- 2. Such drainage rates are made and shall be levied for the 2. Such dramage rates are made and small be levice for the period of six months beginning with the 1st day of January. 1938, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1938, and shall be payable on the 20th day of May, 1938; at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 5, opposite the name of the respective drainage districts in column 1 of the said schedule.

For making and levying such drainage rates the value of the lands in the respective drainage districts, set out in the valuations made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, and adopted by the said Commission on the 2nd day of May, 1938, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands.

This Regulation shall not apply to self-propelled vessels of less than the following dimensions:—





"3. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
