ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4542. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and one thousand four hundred and one pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven and One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight."

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a street by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do

by this Proclamation declare the land used as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

All that piece or parcel of land commencing at a point on lines bearing S. 15 deg. 38 min. E. 1,555 links, S. 37 deg. 40 min. E. 740.5 links from the north-west corner of Crown allotment 37, Parish of Eumemmerring, County of Mornington; thence bounded by lines bearing east 3,534.5 links, S. 0 deg. 18 min. E. 100 links, west 3,457 links, N. 37 deg. 46 min. W. 126.5 links to the commencing point.

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CONDITIONS RESPECTING NETTING IN ANDERSON'S INLET.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamations made the sixteenth day of August, 1910, and the nineteenth day of January, 1917, and published in the *Government Gazette*s of the twenty-fourth day of August, 1910, and the twenty-fourth day of January, 1917, respectively, regarding netting in Anderson's Inlet, and in lieu thereof prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Anderson's Inlet—

- (a) during the whole of each year within or inside an imaginary line bearing north-easterly from the most northerly point of Point Griffith to the most seaward point of the north-western bank of the mouth of Cherry Tree Creek;
- (b) from the first day of December in each year until the last day of February next following (both days inclusive) within or inside an imaginary line running from the most seaward point of Point Hughes to the most seaward point of Point Smythe.

As a guide to fishermen and others two posts will be erected on Point Griffith to mark the boundary of closure (a), but the absence or invisibility of one or both posts will not relieve any person from compliance with the provisions of this Proclamation.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE MACALLISTER RIVER WITHIN A DISTANCE OF ONE HUNDRED YARDS BELOW THE GLENMAGGIE WEIR.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation prohibiting all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Macallister River during the whole of each year within a distance of one hundred yards downstream from the Glenmaggie Weir.

STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD—
VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force; the Governor in Council did, by Order, appoint a Wages Board

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING FORMS.

WHEREAS by section 46 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (Act No. 3799), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make Regulations for or with respect to certain matters therein referred to: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Destruction (Forms) Regulations 1928*, and shall come into force upon the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

INTERPRETATION.

2. In the construction of these forms the terms hereunder shall have the respective meanings assigned to them:—

“The Act” shall mean the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799).

“Minister” shall mean the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey.

“Superintendent” shall mean the Superintendent of vermin and noxious weeds destruction appointed under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*.

“Corporation” shall mean the Board of Land and Works, the Victorian Railways Commissioners, the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the Country Roads Board, the Closer Settlement Commission, the Forests Commission, and the State Electricity Commission of Victoria.

“Municipality” shall include the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong.

“Owner” shall include—

- (a) any person holding or occupying any land under any lease or licence from the Crown or deriving title from, under, or through such person; and
- (b) a mortgagee of land in possession thereof.

“Owner” and “Occupier” shall respectively include any joint owner, or joint occupier, or the agent of any owner or occupier.

“Noxious weed” shall mean any plant which the Governor in Council by Proclamation declares to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*.

“Vermin” shall mean any animal or bird which the Governor in Council by Proclamation declares to be vermin for the purposes of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928*.

3. The forms hereunder set forth lettered A to Z or others to the like effect are hereby prescribed as the “Forms” to be used for the whole of Victoria under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* in respect of the several matters which they purport to cover.

4. If any lessee or occupier of any land of the Crown held or occupied under lease or licence has expended in any one year a sum of more than One hundred pounds in the destruction of noxious weeds on such land under the supervision of an inspector, and desires to claim payment of the sum so expended over and above the sum of One hundred pounds, he may apply to the Minister by forwarding through the Superintendent a statement supported by statutory declaration showing particulars of the total amount so expended as provided for in Form T of these Regulations, accompanied by an L2 claim for the difference between the amount so expended and the sum of One hundred pounds.

Such claim shall, before being passed for payment, be duly certified to by the Superintendent and be approved by the Minister.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Fruit and Vegetables Act 1928* (No. 3687), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby order that the Regulations made under the provisions of the said Act on the 11th November, 1935, as amended on the 25th May, 1937, be further amended from and inclusive of the first day of September, 1938, as follows, that is to say:—

1. In Regulation 3, in the heading Part III, after the word "Prunes" appearing in the second line insert the word "Peaches."

2. In Regulation 7, in place of the word "third" appearing in the sixth line, substitute the word "fourth."

3. In Regulation 8 (g), delete the word "and", and after the word "Seventh" insert the words "and Twelfth."

4. Repeal Regulation 14 (e), relating to Apples, and substitute therefor the following Regulation:—

"Good."
(e) Apples described as "Good" shall consist of sound apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by Black Spot fungus, caterpillars, hail marks, or limb rubs may be permitted, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple of two and a half inches and over does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half an inch, and on any apples under two and a half inches does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch. Provided, further, that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any apple of two and three quarter inches and over do not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of one inch, and on any apple under two and three-quarter inches do not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half an inch.

(i) Russetting shall not be deemed to be a blemish with the Sturmer variety, but with other varieties the russetting must not be more than 50 per cent.

(ii) The minimum sizes shall be as set out hereunder, with no limit as to maximum sizes.

5. Repeal Regulation 14 (f), relating to Apples, and substitute therefor the following Regulation:—

"DOMESTIC."
(f) Apples described as "Domestic" shall consist of sound apples of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and serious damage caused by insects,

disease, or otherwise, but may include blemished fruit, provided that the total area of any blemishes on any one fruit shall not exceed the area of a circle having a diameter of three-quarters of an inch; provided further; that where the blemishes are wholly restricted to superficial hail marks, the blemishes on any apple do not exceed the area in a circle having a diameter of one and a half inches.

(i) The minimum sizes shall be as set out hereunder, with no limit as to maximum sizes.

After the 30th June of any year no person shall sell apples described as "Domestic" with the exception of the varieties known as "Granny Smith," "Democrat," "Rome Beauty," and "Yates."

6. In Regulation 14 (e), relating to Pears, before the word "pears" where it appears the second time, insert the word "sound."

7. In Regulation 14 (f), relating to Pears, before the word "pears" where it appears the second time, insert the word "sound."

8. After Regulation 21, insert the following additional Schedule and Regulation:—

TWELFTH SCHEDULE.

Grade Standards for Peaches.

22. No person (whether by himself or by an agent or servant or on behalf of another person) shall sell any peaches contained in a package unless, in addition to compliance with the general requirements of these Regulations, the peaches have been graded into either one or other of three grades, viz.:—"Extra Fancy," "Fancy," or "Good," and the peaches have been graded and packed in accordance with the following provisions:—

(a) The package shall be marked with a true designation of the grade, whether "Extra Fancy," "Fancy," or "Good" of the peaches contained therein; also whether the peaches are "Slipstone" or "Clingstone."

(b) Each external layer of peaches on the top, bottom, and sides of the peaches, whether described as "Extra Fancy," "Fancy," or "Good" shall be a true indication of the average of peaches throughout the package.

(c) Peaches described as "Extra Fancy" shall consist of sound clean well-formed peaches of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and disease. Superficial blemishes caused by hail marks or limb rubs shall not be allowed to a greater extent than 10 per centum (by number) of the total peaches in any case. The peaches shall be of uniform colour. None of the peaches shall be less than two and a quarter inches in diameter.

(d) Peaches described as "Fancy" shall consist of sound clean well-formed peaches of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by disease; but peaches slightly blemished by hail marks or limb rubs may be sold provided—

(i) the proportion of such peaches does not exceed 15 per centum (by number) of the peaches in any case,

(ii) the total area covered by such blemishes on any peach does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch.

None of the peaches shall be less than two and one-eighth inches in diameter.

(e) Peaches described as "Good" shall consist of sound peaches of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease; but peaches slightly blemished by hail marks or limb rubs may be sold, provided that the total area covered by such blemishes on any peach does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of a quarter of an inch. The diameter of peaches shall not in any case be less than two and one-eighth inches except in the case of varieties which, in the opinion of the Director, may be regarded as normally small, in which case none of the peaches shall be less than two inches in diameter.

(f) Peaches sold in open packages shall be graded into either one or other of the three grades.

And the Honorable Edmond John Hogan, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
