RESUMPTION OF LAND FOR MINING PURPOSES,
PARISH OF WONTHAGGI.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Indenture of Lease entered in the Register Book in the Office of Titles, volume 818; folio 163563, made between His Most Gracious Majesty King George VI. of the one part and Lothar Schmitt (therein and hereinafter called the lessee) of the other part, his said Majesty, in consideration of the rent thereby reserved and the covenants and conditions therein contained, and on the part of the lessee, his executors, administrators, and assigns to be observed and performed, did thereby grant and demise unto

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the lessee for the term of thirty-four years from the second day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five, unless sooner determined as therein provided, the surface and down to the depth of Fifty feet below the surface, of all that piece of land in the Parish of Wonthaggi, County of Mornington, in the State of Victoria, containing three hundred and nineteen acres one rood and thirty-six perches, more or less, which land is delineated on the plan kept in the Crown Lands Office of land in the said Parish, and thereon shown as allotment 23B, and shown with the measurements and abutments in the map or diagram drawn in the margin of the said Indenture, and in such map or diagram coloured yellow, subject, however, to the proviso that the said land might be resumed for mining purposes: And whereas the land described in the schedule hereto being part of the land comprised in the aforesaid Indenture of lease is required for mining purposes: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 168 of the *Land Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c., acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set out the land described in the schedule hereto as being required for mining purposes.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts set forth be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the portions of the Shires of Creswick, Newstead and Mount Alexander, Talbot, Donald, Marong, Tungamah, Yackandandah, and Eltham set forth hereunder shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly.

CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Creswick.—Creswick.—Parishes of Ascot and Creswick: Commencing at a point 25 chains north from the south-east angle of portion 75, in the Parish of Ascot; thence by a line bearing north 2 miles and 10 chains; thence by a line bearing east 3 miles and 40 chains; thence by a line bearing south 2 miles and 10 chains; and thence by a line bearing west 3 miles and 40 chains to the commencing point.

SOUTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Newstead and Mount Alexander.—Parish of Castlemaine, County of Talbot: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 46 of section 3A; bounded thence by that allotment and a line bearing north to Campbell's Creek; thence generally northerly by that creek to the road forming the north boundary of allotment 287 of section 1A; thence by roads bearing west, S. 56 deg. 22 min. W., S. 48 deg. 50 min. W., and S. 76 deg. 0 min. W., to a point in line with the east boundary of the Cemetery Reserve extension; thence north by a line and the east boundary of the said Cemetery Reserve to the road forming the south boundary of allotment 270; thence by that road bearing east to the south-east angle of allotment 277; thence by roads bearing north-westerly and westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 157; thence north-easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 79; thence by the south and west boundaries of that allotment to a road; thence north-easterly by a line across that road to the south-west angle of allotment 100; thence north by the west boundary of that allotment to a road; thence east and north-easterly by that road and a line to Campbell's Creek aforesaid; thence northerly by that creek to the borough boundary; thence east by that boundary to the north-west angle of allotment 75A of section 4A; thence by the west and south boundaries of that allotment to the south-east angle thereof; thence by roads bearing S. 0 deg. 15 min. E., S. 29 deg. 27 min. E., S. 19 deg. 35 min. E., S. 30 deg. 27 min. E., S. 24 deg. 40 min. W., S. 64 deg. 20 min. E., and S. 68 deg. 56 min. W. to the most eastern boundary of the Township of Campbell's Creek; thence south-easterly, west, south, and westerly by that boundary to the Castlemaine and Maryborough railway; thence south-westerly by that railway to the road forming the south boundary of allotment 46 of section 3A aforesaid; and thence south-westerly by that road to the commencing point.

Shire of Talbot: Commencing at a point on the west boundary of Crown allotment 33 of section 7, Parish of Amherst, County of Talbot, distant 25 chains south from the north-western angle of the aforesaid allotment; thence east by a line to the south-west angle of Crown allotment 23A of section B; thence east by the south boundaries of allotments 23A, 12A, 13, and 14 to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by a road and the west boundary of the Parish of Amherst to a point on the east boundary of allotment 38B, section 4, in line with the south boundary of allotment 35, section 4; thence west by a line

and the south boundaries of allotments 35 and 36, section 4, to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence north by the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment H, section 3; thence west by a line and the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its south-western angle; thence north about 705 links to a road; thence westerly and southerly by that road to the north-western angle of allotment 37, section 1; thence south by a road to the south-western angle of allotment 32, section 2; thence south-westerly by a line to the north-eastern angle of allotment 43, section 2; thence south-westerly by the western boundaries of allotments 43 and 5A, section 2, across a road, and by the west boundaries of allotments 2B and 2C of section F to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by the boundaries of allotments 2c and 2d to the most southerly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-east by a line to the most northerly angle of section A3; thence generally in a southerly direction by a road to a point in line with the point of commencement; thence easterly by a line to the point of commencement.

NORTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Donald: All that land contained within the circumference of a circle having a radius of 2 miles, and having as its centre the northern corner of allotment 1B, section 5, in the Town of Donald.

NORTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Marong.—Parish of Mandurang, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 9, section D, Township of Kangaroo Flat; thence southerly and easterly by the west and south boundary of the township to the Northern Railway; thence southerly by that railway to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 69, section D, in the Parish of Mandurang; thence westerly by a line and the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its south-west angle; thence westerly by a line following through allotments 74D and 75C, section D, to the southern angle of allotment 93, no section; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by the south and west boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the road forming the southern boundary of allotment 76, section E; thence north-westerly by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 80, section E; thence north-easterly by a road to the south boundary of the Parish of Sandhurst; thence easterly by that boundary to the commencing point.

Parish of Sandhurst, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 43A, section L; thence south-westerly by Aspinall-street to the north-west angle of allotment 47B, section L; thence south-easterly by the north boundary of that allotment and a line to Bullock Creek-road; thence in a south-westerly direction by that road to the Bonemill's-road; thence north-westerly by that road to the road forming the north-west boundary of allotment 67, section 1B; thence north-easterly by that road to the south boundary of allotment 67B; thence north-westerly, north-easterly, and easterly by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that allotment to a point in line with the south-west angle of allotment 42A, section L; thence north-easterly by a line and the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, a line, and the north-west boundary of allotment 42 to the north-west angle of allotment 43A; thence south-easterly by the north boundary of that allotment to the commencing point.

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Tungamah.—Town of Tungamah and Parish of Tharanbegg, County of Moira: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 6B, section B, Parish of Tharanbegg; bounded thence by that allotment bearing south, west, and north to the north-west angle thereof, west by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 49B, north by that allotment, a line through allotment 50, the east boundary of allotment 49, and a line to Boosey Creek; northerly by that creek to a road, west by that road to the north-east angle of allotment 48, northerly by that allotment, a line, and allotment 17 to the north-west angle thereof, east by that allotment and lines through allotment 4 bearing east and south to the north-west angle of allotment 20A, by allotment 4 aforesaid bearing east and north to the south-west angle of allotment 22, east by that allotment and allotment 22A to a road, south by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 13, by that allotment bearing west 2,800 links more or less, south by the east boundaries of sections 38, 37, 36, 35, and 34, Town of Tungamah, to Boosey Creek aforesaid, westerly by said Boosey Creek to the Benalla and Yarrawonga railway, south by that railway to South-road; and thence west by that road to the commencing point.

Shire of Yackandandah.—The Town of Yackandandah as proclaimed in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of 25th February, 1861, page 410, and all that land in the Parish of Yackandandah within the boundaries undermentioned, viz:

Commencing at a point on the boundary of the Town of Yackandandah at the junction of Marcus Creek and Yackandandah Creek, in the Parish of Yackandandah; thence southerly and easterly by the course of the Yackandandah Creek to the nearest point on that creek to the northern angle of Crown allotment 13, section N; thence south-westerly by a line and the north-west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly and south-westerly by the boundaries of that allotment and south-westerly by the west boundary of allotment 14 and a line to a road; thence north-westerly by that road and the south boundary of allotment 11 to a point in line with the most easterly angle of allotment 38, section N; thence south-westerly by a line and the boundary of allotment 38, section N, and north-westerly by the boundary of the same allotment and a line to the most westerly angle of allotment 39A, section N; thence north-westerly by a line to a point on the Yackandandah Creek in line with the south-eastern angle of Crown allotment 9, section 7, Town of Yackandandah; thence south-westerly by the course of the Yackandandah Creek to its junction with Twist's Creek; thence north-westerly by the course of Twist's Creek to a road on the southern boundary of Crown allotment 12, section J1, Parish of Yackandandah; thence north-easterly by that road to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section J1; thence westerly and northerly by the south and west boundaries of the last-named allotment to the south-west corner of allotment 4, section D; thence easterly by the south boundary of the Town of Yackandandah to the commencing point.

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Eltham.—Eltham, Parish of Nillumbik: Commencing at a point being the intersection of Bolton-street and the River Yarra; thence north along Bolton-street to the boundary of the Shire of Eltham; thence east along the shire boundary to Diamond Creek; thence northerly along Diamond Creek to Glen Park-road; thence generally in an easterly direction along Glen Park-road and the Eltham-Yarra Glen road to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 6, section 10, Parish of Nillumbik; thence south along the western boundaries of Crown allotment 6, section 10, Crown allotment 14, section 5, Crown allotment 11, section 5, and Crown allotment 6, section 5, to the River Yarra; thence westerly along the northern bank of the River Yarra to the point of commencement.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

DIMINUTION OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, whenever the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board certifies that it is necessary or desirable that any specified portion of the metropolitan fire district or of any country fire district (as the case may be) be excised therefrom, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that such portion shall be excised accordingly, and that thereupon such specified portion shall for the purposes of the said Act no longer be included in or be part of such metropolitan or country fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is necessary and desirable that the portions of the Central, South Central, North Central, North-Eastern, and Eastern Fire Districts set forth hereunder be excised from such fire districts: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (2) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do

hereby declare that the portions of the said Central, South Central, North Central, North-Eastern, and Eastern Fire Districts set forth hereunder shall be excised from such fire districts, viz:—

- Central Fire District—The Borough of Creswick.
- South Central Fire District—The Townships of Campbell's Creek and Talbot.
- North Central Fire District—The Township of Donald.
- North-Eastern Fire District—The Townships of Tungamah and Yackandandah.
- Eastern Fire District—The Township of Eltham.

AMENDMENT OF FOURTH SCHEDULE TO POISONS ACT 1928.

POISONOUS SUBSTANCES AND PREPARATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act 1928* it is among other things enacted that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* amend the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act 1928* by adding thereto or removing therefrom any substance or preparation, and such Schedule so amended shall have the same force and effect as if such amendment had been enacted in the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation amend the said Fourth Schedule as hereinafter set out:—

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Part I.

In place of the item—

2B. Crayons pastels and coloured chalks containing lead or arsenic in greater proportion than the following limits:—

Lead as Pb—5 per centum.

Arsenic as arsenious oxide As_2O_3 —1 grain to the pound.

which was added to the Fourth Schedule by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on 11th November, 1936, substitute the following, namely:—

2B. Crayons pastels and coloured chalks containing lead or arsenic in greater proportion than the following limits:—

Lead as Pb—0.5 per centum.

Arsenic as arsenious oxide As_2O_3 —1 grain to the pound.

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange, acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described and situated

within the Shire of Cranbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

STANLEY ROAD.

All that piece or parcel of land, being part of Crown portions 40; 41, 42, Parish of Sherwood, County of Mornington: Commencing at a point N. 9 deg. 30 min. E. 1,617 links, N. 8 deg. 57 min. PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AS TO PART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, as amended by section 2 of the *Land Act 1933*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation bearing date the 19th February, 1889 (see *Government Gazette* of 1889, page 688), defining certain land in the Parish of Orbost (now Parish of Orbost East) as a township under the designation of "Marlo," so far as regards the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.:—

70 acres, more or less, Parish of Orbost East, County of Croajingolong: Commencing at a point bearing N. 11 deg. 24 min. E. 110 links and S. 76 deg. 54 min. W. 164 8.10 links from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 8, Township of Marlo; bounded thence by a road bearing N. 11 deg. 24 min. E. to the south-east angle of allotment 9 of section C. by a road bearing S. 78 deg. 36 min. E. 1,429 4.10 links, by a Water Reserve bearing S. 33 deg. 5 min. W. 787 links, S. 73 deg. 40 min. Officers who use their own motor cars or motor cycles, and who are not in receipt of a continued allowance in which the cost of locomotion is included, may, with the approval of the Minister, be paid a mileage rate as set out hereunder, or such weekly or yearly allowance as may from time to time be fixed by the Commissioner:—

NOTE.—H.P. means horse-power as registered in accordance with Regulations under the Motor Car Act.

Provided that, in any case where the Commissioner is satisfied that a mileage rate as above mentioned paid to an officer should be increased, such increased rate may be allowed as the Commissioner shall determine.

Provided also that an officer shall not incur an expenditure in excess of £180 during any financial year either for the use of his own car on official business or for motor car hire or both, unless the Permanent Head certifies that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of the Department, and the approval of the Treasurer is obtained.

An officer authorized to claim mileage rates will not be permitted to hire motor cars, except in cases of emergency, and then only with the approval of the Minister.

REGULATIONS—LEAVE OF ABSENCE—CHAPTER XIII.

THE Deputy Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter XIII. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

For—

Clause 7—

Read—

7. (1) Leave of absence with full pay may be granted to an officer who is a member of the Defence Force for the purpose of attending training camps, drills, parades, schools, classes, or courses of instruction in which his unit is participating.

Provided that, if it would not be in the public interest to grant leave of absence to an officer for the purpose of attending a training camp, drill, parade, school, class, or course of instruction of his own unit, he may be granted in lieu thereof leave of absence as herein prescribed for the purpose of attending an equivalent training camp, drill, parade, school, class, or course of instruction of another unit.

Applications for leave must be accompanied by evidence of the necessity for attendance, and, at the expiration of the leave, a certificate of attendance must be furnished.

(2) Leave of absence granted under this clause shall not be deducted from recreation leave.

(3) Any officer who, while undergoing training, sustains injury or contracts illness necessitating his absence from duty beyond the period of leave with full pay granted under this clause, may be granted leave on the following terms:—

- (a) If compensation is not paid to the officer by the Department of Defence in respect of such absence, the leave may be granted as sick leave.
- (b) If compensation is paid, and is equal to or exceeds the amount of pay which the officer would have received had he been granted sick leave, the leave shall be granted without pay.
- (c) If compensation is paid, and is less than the amount of pay which the officer would have received had he been granted sick leave, he shall be paid an amount equal to the difference, and his sick leave credit with full pay or half pay (as the case may be), shall be reduced as if he had been granted sick leave for such number of days as is appropriate to the amount of the difference.

SHIRE OF CHILTERN.—CHILTERN WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1937.

THE Chiltern Shire Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1928*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure of Twelve pence in the pound of the annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Chiltern Water Supply District.

All water supplied by measure by the Council in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XI.(c).—Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, and in lieu thereof substitute the following Regulation, that is to say:—

REGULATION XI.(c).

PRIMARY TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE, FIRST CLASS.

1. Primary Teacher's Certificates, First Class, will be granted to holders of Second Class Certificates who pass in either:—

- (a) (i) The Leaving Certificate, or some higher examination of the University of Melbourne;
- (ii) Theory of Teaching (Part III.);
- (iii) Needlework (female teachers); and
- (iv) Practice of Teaching;

or

- (b) (i) Four Leaving Certificate subjects (including English, but not including drawing);
- (ii) Drawing (Part III.);
- (iii) Theory of Teaching (Part III.);
- (iv) Needlework (female teachers); and
- (v) Practice of Teaching.

2. The First Class Certificate will not be issued to any teacher until he has satisfactorily performed the duties of a classified teacher or of a registered teacher for not less than two years.

Instructions.

1. Candidates for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, may present themselves for the examination in English and the other elected subjects at the public examinations held by the University, and are required to pay the fees charged by the University. Except as prescribed below, the details of each subject are as prescribed for the School Leaving examination (pass standard) of the University of Melbourne. There will be found in the *Handbook of Public Examinations* published annually by the University. It should be noted that if candidates desire to matriculate in order to enter upon further courses at the University, for example, for the Diploma of Education, they must do so by passing the University examinations.

2. The details of the subjects, Drawing (Part III.), Theory of Teaching (Part III.), Needlework, and Practice of Teaching for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, are as follows:—

Drawing (Part III.).

(a) *Drawing Plant Forms from Nature.*—(Such plants as the eucalyptus, pittosporum, oak, or ivy will be selected.) The work must be executed with the brush and water colour. The application of such plants to decorative designs for simple borders, panels and the like, or to fill simple shapes such as the square, the equilateral triangle, and the circle. Agreeable colour will be considered essential.

(b) *Practice.*—To give a satisfactory lesson in drawing plant forms from nature with the brush and water colour.

Theory of Teaching (Part III.).

To answer questions in school management, and in the methods of teaching the subjects of the Course of Study, in principles of teaching, in elements of psychology, and in health education—

(a) *School Management.*—Principles of time-table construction, modification of course for rural schools, grouping of grades in rural schools, use of monitors, work programmes, time allotments—

Examination of Work.—All needlework for the Primary Teacher's Certificate, First Class, will be examined by the Inspector of Domestic Arts. Work should be forwarded, therefore, not to district inspectors, but to School No. 1895, Cambridge-street, Collingwood.

Syllabus of Work.—The work consists of making the articles prescribed in the General Course of Study, 1934, for Grades III., IV., V., and VI., except—

Grade III.—Knitted face washer.

Grade IV.—Knitted bed slippers.

Grade V.—Knitted scarf.

As there are alternative articles listed in the syllabus, it is recommended that candidates make the articles for which directions are set out in detail in the course of study. Patterns for garments may be had on application to the Inspector of Domestic Arts. If desired, the course may be done by correspondence.

Practice of Teaching.

(a) To prepare notes of and give a lesson on a subject or subjects approved by the inspector; phonics and voice production; class drill, physical and breathing exercises.

(b) To draw up and carry out a time-table suitable for a school of which the candidate has charge; or, in the case of female teachers who are assistants, or teachers not employed in State schools, to draw up and carry out a time-table suitable for two or more grades or divisions of grades.

3. The provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to teachers appointed prior to 1st January, 1937.

- Adjust the powers of the Carpenters Board and of the Woodworkers Board by depriving the said Woodworkers Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed as carpenters or joiners, and conferring such power exclusively on the said Carpenters Board.

- (d) May contain such other conditions and provisions, and require such undertaking or security, as the said Council thinks necessary for the protection of roads and bridges from injury, and for the payment to the said Council of any damages caused to any road or bridge by reason of the use of any traction engine for which a permit is granted, or any trailer attached thereto.

IV. Every permit shall:—

- (a) Be carried on the traction engine to which it refers.
- (b) On demand of any member of the Police Force, or any Officer of the Country Roads Board, or of the said Council, be produced by the driver or person in charge of the traction engine.

V. Neither the granting of the permit, nor any undertaking or security given or lodged on the granting thereof, shall relieve any person from liability for any damage that may be caused to any road, culvert, or bridge, by reason of the use of such traction engine or any trailer attached thereto.
