A By-law of the City of South Melbourne made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 311 for the purpose of adopting certain portions of and carrying out certain purposes provided for in the Thirteenth Schedule of the said Act, and for other purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law and order as follows:—

1. The By-laws set out in the Schedule to this By-law to the extent to which the same are thereby expressed to be repealed are hereby repealed, provided that such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any prosecution for any act or omission prior to the commencement of this By-law.

2. The following Parts of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*, with such exceptions therefrom and as to such portions thereof as are hereinafter set out are hereby adopted in and for the City of South Melbourne, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of South Melbourne:—

- Part I.—The whole.
- Part II.—Section 6 only.
- Part IV.—The whole.
- Part V.—The whole.
- Part VI.—The whole.
- Part VII.—The whole, excepting subdivision (3).
- Part VIII.—The whole.
- Part IX.—The whole.
- Part XI.—The whole, excepting sections 3 and 52.

3. After the signing of the minutes, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv) Presentation of Reports.
- (v) Questions. (Any councillor desirous of obtaining information at a meeting of the Council, on any business which the Council or any committee of the Council is empowered to transact under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* or any other Acts under which the Council exercises functions, may immediately after the fourth order of the day (presentation of reports of committees), put such questions to the Mayor, or through the Mayor to the Chairman of the committee concerned, as shall elicit replies.)
- (vi) Payments.
- (vii) Ordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (viii) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (ix) Extraordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (x) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (xi) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
