PROCLAMATION OF AREA FOR ADDITIONAL VICTUALLER'S LICENCE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS a petition has been forwarded to the Chief Secretary praying for the proclamation of an area in the Licensing District of Mildura for the purposes of section No. 296.—13767.—PRICE 6d.; Quarterly, 7s. 7d.; Half-Yearly, 15s. 2d.; Yearly, 30s. 4d.

36 of the *Licensing Act 1928* and for the granting of an additional victualler's licence therein, and setting out the boundaries of such area: And whereas the Minister has referred the said petition to the Licensing Court, and the said Court has reported to the Minister that it has held an inquiry as to the requirements of the public with respect to licensed victualler's premises in the locality and has satisfied himself that in such area there reside not less than five hundred persons enrolled as electors for the Legislative Assembly and that the majority of the persons aforesaid have signed the said petition, and that the said Court recommends that the prayer of the said petition be granted: And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (5) of the said section, the Governor in Council may proclaim the aforesaid area for the purposes of the said section: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim the following area for the purposes of the said section:—

All that piece of land in the County of Millewa, commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 6, Parish of Merrince; and thence westerly by a line forming the northern boundaries of the Parishes of Merrince, Karawinna, Murruroong, Werrimul, Yarrara, and Meringur, to the north-west angle of allotment 1, Parish of Meringur; thence southerly by a line forming the western boundaries of the Parishes of Meringur and Malloren to the south-western angle of allotment 45, Parish of Malloren; thence easterly by a line forming the southern boundaries of the Parishes of Malloren, Kurnwill, Mallanbool, Koleya, Tarrango, and Yaramba, to the south-eastern angle of allotment 53, Parish of Yaramba; thence northerly by a line forming the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Yaramba and Merrince home to the commencing point.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT BROOKFIELD ESTATE, WARBURTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Allotments 17 and 17A, Parish of Yuonga, County of Evelyn, together with the portion of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works' aqueduct crossing allotment 17, the road abutting on the portion of the east boundary of allotment 17 north of the said aqueduct, and the portion of the river frontage reserve abutting on the southern boundary of allotment 17.

AMENDMENT OF PRINTING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 2).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act* 1928, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. Paragraph (b) of Regulation 8 of the Printing Trades Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 5th day of November, 1937.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person, or any liability of any person, under the said rescinded paragraph before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded paragraph, substitute the following:—

“ 8. (b) The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in the trade of Process Engraving in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the 5th day of November, 1937, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trade shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(i) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 16s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 20s. 6d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 28s. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 37s. 6d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 49s. per week.
- 6th year—at the rate of 65s. 6d. per week.

(ii) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years:—

- 1st year—at the rate of 20s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 28s. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 37s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 39s. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 65s. 6d. per week.

In Regulation 4 for the word “may” occurring in the fourth line thereof, substitute the word “shall.”

By-LAW No. 19.

A By-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under the provisions of the Health Acts, for the purpose of prescribing the fees to be paid to the Council for the registration of certain premises and the renewal or transfer of such registrations.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and every other power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford do hereby order as follows:—

1. Any By-law or By-laws of the Shire of Broadford prescribing fees for the registration of premises and the renewal or transfer of such registration is or are hereby repealed.

2. The fees to be paid for registration or renewal of registration of the following premises within the Shire of Broadford for any calendar year or part thereof, and the fees for transfer of registrations, shall be as follows:—

Offensive trades premises, save piggeries—Two pounds two shillings.

Cattle sale-yards—One pound.

Boardinghouses—Five shillings.

Common lodging houses—Five shillings.

Eating houses—Five shillings.

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 16, with reference to appointing in streets and roads, standing places for motor cars.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other Act, or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl doth hereby order as follows:—

1. *Definitions*.—In this By-law and the schedule thereto, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Township" means the township of Leongatha.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Woorayl.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

"Footpath" includes every footpath, land, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township habitually used by pedestrians, and not vehicular traffic.

"Motor Car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power and includes a motor cycle and motor cycle and side car.

"Parking Area" means any standing place for motor cars duly appointed by the Council under any By-law.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the township other than a footpath.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power and includes a motor car.

"Writing" includes printing, lithography, and other modes of representing or reproducing words in the visible form.

Words importing the masculine gender include females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. *Parking Areas*.—The streets and public places, or parts thereof respectively mentioned or set forth in the schedule hereto (hereinafter called "parking areas") shall be and are hereby appointed by the Council as standing places for motor cars within the township.

3. No person shall park his motor car in any place in the township not being a parking area.

4. *Mode of Parking*.—Motor cars and motor vehicles shall park in the township in the following manner, namely:—

1. In all streets excepting—

(a) McCartin-street, being that portion commencing one and three-quarter chains south-west from Peart and Bruce streets to Bair-street.

(b) Bair-street, from McCartin-street to Church-street—

Parallel to and as close to the kerb as possible without touching, and not nearer than 3 feet to another car.

2. In the abovementioned two streets:—At an angle of 90 degrees (right angles) to the kerb, the front portion of the vehicle to be not farther than 4 feet from the kerb. No portion of the car to project over the footpath.
5. Where parking spaces are shown on streets by white lines, drivers of vehicles must conform to the parking spaces allotted.
6. A driver shall, in any parking area, park his motor car:—
- As directed by the officer in charge of the parking area; or
 - if no such officer be present, shall take up his position in such a manner as will enable him to take up or leave without disturbance to other motor cars already parked and also in such a way as will permit the latter to leave their respective positions without difficulty and not otherwise, and there shall be only one line of cars parked on each side of the street.
7. *Openings for Cross Traffic.*—It shall be lawful for the Council by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the Shire President, or in his absence, of the Shire Secretary, from time to time as may be convenient or necessary, to fix or appoint openings through any such parking area to permit of cross traffic, and also from time to time to fix the hours during which such parking areas, or any of them, shall be available for use, or to discontinue the same or any of them.
8. No person shall obstruct any such opening as aforesaid by placing his vehicle therein, or otherwise.
9. *Orders to be Observed.*—Every person in the township shall at all times observe and comply with any order or direction given under the authority of this By-law, by any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council.
10. Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with or willfully disobeys any order or direction given as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
11. *Penalty.*—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

All streets in the township of Leongatha shall, on every day in the week, be parking areas, excepting the following parts thereof, namely:—

- Any portion of any street required for access to any fireplug, petrol pump, right-of-way, lane, or footpath, water trough, or crossing over footway at entrance to property whether public or private.
- That portion of Bair-street extending for a distance of 40 feet (measured from building line) from McCartin-street alongside part of allotment 1, section 1, Township of Leongatha.
- That portion of McCartin-street extending for a distance of 40 feet from Bair-street (measured from building line) alongside part of allotment 1, section 1, Township of Leongatha.
- All streets and lanes in the township being 20 feet or less in width.
- That portion of McCartin-street opposite the entrances to the Memorial Hall building.
