PROCLAMATION

No. 4536. "An Act to enable The Royal Melbourne Hospital to borrow certain Moneys by the Issue of Debentures and to empower the Treasurer of Victoria on behalf of the Government of Victoria to guarantee the Repayment of such Moneys and Interest thereon and for other purposes."

No. 4537. "An Act to make Provision with respect to the Continuation in certain Cases of the Operation of certain Provisions of the Landlord and Tenant (Rent Reduction) Acts and of certain Orders made thereunder."

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Northcote has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned used as a lane be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a lane hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Northcote aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT ELTHAM.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*:—

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

80 acres, or thereabouts, being allotment 5, and portion of allotment 4, of section 1A, Parish of Nillumbik, County of Evelyn, and more particularly described as follows:—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 5 of section 1A; thence west 3,881 links by the south boundary of a road to a point on the north boundary of allotment 4; thence south by a direct line to the northern bank of the Yarra River; thence south-easterly and easterly by the northern bank of the said river to the south-east angle of allotment 5; thence north by the east boundary of the said allotment 5 to the point of commencement.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM HOLLAND'S BRANCH AND RYAN'S CREEK AND THEIR TRIBUTARIES FROM 1st MAY to 31st AUGUST IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from Holland's Branch and Ryan's Creek and their tributaries above or upstream from the junction of such streams from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WODONGA GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act, the trustees of the Wodonga General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette* and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges made must be paid when applications are made or orders given.

3. Application for an order for interment must be given to the Secretary of the Trust, and must be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

4. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the name, age, place of residence, and supposed cause of death of the deceased given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or a registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary.

5. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved, and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. The hours of burial shall be from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the year.

7. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.

8. The trustees may remit the whole or any part of such charges made for the burial of any person, on the certificate of any justice, or on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

9. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, other erection or additions, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and pay the charge set forth in scale of fees, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees. All foundations of tombstones to be not less than twelve inches in the ground.

10. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

11. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

12. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them and in case interment is made in any private grave or vault belonging to any other person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

13. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners. Wooden fences not allowed. Trustees reserve the right to order the removal of any memorial allowed to become into a state of disrepair.

14. A plan of the cemetery will be kept, together with a register, and may be inspected at the office of the trustees.

15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by the 39th section of the *Cemeteries Act 1928*, No. 3652.

16. No dog or dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery, but if found there will be destroyed.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Water Act 1937* (No. 4513) it is provided that within six months after the commencement of the said Act the Governor in Council after consultation by the Minister with the Commission may by Order adjust the outstanding liability as on the thirty-first day of December. One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, for the cost of works (excluding free headworks) under the jurisdiction and control of the Commission serving each Irrigation and Water Supply District and each Urban Division thereof, each Waterworks District and each Urban District thereof, each Flood Protection District, and each Drainage District by allocating to each such District and Division the liability for such amount of the cost of such works serving such District or Division as he thinks fit and by allotting to the State the liability for the remainder of the cost thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of the said section, doth hereby allot as at 31st December, 1937, to each of the under-mentioned Districts, a liability of the amount set out in the statement hereunder and doth allot to the State the balance of the liability in respect of each of the said Districts as is set out in the said statement and doth hereby direct that each such balance of liability be transferred to an account in the books of the Commission to be called the "Capital Expenditure Borne by the State Account".

West, and Yelta Waterworks Districts, the Echuca North, Fish Point, and Treco Irrigation and Water Supply Districts, the Corop, Heyfield, and Murrumbidgee Urban Divisions, and the Angelsea, Beulah, Bittern, Carwarp, Drysdale, Jung Jung, Koonook, Lake Boga, Meringur, Nyah West, Patchewollock, Piangil, Portarlington, Speed, and Ultima Urban Districts will not produce sufficient revenue to cover the expense of the maintenance and management thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of the said section, doth hereby direct the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission to continue to supply water in each of the said Districts, and doth hereby direct that the annual amount of loss resulting from the maintenance and management of the works of each of the said Districts and Divisions shall be transferred to an account in the books of the said Commission to be called the "Revenue Expenditure Chargeable to the State Account."

And the Honorable Francis Edward Old, His Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATION XI. (K)—CLASSIFICATION IN HONOURS
RESCINDED, AND REGULATIONS SUBSTITUTED

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of
Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive
Council thereof, doth hereby rescind Regulation XI. (K)—
Classification in Honours, made under the Education Act 1928,
and doth substitute therefor the under-mentioned Regula-
tions:—

REGULATION XI. (K)—SECOND CLASS HONOURS.

1. Teachers may be granted classification in Second Class
Honours provided that they—

- (a) hold a First Class Certificate or its approved equivalent;
- (b) have satisfactorily discharged the duties of a classified teacher for at least four years;
- (c) are recommended for the purpose by one of the Chief Inspectors;
- (d) have successfully completed one of the under-mentioned courses, namely:—
 - (i) At least three subjects (including English A) at pass or honour standard of the course for a degree in Arts or Commerce or Science at the University of Melbourne;
 - or
 - (ii) an approved day course for a diploma in a technical school;
 - or
 - (iii) English A and groups of such subjects in technical schools as may be prescribed from time to time;
 - or
 - (iv) English A and such Departmental subjects as may be prescribed from time to time;
 - or
 - (v) the Drawing Teacher's Primary Certificate and English A;
 - or
 - (vi) (1) the Singing Teacher's Primary Certificate; and
 - (2) Theory of Music Grade III. or Musical Perception Grade III.;
 - and
 - (3) Practical Music Grade III. or piano or organ or violin or solo singing;
 - and
 - (4) English A;
 - or
 - (vii) the first year of the special University course in Music for teachers, and English A;
 - or
 - (viii) an Agriculture Group embracing such subjects as may be prescribed from time to time, and English A;
 - or
 - (ix) a Horticulture Group embracing such subjects as may be prescribed from time to time, and English A;
 - or
 - (x) the first year of the course in Physical Education at the University of Melbourne and English A;
- (e) have passed a satisfactory examination in the history, theory, and practice of education, embracing—
 - (i) the leading principles of education;
 - (ii) psychology of education;
 - (iii) school organization and management;
 - (iv) methods of teaching.

2. For the purposes of sub-clause (d) of clause 1 above, the Education Department's examination in English shall be accepted as the equivalent of English A.

3. In the case of teachers who have actually served in the Great War there may be a limitation of the prescribed examinations under clause 1 above to such subjects, standards, and service as may be deemed to be essential to the efficient performance of the duties involved in classification in Honours.

4. Candidates who have completed portion of the course under the provisions of the previous regulation may be granted permission to complete the course as prescribed in that regulation provided that the course is completed not later than the thirty-first day of December, 1941.

REGULATION XI. (O)—FIRST CLASS HONOURS.

1. Teachers may be granted classification in First Class Honours provided that they—

- (a) have obtained Second Class Honours;
- (b) have been recommended for the purpose by one of the Chief Inspectors;
- (c) have successfully completed one of the under-mentioned courses, namely:—
 - (i) At least three subjects as pass or honour standard (in addition to those taken for Second Class Honours) of the course for a degree in Arts or Commerce or Science at the University of Melbourne;
 - or
 - (ii) an approved day course for a diploma at a technical school;
 - or
 - (iii) such groups of subjects in technical schools as may be prescribed from time to time;
 - or
 - (iv) the Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate;
 - or
 - (v) (1) such portion of the Singing Teacher's Secondary Certificate as may be prescribed from time to time;
 - and
 - (2) Theory of Music Grade I. or Musical Perception Grade I.;
 - and
 - (3) Practical Music Grade II. in piano or organ or violin or solo singing;
 - or
 - (vi) an Agriculture Group embracing such subjects as may be prescribed from time to time;
 - or
 - (vii) a Horticulture Group embracing such subjects as may be prescribed from time to time;
- (d) (i) have passed in the theory, principles, history, and practice of education as prescribed for the Diploma of Education at the University of Melbourne;
- or
- (ii) (1) have passed an examination conducted by the Education Department in History of Education and in principles of education and in comparative education;
- and
- (2) have submitted a satisfactory essay of about 1,500 words on some topic of educational interest selected from one of the recommended text books, such essay to be written prior to the examination and to contain proof of original thought and criticism and to be attached to the examination paper of the candidate;
- or
- (iii) have satisfactorily carried out a course of experimental education or an investigation into some important phase of modern education and have embodied the result in an approved thesis.

2. No candidate shall be awarded First Class Honours on the same portion of any examination as that on which he was awarded Second Class Honours.

3. No candidate may present for examination in Education for First Honours unless he has had three years' experience as a classified teacher.

4. In the case of teachers who have actually served in the Great War there may be a limitation of the prescribed examinations under clause 1 above to such subjects, standards, and service as may be deemed to be essential to the efficient performance of the duties involved in classification in Honours.

5. Candidates who have completed portion of the course under the provisions of the previous regulation may be granted permission to complete the course as prescribed in that regulation provided that the course is completed not later than the thirty-first day of December, 1941.

And the Honorable Sir John R. Harris, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MOE RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following additional Regulation in respect of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Yarragon, and known as the "Moe Recreation Reserve":—

REGULATION.

No person shall drive or bring any carriage, motor car, motor, truck, or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulation.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10).
