DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the second year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the *Slum Reclamation and Housing Act 1938*, it is enacted by section 1 thereof that, save as otherwise expressly provided in that Act, the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and whereas it is otherwise expressly provided only in section 8, sub-section 8, of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the provisions of the said section 1, and all other powers conferred upon me by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the twelfth day of October, 1938, as the date upon which the said Act (other than section 8, sub-section 8 thereof) shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE.

APPPLICATIONS are invited from officers (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for nomination during 1939 for free places in a course for a degree, diploma, or licence at the University of Melbourne. The number of officers that may be nominated is five.

The nominations will be made by the Minister of Public Instruction on the recommendation of a Board consisting of the Public Service Commissioner as chairman, the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools, and the Permanent Heads of three Departments other than the Education Department. The recommendations of the Board will be based on the age, suitability, qualifications, and period of service of the applicants, on the reports and recommendations of their Departmental Heads, and, if considered necessary, on the result of a personal interview. Applicants must be qualified for admission to the course upon which they desire to enter, and should have been in the employment of the Government of Victoria for at least one year, and, except in special cases, such as applicants who are returned soldiers or who have already completed part of their course, should be not more than 25 years of age.

Each officer nominated for one of these Free Places will be admitted without fee to all lectures and examinations in the subjects of his course, and will be granted the necessary leave of absence to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will not, however, be granted any allowance for books, materials, or other expenses involved in attending the University. He will be required to enter into an agreement with the Minister of Public Instruction, and be guaranteed by an approved surety, that he will not relinquish his course without permission, that he will carry out the conditions of his Free Place, and that, if required, he will remain and continue in the employment of the Government of Victoria during the period of three years next after the termination of his Free Place, and, if his Free Place extends over more than three years, an additional year for each year by which the term of his Free Place exceeds three years. The amount of liability under the terms of this agreement will not exceed £250.

The continuance of the Free Place will be dependent upon satisfactory reports by the Professorial Board as to the officer's attendance, conduct, and progress at the University, and by the Departmental Head as to the manner in which he performs his official duties.

Forms of application are obtainable at this office. Each application must be made on the prescribed form, and must be forwarded through the Permanent Head of the Department in which the applicant is employed, to reach the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, not later than 1st December, 1938.

TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1938.

THE Tongala Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of One shilling in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Tongala Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifteen shillings (15s.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Fifteen shillings.

Such rates are made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1938, and shall be payable on the 15th day of October, 1938, at the office of the said Trust.

For water supplied by the Trust for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and fourpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand.

For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, the charge for every 1,000 gallons, or portion of same, to be at the rate of Two shillings and six pence per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum of Six pence for any one tank or load.

Notwithstanding the payment of any charge by any owner or occupier, the Trust reserves the right to cut off the supply of water from any premises if such owner or occupier shall wilfully or negligently allow water to run to waste, or who uses it in an unauthorized manner, or who does not supply a meter when requested to do so. When the water is cut off from any premises, the owner or occupier must pay a sum of One pound to be reconnected to the main. Water must not be used for gardens between the hours of Eight (8) o'clock p.m. and Six (6) o'clock a.m. For the purpose of conserving the supply during dry weather, the Trust, in its discretion, may cut off the water during certain hours of the day.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing By-law was made by the Tongala Waterworks Trust and passed this 15th day of December, 1937.

And whereas, in accordance with sub-section 2 of section 12 of the said Act, the Onion Marketing Board has been constituted for at least two (2) years. Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth by this Order hereby direct that a poll of the producers of onions be taken as to whether the Onion Marketing Board should be dissolved: and further, doth hereby appoint Friday, the second day of December, 1938, as the day for such poll to be taken.

RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF ELECTRICITY
REGULATIONS.

PURSUANT to the powers contained in paragraph (e) of section 27 of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1928*, and on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Restrictions on Use of Electricity Regulations*.

2. These Regulations shall come into effect on the day when they are published in the *Government Gazette*.

3. In these Regulations, electricity means electricity, electric current, or any like agency which is generated by the Commission, whether it is supplied by the Commission or by an undertaker or not, and in a case where electricity generated by the Commission and electricity by some other person is transmitted through the same electric lines or works, includes all electricity so transmitted.

4. Any person who, during a state of emergency as hereinafter defined, contravenes the provisions as to use of electricity contained in any advertisement referred to in paragraph 6 of these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for the first offence, and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds for any subsequent offence.

5. A state of emergency shall be deemed to exist for the purpose of these Regulations whenever the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaims that an industrial strike has occurred, or other emergency has arisen, at any portion of any undertaking or works of or operated by the Commission, and that for the protection of works or electrical lines of the Commission, or the prevention of any interference therewith, it is necessary to prohibit or restrict the use of electricity by consumers, and such state of emergency shall be deemed to continue until the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a proclamation of the Governor in Council that such industrial strike or other state of emergency has ceased to exist.

6. The Commission may at any time, and from time to time during a state of emergency, publish in a daily newspaper published in Melbourne a notification that electricity is not to be used—

- (a) for purposes specified in such advertisement; or
- (b) except for purposes therein specified—

either (i) at all; or

- (ii) at an average rate per quarter hour greater than some rate therein specified or indicated in that behalf; and

either (i) anywhere; or

- (ii) at premises within an area therein specified, and such advertisement may also provide the periods during which or the times at which the prohibitions, or any of the prohibitions therein contained, are to operate, including specified hours, specified days, and a specified period.

And the Honorable Francis Edward Old, His Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN AT GREAT WESTERN.

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of 12th June, 1883, and 17th May, 1938, as a site for Public Park and Garden in the Town of Great Western, and known as Great Western Park:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall cut down, remove, or damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, or light fires therein without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or on any buildings in or around the Reserve, or cut names on or injure or otherwise deface the fences, trees, buildings, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles in the Reserve.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Provided always that the moneys received from agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The owner of any horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and, in addition, the Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status), within the meaning of any law, for the time being in force, relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes thereof, "cattle" shall mean "cattle" as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall erect any buildings in the Reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. The Committee of Management shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments,

musical performances, shows, or sports, or for athletic training or other physical recreation, subject to payment of such fees, and on such terms and conditions as it may deem reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto, as hereinafter provided.

10. No club, association, or person shall hold or take part in any game of cricket, football, tennis, or any games of any description, entertainment, performance, show, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No club or association of any kind having for its object physical recreation, or any member or members of any club or association or any other person shall play, practise, train, or engage in any game or sport, or athletic exercise within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, unless any such person is at the time of playing a member of any club, which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time.

Provided that any person not otherwise offending against these Regulations may enter on the Reserve, and play tennis thereon, on paying to the club or association for the time being occupying the Reserve, or the Committee of Management, a green or court fee not exceeding Two shillings and six pence per day, or part thereof, or not exceeding Five shillings per week.

12. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding twenty-six in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for the purpose of fêtes, sports, carnivals, or holiday amusement shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult person, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and six pence:

Provided that the net amount received by the Committee of Management, after providing for any necessary expenses in connexion therewith shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. No person shall train or exercise any horse, dog, or other animal in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall take or drive any motor car, or bicycle, carriage, cart, or any other vehicle into or through the Reserve except along the drives as defined by the Committee of Management, and no person shall park any vehicle or tie up any horse in such a position that the use of the sporting facilities is in any way interfered with.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

CITY OF CAULFIELD.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Municipality of the City of Caulfield has made By-law No. 64 under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and particularly Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for the purpose of regulating and restraining the erection and construction of erections or hoardings and for other purposes set out in the By-law.

The following is a summary of the contents of the By-law:—

Clause 1 defines the meaning of the words "Council," "Surveyor," "Sky sign," as used in the By-law.

Clause 2 provides for the repeal of By-law No. 31.

Clause 3 provides that any person desirous of erecting, constructing, or altering any hoarding shall first submit to the Council a proper plan and specification and other particulars of the proposed work; that the Council will consider such plan, specification, and other particulars and will, if the proposed work will comply with the provisions of the By-law and all other Acts, By-laws, and Regulations applying thereto, and if the prescribed fees are paid, grant a written permit to carry out the proposed work; that no person shall erect or construct or attach to any building or structure any hoarding without a permit.

Clause 4 deals with hoardings erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and which do not conform with the terms and provisions of the By-law.

Clauses 5 and 6 provide for the pulling down and removing of hoardings erected contrary to or not in conformity with the plan and specification approved of by the Council, for the sale of the materials, and for the reimbursing of the Council for any expenses incurred in connexion with such pulling down.

Clause 7 deals with the position and dimensions of signboards.

Clause 8 deals with the conditions under which signs may be erected.

Clause 9 deals with lamps under verandahs.

Clauses 10 and 11 deal with Neon signs.

Clause 12 deals with vertical signs.

Clause 13 requires all signs, hoardings, and similar structures to be kept clean and in good repair.

Clause 14 regulates the erection of signs over buildings erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law.

Clause 15 specifies the distance from a street at which hoardings or signboards may be erected.

Clauses 16 and 17 require advertising signs attached to buildings or verandahs to refer only to the business carried on in the shop or building to which the sign is affixed.

Clause 18 requires the permission of the Council to be obtained for the erection, construction, or placing upon any building of a sky sign.

Clause 19 requires proper plans and specifications to be submitted with applications for permission to erect Neon signs.

Clause 20 requires proper plans and specifications to be submitted with applications for permission to erect any illuminated sign and provides for the issue of a licence when the council approves of the erection of illuminated signs.

Clause 21 sets out the form of licence referred to in Clause 20.

Clause 22 provides for the Council, by resolution, approving of plans and specifications of signs which, in certain respects, do not completely comply with the requirements of the By-law.

Clause 23 sets out the fees payable by any person desirous of erecting, painting, etc., hoardings, signboards, painted signs, luminous and Neon signs, and sky signs.

Clause 24 provides a penalty and a continuing penalty for wilful acts or defaults contrary to the provisions of the By-law.

Clause 25 provides that, in addition to any penalties, any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of the By-law or in the execution of work directed by the By-law, shall be paid by the person committing the breach or failing to execute the work.

Clause 26 provides that the By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

CITY OF MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 237.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* (19 George V. No. 3720) and numbered 237, to amend and add to By-law No. 220 for regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, and for other purposes.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by 19 George V. number 3720, and by every other Act of power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 220 intitled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* (19 George V. Number 3720), and Part IV. of the *Health Act 1928* (19 George V. Number 3697), and numbered 220, to amend and consolidate the By-laws for regulating and restraining the erection and construction or alteration of buildings, erections, or hoardings, and for other purposes" and any By-laws amending the same.

2. Any person having paid the appropriate fee hereinafter prescribed may submit preliminary plans and/or specifications of any building proposed to be erected, constructed, or altered, to the Surveyor for examination and report as to whether such proposed erection, construction, or alteration (hereinafter called a "Proposal") is capable of being executed in conformity with the By-laws of the City of Melbourne:

3. The following fees shall be charged and received by the Council in respect of any such examination and report on a proposal, viz.:—

(1) If the proposal is in respect of the erection or construction of a building a fee equal to twenty-five per centum of the fees for new buildings or additions chargeable under Part XIV. of By-law No. 220 in respect of a building similar to the building referred to in the proposal.

(2) If the proposal is in respect of the alteration of a building a fee equal to twenty-five per centum of the fees for structural alterations chargeable under Part XIV. of By-law No. 220 in respect of a building similar to the building referred to in the proposal.

(3) Provided that—

(i) In no case shall such fees be less than Three pounds three shillings; and that

(ii) If within twelve months from the date of any such report a builder shall deliver to the Surveyor complete plans and specifications for the erection, construction, or alteration of the building referred to in such report, and such complete plans and specifications shall be approved by the Surveyor, the fees payable under Part XIV. of By-law No. 220 in respect of the building referred to in such complete plans and specifications shall be reduced by twenty-five per centum.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne the sixth day of June, 1938, and confirmed the twenty-ninth day of August, 1938.

REGULATIONS.

Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend or add to the Regulations made pursuant thereto by the Council on the 1st day of March, 1937, for amending and consolidating the Regulations made by the Council for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. These Regulations shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with the Regulations (hereinafter called "the Principal Regulations") made by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the first day of March, 1937, intitled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend and consolidate the Regulations made by the Council for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and other public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof."

2. The Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the twenty-fifth day of October, 1937, intitled "Regulations made by the Council of the City of Melbourne, in pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928*, to amend or add to the Regulations made pursuant thereto by the Council of the City of Melbourne on the first day of March, 1937," are hereby repealed.

3. Clause 7 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by inserting the following sub-clause after sub-clause 10 thereof:—

"19A. Not stop, except for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers or in obedience to the direction or signal of such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or traffic control signal as aforesaid (notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause 18 of clause 7 of the Principal Regulations), on the north side of Collins-street between Queen-street and a point opposite the western building alignment of Market-street between the hours of forty-five minutes past eight o'clock in the morning and forty-five minutes past nine o'clock in the morning on any day other than Sunday."

4. Sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph (a) of sub-clause 1 of clause 30 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by substituting for the words "Queen-street" therein the words "Spencer-street."

5. Sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph (a) of sub-clause 1 of clause 30 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the words following:—

"between Spencer-street and William-street or."

6. No driver of a vehicle (other than a tram car) shall leave or allow such vehicle to remain (whether unattended or not) standing:—

(1) In that section of Swanston-street which lies between Latrobe-street and Flinders-street between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and twelve o'clock midnight of any day of the week other than Sunday.

(2) In that section of Elizabeth-street which lies between Lonsdale-street and Flinders-street, or in that section of Collins-street or Bourke-street or Lonsdale-street which lies between Russell-street and Queen-street, or on the north side of that section of Flinders-street which lies between Russell-street and Queen-street between the hours of thirty minutes past four o'clock in the afternoon and thirty minutes past six o'clock in the afternoon of any day of the week other than Saturdays and Sundays, and between the hours of thirty minutes past eleven o'clock in the morning and thirty minutes past one o'clock in the afternoon of any Saturday.

Provided that this clause shall not apply to any vehicle standing in a parking area, or to any driver of a licensed motor car or hackney carriage while plying for hire on any stand duly fixed or appointed by the Council under any By-law, or to any driver of a vehicle stopping for the purpose of putting down or taking up passengers, or for loading or unloading goods, or in obedience to the direction or signal of a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or traffic control signal.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Heytesbury made with the approval of the Governor in Council under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling and numbered 36 for—

- (a) Repealing part of By-law number 33;
(b) Prescribing certain areas in the Township of Cobden in the Shire as Brick areas;
(c) Imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heytesbury, order as follows:—

1. Section 13 of Part III. of By-law number 33 made by the Council on the fourteenth day of March, 1934, in so far as the same is inconsistent with or opposed to this By-law is hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in all those areas which front to or abut on the streets or roads or portions of streets or roads set out in the Schedule hereto and for a distance of 50 feet on each side thereof.

3. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. No person shall erect, build, construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed any building the external walls of which are other than in brick, stone, concrete, reinforced concrete, or approved concrete blocks for a distance of at least 15 feet from the street frontage, and of fire resisting materials (as defined in By-law number 33) for the remainder of such building within the areas prescribed in the First Schedule hereto. Provided that within such area so prescribed shop fronts may be reconstructed in manner approved by the Council or its duly authorized officer in brick, stone, or concrete and metal and plate glass, without it being necessary to alter the construction of existing main buildings; And further that the foregoing restriction shall not apply to alterations of existing wooden buildings provided such buildings and alterations are otherwise in compliance with By-law number 33 and do not involve the alteration of any external wall.

5. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council, its engineer, or secretary of the Commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any court as the case may be.
