# THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

# REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE ISSUE OF INSCRIBED STOCK.

IN pursuance of sections 4 to 11 of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1936 (No. 4422), the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulations in respect to the issue of inscribed stock:—

#### INTERPRETATION.

# 1. Interpretation.

In these Regulations, unless there be something in the subjectmatter or context inconsistent therewith, the following terms shall have the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say—

- "Debentures."—Debentures payable to bearer, with interest coupons attached, issued by the Commissioners under the Melbourne Harbor Trust Acts.
- "Stock."—Inscribed stock created or issued by the Commissioners under the provisions of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1936, or subsequent Acts.
- "Stock-holder."—The person or persons whose name or names is or are inscribed in the stock ledger of the Commissioners in respect of any stock.
- "Stock ledger."—The ledger or ledgers of the Commissioners in which the stock held is recorded or inscribed.
- "The Commissioners."—The Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners.
- "The office."—The principal administrative offices of the Commissioners at Melbourne.
- "The Registrar."—The Treasurer for the time being appointed by the Commissioners or any person acting as such under their authority.
- "The Secretary."—The Secretary for the time being of the Commissioners, or any person acting as such under their authority.
- Words importing the singular shall include the plural and vice versa.
- Words importing the masculine shall include the feminine. "Schedule."—The Schedule to these Regulations.

# Inscription of Stock.

# 2. Minimum Holding.

Except with the approval of the Registrar to the contrary, stock shall be inscribed or remain inscribed only in sums of £10, or in sums which are multiples of £10 where the sum inscribed is in excess of £10.

# 3. Application for Stock.

Form 1.—Persons who are desirous of purchasing stock shall transmit to the Registrar an application in the Form 1 contained in the Schedule, duly filled in and signed, together with a banker's cheque or cash for the amount of stock applied for, or for the balance where portion thereof has already been paid by way of deposit, but where a tenderer has, in his tender, intimated his desire to take stock, the Commissioners may, if they deem fit, inscribe and issue the stock from such tender without any further or other application, and the price shall be paid in manner provided by such tender.

# 4. Interim Receipt Allotment and Certificate of Inscription.

Form 2, Form 3.—On receipt of the said application, the Registrar shall transmit to the applicant an interim receipt in Form 2 contained in the Schedule, and thereupon the Commissioners shall proceed to allot the stock applied for in accordance with the application and the name of the allottee, together with the amount of stock allotted, and such other matters and particulars as the Registrar may deem necessary shall be inscribed in the stock ledger. After such inscription, a certificate of inscription in Form 3 contained in the Schedule shall be transmitted by the Registrar to the allottee or his agent or attorney. The Registrar may, at his discretion, dispense with the issue of any certificate of inscription.

# 5. Exchange of Debentures for Stock.

Form 4.—Where any person desires to exchange debentures of the Commissioners held by him for stock or vice versa, he shall transmit to the Registrar an application in Form 4 contained in the Schedule, and shall lodge therewith the debentures or (as the case may be), the certificate of inscription of the stock held by him, and thereupon the Commissioners will issue and allot stock or (as the case may be) debentures in accordance with such application, and the debentures or certificate of inscription lodged with such application shall be cancelled by the Secretary, and every such debenture shall thereupon be destroyed by the Secretary, in the presence of the State Auditor-General or an officer appointed by him for the purpose, who shall certify to the Commissioners accordingly. For the purpose of exchange as aforesaid, the value of the stock and debentures shall be taken as par, and the exchange effected on that basis, and on every such exchange the appropriate entries shall be made in the stock ledger and duly attested under Regulation 10 hereof.

# 6. Stock Certificate Lost or Destroyed may be Replaced.

If any certificate of inscription is lost, mislaid, or destroyed, the Registrar shall, on being applied to, issue a duplicate certificate in place of the certificate so lost, mislaid, or destroyed, and such duplicate certificate shall be delivered only to the person whose name is inscribed in the stock ledger as the holder of the stock, or to his attorney or agent.

# 7. Companies, Firms, Corporations, &c.

Stock may be inscribed in the name or names of one or more persons, not exceeding four, or in the name of a registered company or other corporation, but the Registrar must first be furnished with a copy of the certificate of incorporation or special Act of Parliament under which such corporation is established, together with a certified specimen of the seal of the corporation, a duly verified copy of any regulations governing the mode of affixing the seal, and the full names and specimen signatures of all persons authorized to sign documents in connexion therewith. The document containing such information must—unless the Registrar otherwise decides—be signed and sealed in the presence of an officer of the Commissioners. The Registrar shall cause such document to be affixed in the Signature Book, and thereafter it shall not be necessary for an officer of the Commissioners to witness the affixing of such Corporation's seal.

If from any cause any such authorized person is substituted by another person, notification in writing and under seal must be given to the Commissioners.

Firms will not be registered as such, but in the names of the individual partners.

# S. Minors-Persons of Unsound Mind.

Where stock is inscribed in the name of an infant or persons of unsound mind jointly with any person or persons not under legal disability, a power of attorney for the receipt of the interest on such stock shall be sufficient authority in that behalf if given under the hand and seal of the person or persons not under disability and duly attested. The Registrar, before acting on any such power of attorney, may require proof to his satisfaction of the alleged infancy or unsoundness of mind by statutory declaration of competent persons or otherwise in such manner as he may reasonably require.

9. Change of Address.

Any change of address of a stock-holder shall be at once notified in writing to the Registrar.

10. Verification of Ledger Entries.

Every entry in the stock ledger shall be initialed by the Registrar or such officer of the Commissioners as the Commissioners shall from time to time appoint, and such ledger shall be audited from time to time by the State Government Auditor.

11. Persons Whose Names are Inscribed Alone Recognized as Owners. The Commissioners and the Registrar shall, for all purposes, be entitled to regard the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the stock ledger as the true and absolute owners and holders of the stock in relation to which such name or names is or are so inscribed, and all receipts, acquittances, discharges, releases, and documents whatsoever executed by such person or persons in relation to such stock, or the interest thereon, shall be deemed for all purposes and against all persons to be documents duly executed by the person or persons entitled to such stock or interest, as the case may be.

# 12. Trusts Not Recognized.

No entry of any Trust shall be made in the stock ledger, and the Commissioners shall be entitled to treat the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed in the stock ledger in respect of any stock as the absolute owner or owners thereof, and accordingly, shall not be bound to recognize any equitable or other claim to or interest in such stock on the part of any other person.

# 13. Receipts of Joint Holders.

The receipt of any one stock-holder or of his attorney or agent in the case of stock inscribed in more than one name for any interest or for any document relating to such stock shall be a sufficient discharge to the Commissioners in respect thereof, but with regard to the repayment of principal a discharge must be given by all stock-holders in a joint account.

# TRANSFERS OF STOCK.

# 14. Transfer Books.

Form 5.—There shall be kept at the office of the Commissioners, books to be called "Transfer Books," wherein all transfers of stock, or any part thereof, shall be entered and registered, which entries shall be numbered in such manner as the Commissioners shall determine, and all transfers shall be in the Form 5 contained in the Schedule, and shall be signed by the parties making and accepting such transfers, or if any such party or parties be absent, by his or their attorney or attorneys thereunto, lawfully authorized as hereinafter mentioned, and every such transfer shall pass the right to all interest becoming due and payable after the date of registration thereof, so that the Commissioners shall not be under any necessity to apportion any such interest as between transferor and transferee.

Registration will not be made of any transfer or application for transfer received within a period of 21 days immediately preceding the date of maturity of stock.

An instrument of transfer may be registered at any time within fourteen days after the Registrar has marked it with a notice that the stock is registered in the name of the transferor, notwithstanding that the transferor, after executing the transfer, has died or become bankrupt or insolvent, but if after the expiry of the said period of fourteen days and before registration the transferor has died or become bankrupt, no transfer of stock shall be registered unless it is executed by the person who is for the time being registered as the holder of the stock, and if the Registrar has knowledge of the death, bankruptcy, or insolvency of the transferor, he may refuse to register the transfer.

On a transfer being lodged for registration, the Registrar may, if he thinks fit, require the production of the original certificate of inscription, to be cancelled and retained by him, and a fresh certificate shall be issued to the transferor for the balance of stock (if any) remaining to his credit.

# 15. Transfers to be Lodged on a Transfer Day.

Every transfer of stock shall be lodged at the office on a transfer day; the transfer days will be Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, from 10 o'clock a.m. to 1 o'clock p.m., and 2 o'clock p.m. to 3 o'clock p.m., except when any such days fall on a public holiday.

# 16. Stock Ledger, &c., to be Closed.

The Registrar will cause the stock ledger and transfer books to be closed for a period of fourteen clear days next before any of the days on which interest on the stock is payable, and shall cause the amount of the stock respectively standing to the credit of the several holders thereof to be ascertained and the balances to be struck in the proper ledger, and the persons, who on the day such books are so closed are inscribed as holders of stock, shall be entitled to receive the interest next payable thereon.

# 17. Entries in Stock Ledger.

As soon as possible after the registration of any transfer or transmission of stock, the amount of stock transferred or transmitted shall be debited in the proper account in the stock ledger, and shall be forthwith credited in the same ledger to the account of the person or persons to whom it shall have been so transferred or transmitted, and the Registrar shall cause the said stock ledger to be compared with the transfers and applications so as to ascertain that all the business transacted has been duly and properly entered and recorded.

In the event of any stock being inscribed incorrectly, owing to a mistake in any document, the account may be amended by a letter or declaration or in such other manner as the Registrar may reasonably require, and in the event of the alteration of any name or names, a request from the transferor in the original transfer shall be required by the Registrar.

18. Inspection of Stock Ledger.

Any stock-holder, or his attorney, on production of authority in writing, shall be at liberty to inspect his account in the stock ledger at all reasonable times on payment of the prescribed fee.

#### Transmission of Stock.

19. Executors or Administrators Alone Recognized.

(a) The executors or administrators of a deceased stock-holder (not being one of several joint holders) shall be the only persons recognized by the Commissioners as having any title to the stock inscribed in the name of such deceased stock-holder, and
(b) in the case of the death of any one or more of the joint

holders of any stock, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Commissioners as having any title to or

interest in such stock.

- (i) The death may be proved by the production of probate of will, letters of administration, or certificate of death, and, if required by the Registrar, by a declaration by some disinterested person as to the identity of deceased as the owner.
- (ii) On completion of the proof of death in a joint account, the stock and dividends thereon will be registered in the name of the survivor or survivors.
- (iii) On the decease of the last survivor in a joint account, the death must be proved as in the case of an owner on sole account, and steps taken to inscribe the stock in the name of the executor or administrator of the last survivor.

20. Transmission-Evidence of.

If any stock has become transmitted in consequence of the death or bankruptcy or insolvency of any stock-holder, or by any lawful means other than by a transfer under these Regulations, the application for registration of such transmission shall be authenticated by a declaration in writing, as hereinafter mentioned, and in such other manner (if any) as the Registrar shall require, and every such declaration shall state the manner in which and the name of the said party to whom such stock shall have been so transmitted, and shall identify the applicant as the said party, and shall be signed and made by some credible person, and also by the said party before a justice of the peace of the State of Victoria, or if made outside the said State, shall be signed and made by such credible person or the said party before a notary public or British Consul or Vice-Consul or other British authority, who shall also certify to the identity of the claimant, and the said party, and shall be delivered to the Registrar, and shall be numbered by him in such manner as he shall determine. Every application for transmission shall be made in Form 6.

21. Documents to be Lodged on Transmission.

If such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any testamentary instrument or by intestacy, the probate of the will or the letters of administration, or an office copy thereof shall, together with such declaration, be produced to the Registrar, and if such transmission shall have taken place by virtue of any bankruptcy or insolvency, the adjudication or order of sequestration, or an office copy thereof respectively shall, together with such declaration, be produced to the Registrar.

22. Persons Entitled to be Registered on Transmission.

(a) The person becoming entitled on transmission in manner aforesaid may either himself be registered as the bolder of the stock so transmitted, or instead of being himself registered, may make such transfer of the stock as the stock-holder from whom the same was transmitted could have made, and any such transfer shall be accompanied by such evidence in proof of the title of the transferor as the Registrar may reasonably require, and the person registered pursuant to this Regulation 22 shall be entitled to receive the interest on such stock, and to all other advantages he would be entitled to if he were the registered holder of the stock

(b) The Registrar shall require the signatures of persons who claim transmission of stock by virtue of their appointment as executors, administrators, or trustees, to be verified to his satisfaction. This should

be done by a disinterested person approved by the Registrar,

Where the Registrar is satisfied that stock is inscribed in the name of a person whose property is required by law to be placed in the hands of a public curator or other officer charged with the duty of administering the estates of deceased or missing persons or persons under disability, the Registrar may, upon receiving such indemnity from the public curator or officer as he thinks necessary, transfer the stock to the name of the public curator or officer.

23. Marriage of Female Stock-holder.

In the event of the marriage of a female stock-holder, such stockholder may apply, in writing, in Form 11, to have such stock inscribed in her married name, or jointly with any other name, and shall lodge therewith the certificate of inscription of such stock and her marriage certificate or certificate of registration of marriage, and such other proofs as the Registrar may reasonably require, and the Registrar shall thereupon have such stock inscribed as required, and shall issue a new certificate of inscription in that name, and shall cancel and retain the old certificate.

24. Power of Attorney.

Form 7.—Any attorney who shall be appointed by any stock-holder for all or any of the purposes authorized by these regulations, or approved by the Commissioners, shall be thereunto authorized by writing under hand and seal attested by two or more credible witnesses, and except with the Registrar's approval to the contrary, every such power shall be in Form 7 contained in the Schedule hereto, and shall be executed and attested in accordance with the instructions printed at the foot thereof or endorsed thereon, and shall be deposited and kept at the office, and shall be as valid and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same had been filed in the office of the Registrar-General, and the death, insolvency, or (if a female) the marriage of the principal or the revocation of such power bad not been registered according to law, and the same shall continue in force until actual written notice of the death of the grantor of such power or of the revocation thereof shall have been received by the Registrar, and the burden of proof of such receipt shall be upon the person seeking to impeach any act of the Registrar or Commissioners purporting to have been done by virtue or reason of such power. In case of a joint account, such power of attorney shall be signed by all the owners. No form of any such power of attorney shall be supplied to any person except on the written request of the registered holder of the stock to be affected thereby, or some other person on behalf of such owner, as approved by the Registrar.

Where, in the opinion of the Registrar, it is inconvenient to obtain a power of attorney in accordance with Form 7, the Registrar may act on a power of attorney which is not in accordance with Form 7, but, in such a case, if the power of attorney has been lodged with a State officer, the Registrar may act only after a copy of the power of attorney, or extract thereof attested by the proper State officer, has been lodged with the Registrar; or, if the power of attorney has not been lodged with a State officer, the Registrar may act only if a copy of the power of attorney or an extract thereof, verified by a person approved by the Registrar, has been lodged with the Registrar, and if the power of attorney has been attested as provided in regard to Form 7, provided that in every case where the power of attorney is not in accordance with Form 7, the Registrar may require a declaration from the attorney that he has not received notice of revocation of such power by death of the grantor or otherwise.

25. Power of Attorney, &c.-When to be Lodged.

Every power of attorney, probate, letters of administration, marriage certificate or certificate of registration of marriage, certificate of adjudication, order of sequestration, declaration, &c., must be lodged at the office of the Registrar at least two clear working days before the same can be acted upon, and neither the Commissioners nor the Registrar shall be answerable for any claim made or loss arising by reason of their not having acted upon any such, or of their or his having acted otherwise than in accordance with the same during a period of two clear working days after the same has been so lodged.

# INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL.

26. Interest-When Due.

.Interest is due half-yearly on such days during the currency of the stock as shall have been prescribed by the resolution of the Commissioners creating the stock for the half year ended with the day previous to those dates respectively, and is payable on and after those days, holidays excepted.

# 27. Payment of Interest.

Interest will be paid in one of the following modes:-

- 1. To the stock-holder or to one of the stock-holders in a joint account personally, or to his or their attorney, at the Commissioners' office, by cheque, and a receipt therefor must be given.
- 2. At the risk of the stock-holder, by transmission of interest cheques by post or by payment into an account in a bank within the Commonwealth having a branch at Melbourne under the following conditions:-
  - (a) Any stock-holder who desires to have his interest cheques as they become due, sent by post or paid to the credit of a bank account, must fill up and sign an authority in the Form 8 or 9 contained in the Schedule. In the case of a joint account, all the stock-holders or the stock-holder whose name is first inscribed may sign the form.
  - (b) Post-interest cheques will be crossed "credit bank a/c. only." They will be drawn to the order of the stock-holder or person nominated by him.
  - (c) Applications for transmission of cheques by post or payment into a bank account must be lodged at the office fourteen days before the interest is due, and the instructions therein will remain in force although the stock may have been added to or partly transferred.

Principal.—Stock-holders may, if they so desire, arrange in manner approved by the Registrar for the repayment, when due, of the prinpical sum into a bank account at their own risk.

#### FORMS.

# 28. Forms.

The Registrar shall cause to be printed and kept at the office a sufficient supply of the several forms contained in the Schedule, and no forms other than those printed as aforesaid shall be used except with his approval. All forms from which entries are made shall be carefully preserved.

# 29. Fees.

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Except as the Registrar may direct, there shall be paid to the Commissioners the following fees, namely:-

For every inspection allowed by these regulations, 1s.

For filing or noting power of attorney, 1s. For every issue of debentures in place of stock, 1s. per cent. and the cost of printing such new debentures.

# GENERAL.

# 30. Specimen Signatures, &c.

The Registrar shall take such steps as are necessary to immediately secure either by post or personally, specimen signatures of all stock owners; the signatures to all forms shall be tested by comparison with those in the signature book.

If in cases where the owner is not personally known to the Registrar or where the Registrar is doubtful as to the genuineness of a signature, or if for any other reason he is not satisfied as to the genuineness of an application, a notice of dealing in accordance with Form 10 shall be forwarded to the owner by the Registrar, who shall not register the transaction until a sufficient time has elapsed for a reply to be received.

All possible precautions shall be taken by the Registrar for the security of the stock to its owner and to guard against fraud or improper transactions; erasures must not be made in the stock ledger, errors must be ruled through, and the correct entries made.

In all cases of proposed dealings in stock, the attendance of the owner at the Commissioners' office should, when practicable, be arranged for.

No person other than the officers immediately engaged on inscribed stock business shall have access to any of the books, forms, or other records, and all officers are expressly forbidden to divulge any information coming to their knowledge in the course of their duties except as necessary in the transaction of business or as required by law.

FIBROUS PLASTERING TRADE REGULATIONS (No. 1).

HEREAS, by section 39 of the Apprenticeship Act 1928 (No. 3636), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to Ilis Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now, therefore, Ilis Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

# Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Fibrous Plastering Trade Regulations (No. 1)."

#### Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—
"Act" means the Apprenticeship Act 1928;
"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria. "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

#### Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the tollowing apprenticeship trade, viz.:--

# FIBROUS PLASTERING.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desiring to become apprentices in the said trade shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the Act.

# Applicants may be Examined-Exemptions.

- 5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trade may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trade. Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination—
  - (a) If he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

quantocations or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(i) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the school Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(ii) The satisfactory completion, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission, of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(iii) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the elementary schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission: Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall remain in operation until the 31st day of December, 1937, only and no longer.

(b) If he satisfies the Commission, in accordance with sub-section (2) of section 18 of the Act, that he has not had sufficient opportunity to obtain the preparatory educational qualifications prescribed for entry into the said trade.

REGULATION XXIV.—CONVEYANCE OF CHILDREN TO SCHOOL—RESCINDED AND REMADE.

H IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof. in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Education Act 1928, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby rescind Regulation XXIV.—Conveyance of Children to School, and in lieu thereof substitute the Regulation hereunder:—

REGULATION XXIV .- CONVEYANCE OF CHILDREN TO SCHOOL.

- 1. Allowances for conveyance to State or registered primary 1. Allowances for conveyance to State or registered primary schools will be granted for the attendance of children between the ages of six and fourteen years, whose residences are more than 4 miles from the nearest existing State school, and who, as certified by the Director, would without such allowance be unable to attend a school. For each day's attendance the allowance in respect of each of such pupils will be fourpence.
- 2. Where a State school has been closed in consequence of low average attendance, or where the number of children in a locality would in ordinary circumstances warrant the establishment of a chief allowance for account of a chief of the control o ment of a school, allowance for conveyance may be granted as under :-
  - (a) For each day's attendance of a child over six and under eleven years of age, whose residence is

beyond 21 miles and under 3 miles from the nearest existing State school by the shortest practicable road, the allowance will be threepence.

(b) For each day's attendance of a child between the ages

of six and fourteen years whose residence is not less than 3 miles from the nearest existing State school by the shortest practicable road, the allow-

- ance will be fourpence.

  (c) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant an allowance for conveyance to any child enrolled in a school, notwithstanding that he is under six years or over fourteen years of age.
- 3. Payments will be granted from the day on which children reach the age of six years, and will cease on the last day of the month in which they reach the age of eleven or fourteen years, as the case may be.
- 4. Such payments will be made quarterly through the head teacher, who will certify that such children are duly conveyed in accordance with clauses 1 and 2 above.
- 5. Parents must make all arrangements for the conveyance of their children, and must accept all responsibility in connexion therewith.
- No claim for a conveyance allowance will be recognized until the sanction of the Director has first been obtained.
- 7. Subject to the conditions of clauses 1 and 2, special school 7. Subject to the conditions of clauses I and 2, special second tickets will be issued by the Railway Department to and from certain stations, and these tickets must be paid for by the children at the time of issue. The return half will not be available unless initialed by the head teacher as a guarantee that the child has been in attendance.
  - (a) Head teachers will be required to keep a record of the number of tickets issued to each child, and to furnish a return each month to the Secretary, Education Office, upon receipt of which the parents will be reimbursed.
  - (b) The fares by rail are as follow:—Up to 6 miles, 2d. daily; from 6 miles to 12 miles, 4d. daily.

#### Additional Clauses.

- 8. For the purpose of contributing towards the cost of the carriage of a group of pupils attending any elementary school the Minister may, in his discretion, grant an allowance not exceeding half the weekly fare to be charged for each pupil by the owner of the vehicle in which the pupils are carried. Provided, however, that such allowance shall be payable only in respect of pupils and in the circumstances described in clauses 1 and 2.
- 9. For the purpose of enabling pupils to obtain the advantage, of clause 8 hereof, the head teacher of the school shall submit to the Director a report setting forth the nature of the service by which it is proposed to carry the pupils to such school, including the weekly cost of the service, the weekly fare payable for each pupil, the time-table to be observed, and the name of the owner of the vehicle who is willing to operate the service. In addition, the full name and address, date of birth, qualifications of each pupil, the distance of the home of each pupil from the school, and the distance of the home of each pupil from the nearest other existing State school by the shortest practicable route shall be supplied by the head teacher.
- 10. The owner of the vehicle shall in the carriage of the pupils comply with the provisions of the Transport Regulation Acts, and with the provisions of any statute, regulation, or by-law from time to time in force relating to the conduct of his vehicle.
- 11. The head teacher of the school to which the pupils are carried shall at the end of each week collect the amounts payable by the pupils, and pay the same to the owner of the vehicle. The head teacher must obtain a receipt from the owner of the vehicle in respect of amounts so paid.
- 12. Payments of the allowance under clause 8 will be made by the Director to the owner of the vehicle at the end of each quarter.
- 13. In the event of the owner of the vehicle failing to operate the service in accordance with the arrangement agreed upon by him the head teacher shall report such failure to the Director, and furnish the name of any other person who is prepared to operate the service in an efficient manner.

VARIATION OF ORDER APPOINTING A FIBROUS PLASTERERS BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE POTTERY BOARD AND OF THE TILELAYERS BOARD.

W HEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board, described as the Fibrous Plasterers Board, and did by further Order vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to vary the said powers in the manner hereafter appearing: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby:—

(a) Vary the Orders abovementioned so that in substitu-tion for the powers thereby conferred, the said Fibrous Plasterers Board shall be given the follow-ing powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) manufacturing fibrous plaster, or making architectural ornaments of fibrous plaster, plaster, or cement;
- (b) fixing fibrous plaster on walls or ceilings of buildings;
- (c) architectural modelling;
- (d) preparing material for or making or fixing acoustic tiles moulded into slab form and having an earth base.
- (b) Adjust the powers of the Fibrous Plasterers Board and of the Pottery Board by depriving the said Pottery Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of preparing material for, or making acoustic tiles moulded into slab form and having an earth base and conferring such power exclusively on the said Fibrous Plasterers Board.
- (c) Adjust the powers of the Fibrous Plasterers Board and of the Tilelayers Board, by depriving the said Tilelayers Board of the power to determine the lowest price or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of fixing acoustic tiles moulded into slab form and having an earth base and conferring such power exclusively on the said Fibrous Plasterers Board.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1928, and numbered 74, for controlling, managing, and preserving the children's playgrounds within public reserves in the City of Moorabbin.

pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Govern ment Act 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. The children's playgrounds shall be open daily from 8 o'clock a.m. until sunset.

2. Any person found within the children's playgrounds between sunset and 8 o'clock a.m. shall be guilty of a breach

between sunset and 8 o'clock a.m. shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

3. Although the children's playgrounds are provided for the use of children only, parents and guardians shall be at liberty to enter such playgrounds for the purposes of watching over the children playing therein.

4. No person above the age of twelve (12) years shall be permitted to use the ocean waves and log swings erected in the children's playgrounds, and no person above the age of fourteen (14) years shall be permitted to use the slides and other equipment erected in such playgrounds. Such swings and other equipment shall not be used by any child for a longer period than five minutes at any one time if other children are waiting to use them.

5. No child shall use any of the swings or other equipment in the children's playgrounds except in the ordinary manner.

6. No cricket or football shall be played in any of the children's playgrounds.

7. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be deposited in the bins provided by the Council for the purpose.

8. Persons using the children's playgrounds shall obey all reasonable and lawful directions of the officer or employee of the Council in charge of such playgrounds.

reasonable and lawful directions of the officer or employee of the Council in charge of such playgrounds.

9. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of the swings and other equipment in the children's playgrounds.

10. Any police constable or officer or employee of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the children's playgrounds any person who commits a breach of this by-law, or who wilfully dumages any of the equipment or other property of the Council in such playgrounds.

Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
