AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION
By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any Municipal District outside the Metropolitan Fire District or any Country Fire District, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such Municipal District or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such Fire District, and that thereupon such Municipal District or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such Fire District: And whereas the councils of the Municipal Districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder and not already part of the Fire Districts respectively specified in connexion therewith be added to and form part of such Fire Districts: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such Municipal Districts shall be added to and form part of the Fire Districts respectively specified accordingly.

Southern Fire District.

Shire of Heytesbury.—Town of Cobden and Parish of Tandarook, County of Heytesbury: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment F2, Parish of Tandarook; thence due east by a line 5 chains more or less; thence due south by a line to the Country Roads Board main road; thence north-easterly by the western boundary of that road to a point due west from the most westerly angle of Crown allotment 35B; thence easterly by a line to the angle aforementioned and south-easterly by the east side of a road to a point in line with the most northerly angle of allotment 42Ca; thence southerly by a line and a road to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 1A; thence by a line, said allotment 1A and allotment 2 bearing westerly to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally in a southerly direction by the western boundary of allotment 2A and the eastern boundary of allotment 45 of section 1 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 45 to its south-western angle; thence north-westerly by a line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 31; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotment 31 to its south-western angle; thence southerly and westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of allotment 40 to its south-western angle; thence southerly by the western boundary of allotment 42 to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 18; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its south-western angle; thence westerly by a line to the west side of a road forming the boundary of the Parish of Tandarook; thence northerly by the boundary of the Parish of Tandarook and the boundary of the Town of Cobden to the north-western angle of allotment 2, no section, Town of Cobden; thence easterly by the town boundary to the Camperdown and Timboon railway line; thence generally in a north-easterly and north-westerly direction by the railway line to the north boundary of allotment F2 aforesaid; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

South Central Fire District.

Shire of Newham and Woodend.—Township and Parish of Woodend, County of Dalhousie: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 4, section 42A, in the Township of Woodend; bounded thence by the boundary of the Township of Woodend bearing respectively north and east to the Calder Highway; thence bearing north along the Calder Highway and along Carlisle-street in plan of subdivision No. 10183 to the north-west corner of lot 26 of the said subdivision; thence bearing east along the boundaries of lots 26 and 1 to the north-east angle of lot 1; thence southerly to the south-east angle of lot 13; thence bearing east to the north-east angle of Crown allotment 98; thence bearing southerly along river frontage on eastern boundaries of allotments 98, 99, and 100 to the north-east angle of allotment 101; thence by the said allotment 101 and a road bearing south to the south-east angle of allotment 10 of section 1; thence by a road bearing west to the south-west angle of allotment 16; thence by a road, a line, and the east boundary of allotment 10A of section 9 bearing south to the south-east angle thereof; thence

by the said allotment 10A, a line, and allotment 1A bearing west to the Calder Highway; thence by a line bearing north-west to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 10; thence by roads bearing westerly and northerly to the southern boundary of the Township of Woodend; thence along that boundary westerly to the point of commencement.

North-Eastern Fire District.

Shire of Mansfield.—Town and Parish of Mansfield, and County of Delatite: Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 24, Parish of Mansfield; thence southerly by the western boundary of that allotment to its south-western angle; thence south-easterly along the southern boundary of that allotment to a point in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 4A; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundary of the aforesaid allotment to its south-eastern angle; thence westerly along the southern boundary of allotments 4A and 5A to a road forming the east boundary of the Town of Mansfield; thence southerly by that road to the south-western angle of allotment 15A; thence westerly by a line and the southern boundary of allotment 10A and continuing westerly by the southern boundary of the Parish of Mansfield to the south-western angle of allotment 69; thence northerly by the west boundary of the last-mentioned allotment and allotments 68, 58, and 57 to the north-western angle of allotment 57; thence easterly by a road forming the north boundaries of allotments 57, 38, 37, and 36 to the point of commencement.

Shire of Alexandra.—Town and Parish of Alexandra, County of Anglesey: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 26, being the Racecourse Reserve; bounded thence by that allotment bearing east and south to the north-west angle of allotment 26B; thence by that allotment bearing east and south to the south-east angle thereof; thence by a line, allotment 25A and a line bearing south to the north-west corner of allotment 25B; thence by the northern, east, and southern boundaries of that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 24C; thence by that allotment and allotment 24D bearing south to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence by a road bearing west to the east boundary of the Town of Alexandra; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 29; thence by that allotment bearing south-easterly to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 30H; thence by a line and that boundary bearing west to the north-west angle of said allotment 30H; thence by allotment 30D bearing north, west, and again north to the north-east angle thereof, Parish of Alexandra; thence by Pendlebury-street, Town of Alexandra, bearing westerly to Hall-street; thence by that street bearing generally northerly to the southern side of the 3-chain road from Yea; thence by that road bearing north-westerly and north-easterly to the south angle of allotment 34B1, Parish of Alexandra; thence by that allotment and allotment 34B2 bearing north-easterly to the east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; and thence by allotment 55A and a line bearing east to the commencing point.

Shire of Yarrawonga.—Town and Parish of Yarrawonga, County of Moira: Commencing at a point on the south bank of the Murray River distant 10 chains east from the east boundary of the Town of Yarrawonga; thence southerly by a line parallel with and 10 chains east from the aforementioned boundary 115 chains more or less; thence westerly by a line parallel with and 10 chains south from the south boundary of the Town of Yarrawonga 105 chains more or less; thence northerly by a line parallel with and 10 chains west from the west boundary of the Town of Yarrawonga to a point on the south bank of the Murray River; thence generally in a north-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly direction by the Murray River to the point of commencement.

Eastern Fire District.

Shire of South Gippsland.—Township of Toora and Parish of Toora, County of Buln Buln: Commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 11, section A, Parish of Toora; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the aforesaid allotment a distance of 3.338 links; thence easterly by a direct line to the north-western angle of Crown allotment 5; thence easterly, northerly, and easterly by the boundaries of Crown allotment 5 to the north-eastern angle of the aforesaid allotment; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Crown allotment 5 and westerly along its southern boundary to the north-eastern angle of the Mangrove Pre-emptive Right; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of the Mangrove Pre-emptive Right and westerly along its southern boundary to a point due north from the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 102; thence southerly by a line to the north-eastern angle of the aforesaid allotment, and south-easterly and southerly along the western boundary of a Government road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 93; thence westerly by a road and a line to the south-eastern angle of allotment 12a; thence westerly and northerly by the boundaries of the aforesaid allotment to the south-eastern angle of allotment 13c; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 13c and 13b to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned

allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment 13B, a line, and the western boundaries of allotments 12E and 11 to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the eleventh day of April One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be main roads and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads mentioned in the schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for Declaration of Main Roads under the *Country Roads Act*.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highways within the State of Victoria set out or described in the schedule hereunder written are of sufficient importance to be main roads acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highways to be main roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

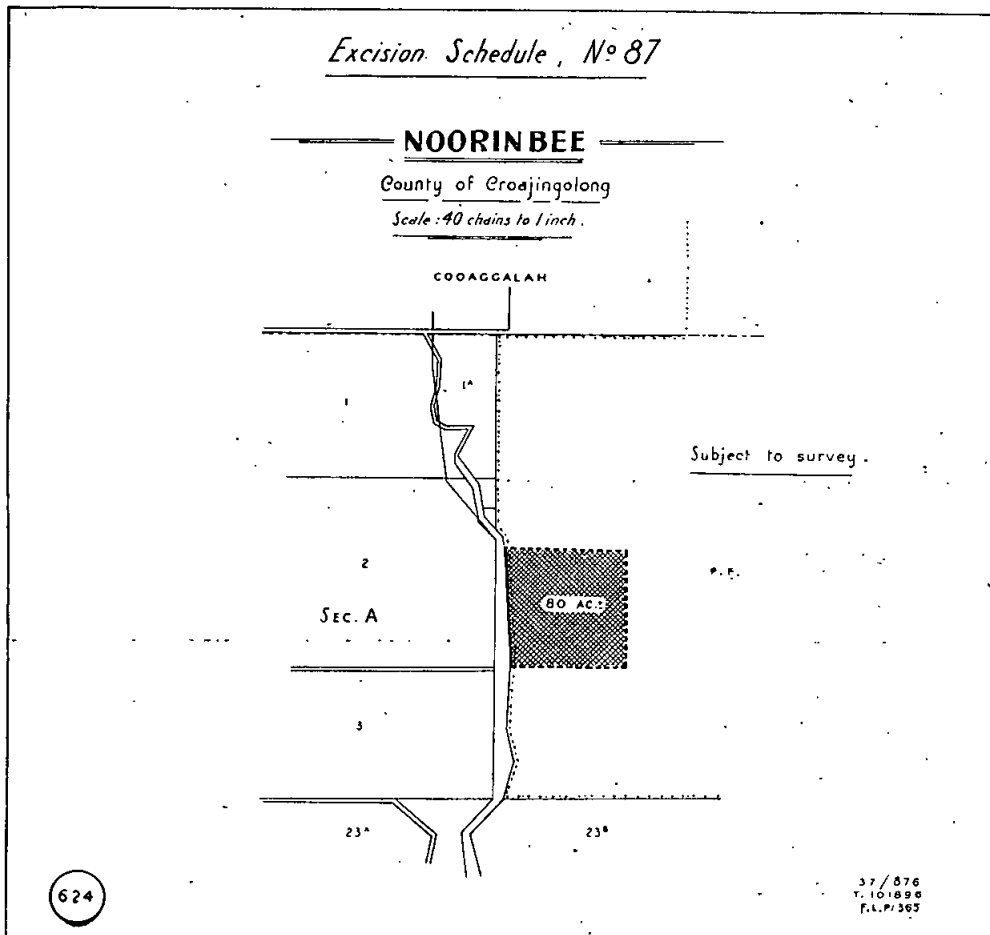

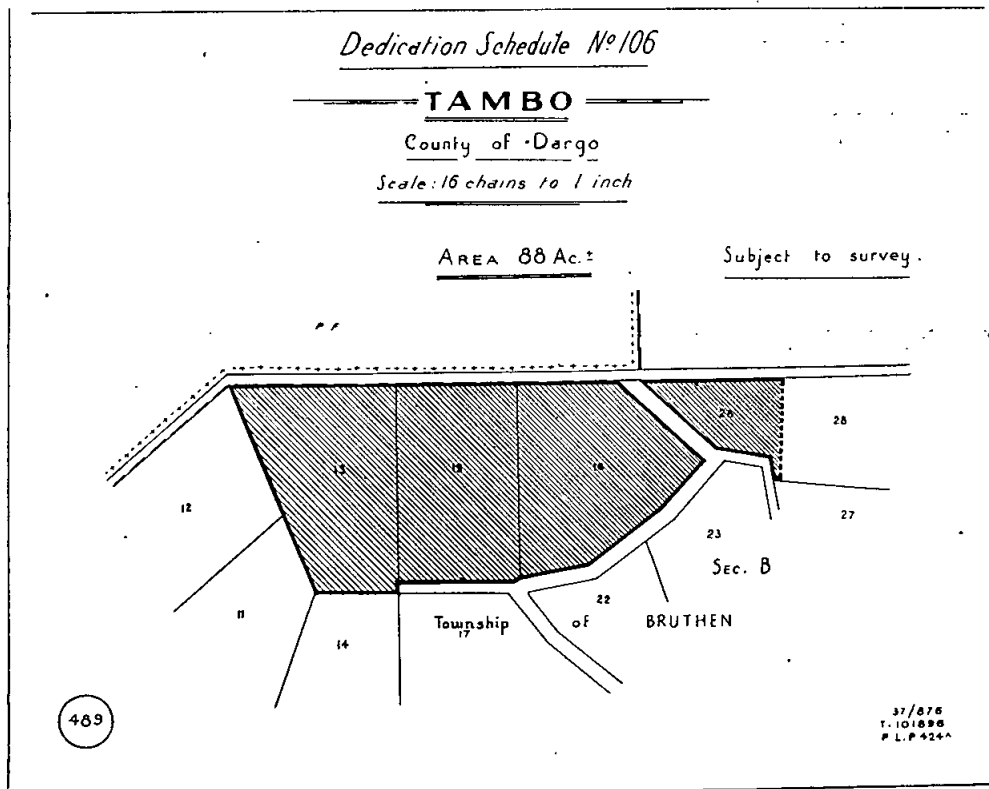

That a charge of One shilling be made for all vehicles entering the Garden to sports or such gatherings.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 182 of the *Land Act* 1928, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who so offends, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the Trustees, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff, officer, or servant, or member of the Police force, and taken before some Justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

- (b) Permit or suffer the use on the wheels of any vehicles (including tractors) of chains, bars, spikes, or other projections.
- (c) Permit or suffer the locking of the wheel of any vehicle when descending a hill.

2. Any person or persons guilty of a breach of or an offence against this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, be liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £20, and in addition shall pay to the Council of the Shire of Korumburra all expenses incurred in making good any damage resulting from such breach or offence.

3. This By-law shall repeal By-law No. 15 of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the said Shire of Korumburra on the sixteenth day of March, 1938, and was confirmed by the said Council on the thirteenth day of April, 1938.

8. Provision of pan closets in all houses and buildings.
9. Notice of intention to build a pan closet.
10. Distance at which pan closets or urinals shall be erected from buildings.
11. Specifications for erection of pan closet.
12. Pan closets not in accordance with By-law.
13. Access to be provided for double pan service.
14. Deodorant to be provided for pan closets and urinals.
15. Provision for maintenance and inspection.
16. Pan to be removed by contractor once a week or twice if necessary.
17. Contractor to report of pan found to be overflowing or leaking.
18. Nightsoil not to be removed without written consent of Council.
19. Burial of nightsoil in place not set apart for such purpose.
20. Collection of household garbage.
21. Specification of garbage receptacle.
22. Responsibility of contractor for emptying receptacle and closing gates.
23. Vehicle to be suitable, disinfected, and maintained in a proper state of repair.
24. Stables, shed, yards, &c.; used for the keeping of animals shall be cleansed at least once a week.
25. Dung or soil (excepting nightsoil) may be used for manure, provided it does not contravene any By-law of the Council.
26. Filth, rubbish, offensive matter, not to be deposited in any place so as to be a nuisance.
27. Inspector shall have power to enter into or upon any premises at any time to make an inspection.
28. Provision is made for a penalty for any breach or continuance of such breach of this By-law.
