ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4524. "An Act to make provision for the Appointment of a Workers Compensation Board and for other purposes."

No. 4525. "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts or in the State Loans Repayment Fund for State Forests."

No. 4526. "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available for Railways under Loan Acts or in the State Loans Repayment Fund, and for other purposes."

No. 4527. "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts or in the State Loans Repayment Fund for Public Works and other purposes."

No. 4528. "An Act to further continue the Operation of certain Provisions of Part I. of the *Landlord and Tenant (Rent Reduction) Act 1931*, and of certain Orders made under the Provisions of the said Part I."

No. 4529. "An Act relating to Leases given to Companies the Rent payable under which has been reduced by or under the *Landlord and Tenant (Rent Reduction) Acts*."

No. 4530. "An Act to re-enact Section One hundred and seventy-nine of the *Health Act 1928*."

No. 4531. "An Act to make provision with respect to the Constitution of a Housing Commission and the Powers and Duties thereof and to authorize the raising of Moneys by the State of Victoria and to Sanction the Application thereof."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE NURSES REGULATIONS.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the *Nurses Act 1928*, doth hereby make the following amendments to the Regulations which shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

ORTHOPAEDIC NURSING.

TRAINING SCHOOLS IN ORTHOPAEDIC NURSING.

V. (1) Any hospital for Orthopaedic Nursing which fulfils the following requirements to the approval of the Board may be recognized for the purposes of the Acts as a Training School in the special branch of nursing known as Orthopaedic Nursing:—

- (a) That no person other than a registered nurse holds (except in cases of emergency) any appointment thereat, whether honorary or otherwise, as the matron or sister or nurse in charge of the nursing of patients.
- (b) That the matron or sister or nurse in charge of the nursing thereat has had not less than three years' training in a hospital or hospitals recognized by the Board for the purpose.
- (c) That the period of the course of training available for nurses registered under Part V. of these Regulations does not exceed six months.
- (d) That proper facilities are available that trainees thereat shall receive practical instruction in the wards thereof from the matron or other registered nurse, provided, however, that such instruction shall not be approved unless the building, equipment, and appliances are approved by the Board.
- (e) That proper facilities are available to ensure that trainees thereat shall attend a systematic course of lectures and receive instruction from legally qualified medical practitioners and from the matron or other registered nurse in the special subjects which relate to the nursing received at such hospital, and pass an examination therein and receive a certificate to that effect.
- (f) That a certificate is issued to trainees.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ADVISORY COMMITTEES.

WHEREAS by section 39 (a) of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations with respect to providing any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission, in pursuance of section 38 (1) (a), has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations with respect to matters relating to the constitution of Advisory Committees, the number of members thereof, the qualifications, appointment, removal, and term of office of members thereof, and the powers, duties, and procedure thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

ADVISORY COMMITTEES.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Advisory Committees Regulations 1937."

2. In these Regulations—

"Acts" mean the Apprenticeship Acts.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"President" means the President of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

3. When a trade or group of trades has been proclaimed an apprenticeship trade or apprenticeship trades in any district other than the Metropolitan District to which the Acts apply, an Advisory Committee shall, wherever practicable, be appointed by the Commission, and shall consist of such number of members as shall be decided by the Commission subject to the provisions of the Acts.

4. The organized body or bodies of employers and the organized body or bodies of employees concerned shall be requested in writing to nominate within a period of 30 days such number of representatives as aforesaid.

5. Members of every Advisory Committee other than the Chairman, shall be persons actually engaged in the apprenticeship trade or in any of the group of apprenticeship trades concerned, and shall as far as possible possess an expert knowledge of the trade which they represent: Provided that one member may be appointed as representing employers and one member as representing employees if (though not actually engaged in such trade at the time of his appointment) he has at any time prior to his appointment been engaged for five years in such trade.

6. Subject to the provisions of the next two succeeding Regulations, all members of Advisory Committees, other than the Chairman, shall be appointed by the Commission for a period of three years.

7. Where a vacancy occurs (otherwise than by the retirement of a member on the expiration of his term of office), the person appointed to fill the same shall be entitled to hold office during the residue of the term of the member whose office he fills and no longer, but at the expiration thereof shall be eligible for re-appointment.

8. A member of an Advisory Committee shall vacate his seat—

- (a) by resignation under his own hand;
- (b) by absenting himself from three consecutive meetings without leave granted by the Commission;
- (c) on the expiration of the term for which he was appointed;
- (d) subject to the approval of the Commission, by the nomination of another member in his stead by the organized body of employers or employees by whom he was nominated;
- (e) by order of the Commission.

9. The duties of any Advisory Committee shall be—

- (a) to confer with the Commission or Trade Committee whenever necessary on matters relating to apprenticeship in the trade or trades concerned as provided for in the Acts;
- (b) to endeavour to promote apprenticeship in apprenticeship trades up to the limit prescribed in Regulations made under the said Acts for each such trade;

- (c) to keep in touch with the work of apprentices in the school by periodically visiting the school class rooms or workshops during hours of instruction;
- (d) to bring under notice of the Commission any matters concerning the equipment and staffing of technical schools for trade instructional work, which will make for the more efficient training of apprentices;
- (e) to assist the Commission as required in the preparation of information setting out the nature and possibilities of various skilled trades, the opportunities for employment therein and the personal qualities, physical development, or peculiar skill required, to enable young persons to make an intelligent choice of occupation;
- (f) to bring under the notice of the Commission any matters conducing to increased efficiency in the training of apprentices;
- (g) subject to the Acts to exercise such powers and perform such duties as are delegated to it in writing by the Commission.
10. Each Advisory Committee shall meet at such times and at such places as may from time to time be appointed by the Commission.
11. The President—
- (a) shall be a member and ex-officio Chairman of every Advisory Committee;
- (b) shall not have a deliberative vote at any meeting of an Advisory Committee, but in the event of an equal division of votes at any meeting, shall have a casting vote.
12. Minutes of meetings of each Advisory Committee shall be kept by the Secretary to the Commission, or by such other person as the Chairman of the Committee may appoint.
13. The mode of conducting the business for which any Advisory Committee is appointed may be determined by any such Advisory Committee, or may be left to the decision of the Chairman.
14. The quorum for an Advisory Committee shall be decided by the Commission when the number of members of such Advisory Committee has been determined.

In paragraph (a) of Regulation 5, for the words and figures "the 31st day of December, 1937" substitute the words and figures "the 31st day of December, 1938".

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1928* (No. 3636), the Governor in Council did, on the 9th day of September, 1935, make Regulations entitled Moulding Trades Regulations (No. 1): And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Acts*, and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

In paragraph (a) of Regulation 5, for the words and figures "the 31st day of December, 1937" substitute the words and figures "the 31st day of December, 1938".

FURTHER AMENDMENT OF BOOT TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 2).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Apprenticeship Acts* and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. Regulation 8 of the *Boot Trades Regulations* (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the 1st January, 1938.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person, or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation 8 substitute the following:—

"8. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall commence on the first day of January, 1938, on, from and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SITE RESERVED FOR CAMPING AND WATERING PURPOSES AT CHILTERN WEST.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering

therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land reserved by Order in Council dated the 6th July, 1937, as a site for Camping and Watering purposes in the Parish of Chiltern West.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the Reserve.
2. No person shall climb or jump over any fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.
3. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided for that purpose.
4. All buildings to be erected on the Reserve, in pursuance of any consent given by the Committee of Management, must conform to plans and Regulations as to the position and design approved by the Committee of Management.
5. No person shall camp or erect any tent in or upon the Reserve except in such places (if any) as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management shall determine.
6. All persons using the conveniences (if any) provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall light fires except in places (if any) set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management, and no refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.
8. No person shall break glass of any kind on the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.
9. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearms in or upon the Reserve, except by permission of the Committee of Management.
10. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without the permission of the Committee of Management.
11. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
12. No assemblies for fêtes or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, shall take place on the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
13. All fees received for camping, agistment, or any other purposes shall be expended on the liquidation of any liability already incurred in the maintenance and improvement, and in the further maintenance and improvement, of the Reserve, and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

The Council of the Shire of Chiltern has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC BATHS AT TRARALGON.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 5th October, 1937, as a site for Public Baths in the Parish and Township of Traralgon.

1. No person shall enter any of the pools before first washing himself in the shower bath, and every bather after using the latrines shall again wash under the showers without costume before returning to the pools.
2. No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or sores shall enter or attempt to enter the baths.
3. No person shall use soap in any of the pools or cause the water therein to be fouled or polluted in any way.
4. No person shall use obscene language within the baths premises.
5. No person shall spit in any of the pools, or on any seat or fixture or on to the floor or walls or any portion of the buildings or bathing enclosure.
6. No person shall enter or remain in the baths while in a state of intoxication.
7. No person shall smoke within the bathing enclosure or any portion of the buildings.
8. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter the baths.
9. No person shall remain in the baths for a longer period than one hour.
10. No person shall commit any nuisance in or upon any portion of the baths premises.
11. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall either enter or leave the bathing enclosure, save by walking through the foot pools, nor be or remain within the said enclosure unless decently attired in an approved bathing costume, save that the parents or guardians of small children using the pools may be permitted to accompany them within the bathing enclosure in ordinary attire, provided their feet are either bare or their footwear rubber soled.
12. No person shall at any time introduce into the baths premises any spirituous or intoxicating liquor.
13. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with, any locks, taps, or fittings in connexion with the baths, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure fittings, or other articles supplied for use in the baths, nor write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the baths.
14. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall climb or attempt to climb over, on to or upon, or remain on or upon any fixture, fountain, fence, roof, building or structure surrounding or appurtenant to the baths.
15. No person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall be or remain upon the baths premises when the pool is being emptied or refilled or at night time when the lighting system is not in operation.
16. Except in the case of accident no person not authorized by the Committee of Management shall use or in any way interfere with the first-aid kits, life-buoys, or other similar apparatus.
17. No person of either sex shall enter or attempt to enter or look into or attempt to look into any portion of the bath premises set apart either permanently or temporarily for the use of the other sex.
18. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix the hours during which the baths shall be open for the use of females only, or for special purposes only, and no person shall enter or attempt to enter or use or attempt to use the baths or portion thereof contrary to the terms of such resolution.
19. It shall be lawful for the person for the time being in charge of the baths to expel any person or persons from the bath premises who indulge in any boisterous or rough play or unseemly conduct or who in any way commit any breach of these Regulations.
20. No person shall do any act or thing or interfere in any way with any other person or persons or with the spring-board or with any stand platform apparatus, fixture or facility established for use either permanently or temporarily at the baths which will cause or be likely to cause inconvenience, injury or danger to himself or to any other person within or without the baths.
21. The Committee of Management shall not be responsible for any articles lost by, or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

22. The Committee of Management may at any time and from time to time close the baths to bathers.

23. The Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid by the public for admission to the baths.

24. The said Committee of Management shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper management of the baths.

The Council of the Shire of Traralgon has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force or Officer of the Council, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force or Council Officer and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "HALL'S GAP PICNIC RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 9th December, 1935, as a site for Public purposes (Hall's Gap Picnic Reserve) in the Parish of Boroka.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge at all times except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall whilst in the Reserve—
 - (a) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession, or take away from the Reserve any live or dead timber, or the whole or any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or other vegetation;
 - (b) ringbark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.
4. No fires shall be lighted on the Reserve except where authorized by the Committee of Management.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, trees, or rocks in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind, and no person shall dig or remove any sand, soil, or other material in or around the Reserve.
6. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause cattle shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
8. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall in any part of the Reserve erect any booth, or any other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp on any portion of the Reserve except in those parts specially set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management, and then only after obtaining a permit subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as may be determined by the Committee of Management.

The fees payable to the Committee of Management for the right to camp in the portion of the Reserve set apart for the purpose shall be—

For one night, 2s.; for each additional night, 1s.
For one week, 7s. 6d.; for each additional week, 5s.

11. Every person camping in the Reserve shall take special precautions against the risk of fire. Where a fireplace is provided, fires for camp purposes must be lighted in such fireplaces only. Where no fireplaces have been constructed, the camper shall before lighting a fire select an open position, clear the surface from inflammable material, and form a protecting bank of earth or stone. No fire shall be lighted against any tree, log, or stump. No fire shall be left burning or unattended. Before lighting a fire provision must be made for extinguishing the same either by water or loose earth.

12. Camp sites, whilst being occupied by a camp party, must be kept in a clean and sanitary condition, and all refuse, litter, and garbage produced at a camp or camp site must be collected and burnt before the camp party vacates the Reserve.

13. The Committee of Management reserves the right to control the parking of motor cars, motor cycles, or any other vehicles within the Reserve, and also has the right to levy a fee for such parking. The maximum fee payable for the use of the parking area shall not exceed One shilling per day.

14. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

15. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure in the Reserve.

16. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosure and Reserve.

17. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injuries sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

18. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

19. All fees received for camping and parking shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

20. No person shall carry firearms in the Reserve, or injure in any manner any animal or bird life therein except where in the opinion of the Committee of Management such animal or bird is in the nature of a pest and liable to cause damage.

21. No intoxicating liquor shall be sold on the Reserve.

22. No person shall bring, carry, or take into the Reserve any fermented or spirituous liquors, nor shall any persons consume or drink same in the Reserve, nor shall be found therein having any fermented or spirituous liquors in his possession or under his control.

23. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management of the Reserve.

24. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purposes of a swimming pool, and may make the same available for use by the public subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees it may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

25. No person shall bathe in the swimming pool who is not decently attired or who is suffering from any infectious disease or who is under the influence of intoxicating liquor, and no person shall use soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the swimming pool may be rendered turbid or impure for the use of bathers.

26. No dogs shall be permitted to enter the swimming pool. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any

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member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

That part of clause 1 of Part II, of By-law No. 83 hereinbefore referred to containing the following words, that is to say:—"No builder shall commence any building, erection, or structure, or any addition or alteration to any building, erection, or structure without first delivering at the office of the Surveyor a written notice of such intention three days before so commencing, and until the plans have been approved in writing by the Surveyor, and producing to the Surveyor properly prepared plans and specifications of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, together with a tracing or copy of the plans of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, and also details and dimensions, sizes and qualities of all materials and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in the construction of same. Also block plan to show the relation of building-to adjoining buildings and boundaries, also to kerb line of channel or upper edge of pitchers where no kerb exists," shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following clauses are hereby enacted:—

1. No person shall commence or cause to be commenced the erection of any building without first delivering to the Surveyor notice in writing of his intention so to do, accompanied by the following particulars in writing signed by such person, namely, properly prepared plans and specifications of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, together with a tracing or copy of the plans of such building, erection, structure, addition, or alteration, and also details and dimensions, sizes and qualities of all materials, and enumerating any old materials proposed to be used in

the construction of same. Also block plan to show the relation of building to adjoining buildings and boundaries, also to kerb line of channel or upper edge of pitchers where no kerb exists.

2. Such plans, specifications, and other particulars shall be considered by the Council at the first available opportunity after the lodging thereof with the Surveyor pursuant to the last preceding clause, and the Council shall if—

- (a) the building therein referred to (if erected in accordance with such plans, specifications, and other particulars) will comply with the provisions of this By-law and of all other Acts, By-laws, and Regulations (if any) applying thereto;
- (b) such plans and specifications and other particulars are otherwise in conformity with the provisions of this By-law; and
- (c) the fee as prescribed by Part XVI. of By-law 83 hereinbefore referred to payable in respect of the permit hereinafter referred to shall have been paid to the Treasurer—

grant or cause to be granted to the person lodging the same a written permit for the commencement of the building referred to in such plans, specifications, and other particulars.

3. No person shall hereafter commence or cause to be commenced the erection of any building without having first obtained from the Council such written permit for the commencement of the same as aforesaid.

4. No person shall hereafter erect any building (for which a permit for the commencement thereof has been granted as aforesaid) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or the plans, specifications, and other particulars in respect of which such permit was so granted.

Rubbish and Refuse on Lands and Streets.

A By-law of the Borough of Queenscliffe, made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928 and numbered 28, for—

- (a) prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (b) prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
- (c) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Queenscliffe order as follows:—

- 1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any lane, passage, street, or road.
- 2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land.
- 3. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the Health Act 1928).
- 4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Queenscliffe.
- 5. Any person who by any wilful act or default contrary thereto shall offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Twenty shillings for each such offence, and in case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound per day and not exceeding Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

SHIRE OF MILDURA.

BY-LAW No. 77.

A By-law of the Shire of Mildura, made under the provisions of sections 766 and 767 of the Local Government Acts and numbered 77, for regulating the management and use of the Municipal Baths, situate in the Kenny Memorial Park, Merbein, on the frontage to Box-street, between Smith and Sanders streets, and for the Municipal Baths situate in Heytesbury-avenue, Redchiff's, between Jacaranda and Heath streets, and for fixing the amounts to be charged for the use of certain conveniences thereon, and for the supply of bathing requisites and refreshments, for fixing the hours during which such baths shall be available to the public, and for fixing the penalty for any breach of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mildura order as follows:—

1. The Baths shall be open to the public during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April during the following hours:—Seven a.m. to Nine p.m.

Provided that the Baths may be kept open till Eleven p.m. on those days during the summer when, in the opinion of the lessee or person in charge, there is a sufficient attendance of the public to render it inexpedient to close the Baths at Nine p.m.

2. No person shall bathe in the Baths unless wearing approved bathing costume, and no person clothed in bathing costume shall enter into or be in or upon any part of the Baths enclosure, or any part of the staging of the Baths, or any part of the Baths open to the public view, unless such bathing costume conforms to the provisions of this By-law, and the lessee or person in charge shall require any person contravening this provision to at once resume his or her ordinary dress. Approved bathing costume is a bathing costume covering the body at least to the extent herein set out—

The costume shall have legs at least 3 inches long.

The costume shall completely cover the chest and front of the body from a line at the level of the armpits down to the waist.

Below the waistline the whole of the trunk, front, back, and sides shall be covered, and the covering shall descend without a break to the lower end of the leg covering. The costume shall be provided with shoulder straps or other means of keeping it in position.

In the case of a person over the age of twelve years, the costume shall, in addition, have a half-skirt attached to the waist covering the front of the body below the waist line and descending to the lower end of the leg covering.

3. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the Baths or in the entrance to the dressing rooms, compartments, passages, or conveniences of the Baths.

4. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain in the Baths.

5. The lessee or person in charge of the Baths may charge every person entering the Baths the proper fees or dues for the use of receptacles for clothes and for bathing accommodation and requisites as appear hereunder, or as shall from time to time be fixed by any resolution of the Council, which fees or dues shall be exhibited in plain figures at the entrance to the Baths.

Charges.—From the 1st day of October in each year to the 30th day of April in the following year the schedule of charges as set out hereunder shall apply:—

Provided, nevertheless, that children attending the State or other schools of the Shire of Mildura, whilst in charge of a teacher, shall be admitted for One penny per child under fourteen years and Two pence per child over fourteen years, at such times and on such days as the Council may appoint.

6. No person shall dress or undress, or remove any part of his or her bathing costume, in any part of the Baths open to the public view.

7. No boy or girl under the age of fourteen years, and who is unable to swim, shall use the adult baths without the permission of the lessee or attendant in charge.

8. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself, or commit a nuisance in the Baths, or bring any rubbish, filth,

or other offensive matter into the Baths, or deposit any rubbish therein, nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes, or other litter.

9. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the Baths, or roll or throw stones in the Baths.

10. No person other than the lessee or person in charge shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale in the Baths any goods or articles.

11. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the Baths.

12. The Council may, however, by resolution, close the Baths, or any part thereof, to the public on any day or days, or at any times, should it be considered necessary to do so, and may also vary the periods or hours during which the Baths shall be open to the public.

13. No person using the Baths, nor any attendant, lessee, officer, servant, or other person employed thereat, shall at any time bring or introduce into the Baths, or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.

14. No person shall use the Baths whilst in an uncleanly condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the Baths immediately upon being requested so to do by the lessee or any of the attendants on duty in the Baths.

15. No person shall enter or remain in the Baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

16. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the Baths, or the shower baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing room, closet, box, or compartment, or any part of the Baths, or any furniture or article therein.

17. Every person shall, before entering the Baths, pay to the authorized money-taker the price of payment for entrance and bath as set out aforesaid, and every person shall, before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume, or receptacle for clothes or valuables, pay to the authorized money-taker the price of payment for the use thereof, and the deposit for the same as set out aforesaid, and after use shall return the same to the attendant in charge, who will issue a ticket for the return of the deposit or deposits lodged.

18. Any person hiring any towel, bathing costume, or any article from the attendant in charge of the Baths shall return the same on leaving the Baths.

19. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fitting in connexion with the Baths, nor carelessly, negligently, or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel, or other article supplied for use in the Baths, or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other part of the Baths.

20. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the Baths use indecent or offensive language, nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

21. No person shall knowingly occupy any part of the Baths for a longer period than two hours, or the shower baths for an unreasonable time.

22. Any person finding any article in the Baths shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for that purpose; and any owner losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the lessee or attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address, and signing a receipt for such article in the book referred to.

23. The Council or lessee will not be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Baths. Valuables may be handed to the lessee or person in charge for safe keeping.

24. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Baths by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the Baths when required to do so by the person in charge of the Baths.

25. No man or boy above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

26. No boy or girl under the age of fourteen years shall use the dressing sheds provided for adults without the permission of the lessee or attendant in charge of the Baths.

27. No woman or girl above the age of six years shall enter or use any dressing room, shower, or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

28. No child under the age of six years shall be admitted to the Baths unless, in the opinion of the attendant, such child is in the care of a responsible person.

29. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the lessee or person in charge of the Baths may refuse admission thereto to any person.

30. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with the lessee or any person employed at the Baths or any officer of the Council in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

31. Any person wilfully offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

32. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication, as provided by the Local Government Acts, in the *Government Gazette*.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the twenty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and confirmed the second day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.
