish before the end of any week then at the end of the job.
- (5) Where an employee doing special work provided for in clause 2 (b) or clause 23 hereof is kept waiting after his discharge for his pay for more than fifteen minutes through default of the employer the employee shall be paid at overtime rates for all time from the time of his discharge until he is paid.
- (6) One hour or such other time as may be agreed upon shall be allowed for meals except in a case of urgency or except where not more than half an hour is required to finish a job. Except in such cases no special worker shall be called upon to work during the meal hour unless he consents to do so. Where a special worker works during the meal hour he shall be paid for the time worked at the rate of 2s. 3d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rate for such period.
- (7) A special worker having begun work shall not, without reasonable cause or excuse, be dismissed or cease work until the job is finished. The burden of establishing such reasonable cause or excuse shall in every legal proceeding be upon the party alleging such reasonable cause or excuse.
- (8) Any special worker engaged for work shall be paid for at least two hours if not put to work.

(24)

DEFINITIONS.

In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears:—

- (a) "Millwright" shall mean and include an employee who installs machinery in a sawmill.
- (b) "Leading hand" means an employee who, while he is working, has under his charge or control any adult person or persons not apprentices or improvers who are performing the same class of work as himself, and who has been appointed by the employer to take such charge or control. This definition does not apply to engine drivers, firemen, or greasers. A leading hand shall receive 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (c) "Main dock" means the dock, in a mill where there are two or more docks, at which most timber is docked. In mills where the breaking down bench feeds two benches with approximately equal quantities of timber, the two docks shall be rated as main docks.
- (d) "Measurer": See "Tallyman or measurer".
- (e) "Mixed industry" shall mean an employer's industry where the work performed by an employee as herein defined is subsidiary and ancillary to the chief and principal purpose and business of such industry.
- (f) "Orderman" means an employee who is responsible for the selection, allotment, and measuring of orders for delivery and/or for the execution of orders for delivery. The word "order" in this definition shall mean the demand of a customer or of the employer, or some one on his behalf to the orderman for an expressed size and class, or expressed sizes and classes of timber.
- (g) "Tallyman or measurer" is an employee who by measuring and/or calculating quantities keeps an account of timber, and does not include one who merely measures lengths of timber, or merely counts timber by pieces.
- (h) "Tramway builder or repairer" means an employee engaged in the work of tramway construction and maintenance, but does not include the work of clearing the track and forming the permanent way, or the work ordinarily performed by a fettler.
- (i) "Union" means the Australian Timber Workers' Union.
- (j) "Year" means a year commencing the 23rd day of January in each year.
- (k) "River logman" means an employee usually and ordinarily engaged on or in connexion with any barge, raft, or punt on any river, in loading, discharging, or bringing logs, piles, hewn or sawn timber to or from any mill or depot.

(25)

CLASSIFICATION OF SAWN BENCHES.

The following provisions shall apply to log sawmills:—

- (a) A breaking down bench shall include a circular saw, a band saw, twin saws, horizontal saw, or vertical saw when any of such saws is used for the purposes of reducing a log to fitches.
- (b) A No. 1 Bench shall mean any bench which takes fitches 3 inches thick or over from the breaking down bench.
- (c) A No. 2 Bench shall mean any bench which is fed directly from a No. 1 Bench, and which is not being used as a picket bench within sub-clause (e) hereof.
- (d) A No. 3 Bench shall mean any bench which is fed directly from a No. 2 Bench, and which is not being used as a picket bench within sub-clause (e) hereof.
- (e) A No. 4 Bench shall mean a bench on which timber is cut into pickets, laths, droppers, palings, staves, or other small sizes which small sizes do not exceed 3 inches by 1½ inches by 9 feet or the equivalent in section by 9 feet.

(26)

MEASURING LOGS.

All logs felled or hauled at piece-work rates shall be measured at the mill landing. Particulars of the logs so measured shall be given to the piece-worker at least once a fortnight unless otherwise agreed upon by the employer and employee, and such particulars shall set out the name of the mill supplied, the name and names of the employees, the date, the brand, the length, the girth, and the cubic feet of such logs. Provided that in respect of measuring red gum logs an agreement may be entered into between the State Branch of the Union and employers.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 3 (BUTCHERS).

NOTE.—This Determination on the 14th October, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak ridings of the shire of Corio.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butchers or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 14th October, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

No carter or driver under 18 years of age shall be allowed to have sole charge of a motor vehicle.

PROPORTION (BY ANY EMPLOYER).

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than the minimum wage prescribed by this Determination.

Improvers.

Carters or Drivers—

One improver to every five drivers receiving not less than the minimum wage.

Other Improvers—

Such number of improvers as shall not, together with apprentices, exceed, in the aggregate, one to every three or fraction of three adult weekly workers (other than carters or drivers) receiving not less than the minimum wage.

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 12th September, 1911.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to casual employees.

(11) ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.—Stablemen or grooms employed in connexion with abattoirs or meat markets, who are usually required to work continuously seven days in the week, shall be allowed one week's holiday on full pay at the expiration of each twelve months' service.

The days to be recognized as holidays under this clause shall be those specified for the respective sections in clause 12; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of such holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(14) NOTICE TO WORK ON HOLIDAYS.—Except in the case of unavoidable accident or emergency, three days' notice shall be given to an employee who is required to work on a holiday prescribed in this determination.

(15) SMOKO INTERVALS.—All persons (other than carters, drivers, stablemen, or grooms) employed in connexion with abattoirs or meat markets shall be allowed twenty minutes' smoko each forenoon and afternoon.

(16) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Wages shall be paid not later than Friday in each week, and must be paid during working hours.

(17) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanour seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to tacklemen, slaughterers, or labourers employed in or in connexion with abattoirs or meat markets in the Metropolitan District.

(18) STOP WORK MEETINGS.—No stop work meetings shall be held by employees during working hours. If, in contravention of this clause, a stop work meeting should be held, the pay for the time lost may be deducted.

(19) TIME BOOK FOR SLAUGHTERMEN.—Every slaughterman shall indelibly record daily his correct times of beginning and ending work, also the daily tally of work performed by him in a book which shall be furnished by the employer. Such time book shall be produced for inspection during reasonable hours to the Secretary of the Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union or any official thereof duly authorized in writing by the President and Secretary of the local branch or sub-branch of the Union.

(20) TREATMENT OF INJURED STOCK.—

(a) The employer shall have power to call on slaughtermen during the following periods to kill stock that require immediate treatment, viz.:—During smoko intervals, between 12 and 1 p.m., and after 5 p.m. on week days, and after 11 a.m. on Saturdays. Stock killed during such periods are to be considered extra to the day's tally, and shall be paid for at one and a half times the ordinary rates.

(b) Where a watchman is employed, he shall be able during his period of watch, but not during the hours when slaughtering operations are being carried on, to kill and dress any injured or crippled sheep or lambs that may require attention.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE GROCERS' SUNDRIES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 15th October, 1937, applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which, since the 23rd July, 1934, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) manufacturing cereal foods (except in flour mills), spices, condiments, coffee, chicory, cocos, or any kind of goods commonly known as Grocers' Sundries;
- (b) making, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale moulders' blacking, moulders' plumbago preparations, blacklead, boot blacking, boot paste, boot polish, washing blue, harness dressing, harness compounds, ebonite shine, stove polish, knife polish, metal polish;
- (c) grinding, tinning, putting up, bottling, wrapping, labelling, or otherwise preparing for sale charcoal or coal dust; and
- (d) making soap, washing soda, candles, or starch"—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th October, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **EMPLOYMENT.—WEEKLY WAGES.**—(a) Employees may be engaged by the week, and when so engaged must be available, ready, and willing to perform such work as the employer shall from time to time require on the days and during the hours usually worked by the class of employees affected.

(b) Employment for the first two weeks of service shall be from day to day at the weekly rate fixed.

(c) Any weekly employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless he or she produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence satisfactory evidence to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year commencing from the 21st December.

(d) An employee is not to be entitled to more than six days' payment in any year for such non-attendance notwithstanding that he or she may be employed during the year by more than one employer.

(4) **HOURS OF WORK.**—(a) The hours of employment without payment for overtime shall not exceed 44 per week. Except as to shift workers ordinary hours shall be worked in 5 days of 8 hours, and one day (Saturday) of 4 hours, or in 5 days of 8 hours 48 minutes each, continuously, except breaks for meals, between 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, and 7 a.m. to noon on Saturday, at the discretion of the employer. Provided that the spread of hours herein prescribed may be altered by mutual agreement between an employer and the Manufacturing Grocers Employees' Federation of Australia.

(b) The employer shall fix the starting and finishing times, provided that no change in such fixed times shall be made except by agreement between the employer and the Manufacturing Grocers Employees' Federation of Australia, and provided further that one week's notice of any such change shall be given to the employees.

(5) **OVERTIME.**—All work performed outside the starting and finishing times, provided for in clause 4 or fixed pursuant to an agreement under clause 11 (d) of this Determination, or in excess of 44 hours per week, shall be paid for at the rate of half time in addition to ordinary time. Overtime rates shall be paid on the basis of a quarter of an hour. A fraction of a quarter of an hour shall be paid for as a quarter of an hour. Piece-work done outside the starting and finishing times shall be paid for with the addition of a half rate to the ordinary rate.

(6) **SPECIAL RATES.**—(a) Employees shall receive payment at double time rate for work done on Sunday, and shall receive payment at ordinary rate in addition to the full weekly rate for work done on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(b) When Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or New Year's Day, or a proclaimed substitute therefor falls on a day other than Sundays and payment of wages is not included in the weekly wage in consequence of the Christmas holidays having been taken as provided for in sub-clause (f) hereunder, then employees shall receive payment for each of such days calculated as eight hours.

(c) All employees on time work off duty on any of the above-mentioned holidays, other than Sunday, shall be paid for such days at ordinary rate. Piece-workers shall be paid for such holidays and Sundays at the rate payable to employees on time work doing the same class of work.

(d) Where an employee is absent from his or her work on the day before or the day after a public holiday without reasonable excuse, or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holidays.

(e) Where the majority of the employees of any establishment or of any department agree with the employer to work part time for any period, or to close down for any period on the days other than the prescribed holidays, the weekly rate shall not apply.

CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS.—(f) On or before the 14th December in each year the employer shall be given or may obtain notice of the number and names of his adult employees who do not elect to work on the working days between Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If more than 33 per cent. of such of the adult employees in any particular establishment as come within the classification in this Determination indicate to the employer their election not to work on such days, then the employer may if he chooses, close down his establishment on such days, provided that on or before the 21st December he gives notice to his employees of his intention to do so. Where such number is 33 per cent. or under, then the employer shall keep his establishment open for work on such days, or, if he closes it, he shall pay the ordinary wage to those employees who have declared themselves ready and willing to work on such days and who have not been dismissed in conformity with this Determination.

(g) Where the business is kept open for work, the employer may require the employees presenting themselves for work to work in any capacity he may appoint, provided the employees shall be paid at their ordinary rates for such work as they are called on to do.

(h) If any employee has not indicated to the employer on or before the 14th December that he does not intend to work on the days in question, and absents himself from work when the business is open for work on such days, then such employee shall receive no pay therefor.

(7) **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—(a) Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given on any day of the week by either employer or employee provided that such notice given to an employee solely for the purpose of avoiding payment for prescribed holidays shall not deprive such employee of payment for holidays occurring between such notice and re-engagement, if any.

(b) Nothing contained in this Determination shall affect the right of the employer to dismiss any employee without notice for malingering, inefficiency, neglect of duty, or misconduct, or to deduct payment for any day on which the employee cannot usefully be employed because of a strike, or stoppage of work for which the employer cannot reasonably be held responsible.

(c) In the event of such dismissal, wages shall be paid up to the time of such dismissal. If an employee's services be terminated during the course of a week he shall be paid all money due to him at the termination of his services, or such money shall be forwarded to him by post within 24 hours thereafter.

(8) **PAYMENT OF WAGES.**—Wages shall be paid weekly on a week day other than Saturday.

(9) **MEAL TIMES.**—A lunch period of at least one half-hour for each employee shall be fixed in each factory between 12 noon and 2 p.m. for other than shift workers. No employee shall be required to work more than five hours from the starting of work in the morning without a break for lunch.

(b) Work performed during the usual meal hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, but where the total hours worked (including time worked during such meal time) do not exceed the prescribed daily number of hours then such time shall be deemed to mean an additional payment at half ordinary rate only for such meal time. Such employee shall be allowed time for a meal.

(10) **REST PERIOD.**—Women workers on time work shall be allowed an interval of ten minutes between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. for rest, and such interval shall be observed at times convenient to the employer. Such intervals shall count as time worked.

(11) **SHIFT WORKERS.**—(a) Shift workers shall have a break for meals without deduction of pay.

(b) Shift workers engaged on a second or third shift daily, other than overtime, shall receive payment at ordinary time plus 5 per cent.

(c) Shift workers on a second or third shift who are unable to travel to and from work on workmen's tickets shall be paid 1s. 6d. per week in addition to their ordinary rate of pay.

(d) Shift work, including overlapping shifts, may be arranged by agreement between the employer and the Manufacturing Grocers Employees' Federation of Australia.

(12) **SUPPLY OF MATERIALS.**—The undermentioned materials shall be provided free of charge by every employer—

(a) All necessary tools of trade, which shall be kept in good repair by the employer.

(b) Uniforms and caps required by the employer to be worn by the employees.

(c) Goggles for employees engaged in work injurious to the eyes.

(13) **TEA MONEY.**—Any employee required to work overtime for any period in excess of one hour after the usual hour of ceasing duty shall either be supplied with a meal at the employer's expense, or be allowed 2s. for each meal required if the expense is incurred. Provided that this clause shall not apply where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime. Provided further that where the employee was notified the previous day of the intention to work overtime and such overtime was not worked he shall be entitled to the meal allowance herein provided.

The provisions of this clause shall not apply in the case of boys under sixteen years of age or women or girls employed in factories whose conditions regarding overtime are governed by section 38 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677).

(14) **PIECEWORK.**—The Board determines under Section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677) that the employer may fix his or her own piecework rates, provided such prices enable an employee of average capacity working under like conditions to earn at least 10 per cent. above the minimum weekly wage in their respective classes. The same piecework prices shall be paid to all pieceworkers doing the same operation in the factory, whether they be improvers or juveniles on piecework or otherwise.

(b) Pieceworkers who are requested to wait on or about the employer's premises for work on any one day for more than half an hour shall be paid for such waiting time at the rate based on the minimum weekly wage.

(c) A weekly pieceworker shall be allowed in each week sufficient piecework to enable such employee to earn at least the prescribed rate fixed in this Determination for the class of work performed. If such work is not provided, and the employee is ready and willing to perform all work provided, then such employee shall be paid the minimum wage applicable to the employee so employed.

(d) Pieceworkers working overtime for less than 15 minutes, or any fraction of 15 minutes, shall have their payment computed on the basis of an average amount of work done in 15 minutes.

(15) **DESTRUCTION OF CLOTHING.**—Where satisfactory evidence is produced by an employee that, when dissolving caustic soda, using solutions of caustic soda or mineral acids, his or her clothing has been destroyed through no fault of such employee, reparation shall be made by the employer.

(16) **WEIGHT CARRYING.**—No woman worker over the age of 18 years shall be required to carry a greater weight than 30 pounds. Section 207 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677) provides that no person employing any girl under the age of 18 years in a factory shall permit such girl while so employed to lift or carry a greater weight than 25 pounds.

(17) **TEMPORARY WORK.**—A temporary employee shall mean a person employed for 24 hours or less in any one week, but no employee shall be deemed to be a temporary worker where after employment for at least one week he is dismissed before he has worked 24 hours in the succeeding week, or where his non-employment for more than 24 hours is wholly attributable to causes over which the employer has no control.

Temporary workers unless dismissed for misconduct shall be paid at the rate of time and a third for all work performed.

(18) **DEFINITION.**—For the purpose of this Determination, year shall mean a period of twelve calendar months commencing on the 21st December in each year.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 23rd October, 1937, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a seller of furniture or floor coverings," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 23rd October, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(5) MEAL INTERVAL.—No employer shall require any employee to take a longer interval than one hour for a meal.

(7) SPECIAL RATE FOR PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Time and a half shall be paid for all work done on New Year's Day, 28th January (Australia Day), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Labour Day), King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928* within the area to which this Determination applies). If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(8) SUNDAYS.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays.

(9) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(10) TEA MONEY.—Any employee who is required to work overtime in excess of two hours on any day shall receive an allowance of 2s. as tea money in addition to the rates provided in Clause 6.

(11) RATIONING OF EMPLOYEES.—Where it is claimed by the employer that the exigencies of trade necessitate the rationing of employees, then such employer shall give at least seven days' notice of such rationing to the employee concerned.

(12) ANNUAL LEAVE.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday on full pay, and thereafter one week's holiday (with full pay) on each completed year of service.

(4) HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT.—The ordinary hours for a week's work shall be 44 per week, to be worked in five days of eight hours, and one day (Saturday) of four hours, or five days of eight hours forty-eight minutes each.

(5) OVERTIME.—Time and a half shall be paid for all work done—

- (a) In excess of four hours on Saturday and eight hours on other days. } Where an ordinary week's work is worked on six week days.
- (b) On Saturdays, and in excess of eight hours on other days. } Where an ordinary week's work is worked on five days (Monday to Friday).

(6) CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT.—(a) With the exceptions hereinafter stated, employment may be by the week or by the hour. If by the week it shall be terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day or (if the employer terminate it without such notice), by payment of one week's wages.

A contract for weekly employment may be terminated by any employer, without liability to pay for more than time actually worked, for misconduct or for absence from work without reasonable excuse.

If an employee engaged by the week absents himself from duty, except on public holidays or on days for which he produces a certificate from a medical practitioner or other proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness (aggregating four days of sickness in each year), a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay, i.e., one-sixth of the weekly wage for each day of absence, including Saturday in shops working six days and one-fifth in shops working five days per week: Provided that only time actually lost shall be deducted when an employee is absent with leave on a Saturday.

(b) If the contract of employment is for hourly hiring, the total amount of the rates prescribed in clause 3 (a) hereof shall be increased by 5s. per week (with a proportionate amount added to the wages of females and improvers), but such amount shall not be taken into account in computing overtime, Sunday, and holiday rates.

(c) An employee starting work on hourly hiring shall be entitled to a minimum of four consecutive hours' work or to four hours' pay for the job—such hours may be deemed to be consecutive if worked in ordinary hours at the end of a day and the beginning of the next succeeding day.

(7) HOLIDAYS.—All weekly wage employees shall be granted the following holidays without deduction of pay:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

All employees working on piece-work shall be granted the same holidays as are granted to weekly wage workers, and they shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be paid for such holidays the amount for each holiday based on the minimum weekly wage as set out in this Determination for the class of work performed.

If any of the above holidays occur on a Sunday or Saturday and are not observed on any other day, then employees shall not be paid for such Sunday, and shall be paid for such Saturday as for a half-day, but not otherwise.

Where an employee is absent from his or her employment on the day before or the day after a public holiday without reasonable excuse or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(8) MEAL ALLOWANCE.—Any employee required to work overtime beyond two hours without previous day's notice shall be allowed 1s. 6d. meal money.

(9) MEAL BREAK.—The meal-break shall be a period of not less than thirty minutes between noon and 2 p.m.

(10) REST INTERVAL.—There shall be an interval of ten minutes at a time fixed by the employer between 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. for rest on each day, Monday to Friday inclusive, in each week for each employee, such time to count as time worked. Reasonable facilities shall be provided by the employer for the employee to have refreshments during such interval if the employee so desires.

(11) SEATS FOR FEMALES.—Seats where practicable shall be provided for all female workers whilst on duty.

(12) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—(a) Wages shall be paid during working hours not later than Friday in each week.

(b) Where the services of an employee are dispensed with wages shall be paid on the day of dismissal or forwarded by post on the day following.

(13) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work for which the Board has fixed a minimum wage, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than 10 per centum in addition to the wages rates that are fixed by the Board for such work.

(2) On the 7th July, 1926, the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed laying or fixing faience or majolica on floors, walls, or ceilings, was taken from the Tilelayers Board and conferred exclusively on the Bricklayers Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than labourers) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a bricklayer," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 20th October, 1937, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—

(1) An amount of 2s. 6d. per week shall be paid to any employee going from and to his residence to and from his work.

(2) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night:—

6s. per day for the first seven days, and thereafter 30s. per week extra.
The fares necessarily expended, in addition to travelling time at ordinary rates during the ordinary working hours.

(4) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—(a) All wages due shall be paid not later than Thursday in each week.

(b) An employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand.

(c) If an employee leaves or is dismissed he shall be paid his wages on leaving or being dismissed, or paid by post or otherwise within 24 hours thereafter. If wages are not paid within the time prescribed in this paragraph, the employee shall be paid at ordinary rates for all time in excess of fifteen minutes beyond such time until the wages are paid or posted to his last known place of address.

(d) All other wages shall be paid during ordinary working hours.

(5) TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—The time of beginning and ending work for persons (other than those employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction) shall be—

7.45 a.m.	5.15 p.m. on each of five days in the week.
and 7.45 a.m.	12 noon on the other working day of the week on which the half-holiday is usually observed.

(6) OVERTIME.—(a) Persons employed on sewerage work, drainage work, or underground work not connected with building construction shall be paid—

For work done in excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a quarter.

(b) Persons employed on any other work shall be paid—

For work done within the hours fixed as the time of beginning and ending work in excess of 44 hours in any week Time and a quarter.

For work done on the weekly half-holiday—

Between 12 noon and 5 p.m. Double time.

Between 5 p.m. and midnight Double time.

For work done on the other working days of the week—

Between 5.15 p.m. and 8 p.m. Time and a half.

Between 8 p.m. and midnight Double time.

Between midnight and 7.45 a.m. Double time.

(7) DEFINITION OF FOREMAN.—Where four or more bricklayers are employed on any job, one shall be deemed to be a foreman and entitled to the rate prescribed for such a foreman.

(8) TOOLS.—Each employer shall provide at the works a safe and suitable place for the tools of his employees.

(9) SHELTER.—Where reasonably practicable each employer shall provide suitable dressing accommodation on all jobs where more than six men are employed and the work lasts or is estimated to last more than three weeks.

(10) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—All work done on—Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Monday, 26th January (Australia Day), 21st April (Labour Day), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since 13th December, 1927, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons (other than persons bolting structural ironwork in position, heating rivets, and holding up for boilermakers) employed in the occupation of—

- (a) builder's labourer on or about any building, or assisting any bricklayer, mason, plasterer, carpenter, plumber, or any other tradesman engaged in building operations;
- (b) labourer engaged in the construction, repair, demolition, or removal of buildings and bridges;
- (c) scaffolder, gear hand, gantry hand, crane hand, or dogman, or as a drainer on work in connexion with buildings;
- (d) labourer excavating ground for foundations or basements of buildings, or levelling ground on a proposed building site;
- (e) labourer doing concrete work or mortar mixing in connexion with or incidental to building construction;
- (f) labourer doing tar-paving or asphaltting work, or other work of a similar character in connexion with or incidental to building construction;
- (g) Labourer cleaning bricks on a site on which a building is being demolished, repaired, or constructed,

has made the following Determination, viz. :—

(a) Labourer employed as steel structural erector (on steel frame buildings), gear hand, rigger, pile driver, tackle hand, gantry hand, dogman, scaffolder (erecting rope scaffolding on buildings exceeding two stories above ground level), powder monkey: Provided always that men employed doing labouring work assisting these classifications shall be paid under sub-clause (b) hereof	88 8
(b) Builders' labourers in occupations other than those set out in sub-clause (a)	82 8

(3) WAGES OF CASUAL EMPLOYEES.

Builders' labourers shall, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, be deemed to be and shall be paid as casual employees for the first six months of their employment. At the end of six months employees who have been continuously employed for that period without loss of time on all usual working days and with loss of time if such is due to the fault of the employee shall be deemed thereafter to be continuously employed and shall be paid not less than the weekly rate herein prescribed. The period of six months referred to in this sub-clause may have been served during or before or partly during and partly before the date of the coming into operation of this Determination.

Casual employees shall be paid not less than the following per hour :—

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Where the employer has made a payment, which payment purports to be a payment of the wages payable to an employee for any period, the employer shall not be liable to pay to such employee any further sum prescribed by this Determination in respect of any services rendered to the employer during such period, unless within three months after the last day of such period a demand in writing of such further sum claimed has been made to the employer by such employee or by some person on his behalf and/or if proceedings to recover the amount claimed are not taken within nine months.

Wherever in this Determination time worked is required to be paid for at more than the ordinary rate, such time shall not be subject to more than one penalty, but shall be subject to that penalty which is to the employee's greatest advantage.

(5)

SPECIAL RATES.

Employees when working for more than one hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees Fahrenheit, shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra; employees when working in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahrenheit shall be paid 3d. per hour extra. Where work continues for more than two hours in temperatures exceeding 130 degrees Fahrenheit, employees shall also be entitled to twenty minutes rest after every two hours work without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the representative of the employer after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.

Employees when working for more than one hour in places where the temperature is reduced by artificial means below zero, shall be paid 1½d. per hour extra. Where the work continues for more than two hours employees shall be entitled to a rest period of twenty minutes after every two hours without loss of pay.

(6)

FARES AND ALLOWANCES.

Town work.—Except as to work within a radius of twelve miles of the General Post Office at Melbourne and except as to an employee continuously employed, an employee on construction work shall be paid all fares necessarily incurred in travelling to and returning from the job to his home in excess of 3d. per day.

As to work performed by such an employee within the above-mentioned radius there shall be added to the wages of such employee an allowance at the rate of 2s. 6d. per week in lieu of excess fares.

Country work.—When engaged on country work (as hereinafter defined) an employee shall be entitled to an additional payment at the rate of 3d. per hour if he return to his home on completion of the day's work or an additional payment at the rate of 3s. 6d. per day for seven days if the work render it reasonably necessary for him to sleep at a place other than his usual place of residence, and in either case such employee shall be entitled to fares necessarily incurred in travelling from and to his centre, and to have his time of travelling from and to his centre (not exceeding eight hours per day) treated as time on duty.

A fare shall be deemed to be necessarily incurred under this clause, or such additional payment shall be made if the employee use a bicycle or other means of locomotion or walk instead of using a public conveyance, but a fare shall not be deemed to have been so incurred and such payment shall not be required to be made where the employer provides or offers to provide a reasonable conveyance free of charge.

(7)

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

Employees other than casual employees shall be entitled to the following days (referred to herein as "public holidays") on full pay, namely:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary or Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day, Anzac Day, or such days as are observed from time to time as substitutes in a city or locality: Provided always that if any of the above-mentioned holidays fall on a Saturday or Sunday where a week of six days is worked only the half day in the case of Saturday shall be observed and in the case of Sunday no holiday shall be allowed excepting where a day is generally observed in the locality as a substitute. Provided also that in the case of a five-day week no holiday shall be allowed on a Saturday or Sunday excepting on such a substituted day: And provided further that such employees when engaged in another industry shall be entitled only to the public holidays prescribed for the majority of employees in such other industry.

(8)

TRANSFER FROM JOB TO JOB.

An employee transferred by the employer from one job to another job on the same day shall be paid for the time occupied in travelling as for time worked and the cost of such transfer shall be borne by the employer.

(9)

EMPLOYEES CALLED FOR WORK.

(a) An employee notified to commence duty and actually attending for duty and who is notified by the employer or his representative that his services are not required, shall be paid for two hours as time worked.

(b) An employee who is required to attend for work and is kept waiting to commence work by the instructions of the employer or his representative shall be paid at his ordinary rate of pay for the time he is so kept waiting.

(c) The provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) hereof shall not apply where one hour's previous notice that he will not be required to take up duty at the commencement of work has been given to the employee personally or left at his residence provided that if the employee has not given his address to the employer then the employer shall not be required to pay as prescribed by these sub-clauses.

(d) The provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) hereof shall not apply in cases where work cannot be commenced or continued on account of wet weather.

(10)

PAYMENT OF WAGES.

(a) Wages accrued may be paid on any day of the week, Monday to Friday inclusive, and shall be paid at or before the cessation of work.

Provided always that—

(i) an employer shall not keep more than one day's pay in hand;

(ii) an employee whose service ends before pay time shall be paid at or before the time of its ending, or shall be paid by post or otherwise within 24 hours thereafter;

(iii) in the case of a mixed industry, payment of wages shall be made in accordance with the practice prevailing for the majority of the employees in such mixed industry.

(b) If wages be not paid within the periods prescribed the employee shall be paid at ordinary rates for all time in excess of fifteen minutes beyond such time until the wages are paid or posted to his last known place of address.

(11)

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

Casual employment may be terminated by the employee on giving not less than one hour's notice or by the employer on giving not less than one hour's notice or by the payment of one hour's pay.

(12)

HOURS OF LABOUR.

(a) Except as herein provided the ordinary hours of duty shall be 44 per week to be worked on five days of eight hours and one day (Saturday) of four hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., with one hour's interval for a meal on week days, and 8 a.m. and noon on Saturday: Provided always that an employer may agree with the Australian Builders Labourers' Federation to vary the hours of starting and finishing work or to work a five-day-week within such hours as may be agreed upon or as may be determined by a Board of Reference in default of such agreement. The Board of Reference shall for the purpose of this determination consist of the Chairman of this Wages Board, the President of the Victorian Branch of the Australian Builders Labourers' Federation, and the President of the Master Builders Association, or the respective occupants of those positions for the time being.

(b) Where the standard hours in an employer's industry exceed 44 per week, the hours of duty shall be the standard hours in that particular industry.

(c) The ordinary hours of duty of employees engaged in a continuous process shall be 48 per week to be worked as to day workers eight and three-quarter hours on ordinary week days between 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with three-quarters of an hour interval for a meal, and four and a quarter hours on Saturday between 7.30 a.m. and 11.45 a.m., and as to shift workers eight hours per shift.

(d) Builders' labourers attending on or assisting tradesmen whose ordinary hours of duty are more than 44 per week shall work the hours of such tradesmen and such builders' labourers shall be entitled only to overtime for work done in excess of such hours.

(e) In the case of a mixed industry, builders' labourers shall conform to the daily hours and meal time of the tradesmen they assist.

(13)

OVERTIME.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, all time on duty beyond the ordinary hours of duty hereinbefore provided shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and at the rate of double time thereafter.
- (b) As far as practicable employees shall not be required to work overtime.
- (c) In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone.
- (d) For the purpose of computing overtime each fraction of a quarter of an hour shall be paid for as if it were a full quarter of an hour.
- (e) In the case of employers employing members in a continuous process, all time on duty beyond 8 hours per day or beyond 48 hours per week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, except where the excess time of duty—
- (i) is by arrangement between the employees themselves; or
 - (ii) is for the purpose of effecting the customary weekly rotation of shifts; or
 - (iii) is due to the fact that the relieving man does not come on duty at the proper time.

(14)

MEAL HOURS.

- (a) For work done during meal periods and thereafter until a meal period break is allowed time and a half rates shall be paid. Where owing to the requirements of the work it is necessary for an employee to work beyond noon then the meal period of such employee shall commence not later than 1 p.m.
- (b) An employee working overtime shall be allowed a crib-time of twenty minutes without deduction of pay after each four hours of work, but this provision shall not prevent any arrangement being made for the taking of a longer meal period without pay.
- (c) Before starting overtime after working ordinary hours a meal period of at least 45 minutes shall be allowed, unless the period of overtime is less than one and a half hours.
- An employer and his employee may mutually agree to any variation of this sub-clause to meet the circumstances of the work in hand.

(15)

SUNDAY AND HOLIDAY WORK.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, all time on duty on Sundays or public holidays (as herein defined) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (b) In the case of an employer employing workers continuously, all time on duty on Sundays or on the public holidays observed by the majority of the employees in the establishment concerned shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clauses (a) and (b) hereof employees engaged in repairs or renewals of their employer's plant or machinery necessary for the resumption of work the next following working day shall on public holidays or Sundays be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(16)

SHIFT WORK.

Within half a mile from the General Post Office at Melbourne the employer may carry on demolition and/or building work or work incidental thereto by shifts subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Up to three shifts may be worked, namely, morning shift, afternoon shift and night shift.
- (b) As far as practicable shifts shall be worked in rotation.
- (c) The hours of work in each shift be as follows:—
 - (i) Night shift from midnight Sunday to 7 a.m. Monday, from 11 p.m. Monday to 7 a.m. Tuesday, from 11 p.m. Tuesday to 7 a.m. Wednesday, from 11 p.m. Wednesday to 7 a.m. Thursday, from 11 p.m. Thursday to 7 a.m. Friday, and from 11 p.m. Friday to 7 a.m. Saturday.
Day shift from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
Afternoon shift from 3 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday with an allowance of half an hour in each shift for a meal.
 - (ii) The wages to be paid to builders' labourers as such who are employed on the said works shall be as follows:—
Morning shift—Ordinary rate.
Afternoon shift—Time and one-eighth.
Night shift—Time and a quarter.
 - (iii) All time on duty in each shift beyond the hours of work mentioned shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two hours and double time thereafter.
 - (iv) That any builder's labourer properly presenting himself for work and no work being then available for him shall be allowed and paid two hours wages at shift rates.
 - (v) That so far as possible 44 hours' work shall be made available for each builder's labourer in each week.
 - (vi) That in the event of any builder's labourer having to cease work on account of any stoppage operations after trams and trains have ceased running, provision shall be made by the employer for conveying him to his home or alternatively he shall be paid in respect thereof two hours wages.
- (d) If it is desired to work shifts in any other place then the question shall be referred to the Secretary for Labour and he shall determine whether under all the circumstances it is proper for the work to be carried on by shift. If he should so determine, then the above provisions relating to shift work shall apply.
- (e) Except where inconsistent with the provisions of this clause the other provisions of this Determination shall apply to such work.

(17)

SANITARY CONVENIENCES.

Suitable and adequate sanitary conveniences shall be provided by the employer.

(18)

SUPPLY OF WATER.

Employers shall provide pure drinking water for employees and boiling water at meal times. Where the water is not conveyed by pipe it shall be kept in a covered receptacle.

(19)

FIRST AID.

- (a) A sufficient first aid chest shall be supplied and maintained by the employer and shall be kept under the control of a responsible person in a place accessible to the employees. In case of any dispute as to the adequacy of any first aid equipment the matter shall be referred to the Secretary for Labour.
- (b) An employee meeting with an accident on the job necessitating his removal to hospital or to a doctor for medical attention shall be conveyed by ambulance or other suitable conveyance at the expense of the employer.

(20)

LOADS.

- (a) No employee shall be required to carry more than the following loads by hod:—
Up to a height of 15 feet—12 bricks.
Over a height of 15 feet—10 bricks.
- (b) In cases where bricks are carried by wheelbarrow the employee shall not be required to carry more than 36 bricks in a load on scaffolding at a height of more than 15 feet from the ground, or more than 40 bricks in a barrow in any other place.
- If any other barrow than that which is commonly in use at the time of this award is introduced by an employer then any question as to the load which may be carried in such barrow shall be determined by the Secretary for Labour.

(21)

TOOLS.

(a) Employers shall provide all necessary plant and tools except picks, shovels, hods and larries, which are to be provided by employees.

(b) The employer shall be responsible for the sharpening of picks.

(c) Employers shall provide a suitable lock-up place in which to store employees' tools.

(22)

CHANGE HOUSE.

Where practicable and where not less than a total of fifteen men are employed the employer shall provide a suitable change house for the keeping of the clothes of the workmen employed. No cement, lime or building materials shall be stored in such change house. This clause shall come into force after the expiration of two months from the coming into force of this Determination.

(23)

WET PLACES.

(a) Where an employee is obliged by the employer to work spreading or packing wet concrete so that his boots are liable to become saturated, then the employer shall provide the employee with gum boots.

(b) Where an employee is obliged to work in conditions where boots become saturated with water, the employer shall supply the employee with gum boots for use on such work.

(c) If an employee is required to work in a place in which water is continually dripping from overhead so as to saturate the clothing of the employee he shall be provided with an oilskin coat so as to protect him from getting wet or in lieu thereof shall be paid 1s. extra for the day whatever amount of work may be done by him on such day.

(24)

DEFINITIONS.

For the purposes of this Determination—

"Continuous process" means a process in which during an unbroken period of not less than one week operations are continued during all the hours of the day from midnight to midnight or during sixteen hours of the day. Such a process shall be deemed to be a continuous process even if, through no fault of the employer, the work ceases for a time to be carried on.

"Shift worker" in a continuous process means an employee engaged for not less than a week in such continuous process.

"Country work" means work on a job distant more than 20 miles from the employee's centre (in case the centre be in Melbourne or in the suburbs thereof respectively) or more than 6 miles in other places.

"Employee's centre" means his residence or his nearest post office, whichever be the nearer to the job.

(25)

CONTRACTING, SUB-CONTRACTING.

(a) No employer shall permit any of the classes of work covered by this Determination to be carried on by a contractor or other person except in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Determination as if the contractor or other person were himself an employer and bound by this Determination.

(b) No employer shall enter into any contract for the carrying on of any of the classes of work covered by this Determination by any contractor unless the contract contains a clause binding the contractor to pay the rates and observe the conditions set out in this Determination in respect of the work contracted for, and unless a clause is inserted in any such contract to the effect that the employer can determine the contract if there is any breach of the condition above referred to.
