PROCLAMATION OF A TOURISTS' ROAD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 3 (1) of the *Country Roads (Tourists' Roads) Act 1936*, it is provided that the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board made after consultation with the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and on the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a tourists' road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the Country Roads Board (after consultation with the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby proclaim the said road to be a tourists' road for the purposes of the said Act.

## THE GEELONG HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

PORT OF GEELONG.—VICTORIA.

*New Deep-water Route between Point Richards and Inner Harbor.*

MASTERS, pilots, and others are hereby notified that on or about the 26th April, 1938, a deeper water route will be available from Point Richards to the Inner Harbor and to the piers therein, having a depth of 29 feet at low water ordinary spring tides.

Referring to Notices to Mariners, Victoria, Nos. 15 and 16 of 1936, Nos. 9, 14, 15, 19, and 30 of 1937, and No. 5 of 1938, the following alterations to the navigational aids within the Port of Geelong will be effected:—

## POINT RICHARDS CHANNEL.

No. 1 Buoy.—The position of this buoy will be unaltered. The group flashing white light exhibited therefrom will be altered to a group flashing red light. All other characteristics of the light will remain unchanged. This buoy marks the north-eastern end of Point Richards Channel on the port or south-eastern side.

For 1,000 feet southward of the buoy there is not less than 27 feet water, and for 3,000 feet not less than 26 feet.

No. 2 Buoy.—A spherical gas buoy with superstructure, painted red, and exhibiting at a height of 14 feet above sea level a flashing white light, showing one flash every four seconds and visible 5 miles, will be moored 9,273 feet 319 deg. from Point Richards Beacon.

This buoy will mark the starboard or north-western side of the channel, northward of which the depths decrease to 25 feet at 500 feet distant.

No. 3 Buoy.—This buoy will be removed to a position 9,144 feet 311½ deg. from Point Richards Beacon or 1,062 feet 311½ deg. from its present position.

The green flashing light exhibited therefrom will be altered to a red flashing light; all other characteristics of the light will remain unchanged. This buoy will mark the south-western end of Point Richards Channel on the south-eastern or port side, and will be 6,603 feet 239 deg. from No. 1 buoy.

South-eastward of this buoy the depths decrease to 24½ feet at 1,000 feet distant.

The direction of Point Richards Channel is 239 deg. and the navigable width 300 feet. The buoys will be moored 50 feet outside the line of the cut on each side.

## WILSON'S SPIT CHANNEL.

No. 2 Buoy.—Now established (see Notice to Mariners, Victoria, No. 5 of 1938), marks the eastern entrance to Wilson's Spit Channel, on the northern or starboard side.

The beacons referred to in Notices to Mariners, Victoria, Nos. 14, 15, and 19 of 1937, as a, b, c, d, e, f, and g, will be known and numbered respectively as Nos. 1, 4, 3, 6, 5, 8, and 7, Wilson's Spit Channel.

Nos. 4, 6, and 8 beacons define the northern or starboard side of channel. They will be painted red and numbered in black figures.

White flashing lights showing a flash every four seconds and visible 5 miles will be exhibited from Nos. 4 and 6 beacons at an elevation of 20 feet above sea level.

A similar light is already established on No. 8 beacon. Nos. 1, 3, 5, and 7 beacons define the southern or port side, and will be painted black and numbered in white figures.

Red flashing lights, visible 3 miles and showing one flash every four seconds, will be exhibited from Nos. 1 and 3 beacons at a height of 20 feet.

Similar lights are already established on Nos. 5 and 7 beacons.

The beacons on each side of this channel when in line bear 281 deg. 54 feet. The width between the lines of beacons is 380 feet, but, as the beacons are placed 40 feet outside the edge of the cut on both sides, the navigable width is reduced to 300 feet. Distances between the beacons are—

- On the northern side—
- No. 2 buoy to No. 4 beacon = 7,190 feet.
- No. 4 beacon to No. 6 beacon = 4,900 feet.
- No. 6 beacon to No. 8 beacon = 5,400 feet.

- On the southern side—
- No. 1 beacon to No. 3 beacon = 4,400 feet.
- No. 3 beacon to No. 5 beacon = 5,400 feet.
- No. 5 beacon to No. 7 beacon = 5,400 feet.

Westward of No. 7 beacon the channel connecting the Hopetoun and Wilson's Spit Channels is defined, on the northern side, by the lines of the northern beacons, which junction at a point 1,000 feet west of No. 7 beacon, and on the southern side by a straight line joining No. 7 beacon, Wilson's Spit Channel, and No. 1 beacon, Hopetoun Channel. At the above-mentioned junction, the channel is 580 feet wide, from which point it converges to a navigable width of 220 feet at No. 1 beacon, Hopetoun Channel.

A black-painted gas buoy with superstructure, and exhibiting at a height of 14 feet above sea level a red flashing light showing one flash every four seconds visible 3 miles, will be established in the following position:—5,600 feet 262½ deg. from No. 5 beacon, Hopetoun Channel, in line with the southern beacons in 29 feet of water.

This buoy will mark the western end of Hopetoun Channel, and will be known as No. 7 buoy, Hopetoun Channel.

The existing No. 7 buoy (Moolup) marking the course round Wilson's Spit beacon will be permanently withdrawn.

The existing fixed green light at the outer end of Portarlington jetty will be discontinued.

## SAILING DIRECTIONS.—INWARD.

After passing Prince George's Bank beacon a course should be shaped to permit of a vessel being straightened up on the line of the Point Richards Channel—239 deg.—before passing No. 1 buoy. Steering this course, vessel should pass about 200 feet north-west of No. 1 buoy 200 feet south-east of No. 2 buoy and 200 feet north-west of No. 3 buoy. Having passed No. 3 buoy, proceed on a 239 deg. course for 4½ miles to No. 2 buoy, Wilson's Spit Channel, which marks the eastern entrance to this channel.

This buoy, which is moored in 32 feet of water, may be passed close to on the starboard hand, but, as depths of 32 feet exist for a distance of 1 mile south-eastward of it, a little wider course may be steered when approaching the buoy, enabling a vessel to be straightened up for her passage through the channel before passing No. 2 buoy.

For about 1,000 feet westward of this buoy, and for a width of 300 feet northward from the line of the northern beacons, there is not less than 29 feet of water. West of this point the 5-fathom contour line recedes to the northward, and then curves towards the channel, which it meets at 500 feet eastward of No. 1 beacon. South of the line of the southern beacons there is not less than 30 feet of water over a width of half a mile, until within 1,500 feet eastward of No. 1 beacon, when the water shoals rapidly. Vessels navigating the entrance to Wilson's Spit Channel have, therefore, ample room to straighten up on the line of the channel after passing the entrance buoy, but care should be taken to ensure that a vessel is within the lines of the beacons when 1,500 feet eastward of No. 1 beacon, which should be passed on the vessel's port hand. A mid-channel course of 282 deg. should then be steered passing the succeeding beacons as follows:—No. 4 to starboard, No. 3 to port, No. 6 to starboard, No. 5 to port, No. 8 to starboard, and No. 7 to port.

From No. 7 beacon, Wilson's Spit Channel, the course may be altered to 266 deg. for No. 1 beacon, Hopetoun Channel, a distance of 5,980 feet, passing same to port, and thence a mid-channel course of 263 deg. through the Hopetoun Channel as formerly. Having passed No. 8 beacon, Hopetoun Channel, deep-draught vessels should continue on this course until abreast of No. 7 buoy, Hopetoun Channel, when a course may be shaped to any of the piers within Corio Bay.

## DREDGED AREAS AT PIERS.

The approaches and dredged areas adjacent to the various piers having a depth of 29 feet low water are as follows:—

## Cunningham Pier.

Western Side.—A width of 250 feet at outer end, converging to 125 feet at inner end.

Eastern Side.—A width of 450 feet at outer end, converging to nil at the inner end.

## Yarra Pier.

A width of 250 feet at outer end on both sides, converging to a width of 200 feet at inner end.

## Corio Quay.

No. 1 Berth.—250 feet wide at main wharf, converging to 200 feet at 200 feet westward of western end.

No. 2 Berth.—All the area eastward of a line joining the junction of Nos. 1 and 2 berths, Corio Quay, and the eastern end of North Wharf has a least depth of 29 feet.

North Wharf.—A width of 200 feet at inner end, diverging to a width of 280 feet at outer end.

## Lascelles Pier.

Anywhere eastward and southward of a line joining the northern end of this pier and the single pile beacon 2 cables northward.

## CONTROL OF TRAFFIC IN WILSON'S SPIT AND HOPETOON CHANNELS.

With a view to providing clear channels for both inward and outward traffic, a temporary signal station will be established at Portarlington.

From a mast at the outer end of Portarlington Pier, the following signals will be exhibited between sunrise and sunset:—

<i>Signal.</i>	<i>Meaning.</i>
Black ball at masthead	Wilson's Spit and Hopetoun Channels closed to inward traffic.
Black ball hauled down	Wilson's Spit and Hopetoun Channels open to inward traffic.

Between sunset and sunrise the following signals will be exhibited from a structure adjacent to the Day Signal Mast:—

<i>Signal.</i>	<i>Meaning.</i>
Red triangular Neon light— Apex up	Above channels closed to inward traffic.
Green triangular Neon light— Apex up	Above channels open to inward traffic.

Outward traffic will be regulated by direct telephonic communication between the Harbor Master and vessels moored at the piers.

All shipping movements will be controlled by the Harbor Master.

On and after the 26th April, 1938, no vessel must leave any pier for the purpose of passing through the channels within the Port of Geelong until permission has first been obtained from the Harbor Master.

On and after the 26th April, 1938, every vessel, irrespective of draught and whether inward or outward bound, must be navigated through the entire length of Hopetoun and Wilson's Spit Channels unless permission to follow any other course has first been obtained from the Harbor Master.

Light-draught vessels proceeding from Melbourne to Geelong which heretofore have entered the Hopetoun Channel via the Point Wilson (Steamboat) buoy will now be required to shape a course for the No. 2 buoy, Wilson's Spit Channel, and to pass within signalling distance of the Portarlington Signal Station.

BY-LAW NO. 3801.—DRAINAGE RATE—RODNEY DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following Drainage Rate is hereby made under the provisions of the *Water Acts*, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Rodney Drainage District:—

For the drainage of such lands—

- (1) Of all lands in the First Division, being the lands included within red border on a plan of such district, signed and sealed by the Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, and an authenticated copy of which is also lodged at the office of the Commission at Tatura, excepting and excluding all lands in the Second Division as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan, and excepting and excluding all lands in the Third Division as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Eight pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (2) Of all lands in the Second Division, as shown coloured green on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Four pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.
- (3) Of all lands in the Third Division, as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plan—a rate of Two pence in the pound of the rateable value of such lands.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the period of six months beginning with the first day of January, 1938, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1938, and shall be payable on the 22nd day of April, 1938, at the office of the said Commission at Tatura.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Acts*, and adopted by the said Commission on the 4th day of April, 1938, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands.

*Power to Enter and Inspect.*

8. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence.

*Offence.*

9. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

*Penalty.*

10. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

*Exemptions May be Made by the Council.*

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings or an adjoining property boundary.

NOTE.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

*Definitions.*

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said Shire of Benalla, or any deputy appointed by the Council of the said municipality to act for him. "Council" means the Council of the said municipality. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test, if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

*Schedule.*

Methylated spirits, benzene, petrol, naphtha, or any other products of petroleum or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour below a temperature of 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF "ARAPILES CENTENARY PARK."

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 56 of the *Forests Act 1928* the Governor in Council is enabled to make Rules and Regulations in regard to the care, protection, and management of any land forming part of any reserved forest, such land being a place of natural beauty or interest, or a health resort, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such land or any specified part or parts thereof, and by such Rules and Regulations to extend and apply for the purposes of such section and the Rules and Regulations thereunder the provisions of sub-sections (2), (3), (4), and (5) of section 182, and section 185 of the *Land Act 1928*, with such alterations, substitutions, additions, omissions, and modifications as are necessary or expedient for the purposes of carrying out the objects of this section: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, do hereby make the following Rules and Regulations in respect of the land forming part of the reserved forest in the Parish of Arapiles, County of Lowan, described in the Schedule hereto, and known as "Arapiles Centenary Park," and also for the purposes of the said section 56, and the Rules and Regulations thereunder, do hereby extend and apply sub-sections (3), (4), and (5) of section 182 of the *Land Act 1928* and section 185 of such Act, with the alterations, additions, and modifications hereinafter appearing.

## SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

Parish of Arapiles, County of Lowan, 18 acres: Commencing at a point on the west side of a 1-chain road, bearing S. 6 deg. 58 min. E. 700 links from the south-east angle of allotment 41; bounded thence by the said road bearing S. 6 deg. 58 min. E. 1,000 links; and thence by lines bearing respectively S. 83 deg. 2 min. W. 1,800 links, N. 6 deg. 58 min. W. 1,000 links, and N. 83 deg. 2 min. E. 1,800 links to the commencing point (36/1409).

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND  
MANAGEMENT OF "ARAPILES CENTENARY PARK," THE LAND  
DESCRIBED IN THE SCHEDULE ABOVE-MENTIONED, AND  
REFERRED TO IN SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS "THE  
RESERVE."

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set aside for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, remove, cut, damage, mark, write, or deface, or in any way damage any buildings, trees (whether alive or dead), or any shrubs, ferns, plants, bark, fruit seeds, roots, leaves, or flowers, or notices, seats, tables, gates, posts, fences, railings; pillars, or any other erection or property within the Reserve.

4. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal (including birds of any description), or any skin, egg, feathers, or nest, or carry any firearms, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences in or around the Reserve, or affix any bills or signs to any tree, seat, gate, post, table, fence, pillar, railing, building, or any other erection within or around the Reserve, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall light or maintain any fire within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only in such places and in such manner as may be prescribed by such Committee.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, nor any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of

Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may in its absolute discretion determine. Such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of same.

8. No person shall bring into the Reserve or allow to wander therein any horse, cattle, sheep, goat, pig, or other animal without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the owner of any such animal found trespassing in the Reserve shall be liable for breach of these Regulations.

9. The Committee of Management shall have full power to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and the Committee of Management shall be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any seed or portion of any plant, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall park any motor car within the Reserve excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose.

12. No person shall conduct or take part in any public meeting or organize entertainments or sports of any kind in any part of the Reserve without the written permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve unless under control, and all dogs found wandering therein shall be liable to be destroyed and the owners thereof to prosecution.

14. No persons except those employed in the Reserve and other persons authorized by the Committee of Management shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers, or for the protection of young native species naturally grown, or remove therefrom any plant or bark, fruit, seed, leaves, or flowers, or other part of any plant, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

16. No person shall break glass of any kind or deposit broken glass in the Reserve.

17. No vehicle with iron tires, carrying a load exceeding 1 ton on four wheels or half a ton on two wheels shall be allowed within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

18. The Committee of Management shall have power to restrict the load on any vehicle when, it is considered that such load will damage any road or roads within the Reserve.

19. No person shall commit a nuisance in any part of the Reserve or in or on any building in the Reserve.

20. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, or at any time behave in such a way as in the opinion of the Committee of Management tends to frighten or disturb the native animals and/or birds therein.

21. Every person offending against any of these Rules or Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any forest officer or officer or servant of the Committee of Management, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such forest officer, officer or servant, or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

22. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke any of these Rules and Regulations, and thereupon such rule or regulation shall have no force or effect.

23. The Committee of Management or a majority of its members shall have full power either in the name of any one or more of its members or in the name of some person appointed in that behalf by the Committee to take any legal proceedings for or in connexion with the breach or non-observance of any of these Rules or Regulations.

24. In no case shall the Forests Commission or His Majesty be liable for any costs or expenses incurred or awarded in connexion with any prosecution under or pursuant to any of these Rules or Regulations.

25. These Rules and Regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be posted in some conspicuous place adjacent to the entrance gates to the Reserve.
