Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 3, 4, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), sections 518 and 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Prahran has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter named and described, and situated within the City of Prahran aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), doth by this Order prescribe a further route within the Metropolitan Area along which Motor Omnibuses for which "regular service" licences are granted may ply for hire, also sections and terminal points and stopping places on such route, time-tables to be observed by owners of motor omnibuses plying for hire, fares to be charged, and the maximum number of motor omnibuses which may be licensed to ply for hire on such prescribed route, as set forth in detail in this schedule hereunder:—

Stopping Places on Route.

Pending the fixing of stopping places, motor omnibuses shall only stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of passengers in motor omnibuses.

Fares to be Charged.

The fares to be charged for children under twelve years of age (other than children under three years of age carried on passenger's lap, who shall be carried free) shall be one-half of the fares charged for adult passengers calculated to the nearest higher penny.

REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF BONUSES FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF FOXES, WILD DOGS, WOMBATS, AND VERMIN GENERALLY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby rescind the Regulations made under the provisions of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* (No. 3195) on the ninth day of November, 1925, the sixth day of August, 1934, and the twelfth day of January, 1937, respectively, and do hereby make the following Regulations for the payment of bonuses for the destruction of vermin, and the amount of such bonuses (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bonus for Vermin Destruction Regulations 1928, and shall come into force on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations the terms hereunder shall have the respective meanings assigned to them:—

“Minister” shall mean the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey.

“Superintendent” shall mean the Superintendent of Vermin and Noxious Weeds Destruction appointed under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*.

“Vermin” shall mean any animal or bird which the Governor in Council by Proclamation declares to be vermin for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*.

“Wild Dog” shall mean a dingo or any undomesticated dog generally known as a wild dog inhabiting the bush and apparently having no owner and being under no control, and which in the opinion of the dog inspector of any municipality is a wild dog [and not a dog apparently belonging to a breed commonly owned or kept by persons residing in Victoria].

PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF FOXES.

3. Pursuant to the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* the council of any municipality may, out of the municipal fund thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every fox destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

4. Every person claiming a bonus for the destruction of a fox shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the First Schedule hereto, setting forth the parish and the particular place in such municipality in which and when such fox was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the skin of every such fox, with the brush and scalp attached thereto, and without any letter perforated thereon.

5. Such skin, with the brush and scalp attached thereto, shall, when handed to such officer, be thoroughly dry and free from weevils, fat, or other objectionable matter.

6. The secretary or other authorized officer of a municipality shall, after receiving such skin with the brush and scalp attached thereto, legibly perforate such skin as nearly as possible in the middle with five or more small holes representing the letter V.

7. Such skin, with the brush and scalp attached, after being so perforated, shall belong to and shall be sold by such municipality.

8. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus for the destruction of foxes destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer of the State of Victoria (hereinafter referred to as the “Treasurer”) shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to one-half of the difference between the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in each year by way

of bonus for the destruction of foxes, and the amount received by such council for skins received and sold by such council during such twelve months: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding One shilling and threepence for any fox destroyed.

9. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any year under the provisions of these Regulations unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in such year the council of the municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement, declarations, vouchers, and receipts:—

- A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the Second Schedule hereto setting forth the number of skins, with the brushes and scalps attached, received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such skins.
- The statutory declarations in the form or to the effect of the form in the First Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.
- The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.
- The credit notes, receipts, or account sales received by the council from the purchasers or selling agents showing the amounts received by such council by the sale of skins included in the statement provided for in clause (a) of this regulation.

PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WILD DOGS.

10. Pursuant to the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*, the council of any municipality may, out of the municipal fund thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every wild dog destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

11. Every person claiming a bonus for the destruction of a wild dog shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the Third Schedule hereto setting forth the parish and particular place in such municipality in which and when such wild dog was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the skin of every such wild dog, with the scalp attached thereto, and without any letter perforated thereon.

12. Such skin, with the scalp attached thereto, shall, when handed to such officer, be thoroughly dry and free from weevils, fat, or other objectionable matter.

13. The secretary or other authorized officer of a municipality shall, after receiving such skin with the scalp attached thereto, legibly perforate such skin as nearly as possible in the middle with five or more small holes representing the letter V.

14. Such skin, with the scalp attached, after being so perforated, shall belong to and shall be sold by such municipality.

15. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus for the destruction of wild dogs destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to two-thirds of the difference between the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in each year by way of bonus for the destruction of wild dogs, and the amount received by such council for skins received and sold by such council during such twelve months: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding Thirty shillings for any wild dog destroyed.

16. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any year under the provisions of these Regulations unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in such year the council of the municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement, declarations, vouchers, and receipts:—

- A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto setting forth the number of skins, with the scalps attached, received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such skins.
- The statutory declarations in the form or to the effect of the form in the Third Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.

- (c) The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.
- (d) The credit notes, receipts, or account sales received by the council from the purchasers or selling agents showing the amounts received by such council by the sale of skins included in the statement provided for in clause (a) of this regulation.

PAYMENT OF BONUS FOR DESTRUCTION OF WOMBATS.

17. Pursuant to the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* the council of any municipality may, out of the municipal fund thereof, pay from time to time by way of a bonus such sum as to such council seems fit, for the destruction of every wombat destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality.

18. Every person claiming a bonus for the destruction of a wombat shall, before payment is made, furnish to the council of such municipality a statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the Fifth Schedule hereto setting forth the parish and particular place in such municipality in which and when such wombat was destroyed, and shall also hand to the secretary or other authorized officer of the municipality the scalp of every such wombat, and when payment has been made therefor such scalp shall be destroyed.

19. In the event of the council of any municipality paying or having paid a bonus for the destruction of wombats destroyed within the boundaries of such municipality, the Treasurer shall in each year pay to the council of such municipality a sum equal to three-fourths of the amount paid by such council during the twelve months ending the thirtieth day of June in each year by way of bonus for the destruction of wombats: Provided, however, that the Treasurer shall not pay to the council of any municipality any sum exceeding three shillings and ninepence for any wombat destroyed.

20. No sum shall be payable by the Treasurer for any year under the provisions of these Regulations unless on or before the thirty-first day of July in such year the council of the municipality forwards to the Minister through the superintendent the following statement, declarations, vouchers, and receipts:—

- (a) A statement supported by statutory declaration in the form or to the effect of the form in the Sixth Schedule hereto setting forth the number of scalps received and paid for by such council, the dates of payment, and the names and addresses of the sellers of such scalps.
- (b) The statutory declarations in the form or to the effect of the form in the Fifth Schedule hereto furnished to the council of such municipality by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.
- (c) The council's vouchers or receipts signed by the persons to whom the bonus has been paid.

POWER TO PAY FOR DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN GENERALLY.

21. In so far as the power conferred by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* permits, the council of any municipality may, subject to the provisions of these Regulations relating to foxes, wild dogs, and wombats, pay out of the municipal fund for the destruction of vermin, whether killed within or without the boundaries of the municipality, such bonus as the council deems fit.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the Land Act, 1928 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Pastoral, Agricultural, and Horticultural Shows, and for Public Recreation purposes in the Town and Parish of St. Arnaud.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding fifty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set aside for pastoral, agricultural, and horticultural shows, parades, tennis, cricket or football or other matches, fêtes, coursing, sports, musical entertainments, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions the fees provided hereinafter may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. The Committee of Management may—
 - (a) Let the reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fees shall not exceed a yearly rent from St. Arnaud Pastoral, Agricultural, and Horticultural Society of One pound, and from other bodies, organizations, and/or clubs a fee of Five pounds per day.
 - (b) Set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, fêtes, coursing or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
 - (c) Allow any person or persons, body, society or organization or club the right to erect and remove any building or other improvements on the Reserve.
3. The following is the maximum scale of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges which may be levied for admission to the Reserve and the buildings thereon respectively:—
 - (a) For the admission of each adult to the Reserve a fee not exceeding Five shillings, provided that a further fee not exceeding Five shillings may be charged for the admission of any adult to the grandstand enclosure.
 - (b) For the admission of each horse or pony for training or exercising on the Reserve for every half year, not exceeding One pound.
 - (c) For the admission of each person training or exercising in the Reserve, for every half year, such sum as shall not exceed Five shillings.
 - (d) For the admission of each adult to the Reserve, or any part thereof, on any day not set apart for pastoral, agricultural, and horticultural shows, such sum as shall not exceed Five shillings:

Provided however that any member of the body conducting a show or parade or any sports meeting, gathering, or entertainment on the day may be exempted wholly or partly from the payment of all or any such tolls, entrance fees, or other charges.
4. No person or persons shall—
 - (a) Except the judge, timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, enter the judge's box or the approaches thereto, nor enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room, the show ring, or arena or approaches thereto, except the stewards of any society or club using the Reserve, and such persons as they may invite to do so.
 - (b) Enter the committee rooms and enclosure or the approaches thereto, except the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the body conducting shows, fêtes or other sports gathering on the day, or their respective officers and such other persons as the aforesaid Committee of Management and committee or stewards may invite and/or permit to do so.
 - (c) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (d) Damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein.

- (e) Climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, papers, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- (f) Put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, dogs, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- (g) Be permitted to exercise or train any horse, pony, or dog within the Reserve, or bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- (h) Shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any buildings or any booth or any other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- (i) Carry on the trade, business, or calling of a book-maker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management and/or the committee or stewards of the body conducting shows, fêtes, or other sports gathering on the day, with the permission of the Committee of Management.
- (j) No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
- (k) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (l) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (m) Offer any article for sale or bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without in either case the consent of the Committee of Management.
- (n) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve.

5. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management of the Reserve or of the Committee of Management of the Pastoral, Agricultural, or Horticultural Society of St. Arnaud, or of the committee or stewards of the body conducting fêtes or other sports gathering on the day, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or by any other competent sporting tribunal to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonest, corrupt, fraudulent, or improper practices or dishonorable action or conduct in connexion with recreation, or has been proved to the satisfaction of such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or other competent sporting tribunal to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the Reserve, or any part thereof, or remain upon the Reserve or any part thereof, and may be expelled therefrom after having been warned off by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, or by any person appointed by them for that purpose on the days on which the Reserve may be set apart as provided in Regulation No. 1.

6. Every member of the body conducting fêtes or shows or other sports gathering on the day, and every person paying for admission to the Reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which shall be, upon demand, produced or (if required) surrendered to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the Committee of Management of the Reserve, or the committee or stewards of the body conducting fêtes, shows, or other sports gathering on the day, or those authorized by such Committee of Management, committee or stewards, to demand the production or surrender of the same.

7. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

8. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for that purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee of Management, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by such committee, not exceeding One shilling, in respect of any such car or cycle, for the use of such parking area on such days only as a charge for admission is being made, as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

9. No cart or other vehicle shall, without the authority of the Committee of Management, be driven into or through the Reserve.

10. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee of Management may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

11. All animals and all poultry entering the Reserve must be under proper control, and the owner of any animal or poultry that causes damage within the Reserve shall be held responsible therefor.

12. Any person erecting any tent, structure or sideshow, or occupying any space allotted to him or her by the Committee of Management shall pay for such privilege such sum as may from time to time be determined by the said Committee of Management or any person acting under its authority.

13. Any person conducting a sideshow which the Committee of Management considers objectionable shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, and any fees paid by such person shall be forfeited.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football or other matches, fêtes, coursing, sports, shows, parades, musical entertainments or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee. And all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management. The Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud has been appointed a Committee of Management of the Reserve with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence, be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES (SWIMMING POOL) AT WODONGA.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon. Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portions of the Reserve for Public purposes along the Ana branch of the Murray River, in the Town of Wodonga, as are indicated by pink tint on the plan marked W/3.8.36 attached to Lands Department Correspondence No. C.83528.

REGULATIONS.

1. Every person shall exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any portion of the Reserve, dressing rooms, closets, compartments, or appurtenances, and shall not damage, deface, write upon or cut any part or parts of the fittings or buildings whatever.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Remove any lifebuoy or life-saving apparatus from its place of safekeeping without the consent of the officer in charge unless for the absolute purpose of saving life.
- (b) Climb or attempt to climb on any roof, fence, or other portion of the premises, except such portion as shall be lawfully set aside for such purpose.
- (c) Enter or remain on the premises whilst in a state of intoxication.
- (d) Behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, or offensive manner.
- (e) Use indecent or offensive language.
- (f) Use any portion of the baths whilst suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease.

- (g) Wilfully or improperly foul or pollute the water of the swimming pool, or soil or defile any towel, bathing dress, dressing room, stage, landing, or any portion of the Reserve.
- (h) Carelessly or negligently break or injure, or improperly interfere with any portion of the Reserve, buildings, gates, fences, furniture, fittings, or conveniences thereof or therein.
- (i) Erect in the Reserve any building, hooth, tent, table, or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for the purpose of any game or amusement, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, or bring any intoxicating liquor on the premises, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then subject only to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.
- (j) Bring, cause, or allow any dog or other animal to enter or remain on the premises unless controlled by a cord or chain, and all dogs found wandering in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.
- (k) put in the Reserve, or swim, any cattle, horses, dogs, or other animals.

3. The Committee of Management shall have full authority and power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*, or amendments thereto.

4. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or light any fire in the Reserve, or do any act which may cause or be likely to cause damage by fire to anything growing or being therein.

5. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the premises, nor any officer in charge.

6. Any person finding any article which may have been left or lost in any part of the premises shall immediately deliver same to the officer in charge.

7. The Committee of Management reserves to itself the right of closing the premises for cleansing, repairs, or other purposes, without incurring any liability to any person.

8. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the officer in charge may refuse admission to the premises to any person.

9. Every person over the age of four years bathing or preparing to bathe at the Reserve shall, in order to secure the observance of decency, be clad in a bathing costume covering the body at least to the extent provided for by this Regulation, that is to say: The costume shall completely cover the chest and the front of the body from a line at the level of the armpits down to the waist. Below the waist-

line the whole of the trunk, front, back, and sides shall be covered, and the covering shall descend without a break to the lower end of the leg covering. The costume shall have legs at least 3 inches long. The costume shall be provided with shoulder-straps or other means of keeping it in position.

In the case of a person over the age of 12 years, the costume shall, in addition, have a half skirt attached to the waist covering the front of the body below the waistline and descending to the lower end of the leg covering.

10. No person shall at any time whilst in the Reserve or swimming or washing in the creek, use any soap or other substance or preparation whereby the water in the creek may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for bathers.

11. No carnival or aquatic display shall be held at the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management, nor shall fees be charged for admission to the baths on days on which carnivals or aquatic displays are held without the consent of the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall swim or dive in the swimming pool after nightfall unless the same is lighted to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management.

13. No persons other than the members of the Committee of Management, its officers, servants, or workmen, judges, and stewards, and persons officiating at displays or carnivals, or persons entering or leaving the water, shall enter upon or in any way make use of the dressing rooms, stagings, landings, platforms, steps, diving boards, boats, rafts, or other accessories in connexion with the Reserve.

14. Any police constable or Crown lands bailiff shall have the right (in addition to any other penalty under this Regulation) to remove any person from the Reserve who commits a breach of this Regulation, or who wilfully damages any of the appliances or any property thereat. The Council of the Shire of Wodonga has been appointed a Committee of Management with the power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
