N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regula-

- 1. No person shall bring into that portion of Victoria outside the municipalities mentioned in the First Schedule to these Regulations from those portions of Victoria constituted by or within the said municipalities any of the plants mentioned in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, or transfer or remove such plants from those portions of Victoria constituted by or within the said municipalities to that por-tion of Victoria outside such municipalities unless—
  - (a) Before such plants are transferred or removed from those portions of Victoria constituted by or within the said municipalities they have been fumigated in the presence of an inspector, duly appointed as a foresaid, by the exposure for at least four hours in a gas-tight chamber to the fumes of carbon bisulphide at twenty-five pounds liquid carbon bisulphide for each one thousand cubic feet of space under twenty-eight inches mercury vacuum, and thereupon scaled in the presence of such inspector in a suitable package on which appears the name of the person on whose premises such fumigation was performed; and
  - (b) Such plants are accompanied by a certificate in or to the effect of the form contained in the Fourth Schedule and given under the hand of the inspector in whose presence the fumigation and scaling of the packages were performed.
- 2. (a) Notwithstanding any of the provisions contained in clause 1 of these Regulations the Director of Agriculture may on the application of the owner of any of the plants mentioned in the Second Schedule permit any of such plants to be brought into that portion of Victoria outside the municipalities mentioned in the said First Schedule from those portions of Victoria constituted by or within the said municipalities upon the owner thereof undertaking in writing to have the said plants, after enter, funiorated in the said to have the said plants, after entry, funigated in the manner prescribed in clause 1 (b) of these Regulations, at such place, and on such day as the said Director may in his discretion determine or fix, and in the presence of an inspector duly appointed as aforesaid.
- (b) Every application made in pursuance of this clause of the Regulations shall be in writing, and shall be delivered to the Director of Agriculture before the said plants are trans-ferred or removed from those portions of Victoria constituted by or within the municipalities to that portion of Victoria outside such municipalities.
- (c) Every permit granted by the Director of Agriculture under this clause of the Regulations shall be in writing.

The public reserves under the control or management of the Council shall be open from 6 o'clock in the morning till 9.30 o'clock in the evening of every day from the first day of October to the thirtieth day of April, both inclusive, and between the hours of 7.30 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening of every day from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of September, both inclusive, and no person shall enter or remain in any public reserve except between the hours aforesaid.

3. No person shall pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates of any public reserve, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the seats therein or stick bills or advertisements or writings on any of such fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or missiles or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, glass, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter or rubbish, or disturb, damage or destroy any property or thing in any public reserve. Provided that the Council may permit to be exhibited or shown on such terms and conditions as it thinks fit any sign, poster, bill, placard, advertisement or notice in or upon any buildings, erections, or fences in any public reserve belonging to or under the control of the Council of the City of Brunswick.

4. No person shall drive or take any vehicle, horse, or cattle into through or upon any public reserve without the written authority of the proper officer of the Council.

6. No person shall drive or ride any vehicle in or through any public reserve without the authority of the proper officer of the Council.

7. No person shall take a dog (other than a dog led by a chain or cord) into, through, or upon any public reserve Any dogs (other than those led by a chain or cord) goats or poultry found within any public reserve may be destroyed by a Council officer.

8. No person shall hawk or sell in any public reserve anything of any description, or offer the same for sale therein without the previous written permission of the Council.

9. No person shall take or receive any plants, seeds, or cuttings from any public reserve without the authority of the Council.

No person shall interfere with hinder, or obstruct in any public reserve any Council employee in the performance of his duties nor engage any employee in conversation except on business, and then only with the authority of the proper officer of the Council or of the person in charge of the employees in the public reserve in question.

11. No person in a state of intoxication or in possession of intoxicating liquors of any description shall enter upon or remain in any public reserve, nor shall any person drink intoxicating liquors therein nor sell or offer for sale intoxicating liquors of any description therein.

(a) sell or offer for sale any goods in a manner calculated to obstruct or hinder members of the public in the free and proper use of such street or footway;

5a. No person shall hereafter commence, or cause to be

5C. No person shall hereafter erect any building (for which a permit for the commencement 'thereof has been granted as aforesaid) contrary to or not in conformity with this By-law or the plans, specifications, and other particular-in respect of which such permit was so granted.

#### BY-LAW No. 40.

BY-LAW NO. 40.

A By-law of the Shire of Rodney, made under Part XXX. of the Local Government Act 1928 (19 George V. Number 3720) and numbered 40; for regulating the cattle markets provided by the Council of the said shire at Kyabram and Tatura, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by 19 George V. Number 3720 and by every other Act or power enabling in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Rodney doth livreby order as follows:—

it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Rodney doth hereby order as follows:—

1. All previous by-laws and regulations relating to the subject-matter of this By-law shall, as from the date of the coming into operation of this By-law, be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or abbest-matter—

subject-matter-

"The Inspector" means the Inspector or other person appointed by the Council of the Shire of Rodney to collect stallages, rents, tolls, and dues, and to supervise and direct the toriduct of persons using the markets.

- "The Kyabram Cattle Market" and "The Tatura Cattle Market" mean respectively the municipal sale-yards established by the Council at Kyabram and Tatura. "The Markets" means either the Kyabram Cattle Market or the Tatura Cattle Market.
- 3. The Inspector shall attend the markets on all days on which auction sales are conducted in the markets, and shall perform the following duties, namely:—
  - (a) see that the provisions of this By-law are observed;
     (b) demand and receive, on behalf of the Council, all stallages, rents, tolls, and dues payable in respect of the use of the markets;

- (a) preserve order in the markets;
  (d) allot space for cattle and goods brought into the markets:
- (c) appoint times and places within the markets at which cuttle and goods shall be sold on market days.
- 4. Every person entering the markets shall at all times obey such directions of the Inspector as he may give in the performance of his duties hereunder.
- 5. No person shall remove any cattle or goods from the markets until all tolls, dues, and charges in respect thereof have been paid to the Inspector, or a pass in respect thereof has been issued by the auctioner in whose hands the same were placed in the markets for sale.
- 6. The person in charge of all cattle and goods brought to the markets for sale shall place them in such pen or position as the inspector shall direct, and thereafter no person shall move them or any of them without the consent of the Inspector.
- 7. Every person who brings cattle to the markets for sale shall, if the sane are not sold at the sale for which they are so brought, remove the same from the markets within sixteen hours after the close of such sale, and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of an offence; and, whether procedured for the same or not, he may be required to pay the cost of such food and water as the Inspector may in his discretion provide for such cattle before the same are removed.
- 8. Every auctioneer using the markets for selling cattle or goods shall conduct his sale at the time determined by the Inspector.
- 9. The order in which the auctioneers may conduct sales in the markets shall be determined under the superintendence of the Inspector by the drawing of lots.
- 10. The markets shall be opened for the commencement of sales and the times for commencement and conclusion of each sale signalled by the ringing of a bell or such other distinctive signal as the Juspector may determine.
  - 11. Every auctioneer conducting a sale at the markets shall-
    - (a) conform to the order of selling as determined under clause 9 hereof;
  - clause 9 hereof;

    (b) commence his sale immediately upon receiving the signal so to do:

    (c) continue his sale after commencement thereof without delay until the time allotted to him has expired or his sale has been concluded:

    (d) discontinue his sale immediately upon receiving a signal from the Inspector that the time allotted to him has expired and make way, if required, for the next auctioneer to conduct his sale;

    (e) out of pass-books supplied by the Council or the Inspector issue to purchasers of cattle or goods sond by him and owners of cattle or goods unsold as soon as possible after the sale thereof passes for the removal of such cattle or goods and such passes shall disclose clearly whether such cattle or goods are sold or not;

shall disclose clearly whether such various in games are sold or not;

(1) supply to the inspector, upon request, details of the number and sale price of stock and other articles sold by him;

(y) hand to the disspector, upon request, at the conclusion of each sale, all pass-books mentioned in sub-clause (c) hereof

12. Every dispute or difference arising between auctioneers or between any persons upon matters connected with sales conducted at the markets shall be referred by the parties thereto to the Inspector, whose decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

13. All cattle or other goods unsold by reason of the expiry of the time allotted to auctioneers for their sales may be submitted for sale in the markets by such auctioneers in the order in which they previously conducted their sales on the same day at such time as the Inspector may determine.

14...In the foregoing clauses of this By-law the word "cattle" shall have the meaning assigned to it in section 3 of the Local Government Act 1928.

15. The Kyabram Cattle Market and the Tatura Cattle Market shall respectively be open for the purpose of conducting auction sales of the various classes of eattle and other stock and sundries on the days and at the times following:—

  (b) The maximum time allowed for the sale of each penshall be two and a half minutes, but five minutes shall be allowed in addition to the auctioneer drawing the first sale prior to him offering his first
- (c) All fat cattle not offered at all auctioneers' first sales shall be penned up and offered in the same order as the first sales prior to any store cattle being offered.

  17. The maximum time allowed for the sale of each lot of
- dairy cattle shall be two minutes.

  18. The following provisions shall apply to the sale of store
- - (a) Store cattle shall be sold in pens of not less than four
  - where it is possible.
    (b) The maximum time allowed for the sale of each pen shall be two and a half minutes, but five minutes shall be allowed in addition to the auctioneer drawing the first sale prior to him offering his first

Sheep.
19. The following provisions shall apply to the sale of sheep:-

(a) Sheep shall be sold in pens of not less than fifteen

where it is possible.

where it is possible.

(b) The maximum time allowed for the sale of each pen of fat sheep or lambs shall be one minute, and for each pen of store sheep or lambs three minutes, but five minutes shall be allowed in addition to the anetioneer drawing the first sale of fat sheep and lambs prior to him offering his first pen.

Pigs.

20. (a) Pigs shall be sold in pens of not less than the following numbers where it is possible; that is to say:—

(a) Baconers—minimum three to a pen.

(b) Porkers—minimum five to a pen.

(c) Store pigs—minimum to a pen.

(b) The maximum time allowed for the sale of each pen of pigs shall be two minutes in the case of baconers and porkers, and three minutes in the case of store pigs, but five minutes shall be allowed in addition to the auctioneer drawing the first sale of nics prior to him offering his first pen. first sale of pigs prior to him offering his first pen.

Miscellaneous.

21. No person shall sweep, throw, or deposit, or cause to be swept, thrown, or deposited, any refuse or rubbish of any kind into or upon any of the footways, stands, stalls, or enclosures within the markets.

22. Every person who places any fat, offal, or other offensive matter in the markets shall remove the same from the markets immediately upon being requested so to do by the Inspector.

23. No person shall place or suffer to remain in any part of the markets, or the immediate approaches thereto, any vehicle or any cattle, sheep, horses, pigs, stock, produce, or other thing in such a position that the same will obstruct the free progress of people using the markets or any thoroughters or progress of people using the markets or any thoroughfares or pathways thereiu.

pathways therein.

24. No person shall place, affix, or attach any poster, sign, or placard on or drive or screw any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the woodwork or paving or buildings or erections in the markets without the permission of the Inspector.

25. No person shall use the markets or within a distance of 15 chains from the nearest boundary thereof use the immediate approaches thereto for the purpose of touting for the sale of cattle, sheep, pigs, horses, or other goods, or for soliciting orders for goods of any kind, or for distributing any handbills, books, or pamphlets.

26. No person shall in the markets, or those portions of the immediate approaches thereto lying within 15 chains of the nearest boundary thereof, make or cause to be made any violent outery, noise, or other disturbance, or play any musical or noisy instrument.

the nearest boundary thereof, make or cause to be made any violent outery, noise, or other disturbance, or play any musical or noisy instrument.

27. No person shall bring into the markets or suffer to remain therein any dog contrary to the directions of the Inspector in that regard.

28. No person shall ride, drive, or propel any bicycle or vehicle, or push or drag any barrow, truck, or trolly, along any of the footways of the markets.

29. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the foregoing provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction for such offence to a penalty of not more than £20.

30. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Rodney. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Rodney the twenty-seventh day of September, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.
