REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND WATERING PLACE IN THE PARISH OF PRAHRAN, AND KNOWN AS CAULFIELD PARK.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations and to rescind any Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of the 27th October, 1879, as a site for Public Park and Watering Place in the Parish of Prahran in lieu of all Regulations heretofore in force, which are hereby rescinded:—

1. The Reserve shall be at all times open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
5. No person shall remove any trees, timber, saplings, shrubs, or other vegetation, sand, stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.
6. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll nor throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
7. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, or cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.
8. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.
9. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
11. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
12. No person shall ride a bicycle in the Reserve except by permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
13. No person shall drive or propel a motor car, motor cycle, or other motor vehicle in the Reserve without having first obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, except for the purpose of entering the parking area for such vehicles by the roadway from Balaclava-road immediately west of the Caulfield Park Bowling Green.
14. The following area is hereby set apart as a parking area for motor vehicles, viz.:—All that area of land commencing at a point being the north-west boundary of the Caulfield Croquet Club's premises; thence easterly a distance of 200 feet; thence northerly a distance of 80 feet; thence westerly a distance of 200 feet; thence southerly a distance of 80 feet to the commencing point.
15. The Committee of Management may from time to time set apart certain portions of the Reserve for the playing of any particular game or sport, and may grant the use thereof

to any individual, club, or association of clubs on such terms and conditions as may be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sunday or Anzac Day or Good Friday.

17. No person or club shall take part in or practise any game or sport in any part of the Reserve at any time without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

18. No person or club shall play, practise, or engage in any sport or game except in those portions of the Reserve specially set apart for the particular purpose by the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

20. No cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals shall be allowed to enter the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

21. Every animal permitted to enter the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal that causes damage shall be held responsible therefor.

The Council of the City of Caulfield has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF KURRACA, KNOWN AS KURRACA RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Lands and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 27th July, 1936, as a site for Public Recreation in the Parish of Kurraca, and known as the "Kurraca Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to

the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Persons renting any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. No intoxicating liquor shall be sold on the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

6. No person shall bring into the Reserves any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserves or erect any building, or any booth, tent, or structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or conducting any entertainment or game, and then only after a permit, subject to the payment of such fees and under such conditions as the Committee of Management from time to time determine.

8. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserves.

9. No person shall without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained:—

(a) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession while in the Reserves, or take away therefrom any live or dead timber or the whole or any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or other vegetation.

(b) ring bark, or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub.

(c) carry or discharge therein any firearms.

The Council of the Town of Ararat has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* for such offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any officer of the Council, Bailiff of Crown lands, or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATION No. 140.**

A Regulation of the City of Fitzroy, numbered 140, made under section 4 of Part VI. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* in force in the City of Fitzroy, by virtue of a By-law of the said City, numbered 90, and by virtue of every other Act or power enabling the Council of the said City in that behalf for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building used for public meetings, or any registered building or ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and by every other Act or power enabling the Council in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District, that is to say:—

1. The Regulation numbered 138 for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building or ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purpose for which it is registered is by virtue of the repeal of By-law No. 81 of the City of Fitzroy, under the provisions of which such Regulation was made or otherwise hereby and by virtue hereof repealed.

2. The times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building used for public meetings or any registered building or ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purpose for which such hall, building, or ground is registered shall be as follows, namely:—

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday of each week, from the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight. Provided that this Regulation shall not apply in the case of any ball, private party, or social held in any registered hall or other building on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday.

3. In this Regulation the terms hall, building, and ground shall mean respectively any hall, building, or ground registered under Part VI. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and in addition thereto shall include any public building registered with the Commission of Public Health under the *Health Act 1928*.
