CERTAIN PLANTS DECLARED TO BE NOXIOUS WEEDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my

Proclamation declare the plants named hereunder to be noxious weeds for the purposes of the above Act. viz.:-

- Scolymus hispanicus, L. ("Golden 1 Thistle" or "Spanish Salsify"), within the Shires of Huntly, Gordon. Korong, East Loddon. Tullaroop, and Marong.
- (2) Cytisus scoparius, Link ("English Broom"). Cytisus canariensis, L. ("Cape Broom"), and Madia sativa. Mol. ("Pitch Weed"), within the Shire of Yackandandah.

SANCTUARY FOR NATIVE GAME AT "GILGAI" AND "GUNDAMAIN," NEAR NAGAMBIE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-second day of April, 1936, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of the twenty-ninth day of April, 1936, respecting a sanctuary for native game at "Gilgai" and "Yandra," near Nagambie, and in lieu thereof direct that the parts of Victoria within the boundaries, hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the Game Act 1928.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

Counties of Rodney and Moira. Parishes of Bailieston and Tabilk: Commencing at the south corner of allotment 41A. Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD. $\dot{}$

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a Board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on, from, and after a later date specified in the Proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 24th day of December, 1935, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act. the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 7th April, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to chicory and assigned to such Board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation, hereby provide and declare that on and from the ninth day of April. One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, all chicory shall, subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April. One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, it shall, by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act, become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof. And to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owners of the abovementioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same. I do further provide that all such chicory shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times, at such places, and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division I, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I. the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Exceutive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule referred to

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fire Brigades Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that on the request of the Council of any municipal district outside the Metropolitan Fire District or any Country Fire District, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do. the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the Government Gazetta declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district. And whereas the Councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder and not already part of the fire districts respectively specified in connexion therewith be added to and form part of such fire districts: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenaut-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly. specified accordingly.

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

City of Chelsea.—Those portions not already included within the said Eastern Fire District.

Shire of Lillydale and Parishes of Yering and Mooroolbark, Counties of Evelyn and Mornington.—Boundary comprising the circumference of a circle having a radius of 120 chains and having for its centre a point on the northern boundary of Crown allotment 7, section 30, Parish of Yering, equidistant from the north-west angle and the north-east angle of the aforesaid allotment.

MERRIGUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1938.

THE Merrigum Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes, otherwise than by measure, of Three shillings and six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements within the Merrigum Urban District. BY-LAW NO. 1.

Standing Orders.

For regulating and appointing the place and hour of meetings of the Port Fairy Waterworks Trust, and providing for the management and conduct of business thereat.

Management and conduct of business thereat.

WHEREAS by the Water Acts power is given to any authority (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) from time to time to make, amend, and repeal By-laws relating, inter alia, to the appointment of the place and hour of meetings, whether periodical or special, and providing for the due management and conduct of business thereat, be it therefore ordered and directed, subject as aforesaid, by the Commissioners of the Port Fairy Waterworks Trust, such Trust being an authority under the said Act, as follows, viz.:--

- 1. In all cases not provided for by Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
- 2. Place, Hour, and Adjournment of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically at the Borough Chambers, Port Fairy, on the first Monday in the month, to date from the lst November, 1937, at the hour of Eight o'clock in the evening, and the Commissioners thereat may from time to time by adjournment from such meeting, or from any subsequent adjournment thereof, meet together at any convenient place, and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them
- and at such hour to be from time to time appointed by them for that purpose.

 3. **Alectings, **Special.**—A special meeting of the Commissioners may at any time be called by the chairman or by the Minister, and shall be called by the chairman if so requested, in writing, under the hands of two Commissioners. No special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each Commissioner. Such notice shall be in writing, and shall specify the time of the meeting and the object thereof, and shall be delivered or sent through the post office, or otherwise, to the place of abode, or the usual place of business (if any) within the Waterworks District of each Commissioner. No business shall be transacted at any special meeting, except what is stated on the notice thereof.

 4. **Powers Vested in Commissioners.**—All powers vested in the Waterworks Trust may be exercised by the Waterworks Trust at any meeting held in pursuance of the Water Acts at which there is a quorum of the Commissioners present, but not otherwise.

- 5. Quorum.—A quorum of the Commissioners shall consist of six Commissioners. If there is not a quorum of Commissioners present within half an hour after the time appointed for any present within half an hour after the time appointed for any meeting, the Commissioners present, or the major part of them, or any one Commissioner if there is only one present, may adjourn the meeting until another hour or another day; if no Commissioner is present, the secretary may so adjourn the meeting. Except where a meeting is so adjourned to a subsequent hour of the same day, the secretary shall forthwith deliver or send through the post office to each Commissioner patient in writing, of the time to which the meeting has been notice, in writing, of the time to which the meeting has been adjourned.
- 6. Who Shall Preside at Meetings .- At any meeting of Commissioners the chairman, if present, shall preside, and if the chairman is not present at the time appointed for holding the meeting, the Commissioners present shall choose some one of their number to be chairman of such meeting.
- 7. Majority to Decide.—All questions at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Commissioners present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 8. Meetings, Notice of .- A notice of every regular meeting of S. Meetings, Actice of —A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of each Commissioner, three days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held, except in cases of emergency, when a special meeting may be called as hereinbefore provided.
- hereinbefore provided.

 9. Meetings. Resolutions at, not to be Revoked.—No resolutions at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

 10. Business. &c., Order of—Minutes.—At every meeting of
- 10. Business, &c., Order of—Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings of the previous meeting shall then be signed by the chairman of such meeting.
- 11. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

 - Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Commissioners, if called for.
 Reading letters received, and considering and ordering
 - Reception and reading of petitions and memorials. Receiving deputations from ratepayers.

 Presentation of reports.

 - (5) Presentation of reports.
 (6) Phyments.
 (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the chairman may think desirable.
 (8) Other motions of which previous notice had been continued.

 - (9) Notices of motion and the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

- special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

 12. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioner, as the case may require.

 13. Who to Speak.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

 14. Chairman to Rise when Addressing Meeting.—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any questious, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

 15. Commissioners not to Speak Twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation, when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

 16. Points of Order.—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provisions, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

 17. Commissioners not to Digress, or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subjectmatter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other Commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations or improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioner shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall upon being called to order by the chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw with investments. every Commissioner so doing shall upon being called to order by the chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.

- 18. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down upless permitted to explain.
- 19. Persons not Commissioners to Leave when Requested .-No person, not being a Commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the chairman to so do.
- 20. Call of the Commissioners.—No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.

21. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Commissioners applying to the question under discussion.

22. Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust secretary at the close of the meeting of the Commissioners, or, if not given at a meeting, then four days clear prior to the day upon which the next meeting of Commissioners is to take place, and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

23. No Motion without Notice.—No member shall make any

motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance

of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

24. Motions on Petitions, &c.—No motion, except for the receiving of the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstance. stances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of Commissioners

after that at which it has been presented.

25. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

26. Motions not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

27. No notion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of same.

mitted a draft of same.

'28. Mover of Motion or Amendment not to be Interrupted.—
Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or other matter disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

29. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

sioners thereon.

30. Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.

31. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion .- No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

the infraction thereof.

32. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.—A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a Commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

33. Motions to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the chairman, be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

34. Amendments re Motion in Writing.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

previous amendment is disposed of.
35. Amendment to Become the Question.—If an amendment 35. Amendment to Become the Question.—It an amendment be carried, the question or amendment as amended shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question coming after such first mentioned amendment may be moved.

36. Second Amendment May be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for dis-

amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for dis-

cussion at one time.

37. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but of no amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

- .38. Adjournment, Motion for.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the noticepaper shall then be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.
- ment be made.

 39. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case he given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners, by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which the notice of intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners. to the Commissioners.
- 40. Legal Questions.—If a debate, or any motion moved and seconded, be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
- 41. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice; and then such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so intornated. interrupted.
- 42. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any 42. Voling.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, those voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote and a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except be disabled by law from so doing.
- 43. Questions to be Put.-The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 44. Contents of Petitions .- It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provisions thereof.
- 45. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

 46. Petitions to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written. written
- 47. How Signed .- Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto, by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by

48. No Letters, &c., to be Attached .- No letters, affidavits,

or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

49. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself senting a pecton of the Commissioners shall comme himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allega-tions contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof. 50. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any peti-

tion, or otherwise, must send in an application, in writing, to the Trust secretary the day before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.

51. Cheques to be Signed.—That all cheques shall be signed by three Commissioners, and countersigned by the secretary. 52. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Town of Port Fairy, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

53. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.

54. Commissioners, &c., not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners. 51. Cheques to be Signed.—That all cheques shall be signed

55. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

56. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.

57. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Trust secretary and a member of the Trust, from time to time, on the written order of the chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners, the true of Ten pounds the sum of Ten pounds.

58. Common Seal .- The common seal of the Trust shall be bs. Common Seal.—The common seal of the Irist shall be kept in a box having two locks, one of which locks the chairman shall keep the key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the Trust secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman and one other member of the Commissioners, or, in the absence of the chairman, unless two Commissioners be present.

59. Address to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and Trust secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.

60. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for rates and purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

61. Penalty.—Every person who shall offend against this Bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

By-law No. 3800.—Newstead Urban District within the Newstead Waterworks District.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, hereinafter referred to as "the Commission," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the Newstead Urban District within the Newstead Waterworks District:-

- 1. During the period commencing with the 13th day of April, 1938, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1938, no person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manuscripting mining on fire fielding purposes. facturing, mining, or fire-fighting purposes.
- 2. Every person who shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Commission.
- 3. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does, or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof), close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

Relating to Hours of Duty of Certain Workers at the State Coal Mine, Wonthaggi.

THE State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the provisions of the State Coal Mine Industrial Tribunal Act 1932 (No. 4030), and constituted as provided by the said Act and the Order in Council made thereunder, hereby determines and awards as follows (that is to say):—

FUNERALS OF DESTITUTE PERSONS.

TENDERS will be received until Eleven o'clock a.m. on Friday, 6th May, 1938, from persons willing to undertake funerals of destitute persons to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner; the Necropolis, Springvale; and the cemeteries at Footscray or Williamstown, required by the several Departments of the Government of Victoria, from 1st July, 1938, to 30th June, 1940, in the Melbourne and metropolitan areas, as per Schedule No. 1.

Burials of deceased persons from police sub-districts north of the River Yarra will take place at the New Melbourne Cemetry, Fawkner; those from sub-districts south of the River Yarra, including burials from the Morgue, at the Necropolis. Springvale; and those from the Williamstown-Footscray sub-districts, at the Williamstown or Footscray cemeteries. Burials

of deceased persons whose bodies have been removed to the Morgue from places north of the River Yarra and from places within the Williamstown-Footscray area, respectively, shall take place at the Necropolis, Springvale, and are included in sub-schedule A accordingly.

Printed forms of tender giving full particulars and lists of places for which the funerals are required are obtainable from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, C.2.

Separate prices for ordinary funerals and for funerals under clause 6 of the conditions of contract must be stated (a) for adults, (b) for children above five years and under fourteen years of age, and (c) for children five years and under including stillborn—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges.

Tenderers are required to state on the tender form-(a) the number and description of the vehicles that they have available to carry out the service: (b) their business branches and the telephone numbers thereof, as these factors will be taken into consideration when dealing with tenders.

- 2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any 2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the Contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased: but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral, they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.
- 3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.
- 4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail, unless directed otherwise by the police. Bodies to be buried at Williamstown or Footscray to be conveyed by road. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 15.
- 5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to hear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the scams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin: a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctly offen-sive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the sive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, of timber 1 inch in thickness, hermetically scaled by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor.
