### PROHIBITION OF THE TAKING OF OYSTERS FROM CERTAIN AREAS IN WINGAN INLET.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of  
Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of  
Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the  
Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of  
the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of  
the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me  
enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit the  
taking of oysters or oyster brood from the areas at Wingan  
Inlet referred to hereunder for the period specified:—

Area.—“A,” “AA” and “E,” “B.”

Period.—From 1st January, 1937, to 31st December, 1937.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

### QUARRY TRADE TRIBUNAL.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of  
Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of  
Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act* 1934 it is  
enacted that the Governor in Council may, by  
Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare  
that section 40 of the said Act shall extend and apply to and  
in respect of any trade specified in such Proclamation other  
than the trade of making or baking bread, or in the trade of  
delivering bread: And whereas by the said Act it is further  
enacted that the Governor in Council by such Proclamation  
may appoint a Trade Tribunal, of the name, style, or  
designation stated therein, to have, exercise, and perform in  
relation to the trade specified as aforesaid the powers and  
duties conferred upon the Bread Trade Tribunal by section 40  
of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of  
the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive  
Council, doth by this Proclamation hereby declare that section  
40 of the said Act shall, from the date hereof, extend and apply  
to and in respect of the trade relating to persons employed  
in—

- (1) the process, trade, or business of quarrying, not includ-  
ing agriculture;
- (2) (a) carting or driving, or assisting in carting or  
driving, in connexion with or incidental to the  
trade or business of quarrying (not including  
agriculture);
- (b) the trade of crushing stone.

And doth by this Proclamation appoint a Trade Tribunal,  
styled the Quarry Trade Tribunal, to have, exercise, and  
perform in relation to the trade above specified the powers and  
duties conferred by section 40 of the *Factories and Shops Act*  
1934 upon the Bread Trade Tribunal.

## AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## VIOLET TOWN WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1937.

THE Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of Two shillings and threepence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Two pounds.

A charge of Two pounds for the supply of water to drinking troughs for sheep, cattle, or horses where such trough is within the district.

A charge of Seven pounds for the supply of water to any steam engine within the district.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1937, and shall be payable on the 31st day of May, 1937.

#### LONG LAKE AND QUAMBATOOK WATERWORKS DISTRICTS.

SETTLING AND ADJUSTING RESPECTIVE INTERESTS AND OBLIGATIONS IN REGARD TO PROPERTY, INCOME, ASSETS, RIGHTS, AND LIABILITIES.

2. That all rates, interest thereon, and all charges on any lands and tenements in respect of any rates or interest thereon, and all other charges and sums due or payable to or leviable by the said Commission in respect of lands and tenements within the Quambatook Waterworks District so united, shall be vested in, enforced by, paid to, and received, levied, and recovered by the said Commission, as if the same had been made by and become due to the said Commission in respect of lands and tenements within the said Long Lake Waterworks District.

3. That all interests and obligations of the said Commission in respect of the said Quambatook Waterworks District, referred to in clause 1 above, in regard to any property, income, assets, rights and liabilities, shall be deemed, as on and from the 1st day of January, 1937, to apply to the said Long Lake Waterworks District.

## REGULATION XXXIV. (A).—HIGHER ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.—CLAUSE ADDED.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928*, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby add to Regulation XXXIV. (A).—Higher Elementary Schools, the following clause, viz.:—

8A. Applicants for the position of Head Teacher in a Higher Elementary School shall either have obtained first-class honours or have obtained second-class honours and passed in at least three subjects of an approved course for a University degree or diploma; and they shall in addition be required to furnish satisfactory evidence of their ability to carry out the duties of the position.

## REGULATION XX.—TRAINING SCHOOLS.—RESCINDED AND REMADE.

(b) Not more than two student teachers shall be allotted to any training school.

(c) The Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall determine the number of assistants to be allotted to training schools.

2. Applicants for positions as teachers or as student teachers in training schools shall possess such qualifications, and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

3. (a) Nominations for appointment, transfer, or promotion to positions as teachers in training schools shall be made by the Committee of Classifiers for the Primary Schools Division.

(b) In making such nominations, the Classifiers shall take into consideration the special duties and qualifications of the teachers required for the positions, and shall nominate the applicant who in their opinion is best qualified for the position having regard to the special attainments, record, experience and training of the applicants and their positions on the Classifier Roll.

## CLAUSE 4 OF REGULATION VIII. (A).—ESTABLISHMENT OF SCHOOLS FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, FOR THE DEAF AND DUMB, AND FOR THE BLIND.—RESCINDED AND REMADE.

(b) Applicants for positions as teachers or as student teachers in such schools shall possess such qualifications, and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## CLAUSE 4 OF REGULATION VIII. (C).—TUITION BY CORRESPONDENCE: (A) COURSE OF STUDY FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS.—RESCINDED AND REMADE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred under the provisions of

section 24 of the *Education Act 1928*, and section 149 of the *Public Service Act 1928*, and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby rescind clause 4 of Regulation VIII. (C).—Tuition by Correspondence: (A) Course of Study for Elementary Schools, and in lieu thereof doth substitute the following clauses, viz.:—

4. The Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall determine the number and the classification of the teachers to be allotted to a school in which a correspondence branch has been established.

5. Applicants for positions as teachers in a school in which a correspondence branch has been established shall possess such qualifications and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## REGULATIONS MADE.

4. Applicants for positions as teachers or as student teachers in such schools shall possess such qualifications and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## REGULATION VIII. (E).—SCHOOL FOR RECRUITS OF POLICE FORCE.

1. A special school for recruits of the Victorian Police Force may be established by the Minister.

2. The course of study to be undertaken at such school shall be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

3. The Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall determine the number and the classification of the teachers to be allotted to such school.

4. Applicants for positions as teachers in such school shall possess such qualifications and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## REGULATION VIII. (F).—SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE AND HORTICULTURE.

1. A special school for the purpose of instructing teachers in agriculture and horticulture, and in the conduct of Young Farmers' Clubs, may be established by the Minister.

2. The Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall determine the number and the classification of the teachers and the number of student teachers to be allotted to such school.

3. Applicants for positions as teachers or as student teachers in such school shall possess such qualifications and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## REGULATION VIII. (G).—KINDERGARTEN CLASSES.

1. Kindergarten classes may be established in any schools by the Minister.

2. The Director shall prescribe from time to time the course of study to be undertaken at such kindergarten classes.

3. The Director, with the approval of the Minister, may allot an additional female teacher of the Fifth class to the staff of any school at which a kindergarten class is established.

## REGULATION VIII. (H).—TEACHERS OF SPECIAL SUBJECTS.

1. The Minister may establish a special staff of teachers of such special subjects as Physical Training, Singing, and Swimming.

2. The Director, with the approval of the Minister, shall determine the number and the classification of the teachers to be allotted to such staffs.

3. Applicants for positions as teachers of such special subjects shall possess such qualifications and shall satisfy such requirements as may be prescribed from time to time by the Director.

## REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF PORT FAIRY.

3. It shall be lawful for hairdressers' and tobacconists' shops within the municipal district of the Borough of Port Fairy to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until the hour of half-past Eight o'clock.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Fruit and Vegetables Acts 1928 (No. 3687) and 1936 (No. 4421), the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby order that the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Act on the 11th November, 1935, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 13th November, 1935, be amended from and inclusive of the first day of June, 1937, as follows, that is to say:—

In Part II., at the end of paragraph 7, there shall be inserted the following new paragraph:—

7A. The maximum quantity of any deleterious substance that may adhere to or be on or in any fruit for sale shall be that set out in the Eleventh Schedule to these Regulations.

In Part III., the First Schedule shall be rescinded, and the following new schedule shall be substituted in lieu thereof:—

FIRST SCHEDULE.

GRADE STANDARDS FOR APPLES AND PEARS.

14. No person (whether by himself or by an agent or servant, or on behalf of another person) shall sell any apples or pears contained in a package unless, in addition to compliance with the general requirements of these Regulations, the apples or pears have been graded into either one or other of four grades, viz., "Extra Fancy," "Fancy," "Good," or "Domestic," and the apples or pears have been graded and packed in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (a) The package shall be marked with a true designation of the grade, whether "Extra Fancy," "Fancy," "Good," or "Domestic," of the apples or pears contained therein.
- (b) Each external layer of apples or pears on the top, bottom, and sides of the fruit, whether described as "Extra Fancy," "Fancy," "Good," or "Domestic," shall be a true indication of the average grade of the apples or pears throughout the package.

APPLES.

"Extra Fancy."

- (c) Apples described as "Extra Fancy" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed, mature apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and from disease. Slight blemishes may be permitted, provided such blemishes do not exceed 10 per cent. by number of the total fruit in any case, and provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch.

- (i) Russetting shall not be considered a blemish, provided that not more than 10 per cent. of the surface of any apple is affected.

- (ii) The minimum sizes and colour requirements shall be as set out hereunder, but with no limit as to maximum sizes.

*"Fancy."*

- (d) Apples described as "Fancy" shall consist of sound, clean, and fairly formed mature apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skin and from disease.

Slight blemishes from any cause may be permitted, provided such blemishes do not exceed 10 per cent. by number of the total fruit in any case, and provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch.

- (i) Russetting shall not be considered a blemish, provided that not more than 30 per cent. of the surface of any apple is affected. Provided that in regard to the Sturmer variety not more than 50 per cent. of any apple may be russetted.

- (ii) The minimum sizes and colour requirements shall be as set out hereunder, with no limits as to maximum sizes.

*"Good."*

- (e) Apples described as "Good" shall consist of apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by Black Spot fungus, caterpillars, hail marks, or limb rubs may be permitted, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch. Provided, further, that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any one apple do not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half of an inch.

- (i) Russetting shall not be deemed to be a blemish with the Sturmer variety, but with other varieties the russetting must not be more than 50 per cent.

- (ii) The minimum sizes shall be as set out hereunder, with no limit as to maximum sizes.

*"Domestic."*

- (f) Apples described as "Domestic" shall consist of apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and serious damage caused by insects, disease, or otherwise, but may include blemished fruit, provided that the total area of any blemishes on any one fruit shall not exceed the area of a circle having a diameter of three-quarters of an inch, provided further that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any apple do not exceed the area in a circle having a diameter of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch.

- (i) The minimum sizes shall be as set out hereunder, with no limit as to maximum sizes.

## PEARS.

*"Extra Fancy."*

- (c) Pears described as "Extra Fancy" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed pears of one size and one variety, free from any broken skins and from disease. Russetting shall not be deemed a blemish on pears normally russetted, provided that normally clean-skinned varieties shall not be russetted over a greater area than 15 per cent. of the surface of any one pear.

Superficial blemishes from any cause may be permitted, provided such blemishes do not exceed 10 per cent. by number of the total fruit in any case, and provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch.

- (i) None of the pears in this grade shall be less than  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches in diameter.

*"Fancy."*

(d) Pears described as "Fancy" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed pears of one size and variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease. Pears slightly blemished by Black Spot fungus, or from other causes, may be permitted, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch.

(i) Russetting shall not be deemed a blemish on pears normally russeted, provided that normally clean-skinned varieties shall not be russeted over a greater area than 30 per cent. of the surface of any one pear.

(ii) None of the pears in this grade shall be less than 2 inches in diameter.

*"Good."*

(e) Pears described as "Good" shall consist of pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any diseases, but pears slightly blemished by Black Spot fungus, or from other causes, may be permitted, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half an inch; provided further that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any pear do not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of 1 inch.

(i) Russetting shall not be considered a blemish.

(ii) None of the pears in this grade shall be less than 2 inches in diameter.

*"Domestic."*

(f) Pears described as "Domestic" shall consist of pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but pears slightly blemished by Black Spot fungus, or from other causes, may be permitted, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of three-quarters of an inch; provided further that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any one pear do not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch.

(i) Russetting shall not be deemed a blemish.

(ii) None of the pears in this grade shall be less than 2 inches in diameter.

NOTE.—Normally clean-skinned pears means pears of the following varieties, viz.:—Packham's Triumph, Josephine de Malines, William Bon Chretien (Duchess or Bartlett), Howell, Doyenne du Comice, Beurre D'Anjou, Packham's Late, Clapp's Favorite.

## DEFINITION OF SIZE.

The size of the apples and pears shall be as follows:—

"2 inches," which term shall include fruit 2 inches or greater diameter, but less than  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inches.

" $2\frac{1}{8}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $2\frac{1}{8}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

" $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than  $2\frac{3}{8}$  inches.

" $2\frac{3}{8}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $2\frac{3}{8}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

" $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches.

" $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $2\frac{3}{4}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than 3 inches.

"3 inches," which term shall include fruit 3 inches or greater diameter, but less than  $3\frac{1}{8}$  inches.

" $3\frac{1}{8}$  inches," which term shall include fruit  $3\frac{1}{8}$  inches or greater diameter, but less than  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inches.

At the end of Part IV., there shall be inserted the following additional Regulation:—

SAMPLING OF APPLES, PEARS, AND OTHER FRUIT FOR THE PRESENCE  
OF DELETERIOUS SUBSTANCES.

For the purpose of determining whether any fruit has adhering to it or on or in it a greater quantity than prescribed, of any deleterious substance, an inspector may take for analysis a portion of such fruit in accordance with the following provisions:—

- (a) The inspector shall, in the presence of the *vendor, owner, or person in charge*, select a sample of the fruit consisting of not less than sixteen fruits, and divide it into two approximately equal parts.
- (b) Such part shall be placed in a suitable receptacle and sealed. A label shall be attached to each part stating the name of the vendor, the name of the fruit, and the date and place of sampling. Each label shall be signed by the inspector, who shall submit it for signature to the vendor, owner, or person in charge present at the taking and sealing of the said sample.
- (c) One part shall be handed by the inspector to the vendor, owner, or person in charge of the fruit, and the other shall be submitted by the inspector to an analyst of the Department of Agriculture for analysis.
- (d) The analyst shall issue to the said inspector a certificate of the results of such analysis.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "EASTERN PARK" IN THE TOWN OF PORTARLINGTON.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 19th October, 1936, as a site for a Public Park in the Town of Portarlinton, Parish of Bellarine.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Park shall be open to the public free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding sixteen in any one year) as the Park may be set apart for entertainments, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Park.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Park, nor shall light fires therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and then only in the place set apart for the purpose.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names, letters, or figures on the fences, trees, seats, or buildings in the Park, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, nor remove any sand or soil from the Park.
5. No person shall bring into the Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or any poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Park, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Park, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Park (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall bring into the Park any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Park, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in the Park.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Park, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Park on Sundays.

13. Instrumental music is prohibited in the Park on Sundays between the hours of Three o'clock and Four o'clock in the afternoon, also between the hours of Seven o'clock and half-past Eight o'clock in the evening.

14. The building in the Park known as "the Eastern Park Palais" must not be used between the hours of midnight on any Saturday and Eight o'clock in the forenoon on the following Monday, nor on Good Friday.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good

such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

16. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Park and authorized officers of the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Park has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Bellarine as a Committee of Management, with power to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1937, and the remainder shall be delivered not

later than 28th February, 1938. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, except Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (not folded). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 10.

10. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds, for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

13. In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange, which may affect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

14. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same for identification purposes.
